PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

All Saints Lane - willow trees rear of Church

The Council would advise residents that 2 of the willow trees at the rear of the Church in All Saints Lane, are diseased and have died. A tree surgeon will be removing these early December.

School Admissions – Entry to primary or infant school September 2018

If you are a parent or carer of a child 3 or 4 years old then you need to apply for a primary school place now. This is for children born between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014. You still have to apply even if your child already attends a nursery attached to the school. For further information and to apply online go to www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/admissions The closing date for applications is 15th January, 2018. If you do not have internet access, then you can access the internet at many of the County Council's libraries, and children's centres.

Council budget 2018/19

The Parish Council is holding its budget meeting on12th December to discuss its budget for the next financial year. It will be considering its current monetary position, looking at future expenses, and planning the future financial requirements over the next 12 months. The requirements next year will not only be the usual expenditure costs for the Council, but for the Public Inquiry and representing the parish in regards to the 2 planning appeals. One the budget has been set, the parish council tax figure for next year can be agreed.

Planning Application – appeal sites Hobbyhorse Lane and Harwell Road

The appeals will be heard at a Public Inquiry commencing on Tuesday 23rd January and lasting about a fortnight. At the time of writing, the location of the Inquiry still had to be agreed, but it will be located as close as possible to the The Inquiry process is progressing with community. Statements of Common Ground i.e. statements which contain agreed factual information about the applications. These are being prepared and agreed between the District Council and the applicants. In addition written statements as to what witnesses will say during the Inquiry are being prepared, and will be sent to the Planning Inspectorate the week before Christmas. Sometimes with a lengthy Inquiry, a pre-meeting is required, and we wait to hear if this is the case with the Sutton Courtenay Inquiry. The Council has a planning consultant working for it at the moment, but has decided to



engage a barrister should one be required.

Parking – General Problems

The Council, once again, brings parking problems to your attention. Areas of particular concern are close to the school, the High Street and the Village Green. The Council would ask, so that there is improved safety for everyone using the roads and pavements, that the roads are kept free from obstruction so that the traffic can be kept moving. Access to properties has been restricted and event prevented, in the past, owing to inconsiderate parking. Please do not let it be you who is responsible. Roadworks are scheduled for the Appleford Road area whilst pipes are laid to the new Persimmon development. Residents, in the past, have had to wait for ever to get out of their driveways. Please be considerate where you park your vehicle and where you stop your vehicle and allow those leaving driveways to join the queue of traffic.

Dog Fouling

Councils are obliged to keep public areas such as recreation spaces and play area free from dog fouling. In the interests of health and hygiene, the Council would encourage you to please keep away from the recreation ground and open spaces, and use the designated dog walkers path created at the Southern end of the recreation ground.

Casual Vacancy on the Council

The Parish Council was pleased, at the last meeting, to be able to co-opt Dr. Jennifer Corrigan to join the Council.

Jennifer has lived in the village for well over 20 years, and currently works as a freelance medical writer. The Council welcomes Jennifer to her new role, and looks forward to working with her on the many issues the village faces.

The following planning applications have been considered :

P17/V2698/FUL Erection of new house at 90 Bradstocks Way. The Council has some concerns regarding possible overlooking

P17/V2324/FU Variation of conditions, 2,4,7,11 and 15 of P14/V2362/FUL The Council had no overall objections to the amendments, but was aware of residents' concerns regarding the change in road/driveway materials.

P17/V2783/LB Creation of a small area of stud wall to provide lobby to office at The Abbey. The Council had no objections.

P17/V2860/FUL Variation of condition to omit bonnet dormers and raise ridge height, at 90a Milton Road. The Council had no objection.

P17/V2490/LDO Local Development Order for Didcot Technology Park. The Council had concerns with the draft Local Development Order in that it contradicted the Didcot Garden Town proposal and the saved policies of the Local Plan. There was no prevention of coalescence between Appleford and Dicot.

P17/V1963/O Outline application for up to 200 dwellings and associated works (amended plans Water vole survey).

Vegetation was cut back in September, so it was unlikely water voles would be seen. There are known water voles at the adjacent Catholic Church site a few metres away, and the Council was concerned regarding the loss of habitat for future voles, and the destruction of the habitat which reduced biodiversity.

Meanwhile, Mr Greenough and the Friends Of Sutton Courtenay School are working together to plan the garden ready for spring. He will start work on the raised beds this week, and FOSCS are busy working on all the fundraising events that will be needed to make a fabulous garden appear. We will all need to work together more than ever this year to make this happen. Our children really deserve great grounds to learn in-our school is about so much more than classrooms.

A Busy November

As usual, the school laid a wreath this year at All Saints' Church for Remembrance Sunday. A group of children also stood up to say the poem 'We Shall Keep The Faith' by Moina Michael. They spoke with great confidence, and we were particularly proud of our youngest speaker who was only 6 years old. It was lovely to see so many children at the church representing various different groups in the village.

Once again we joined in with raising money for Children In Need on Friday 17th November. Children were invited to wear spots in exchange for a £1 donation. REST IN PEACE

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following:

WAYNE ALLAN VAUGHAN-JONES who has died aged 52 on 19th October 2017 was born on 24th May 1965 in Sherborne in Dorset and brought up by his Mum, Ronnie, and step-father Tony, along with his two sisters, Sophie and Janice and brother David. Wayne enjoyed his early years in the countryside and had a particularly close relationship with his Grandfather - Grampy Jess - who was a gamekeeper and who took Wayne out with him to look after the pheasants and tend to the sheep. Wayne grew very tall, very quickly, and Ronnie was always teased that she must have stood him in a bucket of manure! Although Wayne didn't particularly enjoy school he was always very creative and skilled with his hands and he loved art - something which his daughter Willow seems to have inherited from him. He liked all sorts of music - from heavy metal to the classics - but not opera. He spent some time as a Goth and at one time he even sported black hair with pink ends! He loved reading sci-fi and particularly enjoyed immersing himself in the disc world of Terry Pratchett. He was also interested in astronomy and never lost his love of the outdoors. As Wayne grew up the family travelled around the country a great deal because Tony served in the Army - they lived, amongst other places, in Surrey, Germany, Blackpool and Wales and 25 years ago came to Didcot. On leaving school Wayne had a variety of jobs from working at a garden centre and driving tractors and driving for Somerfields. He was always a good worker and he got on well with all his work colleagues in whatever job he did. He enjoyed meeting all the clients who came into the shop and he was well known and popular with many people. One of the great loves of his

earlier life was the Ford Capri. He helped to build the engine of the last Capri he owned – and it is that car which has led the cavalcade of cars at his funeral. Wayne never met anyone to fill his life until he met Emma at work. They were each other's soul mates and absolutely adored one another. I remember him telling me, at the time of Emma's death, that the years in which he knew Emma were the best of his life. They were married on 23rd April 2010, at Laines Barn, and went onto have their beloved Willow who, as Ronnie said, was the princess in their lives. Tragically Emma died suddenly just a year ago. But the family rallied around and did all they could to support Wayne and Willow. Wayne spent the last few days of his life at Sobell House Hospice where he was so well looked after. Willow loved her Daddy and he was the most amazing father and Wayne wanted Willow to have the best childhood he could give her so that she would grow up knowing that she was loved. I think he achieved that, with the support of his family and friends. Wayne was a good man hardworking, very kind, caring and gentle. He was a caring brother; a supportive friend; a fun uncle to his nephews and niece; a loyal son; an adoring husband; and a devoted father. He will be greatly missed. His funeral was held in All Saints' Church on 10th November 2017.

This is an edited extract of the address given at his funeral by the Reverend Helen Kendrick.

Credit and debit Card Defender sleeves

Most new debit and card cards have a wireless symbol, which indicates that the card uses Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology. This allows you to simply tap your card on a card-reader and make a payment of up to £30.

Such cards come with security risks, as criminals can create an RFID reader with minimal effort, and steal your details. They can also download an app onto their Smartphones to achieve the same results. They need only to brush past your pocket or bag with their device to do this. You may well not even notice it happening.

Thames Valley Neighbourhood Watch Association (TVNHWA) is able to offer a very competitively priced solution with the Card Defender, which is a sleeve-style card holder that provides RFID blocking technology, thus protecting contactless cards from being read. A similar device was demonstrated on an edition of BBT TV's 'Rip Off Britain' earlier this year. TVNHWA recommends that everyone carrying contactless cards should have one or more Card Defenders. This also applies to Student ID and Oyster cards.

We have very little time left to find a suitable standard Bearer before our application to participate in the event has to be confirmed and paid for.



In October, I spoke in Parliament alongside my fellow Oxfordshire MPs about the future of healthcare in the county. Wantage Hospital is currently in a state of limbo - Oxford Health announced in April 2016 that they would be

closing the hospital due to concerns over legionella in the old pipe system. This decision is subject to a consultation by Oxfordshire CCG - a consultation which was previously promised in October 2016. Phase one of the consultation did not take place until January 2017, three months after the full consultation was promised. As Wantage is a community hospital it is not covered by this phase. Phase 2 of the consultation has yet to take place, and no date has been announced for when it will begin. This leaves the hospital effectively closed with no end in sight.

After an online petition was signed by almost 4,000 people it was agreed to keep the hospital's physiotherapy and maternity services open. However, Oxfordshire CCG re-tendered the hospital's physiotherapy services and the contract passed to HealthShare. The company has since had to close all physiotherapy services provided in Wantage, leaving the hospital with just limited maternity care. Whilst we all recognise the pressures on local health authorities, it is clear that the entire consultation process by Oxfordshire CCG has been completely unacceptable. We must have an open and transparent conversation about the services needed in our towns and communities and this should include full public and stakeholder engagement at every stage.

Also in October, the Communities Secretary Sajid Javid announced £2.5 million allocation funding for 9 garden towns across England. After a successful bid, I am delighted an additional £295,000 of capacity funding has been allocated to support the delivery of Didcot Garden Town in 2017/18. This

additional funding is specifically for ongoing work on placemaking, community engagement and the development of an arts and culture strategy. The Government recognises the important contribution the project will have on its central ambition of delivering more homes and I am pleased by the support for Didcot's ambitious, community-led plans for growth.

It is also worth noting that Public Health England and NHS England have now launched their Stay Well This Winter campaign, which helps the most vulnerable people prepare for winter and avoid having to visit hospital due to common winter illnesses. If you're in one of the groups who are particularly susceptible - such as pensioners and pregnant women - or the parent of a young child, go and speak to your GP or pharmacist as soon as possible to give yourself the best chance of avoiding flu this year. More people than ever before are eligible for that free vaccination this year, including more young children and everyone who works in care homes. To check if you or your loved ones are eligible, and for other tips on staying well this winter, head to: www.nhs.uk/staywell

AIR QUALITY

No more talk and much more management please

For many years, concerns over Air Quality were confined to our largest cities. The Clean Air Acts of the 1950s solved (or at least reduced) the scale of the problem in those cities. As the impact of more and more cars and HGVs on our Air Quality began to be felt, concern spread way beyond the traditional centres of industrial smog. Not only does the centre of Oxford (one of the nation's smaller cities) now have a generally accepted problem of poor air quality, the problems are being felt in towns and villages all across the County. In our immediate area alone, Botley, Abingdon and Marcham have "Air Quality Management Areas (where NOX gas levels breach European safety limits). Several other areas are likely to join them in the next few years. There is a growing awareness from Government at all levels that economic growth must take some account of Air Quality. There is plenty of talk about electric cars, even electric HGVs, clean Air Zones, better bus services and cycle lanes. There is also talk of just how many people's lives are being cut short by poor air quality.

The trouble is, it is just talk! Everyone knows something needs to be done. No-one seems quite sure how to set about it. Meanwhile, we build more and more houses, our roads become more and more congested and our health becomes more and more affected. At this November's Full Council Meeting a motion was passed unanimously calling for urgent action. A Group of Councillors and officers from all Councils (District, City and County) is to be set up to come up with practical solutions to the County's Air Quality issues and instigate them as a matter of urgency. There will be some tough decisions to take including limits to which routes vehicles can take through the County – clean Air Zones, HGV diversions, the refusal of planning developments where air quality solutions cannot be found and an end to the argument that a little more housing wont make much difference.

Above all, it will involve an end to the years of talking about the problem and an end to the trend of different groups (including politicians) attempting to make the Air Quality their own. The problem belongs to all of us – the environmentalists who truly care, the District Councils who are responsible for measuring Air Quality, the County Council which is responsible for traffic management and all levels of Government responsible for planning.
