Reporting problems in the parish

Recently the Parish Council has been made aware of problems with the surfaces at bus stops and uneven pavements/paths. Defects in the area

adjacent to roads and roads themselves are the responsibility of the Highways authority which is Oxfordshire County Council. The Parish Council asks that residents report the problems via https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/ or by calling the County Council on 0345 310 1111. If the County Council fails to act, then please inform the Parish Council via the Clerk with details of the report including when it was made.

If you notice any problems at the **Recreation Ground**, **Cemetery**, **Village Green** or with any of the public **benches** in the parish then please report these directly to the Clerk to the Parish Council, Jennie Currie, (details below) as these sites are owned and managed by the Parish Council.

New Parish Council

Following the May 2023 elections 7 Councillors continued in their roles. At its May meeting the Council elected Rita Atkinson as their chairman for a second year and welcomed Robert Dalby to the role of vice chairman. During the meeting Fiona Wolveridge and Teresa Field were co-opted to the Council.

The Council is now looking to fill the remaining 2 seats by co-option. Individuals who are on the electoral register and who live or work in the parish or within 3 miles of the parish can be considered for co-option. If you are interested in working in a small team to contribute to local life, taking forward projects which benefit people across the parish, then please contact the Clerk, Jennie Currie.

Please note the role is unpaid, as a minimum you would be expected to attend monthly meetings and check your Council email account at least once a week. You would be asked to take an active role in a couple of areas of the Council's work across recreational amenities, the cemetery, planning policy, community infrastructure (defibs, benches, bins), community events and representing the Parish Council at meetings with local charitable and commercial organisations.

2022-23 Unaudited Annual Governance & Accountability Return

Each year the smaller authority's Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) needs to be reviewed by an external auditor appointed by Smaller Authorities' Audit Appointments Ltd. The unaudited AGAR will be published on the Council's website and noticeboard.

Any person interested has the right to inspect and make copies of the accounting records for the financial year to which the audit relates and all books, deeds, contracts, bills, vouchers, receipts and other documents relating to those records must be made available for inspection by any person interested.

The documents can be view by making an appointment with the Clerk to the Council between Monday 12^{th} June and Friday 21^{st} July 2023.

COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

A reassuring message.

One of my obligations on your behalf is to serve on the Thames Valley Police and Crime Commissioner Scrutiny panel. There, I meet Councillors from all around the Thames Valley area to discuss how we should hold the Commissioner to account.

The reputation of our police has taken quite a battering largely as a result of happenings in the Met. As we are the nearest neighbours to the Met, we might have expected that similar problems might spill over from the Met area into the Thames Valley. I am happy to report that I have seen little sign of this. Indeed, I have been very impressed with the determination shown by our Chief Constable and his team of Deputies in dealing with potential problems of misogyny, racism, bullying and the like.

A recent BBC documentary on some of the behaviour at the UN where there were accusations of bad behaviour running right up to the top of the organisation, made me realise just how important it is for the public to have confidence in large organisations that senior management is open, transparent and honest over any shortcomings. The moment that there is any sign of cover up, the reputation of the whole organisation is threatened. This is why I was much reassured by discussions with the senior Thames Valley Police team.

On a lighter note, we were shown one picture of the Commissioner walking across a field between two police officers. Doubtless, this was to convey the daily consultation that goes on between TVP and the Commissioner. However, it struck me that it could have been construed as the Commissioner being "taken in for questioning". It just demonstrates how important presentation and image is in public life!

Election mayhem over

As new Councils and Councillors begin to get their feet under the table, the same local problems and challenges that we faced last month are facing us now. Housing and housing numbers, roads, traffic, active travel and the climate emergency all still need solutions. At the same time, inflation is proving harder to bring down than we thought. If any of our new councillors thought they were in for an easy ride, I fear they were mistaken. But with a bunch of new, fresh faces comes a feeling of optimism that things could get better. That is something we all need to build on.

DAVID JOHNSTON MP



I hope you all enjoyed the Coronation weekend. Whether I was in Wantage, Didcot, Grove or Wallingford, the mood was upbeat, people were having a good time and there was plenty of food, music and activities.

The Coronation itself passed off perfectly, despite the weather — and the concert was great too. It was another reminder of how this country can do events like this better than anywhere else.

While we're still crunching the data, I wanted to thank everyone who completed my health services survey. I've had responses from nearly 3,000 people, which is a really great number to give a picture of what people are feeling across the constituency.

It's clear that, as I expected and as my inbox reflects, many people feel we do not have the health services we need. Nor do I. People particularly struggle to get an appointment with a doctor or with a dentist, but this is not the only thing that people would like to see more of when it comes to health. I will continue to campaign hard on this — watch this space.

After I held a successful crime summit with Thames Valley Police in Wantage, I was asked by local residents to hold one in Wallingford. I can confirm this will take place on 15th June, 6.30pm — 8pm and Waitrose have offered their café as a venue. Sign up on my website: www.david-johnston.org.uk.

Wherever you live, you can also sign up on my website for my third annual climate summit, which will be via Zoom and will have Grant Shapps, Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero, giving the keynote speech.

Sticking with the environment and climate change, I continue to lobby for the Local Electricity Bill, of which I am the lead sponsor, and which is now backed by 318 MPs. This would make it easier for small, community organisations that generate renewable energy to be able to sell it to the community. I am hopeful that with the Government's Energy Bill making its way through parliament at the moment, we might be able to finally make something happen that enables community energy to flourish.

Thanks to everyone who took part in my Apprenticeship Fair in Didcot — nearly 400 people attended and I had great conversations with a range of public and private employers about the variety of apprenticeships they offer. I was asked if I will be doing it again and I will be doing so.

A couple of other things in brief. I met with the Chair of Water Resource South East to again convey the objections local people have about the reservoir proposal. I also continue to encourage people to see if they are eligible for Pension Credit, which can provide an average £3,500 a year to pensioners. The figures show the uptake locally is increasing, but there are more people who could be getting it. See if you or someone else you know is eligible here: www.gov.uk/pension-credit/eligibility




Above: Beware Crocodiles! - Given only planks of wood, we must get across this fast-flowing river infested with crocodiles – come on team, work together!










ABINGDON DAMASCUS YOUTH PROJECT

From the Ministry Team

I could do with a holiday this summer

June is the start of our meteorological summer, and when our hopes turn to restful warm sunny days in the garden or perhaps going on holiday. We look forward to a much needed break from the gloom of the crises and threats which surround us, or the gloom of the weather and our tiredness.

Pentecost heralds the start of summer — the time when the church remembers and gives thanks for God's gift of His life giving, life enhancing, Spirit. To the early church, God sent His Holy Spirit to be their strength in times of human weakness and vulnerability. As our energy, faith and hope diminishes, Pentecost reminds us again that God's strength is made perfect in our weakness.

Pentecost makes me realise that our sense of emptiness is not a negative thing, it is a capacity.

We read on containers the capacity they hold. Capacities are there to be filled. Without the Holy Spirit we are nothing. It is only through the Holy Spirit, God within us, that we come to believe in God's refreshing love. It is only through the Holy Spirit that we can pray at all; for true prayer is always the Holy Spirit praying in and through us. It is only through the Holy Spirit that we are capable of any genuine good, for that which is of God within us is good. Without the Holy Spirit we are an emptiness. But this emptiness is a capacity waiting to be filled.

W.J. Carey, Bishop of Bloemfontein from 1921-1934, wrote a prayer which he suggested should be 'prayed slowly; or brooded over; or thought and felt.' This prayer includes the lines: 'O Holy Spirit of God — come into my heart and fill me ... I offer to thee the one thing I really possess, my capacity of being filled by thee... Fill me so that I may live the life of the Spirit; the life of truth and goodness, the life of beauty ... and guide me today in all things.'





REST IN PEACE

Edith (Cis) Grootz, who died on 7th April 2023, was born on 20th June 1925 in Wolverhampton, to her parents May and Percy Roberts, and grew up with her brother Ted. The family moved to Sutton Courtenay when her Father came to work for MG as a coachfitter.

As a child Cis belonged to a Dancing Academy where she did acrobatics and she and her mother would travel around the country to acrobatic displays. Cis always used to say that it was the money she earned from this that bought the three cottages on Chapel Lane which the family owned. She attended Sutton School on the High Street but left at 14 to go into Domestic Service at Northcourt House in Abingdon. The lady of the house soon recognized that Cis was not suited to the work so sent her home! For a while Cis moved back to Wolverhampton and worked in The Greyhound Pub — owned by her Aunty Doris.

When war broke out she moved back to Sutton Courtenay and it was working in the packing bay at Milton Depot, with her great friend Sylv, that she met and fell in love with Kurt, who was working as a Chef whilst a Prisoner of War. Kurt went onto be repatriated to Germany, but he was determined to return to Cis and – after one long year – he succeeded and arrived back in England to marry her. They walked to Didcot to obtain a Special Licence and they were married here in this church. They went onto have five children, thirteen grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

Apart from a stay of 10 years in Canada the family settled in Sutton Courtenay, where Cis brought up her family and also worked in various jobs — including in the canteen on Milton Park and at John Adams — making cuddly toys and as a cleaner which she did until well into her 80s.

Her life was not without tragedy – losing two of her sons in tragic circumstances and battling with Lymph cancer when she was 85. When Kurt suffered a stroke she lovingly nursed and cared for him. Through all of this she proved herself to be a real fighter and struggler.

Cis loved shopping and always enjoyed going to car boot sales with Sylv, her best friend and buying chocolates and sweets for her grandchildren. She enjoyed the company of her really good neighbours — Billy, Ivan and Mrs Teat. She was always grateful for their love and support. She was a hard-working, houseproud and caring person and a loyal friend. Determined to be independent she could be very stubborn. She liked to be busy — and as long as she was busy she was happy - but above all Cis was someone who loved her family and who always put them first. She will be greatly missed by her family and friends.

Her funeral took place in All Saints' Church on 26th April 2023 and this is an edited extract from the address given by the Reverend Helen Kendrick.




