#### Neighbourhood Plan

The public consultation meeting held on Wednesday 7 September in the Village Hall was well attended from parishioners across the village. A short summary of the key aspects of

the extensive documentation was presented and it is also available to view on the Parish Council website www.suttoncourtenay-pc.gov.uk. The Regulation 14 consultation on the draft Neighbourhood Plan is now closed. The Steering Group is collating all comments and will work with the Planning Consultant to address the comments and update the documents where applicable. All comments and responses will be published and sent to the Vale along with the updated documents. From there on the Vale takes over the process – please do look at the summary on the parish council website – slide 10 sets out the process.

#### **Recreation Ground Refurbishment**

The upgrade is now underway. Sutton Courtenay Parish Council has managed to secure funding for an outdoor gym so that will now be constructed within this phase as well. The Council is still in the process of drawing down s106 funding for combined rugby/football posts to be installed on the playing field. This would complete the initial phases of the work. Refurbishment of the cricket practice strips will be done in a subsequent phase subject to availability of funding.

#### **Planning Matters**

New river crossing – HIF1 application update:

The Parish Council continues to work with the neighbouring parish councils of Appleford, Culham, Burcot & Clifton Hampden and Nuneham Courtenay in relation to current proposals, by Oxfordshire County Council (OCC), for a new road (HIF1) between Didcot and the B4015 at Clifton Hampden.

There are continuing concerns that the impact of the proposed road on our adjacent communities has not been adequately modelled and considered in the decision on the alignment for the road along its route together with the siting and need for junctions (i.e., roundabouts, T junctions etc). With support from professional consultants, the 5-parishes group has been asking the County Council for clarification and more information on these key issues in relation to this application. To date no substantiative response has been received. The council also made representation at OCC's cabinet meeting in March.

A request to meet with members of the OCC Cabinet Advisory Group, set up to oversee the detailed design and development of HIF1, is still outstanding. The OCC Case Officer has raised queries with the applicant (OCC Highways). We understand a response is in preparation and there may be progress after this. OCC is also looking at its planned expenditure on all major projects.

Meanwhile, the 5-parishes group is looking at mitigation measures should the HIF1 project go ahead despite all the objections raised on several fronts. For Sutton Courtenay, the proposed principal mitigation measures are inclusion in the scheme of the derating of the B4016 to a 'C' road and the removal of routing agreements (FCC and Hanson) though our village and inclusion of traffic calming measures.

#### Grants

The Parish Council is pleased to be able to award grants to local organisations which benefit residents in the parish. The organisation must be a not-for-profit although it does not need to be a registered charity. The Council will consider grant applications for the 2023-24 financial year at its Finance and General Purposes working party meeting in November. If you are a member of a local group which would benefit from a grant, please contact the Parish Clerk (details below) Applications will need to be submitted by 31<sup>st</sup> October 2022.

#### **Councillor Vacancies**

There are currently vacancies within the Parish Council. To become a member of our Parish Council you must be:

- Over 18 and on the electoral register
- Live within 3 miles of the parish boundary
- Able to attend regular evening meetings
- Have an interest in local issues
- Have a desire to improve the quality of life in the Parish
- Able to represent the views of local people

The position is unpaid, but some expenses, such as for council related training, can be paid by the Parish Council. For more information contact the Clerk.

## **A Personal Reflection**

Catherine and I made a big decision this week. We would make an effort to witness directly one of the events in London commemorating the passing of Queen Elizabeth II and to pay our respects to her memory. The prospect of possibly queuing up for 24 hours or more to attend Westminster Hall was a bit beyond us, but the procession from Buckingham Palace to the Houses of Parliament and the predicted 4 hours of queuing to get a position on the Mall seemed just about manageable. Catching the 6.30am Oxford Tube into London, going via Hyde Park and Green Park, we found a position by 10.30am and waited for the procession start time of 2.22pm precisely. It was well worth the wait. We met a variety of people of varying opinions on the issues of the day, but all were agreed that our Queen was indeed a very special person and witnessing a part of her send-off was something we would talk about for years. We discussed the major world issues, the Cost of Living crisis, the change of government and Paddington Bear.

What was it about the Paddington Bear sequence in the Platinum Jubilee celebrations that had made such a big impression on all of us? We agreed that it wasn't simply the humour, but was as much the coming together of two characters, gentle, kind and caring, and both with the ability to bring people together. For all the journalists' and commentators' words and reflections over the many events of the past week, it was Paddington's final words "Thank you your majesty, for .... everything" that summed up our feelings better than any of them. Yes, it was a long wait, but we all agreed that it had been well worth it. The conversation flowed and the time passed quickly.

The parade and procession were incredibly moving and, despite watching two buses drive past us full, and not getting home until midnight, we would not have missed any of it for the world.

We now face a time of upheaval and great change. A new King, a new Prime Minister and Cabinet, a fully stretched economy, a major war, a climate emergency and the tail end (we hope) of a major pandemic. Locally we face the threat of major new infrastructure, roads and reservoirs. It all seems a bit of a mess. But it must have felt the same when Queen Elizabeth was a young girl and she helped to ensure things got better. We owe it to her memory to stay positive, to find the best in people and to work as tirelessly as she did, and to work together to make things better ourselves.

## **DAVID JOHNSTON MP**



When the announcement was made that Her Majesty had passed away, I cried in the way I do when told that someone I am close to has passed away, even though she was not someone I had ever met. It felt like we had lost our anchor, the person who has seemingly always been

there to help get us through whatever troubles the country has been facing, most recently Covid.

Parliament does not usually sit on Fridays or Saturdays, but it did so on both days after the Queen's death in order that MPs could give their tributes. In total across the 2 days, 321 MPs gave their tributes to Her Majesty, including myself, shortly before 10pm on the Friday (you can watch it at www.david-johnston.org.uk). Before that, we received the live broadcast to the nation from our new King in the House of Commons; a perfectly pitched and moving address.

The MP speeches were emotional, funny and heartfelt. Over and over the same themes emerged: that even when you hadn't met her you felt like you knew her; that she had given an incredible service to our nation; that she was sharp, passionate, selfless and mischievous, with twinkling eyes.

I bounced between different ceremonies in the constituency and in Parliament during the period of mourning, each of them poignant, but none so emotional as filing past Her Majesty's coffin in Westminster Hall when she was lying-instate. This truly brought home what had happened, although I think it will take some time for it to properly sink in yet.

It is a momentous time for our nation and for the Royal Family. Our new King assumes his responsibilities at a time of great sadness for him and his family. I've no doubt he will be an excellent King. He has shown, in his time as Prince of Wales, the care and concern he has for this country and has had decades to learn from Her Majesty (who became Queen at just 25) the best way to conduct the role. May Queen Elizabeth II Rest in Peace and God Save the King.

The period of mourning, of course, affected the activities that I undertook this month, but around it were still several visits and events, including the Didcot Twinning Association's reception for the Mayor of Meylan, an area of France twinned with Didcot, and a fundraising launch for a 14th century chantry window in All Saint's Church, North Two other things to note: September is Moreton. Alzheimer's Month and I know a lot of your families - like my own - have been affected by this and related conditions, so as a 'Dementia Friend' I encourage people to take part in activities supporting this. Similarly, the 2nd of October is Silver Sunday, the national day for older people, with plenty of events going on which I have been asked to encourage people to participate in or run. ### From the Ministry Team

The news on our economy, energy costs, NHS and business growth is far from hopeful. Concern for the wellbeing of nations and individuals

has increased to levels of anxiety and fear that are unprecedented for most of our nation's population. There is no quick fix and no one person or political group is solely to blame. Where can we find hope in hopeless times? Hope is so often to be found in human form in the skill of NHS staff, the courage of our rescue services such as the RNLI and in the neighbour, carer or welfare worker who comes alongside in our time of need.

Two statements of Jesus' emphasise his priority for those who are in need or oppressed, therefore this should be our local church's priority too: 'Whatever you do for such people, you do it to me' (Mt 25:40) and 'I am going away, and the world will see me no more - but you will, because you know me' (Jn 14:19). The world may never see Jesus in the faces of people in need, but Christians must. Surely a people of faith and hope must live and act in a way that they offer a sure hope to others; a pattern of faithful living demonstrated so wonderfully by our late Queen Elizabeth. The abiding challenge for Christianity is that it cannot be committed to Jesus Christ without being committed to his brothers and sisters. In his recent book, Navigating a World of Grace, Graham Tomlin, Bishop of Kensington defines "holiness" as the willingness to live generously towards others.

The five churches in the DAMASCUS Parish are reviewing how we best care for our community in desperate need. Please look out for details of our actions and working partnerships in village magazines, our website, social media and notices around the villages. ## Warm Home Discount rules updated for 2022-23

As winter approaches, many people will be nervously anticipating the cold weather and its inevitable effect on their heating bills. The Warm Home Discount (WHD) was introduced by the government in 2011 to offset some of this burden.

For 2022-2023 there have been a couple of significant changes to the WHD: the number of energy suppliers participating in the scheme will increase, and those on disability benefits who don't have low incomes nor high energy costs will not receive the WHD.

The value of the WHD payment is currently £150. Nobody needs to apply in order to receive it, with the exception of those living in mobile homes on a park home site (see below). The payment is credited automatically to the consumer's electricity supply account (or credit is directly applied to a pre-payment meter), and energy suppliers have to make this payment by 31 March each year at the latest.

Eligibility for the WHD is ascertained by means of datamatching between energy suppliers and government departments. There are three eligible groups of consumers: low-income pensioner households; low-income people on some means-tested benefits; and households with high energy costs. This last criterium is determined by the type of property you live in, especially its age and its floor area (based on information supplied by the Valuation Office Agency or the Land Registry).
