### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

### Annual Meeting of the Parish Council

The annual meeting of the Council took place on 2<sup>nd</sup> May. CIIr. Michael Jenkins has been elected Chairman for the forthcoming year, with CIIr. Christopher Campbell as Vice-Chairman. The Council has representatives on the WRG Landfill site committee, RWE Power Station, Culham site, Harwell Site and MEPC. If anyone has issues or questions relating to these sites, then please contact the Clerk who can pass on the information to the relevant person.

### Virgin Media – Road Closures

Unfortunately at the last minute, the road closures planned for May to allow for the installation of virgin media cables were postponed. The Parish Council will let residents know when the revised closures will take place, once the dates are known.

### Vale of White Horse D C – Parish Partner Programme

Sutton Courtenay is one parish in the Vale of White Horse area where a Parish Partner Programme with the District Council is commencing. Sutton Courtenay Parish Council along with Faringdon Town Council is trialing training sessions in planning issues such as how the District Council operates in regards to planning, the changes and challenges it is facing, and the development management process. The Parish Council has **appointed Cllr. Hignell to be the parish's contact in regards to** planning issues and, at the time of writing, he will be attending a meeting at the end of May to hear more about and take part in the trial. The District Council will be rolling out its planning training programme to other parish and town councils later in the year.

### Churchmere Road – Give Way lines

The repainting of give way lines at the junction of Churchmere Road and the village green is long overdue, and the Parish Council has asked the County Council when this will be done as it had previously indicated the work should be completed within the 2016/17 year. The Council would ask motorists that use this area to be vigilant and pause as they emerge from Churchmere Road. Not only are the white lines missing, but cars are being parked at the junction, possibly closer to the street light for security reasons, which adds to the problems in this area, as other motorists seeing parked cars are less aware of **the junction's location**.

### Overgrown Footpaths

It is that time of year again when we experience either warm or wet weather and the grass and tree growth is exceptional. There are some paths in the village which are impassable. The Parish Council would kindly remind landowners adjacent to footpaths that it is their responsibility to keep anything overhanging trimmed back to the boundary to allow people to get through. The Council is receiving reports of obstructions to paths, so would occupiers of properties please cut back their overhanging hedges.

### Steventon Rail bridge

The Parish Council has been notified that a planning application has been lodged by Network Rail to demolish the Grade II



listed rail bridge in Steventon in connection with the electricification of the Great Western Line. This will obviously have an impact on Steventon High Street and access to the Milton Interchange for some considerable time. ### <u>Closure of Clifton Hampden bridge for one day on</u> <u>12<sup>th</sup> June</u>

Please note that Clifton Hampden bridge will be closed on 12<sup>th</sup> June owing to cabling works taking place. Access will be maintained for emergency service vehicles. The alternate route suggested by the County Council is the A415, Tollgate Road, Sutton bridge and Appleford Road.

### The following planning applications have been considered :

MW.0005/17 Demolition of asphalt plant and construction and operation of replacement asphalt plant with ancillary plant and machinery, a new weighbridge and portable office at Appleford Sidings, Appleford Road. Council re-considered the application and the placing of a condition tying the end date of the asphalt plant to the end date for the rail sidings rather than the end date of the whole site. It however, maintained its original view that the asphalt plant should cease when the use of the site came to an end, in order to prevent other uses from developing.

P17/V1023/FUL change of use of storage barn to 2 bedroom residential accommodation at The Barn, Church Street. The Council objected owing to lack of vision emerging into Church Street, unsatisfactory parking the possibility of overlooking and lack of identifiable amenity space.

P17V0814/HH and P17/V0815/LB Repairs at 22 Church Street. The Council had no objections

### A New Reading Scheme for Everyone

Reading is a vital foundation for all educational achievement. If a child cannot read fluently, they will struggle in all their subjects in school. Good reading does not just mean being able to work out the words on the page. It means being able to understand those words, talk about the ideas in them, and be able to approach a wide range of text types confidently. Nowadays, with so many distractions, it can be harder than ever to encourage children to spend time and effort practicing their reading. Yet research shows children who read at home for just 10 minutes a day are much more likely to reach the expected level. We all want our children to do the very best they can and eventually leave school well qualified to make choices for their whole lives.

Staff in our school have been working incredibly hard to set up a new reading scheme, coming in during the holidays and returning to school in the evenings to sort the books. The Friends of Sutton Courtenay School (FOSCS) have raised money to improve the shelving in our Library area. We have invested lots of money in new books and have also included many of our old favourites and children's classics. EVERY child will be involved, from the youngest to the oldest. The scheme consists of 20 levels, each divided into 5 boxes. In each box there are 10-15 books to read – that's a lot of books! The boxes build up progressively in difficulty and contain a range of text types, so there is always challenge.

We are all very excited about launching the scheme last month!

### **Times Tables Challenges**

Last Term, all children in Key Stage 2 began a times tables challenge. Each day the children have a quiz against the clock, answering as many multiplication questions as they can in 3 minutes. It is a fast paced and fun session, and the children enjoy collecting awards along the way. I have given out certificates in assemblies to some children who had reached level 10, answering 50 questions with 100% accuracy in the time! With a bit of practice, everyone can improve their scores and work their way up through the levels, so everyone gets a chance to celebrate their own successes.

From the Ministry Team

'The words 'God is love' have no real meaning unless God contains at least two Persons. Love is something that one person has for another person. If God was a single person, then

before the world was made, He was not love.' (CS Lewis).

Trinity Sunday takes place this month (11th June) and it is often said that it is the one Sunday in the year on which preachers really dread having to speak! The idea of One God in three Persons is not easy to get our heads around or to explain. CS Lewis was right in saying that we have to understand the doctrine in relational terms. So why is the Trinity so important for us as Christians?

First, the Trinity provides us with a model of community. God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit relate to one another in love

and work together to accomplish God's purpose in the world. At His baptism, Jesus the Son is obedient to His Father's purpose, who declares His approval and the Spirit anoints Jesus for ministry.

Secondly, we find our mission in the Trinity. As the Father sent His Son into the world, so Jesus sends us out, as the church, to do the Father's work, equipped by the Spirit of God.

All three persons of the Godhead are at work in our lives and church, as well as in the world around. If we live with a renewed awareness of the Trinity, our spiritual lives will take on a new vitality and urgency.

At the request of the parishes concerned, these proposals allow for the three benefices in the existing group ministry (The DAMASCUS Group) to become a single parish benefice (The DAMASCUS Parish). This will allow the new benefice and parish to use the gifts and skills of clergy and lay people more effectively for the growing mission and ministry of the parish; to simplify administration and structures; to share resources and costs more efficiently and to support and encourage one another.

### <u>Crime figures for South Oxfordshire and Vale of the</u> <u>White Horse</u>

Thames Valley Police has released crime statistics which cover the past twelve months. The latest figures show that there were 138,710 crimes reported across Oxfordshire, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire from 1 April 2016 until 31 March 2017. This is a 7.2% increase to the previous year (2015/16) where there were 129,449 reported crimes within the same time frame. Of these 9,895 crimes were reported in South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse Local Police Area (LPA), a rise of 4.0% on last year.

The increase in crime reports is reflected nationally (see ONS Crime Survey of England and Wales https://www.ons.gov.uk/peoplepopulationandcommunity/

*crimeandjustice/bulletins/crimeinenglandandwales/ yearendingdec2016*), and is largely attributed to improvements in compliance with National Crime Recording Standards, following recommendations made by HMIC in 2014.

Overall crime levels in Thames Valley still remain low compared with five and ten years ago. There were 66,976 fewer crimes recorded in this timeframe compared with five years ago (205,686), and 8,357 fewer recorded offences compared with ten years ago (147,067).

Following the release of the figures, Superintendent Rory Freeman, LPA Commander for South and Vale said: "Whilst we have seen some increase in reports of crime this year, this is similar to the national trend.

"Despite this, South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse continues to be a very safe place to live and work. The future is challenging and our priority is constantly trying to match the right resources to our areas of greatest harm and demand whilst seeking to maintain and enhance public confidence in policing.

"Our officers work hard with communities to prevent crime and we are encouraging people to take simple steps that will protect them, their property and businesses. Campaigns such as #Protectyourworld in the Autumn and our February rural crime campaign are good examples of how we have raised awareness and confidence in our communities to report incidents to us.

"I would like to take this opportunity to thank my staff and our partner agencies for their hard work over the last year and most importantly extend my gratitude to our communities for their continued support."
