SSE to carry out tree works which might cause power outages

On Wednesday 2nd August 2023, SSE has arranged for a contractor to carry out tree works in the area of the overhead cables which run alongside the Village Hall and onto the Cemetery. Due to the nature of

the work it is likely that the power supply will need to be temporarily disconnected.

The homes and businesses effected are in the area north of the Village Hall as indicated on this map. SSE will be sending notifications directly to affected premises.

Grass cutting on verges

The majority of the verges in the parish are owned by Oxfordshire County Council (OCC), in 2016 OCC approached all the Parish Councils in Oxfordshire and asked them to take on the responsibility of cutting the verges at least twice a year in return for a contribution of 10.25pence per square metre (£1.025 per 10 square metres) which is £1,607.74 per year. Sutton Courtenay Parish Council has been cutting the verges since then. In 2022/23 the actual cost to the Parish Council was £6,714.96 with the verges being cut once a month from April to October.

In 2023 the current grounds maintenance contract is due to be renewed. In May following adverse weather conditions and problems with the current contractor's equipment, the verges were not cut as planned. In late May the contractor advised that as they planned to retire this year, they would be ceasing to work for the Parish Council at the end of the month.

At the time of writing this piece in June, the contract is out to tender with the intention of the new contractor starting work in July 2023. Aware that costs would have increased since the previous contract was agreed, the Council is looking to have the verges cut 3 times a year in March, June and September, with the first cut taking place in July 2023.

The decision to reduce the number of cuts is to support No Mow May and to reduce the grounds maintenance cost to the Parish Council which receives most of its funding from the precept paid by households via Council Tax.

If you have any issues with the verges within the 30mph speed limit area then please contact the Parish Council via the Clerk. Oxfordshire County Council continues to maintain the verges outside the 30mph zones.

Councillor Vacancies

Sutton Courtenay Parish Council can have a maximum of 11 Councillors. Following the May 2023 election process there are 2 seats vacant and the Council is looking to fill those seats by cooption.

Individuals who are on the electoral register and who live or work in the parish or within 3 miles of the parish can be considered for co-option. If you are interested in working in a small team to contribute to local life, taking forward projects which benefit people across the parish, then please contact the Clerk, Jennie Currie.

Please note the role is unpaid, as a minimum you would be expected to attend monthly meetings and check your Council email account at least once a week. You would be asked to take an active role in a couple of areas of the Council's work across recreational amenities, the cemetery, planning policy, community infrastructure (defibs, benches, bins), community events and representing the Parish Council at meetings with local charitable and commercial organisations.

Preparing for transition

Children have learned so much this year and, as always, it is a joy to watch them progress, each at their own pace and in their unique, individual ways. This term is very much about preparing children for their transition to the next stage, whether that is the move from Foundation Stage to the main school, to a new class, or even to a whole new school! For our oldest children, this is a particularly special time. Meanwhile, there is still lots of learning to do in current classes as we complete the curriculum.

In June, teachers across the school have been busy carrying out assessments. Children in Kestrels class have been taking the Year 1 Phonics Screening test. In this, they have to read 40 words using their phonic knowledge and blending the sounds — to make sure they do not recognise the words, half of them are made up words naming alien characters. We have been impressed with the children's concentration and determination, as well as the progress all have made from their starting points. Across the rest of the school, teachers have also been completing assessments with children, ready to inform their report writing. These form an important part of the school calendar so that we can carry out a good transition to their next teacher.

Star dome!

We were lucky to have a visit from Science Oxford, who brought their star dome with them. This is a giant, inflatable tent the children can go inside. Once in, scenes of the sky are projected onto the inside walls for an immersive experience of star gazing! Children in Barn Owls, Robins, Kestrels, Kingfishers, Red Kites and Falcons all enjoyed the spectacular show, which links to the units they cover on their topic in their science curriculum.





See how the garden grows!

You will remember that last summer we planted a science garden behind Nightingales and Wrens classrooms. It has grown and matured over the past year and is now a wonderful sensory space. This week Year 1 have been making the most of it to explore the feel, smell and taste of

different plants, which is a part of their science work this term focused on observation skills.

We were so impressed with the number of entries to our half term photography competition, capturing mini beasts in their natural habitats. COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Well, that serves me right for taking a holiday. We were very privileged to be taken by family - no, not a political perk - to Hawaii. I have been passionate about volcanoes for many years and this was a great opportunity to see some of the best examples in the world. Most of the dramatic pictures we see of lakes of red hot lava are taken at night and during the few days or weeks of eruptions that occur every few years. Solidified lava is very hard and can take many years to break down. The result is not beautiful but thousands of acres of piled up black rock are mighty impressive. In the months and years between eruptions, steam pours out from the craters but tourists are lucky to see any boiling red lava. We were not lucky but, as we left, a sizeable eruption began. However, whilst we missed the spectacle, it seems that we did bring home some spectacular tropical weather with us. Yesterday's thunder, torrential rain and high winds mixed in with hot sunshine in southern Oxfordshire matched anything in Hawaii.

Meanwhile, local and national politics has been stormier than even the past two years have offered. The Reservoir issue rumbles on. Evermore contentious planning applications are in the pipeline. The HIF1 Road application is due to be heard at a two day planning meeting in late June. By next month things will have progressed on all these issues.

Other updates include:

Mill Rd. Bridge, Marcham – we expect work to begin on this long running issue very shortly.

Noise at Appleford sidings — An application to extend working hours was deferred by the OCC Planning Committee.

Grass cutting — budget cuts over the last decade have reduced the timetable to one cut per year. Visibility at many road junctions is a problem and is being steadily tackled under a priority scheme — major junctions first. We are getting there but, in the meantime, please take extra care.at junctions.

20mph limits. St Helen's is now fully operational and work has begun on Drayton.

And finally, a little good news. VWHDC Climate Action Fund and OCC Councillor Priority Fund are offering grants for worthy local causes. More details on Council's websites or from me.

DAVID JOHNSTON MP



Thank you to everyone who completed my health services survey. In total, 2,838 people did so, 77% of whom said they had had difficulty getting a GP appointment in the last year and 44% pf whom said they had

had difficulty accessing an appointment with a dentist. Unsurprisingly, 97% of people felt we do not have enough GPs for the number of people we have locally and 98% felt we do not have enough dentists. I completely agree and have been banging the drum on our health services since I was elected. Not long after the survey closed, I secured a debate in parliament about our health services and intend to keep banging heads together until we get the services we need.

I was pleased to take the Children's Minister, Claire Coutinho, to a local nursery recently to meet staff and children. The Government is making the largest single investment in childcare in history, which will give parents 30 free hours of childcare every week for 38 weeks a year from when their child is 9 months old until they start school, which will be very welcome to the parents who raise childcare issues with me when I knock on their doors. I have launched a childcare survey on my website which is designed to let parents (and grandparents) talk about their experience of accessing childcare and say what they'd like to see. It is 12th until the www.davidopen johnston.org.uk/childcare.

Sticking with education and children for a minute, I was drawn to ask a question at Prime Minister's Questions and

used it to highlight the great news that English primary school children have just been ranked the best readers in the Western World — better than all other countries in Europe as well as America and Canada — and the fourth best globally. This is in large part testament to teachers and the Government's focus on phonics, which was resisted by some at the time but is clearly bearing fruit.

Depending on when you read this, you'll either just still have time to attend my 3rd Annual Climate Summit for constituents on Zoom on 4 July or it will have happened and you'll be able to watch a recording of it on my website or Facebook page. I was pleased that Grant Shapps, Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero, has agreed to give the keynote speech — and, as ever, local and national experts have agreed to take part.

This year, I have been hosting at least one local young person for work experience every month including Anastasiia, who is originally from Ukraine. I first met her with the family who have kindly hosted her in North Moreton. It was good to have her with us in Parliament.

I've enjoyed getting into the swing of the summer events happening across the constituency, including the Hagbourne Church Fete and Uffington Fun Day. From the Ministry Team

As I write this, today is a beautiful

summer's day, with a clear blue sky and a fresh breeze. A calm June day after the recent dramatic thunderstorms. At this time of the year many of us will be trying to make the most of the great outdoors, and even taking some time to relax and enjoy the great British weather. We often take time off to do this, even take a holiday, a break, time for a change to the routine of daily life.

Jesus often took time to rest and get away from it all. On one occasion St Matthew (chapter 8: 23-27) tells us, that after preaching to large crowds, Jesus, along with his disciples, took a boat to go across the Sea of Galilee. They were going to the opposite shore to find some time and solitude to rest. As they were crossing, a furious storm broke. The worried disciples thought the boat was going to sink and went to wake up a sleeping Jesus. He woke up and asked them why they were afraid and then quickly subdued the wind and waves.

This story illustrates Jesus' calming effect. This you can take literally, and as an analogy, for our lives. There are many storms around us at this time; political ones, the cost of living, wars and refugees, climate change, the list seems endless. However, we are reminded in Matthew's story, that God both permits storms and delivers us through them. Storms do end, and calm will come again.

The lyrics to Rock Me by Thomas A. Dorsey might give you a little calmness too:

Make my journey brighter, make my burden lighter. Help me to do good wherever I can.

Let thou presence thrill me, let thy holy spirit fill me And just hold me in the hollow of your hand.

You just hide me in that bosom 'Til the storm of life is over

Rock me in the cradle of thy love.



Don't get burnt before you're on the beach: Action Fraud reports over £15m lost to holiday fraud in the past year.

Top tips to avoid falling victim to holiday fraud

- Do your own research: Booking your trip via a
 company you haven't used before? Do some research to
 check they're legitimate. Read feedback from sources
 that you trust, such as consumer websites. You can find
 a company's official website by searching for them on
 Google or another trusted search engine.
- Look for the logo: Check whether the company is an ABTA Member. Look for the ABTA logo on the company's website. If you have any doubts, you can verify membership of ABTA online on their website. If you're booking a flight as part of a package holiday and want more information about ATOL protection, or would like to check whether a company is an ATOL holder, visit the ATOL or CAA website.

- Pay safe: Book your holiday with a credit card, if you have one. Most major credit card providers protect online purchases, and are <u>obliged to refund you in certain circumstances</u>. Using a **credit** card (rather than a **debit** card) also means that if your payment details are stolen, your main bank account won't be directly affected.
- Secure your email: If your email is hacked, it could allow a criminal to access information about your holiday booking. Use 3 random words to create a strong password for your email that's different to all your other passwords. If you're offered 2-step verification to protect your email and social media accounts, always use it.

OBITUARY - REST IN PEACE

Frances Elizabeth Faith WILSON who died on 6th May 2023 was born on 5th March 1931 in Aden, Egypt where her father was a junior officer in the Royal Airforce. The next posting was back in the UK near Slough – not as exotic. During the war years, Faith was at primary school. Then her parents were posted to Singapore and she went to Sherbourne School for girls in Dorset, where she passed a happy four years. She left school at 16. She first studied the piano and singing at the Royal College of Music. A concert career did not beckon so she took a piano teaching qualification and a secretarial course in Oxford. Later in life she did earn more than a little pocket money both by teaching the piano and later teaching sewing.

Her first job as a secretary was working for the Foreign Office, in Berlin. It later unfolded that in fact she had been working for MI6 in Berlin at the beginning of the Cold War — a secretary to the spies! Although she never talked about her job she did talk about her social life in Berlin which revolved around the presence of the Black Watch regiment in Berlin. In a letter to her parents she told them "I am out so much I barely have time to eat or sleep — and I need more dance dresses". After MI6 she worked in London for a few years as a secretary.

She met Bernard, her future husband, on a skiing holiday in Zermatt and fell in love with him because, "he had such lovely broad shoulders". They started their married life in Great Barrow in Cheshire with Bernard working as a chemical engineer for ICI in Runcorn. Three daughters appeared in quick succession. They moved to South Africa for 4 years — and another daughter was born there. Then back to the UK and in 1973 to Sutton Courtenay. Faith was 42 when she arrived — with 4 girls of primary school age and this village became her home for fifty years. She found work at the school teaching the piano and sewing. She was humble about her piano skills. She only taught beginners — and always said that if

she ever had a pupil who showed real talent she would pass them on to a far better pianist than her.

Music was always important to her and she sang in both the church choir and with the All Saints' Singers — and also hired and organized all the members of the orchestra. I know she felt lucky that there was so much music in the village. Every August she went to the Edinburgh Festival - three concerts of chamber music and Schubert Lieder a day.

She cared for her husband until his death in 1995 and then rebuilt her life around her family and her many friends. Faith was a woman with a deep personal Christian faith—a loyal member of the Women's Christian Fellowship and keen attender of the monthly bible study group.

Faith was always unfailingly polite; quiet and unassuming, but she had a keen intellect, and enjoyed theological discussions. Indeed, it was her faith which gave meaning to her life and underpinned all that she did. She drew great strength from worshipping at All Saints' and receiving the sacrament. Even when dementia overtook her she was still able to sing every hymn and join in with all the words of the prayers. She greatly enjoyed attending the WeCare2 Group twice a month in the River Room – especially joining in with the singing. Even living with dementia, her faith seemed to help her live in the present moment; to accept that all would be well and to never lose her capacity to be thankful. She never stopped smiling. And, as her daughters said, she was always polite, always gracious. She was grateful for the care and support she received from her family and friends – and grateful that she was able to remain in her home in her final illness because of the loving care she received. She will be greatly missed by her family and her friends.

Her funeral was held in All Saints' Church on 24th May 2023 where tributes were given by her daughters, and an address by the Reverend Helen Kendrick, from which this is an edited extract.
