PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



Thames Water Sewerage Works

The Council are in correspondence with Thames Water regarding the proposed sewerage works which are due to

take place on both the High Street and Drayton Road. The High Street works are scheduled to begin on 28th February (weather dependent) and will take a period of approximately 8 weeks. The works will be traffic light controlled and one lane will be kept open at all times.

The Drayton Road works will not (and indeed are not allowed) to start until the High Street works are completed. Council have been given a provisional start date of 25th May 2020 but this may change dependent on weather and the High Street works being completed. Council have also had confirmation from Thames Water that appropriate signage confirming the village and businesses are open as usual have been requested and further signage can be added during the works if required. Thames Water should be writing to people affected by the works and are keen to ensure works cause as little disruption as possible. They have confirmed that access to Chapel Lane and Ginge Brook will be maintained for residents, along with properties in close proximity to the works. This phase of work is due to last for 10 weeks.

Annual Parish Meeting

Every year, a Parish meeting has to be held. This year's meeting will be on Tuesday 7th April 2020 at 7pm in the Village Hall on Frilsham Street. There will be a report from the Chairman of the Parish Council, presentation of the parish's accounts and the parish charities along with other items.

Neighbourhood Plan

A reminder that the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group will be presenting to the Parish Council prior to the March Parish Council Meeting. The Parish Council meeting will therefore start at the earlier time of $7.00 \mathrm{pm}$ on Tuesday 3^{rd} March in the Village Hall

Tree Planting

As mentioned in the last newsletter we should be receiving some trees from Councillor Webber to plant within Sutton Courtenay. We are awaiting confirmation as to the species, age and number of trees which we will be receiving but if anybody has any

suggestions as to where these could be planted to benefit the community, please do contact the clerk on the details at the foot of this update. Thank you to those people who have already responded. The suggestions will be considered once we have final details on the trees to be donated.

Planning Permissions

The following planning permissions have been considered:-

MW.0008/20 Section 73 application to continue the development of the extraction of sand and gravel and restoration using in situ and imported clay materials to create a wet woodland habitat as permitted by MW.0094/18 (P18/V2171/CM) without complying with condition 16, in order to remove the remaining stockpile of sand and gravel by road rather than conveyor. Bridge Farm Quarry Sutton Courtenay.

Comments: Council feels it has no choice but to support the application but would request a road sweep of the local roads on a daily basis

MW.0004/20 Section 73 application to continue the development permitted by planning permission no. P18/V2145/CM (MW.0093/18) for proposed new stockpile area to be used in conjunction with mineral extraction permitted by planning permission no. P16/V2694/CM (MW.0127/16) for the storage of approximately one month supply of mineral to enable continuous supply in case of flooding for a period of up to three years from date of commencement of extraction under planning permission no. P16/V2694/CM (MW.0127/16) to enable vehicles to transport remaining sand and gravel from the stockpile to the plant site Bridge Farm Quarry, Sutton Courtenay, Abingdon, OX14 4PP

Comments: Council feels that it has no choice but to support the application but would request a road sweep of the local roads on a daily basis

P20/V0175/HH – New House extension including detached garage at 10A Katchside Sutton Courtenay

Comments: Council has no objection but would request that the a condition be inserted that the garage may not be used for residential purposes and that the District Council is consistent with regards to the County Council current views in relation to increase of traffic through the area.

Road/Footpath Closures

The following road/footpath closures are in place/will be taking place in the local area:-

From 1st February 2020 - Drayton: Bridleway 373/18 Lambrick Way southwards to Quarry Entrance and Quarry access road to Drayton Road (Peep-O-Day Lane). The closure is due to bridleway improvement works which are expected to be completed on 17th April 2020. Exemptions are included for emergency services and for the works and for pedestrian access to premises which are only accessible from the closed section of bridleway. The alternative off-road route for those affected by the closure will be locally signed via paths 373/15 southwards to 373/26, west on 192/1, north on 192/21 & 192/9, northeast on 192/16 & 192/8, east to Peep-O-Day Lane, and vice versa.

 22^{nd} March & 23^{rd} March 2020 — Appleford: road from Main Road to Hill farm over Appleford Level Crossing to allow railway level crossing works to be carried out. The closure will operate overnight from $11.30 \, \text{pm}$ to $4.30 \, \text{am}$.

Access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles and for those frontages within the closure area, subject to the progress of the works and liaison with the works supervisor.

Amazon Prime scam calls

In the three months between October 2019 and January 2020 over £1 million was stolen from victims as a result of this scam. One person alone lost over £65,000.

- Victims receive an automated call saying they have been charged for an Amazon Prime subscription and are prompted to 'press 1' on their phone keypad to cancel the subscription.
- Once they've done so they're directed to a fraudster posing as an Amazon customer service representative, who says that the subscription was purchased fraudulently and that remote access is needed to the victim's computer in order to fix a security flaw, and to prevent it from recurring.
- They're asked to download a remote access application, often the 'Team Viewer' app, which grants the fraudster access to the victim's computer.
- The Team Viewer software is then mis-used by the criminal to monitor the victim logging into their online bank account, thus providing their personal and financial details.
- There are other variants of this crime, one being where the fraudster tells the victim that they're eligible for a refund on an unauthorised transaction on their Amazon account
- * Always question uninvited calls, texts or e-mails. Contact the company directly using a known phone number or email address.
- * Have the confidence to refuse requests for financial or personal information. It's easy to get embarrassed or flustered, but it's fine to stop the discussion if you don't feel in control.
- * Never install any software or visit a website as the result of a cold call.

Fake PayPal e-mails

Between October and December 2019 Action Fraud received over three thousand reports about these fake e-mails. Victims reported losing a total of £1,121,446 during this period. Those targeted included people selling electronics, vehicles, phones and household furniture via online marketplaces.

- Fraudsters send the victim an e-mail, purporting to be from PayPal, in an attempt to trick them into believing they have received payment for an item. The fraudster then sends a follow-up e-mail requesting a tracking number in the hope that the victim will be rushed into shipping the item before they've had a chance to verify the payment.
- * Log into PayPal and check for any new activity rather than acting on the e-mail or clicking any links. PayPal will e-mail or notify you in the app if you've received any payments.
- * Check the basics by looking out for misspellings and grammatical errors.
- * Phishing scams often mimic the look and feel of PayPal emails and request sensitive information, which is something a genuine PayPal e-mail would never do.

- * Avoid clicking on links or downloading attachments. Hover over the link to see if it looks genuine.
- * Consider using a protected payment method, such as PayPal, for online purchases. PayPal can reimburse you if your purchase doesn't arrive or match the product description.
- * Use common sense and steer clear of anything that seems to good to be true!
- * If you think you've received a phishing e-mail you can forward it to *spoof@paypal.com* without changing the subject line. PayPal will let you know if it's fraudulent.

These two scams are very common at present but there are many others circulating such as those purporting to be from HMRC and TV Licensing, for example. Please remember that you shouldn't give any personal or financial information to cold callers, either in person or remotely, no matter who they claim to be or however convincing they are.

Traffic calming on Drayton Road

If we are to have a new "build-out" on Drayton Road, can it please be better designed than the one on Milton Road, especially with cyclists in mind? I cycle through the Milton Road build-out several times a week. It is deficient in the following respects:

- No cut-through for cyclists entering the village, meaning that one has to vie with impatient motorists when giving way to on-coming traffic
- Poor signage: currently it says "Give way to oncoming vehicles"; clearly many motorists do not consider cyclists as vehicles and refuse to give way
- When this does happen, there is no drop-curb, so it is impossible for a cyclist to escape an on-coming car that ignores the cyclist's right-of-way

Finally, a new build-out on Drayton Road needs to be carefully integrated with the existing cycle path, both in positioning and signage. It would also encourage more cyclists to use the cycle path if the road surface at the entry/exit point could be improved.

"THE BLAME GAME"

When things go wrong, it seems there is always someone to blame. "Heads must roll!" or, more recently, "Deputy Heads must roll". It seems that if heads of some sort don't roll, we are never satisfied. In politics, at all levels, it seems that this rule is even more fiercely applied than elsewhere. If the social worker did not pick up on someone in trouble, or the train doesn't run to time, or the bus doesn't turn up, or the pothole hasn't been filled, or the streetlamp has been off for months, or my neighbor is annoying me, *someone* is always answerable. Whilst it may be true that everything that goes wrong is always at least one person's fault, society often seems to want to spend more time and energy discovering who is to blame than it does in trying to ensure that the same mistake doesn't happen again.

I wonder how many well-meaning, hard-working people have suffered as a result. I am not talking about scapegoating here — that is unforgivable — I am talking about people who may well have got things wrong, but who are then asked to pay a far too heavy price as a result of society's attitude to blame.

So, why am I writing this? As a District and County Councillor, I am often painfully aware of how blame can be shunted around because no-one is prepared to risk being blamed.

"That's not my job, it's his/hers."

"That's not my department, it's theirs. "

"That's not my Council's responsibility, it's the other's."

"I never received the email."

"Government won't give us the money to do it, or to do it better."

I receive more than a dozen or so emails a day requiring me to act. Here is how I apportion blame:

As far as possible, I try to act quickly (Not always successful – my fault)

I nearly (my fault) always manage to pass on to a relevant officer or council department the concerns expressed in the email. Quite often, I have to follow up with a further request (their fault) to get anything done. Sometimes, in the eyes of the email writer, I am wholly responsible for the issue (not fair, their fault). Sometimes things slip through the net because I thought the problem was resolved (my fault) or because someone at a Council has let it slip (their fault) or nothing can be done (government's fault or everyone's fault).

I am sure you get where I am going with this. In the end, the only thing that really matters is that the problem is solved and, if it can't be, it is passed on or up to someone else who may be able to solve it.

It seems that "pinning blame" on someone has become an objective above all else and this does not necessarily create an atmosphere where individuals work best, where councils and councillors work best and where society works best. Blame properly and fairly applied should improve things. It should always be tempered with patience and understanding that people make mistakes and, in most cases, they are the people most likely to avoid the same mistakes in future.

SUTTON COURTENAY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN



Update from the Sutton C o u r t e n a y Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group

The Steering Group is pleased to report that we have made a very positive start to 2020.

The Parish Council has successfully secured a grant of just under £9000. The grant must be spent by 31st March and it will cover the costs of employing two firms of consultants with good relevant track records. One firm was successful in securing a green buffer between East Hagbourne and Didcot in the East Hagbourne Neighbourhood Plan and has also undertaken assessments for the Didcot Garden Town Plan; the other firm is experienced in working with the VWHDC particularly on neighbourhood plans and policies.

Specifically, packages of work are:

- 1. To assess and build the evidence base for the importance of the:
 - open spaces and landscaping within village
 - key views and landscape character that form an integral part of the village setting
- 1. To produce a layered, digitally superimpose-able visual representation of all the designations of spaces to facilitate clarity of presentation
- 2. To refine the draft policies and produce the supporting text justifying the polices and linking to the evidence base (the assessments).

We have received a very positive response from the Neighbourhood Plan Officer at VWHDC in respect of the work we have undertaken to date.

There are still gaps in our assessments. For example, we need to

- Map the biodiversity in our village
- Build the evidence base for flood-prone areas of the village

Biodiversity data is available from Thames Valley Environmental Records Centre (TVERC) and the Environment Agency has flood maps. However, to make the evidence base robust so that the policies on biodiversity and flooding stand up to scrutiny by the inspector we need as much anecdotal evidence as we can gather. To this end, we are looking

- To gather local sightings in wildlife and species or plants
- To gather residents' anecdotal and historical evidence of surface water; groundwater and /or sewer flood risk incidents

If anyone has evidence (photographs (date stamped), notes, records) that they are able to share please contact the Steering Group. Additionally, it would be much appreciated if residents could log significant species or plants. This information could be loaded up onto iSpot where you are able to post a photo, state the location & identify the wildlife (https://www.ispotnature.org/communities/uk-and-ireland/observations).

If you have time to spare, please do join the Steering Group to help gather and collate the evidence. Steering Group meetings are open to the public and everyone is encouraged to attend. We are making a presentation to the Parish Council on Tuesday 3 March at 7pm. Should anyone wish to learn more please feel free to attend this event as well.

Church of England launches energy rating tool for churches - as Synod considers new 'net zero'

The Church of England is launching an energy rating system similar to those used for household appliances. The aim is to help monitor the carbon footprint of its almost 40,000 buildings, as General Synod has recently voted on a major new proposal to reach 'net zero' CO2 emissions.

The hope is for all parts of the Church of England, from parishes to national bodies, to aim for ambitious year-on-year reductions in emissions to reach 'net zero' by 2045 at the latest.

In a first step, parishes are being offered a new rating tool, which calculates their energy consumption. It will take into account factors including the type of power they use, whether they are on 'green' tariffs, the size of the building and usage.

The Bishop of Salisbury, Nicholas Holtam, the Church of England's lead bishop for Environmental Affairs, said: "The Church of England has buildings in every architectural style and material from the past 1,500 years, posing some unique challenges when it comes to energy efficiency.

"However, churches are not museums; they are living buildings which serve their communities every day of the week, and being greener isn't about doing less, it's about equipping parishes to get smarter about energy consumption.

"Christians are called to safeguard God's creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth. Faced with the reality of catastrophic climate change, which will affect the world's most vulnerable people the soonest, radical and immediate action is our only option."

A paper sent to Synod members before February's General Synod also outlined the potential impacts of climate change directly affecting the Church. It warned parishes that, as impacts start to accelerate, more churches will need to be prepared to be play missional roles in their communities, including offering sanctuary in extreme weather events, as was seen at the church of St Cuthbert, Fishlake, following flooding of the River Don last year.

The DAMASCUS PCC is committed to running energy audits on all our churches and looking for ways to develop as 'Ecochurches'. Watch this space!



The Abbey's second in a series of six Log Fire Evenings exploring aspects of global transformation through personal transformation.

Viktor Klemperer's Lingua Tertii Imperii (Language of the Third Reich) was published 73 years ago. Klemperer's analysis of language as a tool for social transformation is uniquely relevant in the present. Klemperer's notes, which he compiled between 1933 and 1945, are possibly the most important record we have of how language shapes and consolidates ideologies and worldviews, and more importantly, how language is weaponized to bring about social transformation. 75 years after the end of the Holocaust, Klemperer's linguistic and social study of language seems to become more important by the day. Viktor Klemperer was a German-Jewish linguistic scholar and diarist, and survivor of Nazi persecution and the horrors of the Second World War including the bombing of his native Dresden.

Johannes Frank is a Berlin-based author, publisher and manager of the Jewish scholarship fund ELES.
