Thames Water - Drainage Plans for the Village

Thames Water have now progressed their studies on drainage for Sutton Courtenay taking into account the impact that the new housing developments have made. Representatives from Thames Water will give a presentation about their studies and the solutions they have in mind at 7.00 p.m. on Tuesday 7th May in the village hall. The presentation is open to the public, so please attend if you are interested in hearing the latest information.

<u>Local Council Elections - 2nd May, 2019</u> <u>New Parish Council is formed</u>

The term of office for the current Parish Council is coming to an end and a new Parish Council will be formed from the 4th day after the election to serve for the next 4 years. There are 11 seats on the Council and 4 local people have been nominated to fill the seats. As the election is uncontested, no formal ballot is needed. Currently your new Parish Councillors will be:

The following existing Parish Councillors: David Butler, Christopher Campbell, Karl Gebhart, David Hignell, Martin Howell, and Claire Myerson have decided not to stand as candidates for election, and they will therefore be standing down from the Council. The Council wishes to express its thanks to them all for their efforts on the Council and on behalf of the community over the last 4 years.

Vacancies on the Parish Council

As only 4 parishioners were nominated for 11 seats, there are 7 seats on the Council which remain to be filled. The Parish Council can proceed to co-opt others within a statutory The Parish Council maintains the cemetery, recreation ground, and village green, and is currently busy with the Didcot Garden Town and its transport suggestions, the Oxford Cambridge Expressway and supports the Steering Group undertaking a Neighbourhood Plan. It has a statutory right to be consulted on all planning applications in its area and its views are taken into account when the planning decision is made. It is often consulted on other local matters as well, having a representative on local committees such as WRG and RWEnPower at the Power Station. The Parish Council plays a vital part in representing the interests of the community which it serves and is an effective lobby group influencing the other decision makers. P19/V0420/HH Removal of existing conservatory and construction of single storey extension at 125 Drayton Road. The Council had no objections

P19/V0572/HH Single storey rear extension at Jasmine Cottage Abingdon Road. Council had concerns regarding flooding in that location, and the impact on nearby cottages, and possible loss of parking

P19/V0573/HH Single storey rear extension at Rosemary Cottage, Abingdon Road. Council had concerns regarding flooding in that location, and the impact on nearby cottages, and possible loss of parking

P19/V0539/HH Erection of two storey and single storey extensions to existing dwellinghouse and associated alterations including replacement of existing roof at 14 Abingdon Road. As the area was in a flood zone, the Council had concerns that construction could impede water flow, and the Environment Agency was not a consultee.

P19/V0702/LB Minor proposal to supplement existing listed building consents at Tudor House, 20-22 Church Street. Council had no objections

P19/V0580/HH and P19/V0581/LB Demolition of rear projection. Erection of new two and single storey extensions. Insertion of new window on west elevation. Removal of brick wall at Cross Trees, 1 Church Street. Council had no objections

P19/V0706/D Removal of section of off site discharge pipeline between Churchmere Road and Appleford Road.

From the Ministry Team... **CHRISTIAN AID WEEK** 12-18TH MAY 2019

I remember, as a child my Grandmother telling me

that "charity begins at home". I also remember thinking " so if it begins at home, where does it go to and where does it end?"

There are numerous charities, all having specific interests. You can probably think of a few straight away. You may regularly donate to a charity special to you. There are particular times and events when charities will want to highlight their work and fundraising. Every year in May the charity Christian Aid has one week where it aims to do just that. It is a charity that has seventy years of experience helping those at home, wherever that is, and overseas. Christian Aid campaign for change to tackle the root causes of poverty and challenge the systems that keep people poor. It works in thirty-seven countries with people of all faiths and none, to stand up for dignity, equality and justice. Christian Aid believes in life before death and are part of a global movement for change, particularly poverty, which also includes climate change.

There are many disaster appeals due to the effect of climate on people living in poverty. The most immediate disaster has been in south east Africa where two million people have been affected by Cyclone Idai. There are, at the same time Christian Aid appeals for those affected by the Tsunami in Indonesia, floods in Kerala, South Asia floods, affecting almost seventeen million people, not forgetting the Syria crisis.

Christian Aid week is an important and busy time to raise awareness and funding for the challenges of charity beginning at home and spreading out to reach our neighbours near and far. The motivation is of human nature, of wanting to help those less fortunate than ourselves, and it is also a Christian one, by following what Jesus taught and did.

REST IN PEACE

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following person who has died recently:

Mary Veronica Catherine Dalgleish who died on 10th March 2019 was born on 14th September 1945 and had lived in Sutton Courtenay for several years with her husband Paul before moving to Abingdon. Her funeral was held in All Saints' Church, Sutton Courtenay on Thursday 28th March 2019 and tributes were given by, and on behalf of, her brother Peter, her sister Ruth, sons Sasha and Nick and her granddaughter Olivia. This is an edited extract of the tribute given by her brother: Mary, known as Ethel to her family, was warm, generous and big-hearted, small in stature with a large personality. She was the second eldest of four siblings and she took her role as older sister very seriously and was fiercely loyal and supportive. Though she grew up in rural Lancashire, Mary never felt like a country girl and from her early teens had a romantic outlook, craving the glamourous life she read about in magazines, much to the dismay of our stern Grandmother who was rather Victorian in outlook and thought Mary should be meek and demure. Conforming and being seen and not heard was not for Mary; she was exuberant and talkative. After school she went to work in the rag trade, a profession that would influence her for the rest of her life; she was always immaculately turned out with not a hair out of place. Her romantic nature also extended to the books she read, being especially fond of historical novels; in particular the glamour and intrigue of the Tudors. Mary was always an avid reader and remained one throughout her life; in later years she would get through up to five books a week. Her love of literature, history and the arts was certainly a formative influence on me as she enthused about all the wonderful things that the world of culture could bring. To my young eyes it seemed that she occupied a world that was completely different to home; a

world of glamour, extravagant dinner parties, concerts and nightclubs. The premature death of her father had a profound effect on the family coinciding with the grown up siblings moving to different corners of the country. Mary met and married Paul and moved to the South. Mary was pivotal in keeping the family together and many wonderful weekends were spent at her beautiful home in Kingswood. Mary was a fantastic and enthusiastic host, her lavish dinner parties were legendary; she would be there at the centre of things, refreshing peoples glasses and keeping the conversation flowing. These occasions allowed her to flaunt her passion for cooking, possibly inspired by stories of the feasts of the Romanovs, with extravagant dishes like salmon mousse in aspic, which tasted just as good the next morning for a hungover breakfast. She became mother to Sacha and Nicolas - again a romantic connection from novels set in the Russian revolution. She committed to motherhood with the same passion she gave to everything in life, encouraging her boys through the usual ups and downs of childhood, with tenderness and love, as a result she raised two polite and kind young men. Mary was initially ambivalent about becoming a grandmother; not anything to do with children, but because she thought that being called granny would make her feel old. She got that wrong - when Olivia, Charlotte and Xander arrived she was utterly beguiled by their natural loveliness and would talk incessantly about them. Mary was always accompanied by a variety of tiny shivery yappy Yorkshire terriers with names that ended in 'y. Mary was always fantastic company, her energy and enthusiasm for any subject was admirable. She was a good listener and her advice was always heartfelt and based on observation and empathy. She was uplifting, life enhancing and had a real joie de vivre which never seemed to flag. This is how she will be remembered - as a person who lived life to the full and treasured her family and her friends.

Can the police be trusted?

A Didcot resident was the victim of a particularly convincing scam recently. Fraudsters had visited her, saying that the police were involved in a scam and that her help was needed with undercover work to identify corruption in the police and in banks. When the police called to

visit the woman, to tell her she was a victim, she wouldn't be persuaded and thought that the police officers concerned were involved in the scam. The police then resorted to posting plain-clothed officers outside the woman's house and they followed her to where she was meeting the person to hand over the money. It was only at that point that she began to realise she had been duped. The police will never ask a member of the public for this sort of assistance.

A local man was asked to buy £1,500 of gift vouchers from Argos and then read the voucher numbers over the phone to the fraudster, who said that they were invalid and suggested he try again with the same amount of Wilko vouchers. Once again the victim was told that the numbers he read out were invalid and that he should go to the bank and withdraw the cash. It was only when the alarm was raised by bank staff that the scam was picked up and, luckily, the victim did not lose his cash

Fraudsters usually target people who live alone. If you have friends, relatives or neighbours who are elderly or vulnerable they are amongst those most likely to be the targets of scams. Please tell them about the two described above and stress that they should never use an organisation's telephone number that's been provided to them by a caller at the door, during a phone call, in a letter or an e-mail. They should look up the number themselves and make the telephone call using a different phone from the one on which they received the call.

Finally, if you are the victim of a scam or know someone who is, please report it to the police. Don't be embarrassed. You'll be helping the police to prevent it happening to someone else.

Garden equipment and tool thefts

There have been thefts in both Sutton Courtenay and Drayton over the past few weeks and the numbers of shed and garage break-ins continue to be high. Padlocks and bolts can be cut through quickly and residents are urged not to keep valuable items in insecure sheds and garages. If you do store things in a shed consider using a shed alarm, motion sensor padlock and dusk-to-dawn lighting, which are all effective deterrents. Mark tools or equipment clearly, in large text, with your postcode using an indelible pen such as Cre-mark (available online). It will not only make items less attractive to thieves but it will also ensure that, should your property be recovered by the police they can quickly and easily identify the owner. You can download Thames Valley Police's FREE Home Security Guide https://www.thamesvalley.police.uk/SysSiteAssets/ media/downloads/thames-valley/advice/home-securityguide.pdf. If you don't have online access you might consider asking a friend, neighbour or family member to download and print the Guide for you.

Construction sites have also been targeted, with container locks being cut through and large sections of the sides of containers being cut out in order to remove the contents.

Some very good news—the Government have announced a £218million investment in roads and bridges for southern Oxfordshire. This is not only great news for South Oxfordshire and the

No changes will be made to the current PET-CT service at the Churchill while this process is ongoing.
