PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

CIIr. S. Noys - resignation

Councillor Stephen Noys has resigned from the Parish Council and a casual vacancy has been declared. The Council would thank Stephen for his efforts on behalf of the parish during his time on the Council. He represented the Council at meetings at both the landfill site and MEPC. Anyone interested in being considered for the vacancy, then he/she is invited to contact the Parish Clerk for further information about the role. The co-option of the new member is likely to take place at the September Council meeting.

Overgrown Footpaths

Although there was a plea in last month's issue for residents who have hedges next to pavements and footpaths to ensure that they are cut back so that there is no obstruction, the Parish Council has received reports that some footpaths are impassable. Often branches can overhang at eye level making it difficult to walk the paths easily. Would residents please check to see whether any of your hedging is causing a problem for pedestrians, and if so, please trim it back.

Water Extraction from Hydrants

Oxfordshire County Council has been taking water from hydrants in order to flush through surface water drainage. The tankers continuously parked in the same locations have caused difficulties for residents. The Council has approached the County Council to request that a better solution be found to the problem, and has requested that they alternate the sources from where they take the water.

Didcot Garden Town Delivery Plan

Consultation has commenced on the Didcot Garden Town Delivery Plan. This is being undertaken by M-E-L Research, an independent market research company on behalf of the Vale of White Horse District Council. To view the Delivery Plan and to take part in the consultation go to www.didcotgardentown.co.uk. Anyone commenting is strongly advised to read the proposed plan before making comments. Responses to the consultation can be submitted and received until midnight 31 July 2017. All comments are being handled anonymously unless submitted on behalf of groups or organisations. For those not wishing to view the Delivery Plan on line, hard copies are available for viewing at:

South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Council's offices at 135 Eastern Avenue, Milton Park, Didcot Civic Hall, Didcot Library, Cornerstone Arts Centre, The Wave, Didcot, and the former offices of the Vale of White Horse District Council Abbey House, Abingdon. The Parish Council too has been sent a copy.

Recreation Ground – Dog Fouling

Unfortunately dog fouling on the recreation ground has been reported. Please note that there are health hazards associated with dog faeces, as well as it being very unpleasant to find in areas where children and young people play or organized sports take place. The Council appeals to dog walkers to be particularly vigilant and to clean up after their dog. *Chapel Lane to High Street – footpath barrier*

The barrier at the High Street end of the footpath leading to



Chapel Lane is broken. This has been reported to the County Council.

The following planning applications have been considered :

P17/V0764/HH Extension at the Manor House, Church Street (amended plans). Council had no objection

P17/V1326/FUL Change of use D2 to D1 to enable a local charity to operate a day service for people with learning disabilities, at unit 2c Trident Business Park. Council had no objection

P17/V1110/DIS Discharge of conditions 2 and 6 relating to surface water drainage and management plan for future maintenance at Eastwest, All Saints Lane. Council supported local residents in that what was proposed did not seem to solve the problems caused.

P17/V1339/LDE Application to legalise structure that had been in used for more than 10 years as a separate residential unit at 6 Abingdon Road. Council required evidence of long term use.

P17/V1303/FUL Erection of detached house at 90 Bradstocks Way. Council objected as it represented overdevelopment of the plot, overlooked neighbouring properties, parking without any drainage provision was proposed.

<u>Planning Decisions</u> - A new salt barn for the storage of salt for use on the roads in Winter has been approved for the

County Council's highways depot at the Western side of the parish, and a new weighbridge at the landfill site too has been given permission as well as slightly extended off loading hours for the rail sidings.

Following on from this, our Year 5 and 6 children are putting on an end of term production of 'The Jungle Book'. They are already beginning rehearsals and learning the songs. Why not come along? There is a special community performance with refreshments on the afternoon of Tuesday 11th July at 2:00pm, or if you can't make that you are very welcome at one of the evening performances on Tuesday 11th or Wednesday 12th at 6:30pm. It is a name that reminds us of St. Paul on the Damascus Road where he saw the light of Christ in a way that changed his life. The local Christians offered the hand of friendship to their erstwhile enemy and he chose to join the community of believers. We hope that we too will be able to attract new people into the life of our churches.

It makes sense to work together across the local area as we seek to overcome common problems in our communities. Helen has been appointed Rector to the new parish and we have a new curate, Karen Hyde who is being ordained deacon on July 1st.

We have 3 lay ministers and we are advertising for other part time clergy to complete the team across the five villages. We look forward to a new way of working as a local team that will maintain and enhance our Christian witness to the communities we serve.



Financial fraud

Financial fraud cost the UK £2 million per day last year according to official figures released by Financial Fraud Action UK (FFA UK). The figures show that the overall scale of financial fraud in 2016 was £768.8 million, an increase on the £755 million lost in 2015.

The Take Five campaign suggests five simple steps which consumers can follow in order to help to protect themselves from financial fraud.

- 1. Never disclose security details such as your PIN or full password legitimate businesses will never ask you to do this.
- 2. **Don't assume a phone call, e-mail or caller at your door** is genuine people are not always who they say they are.
- 3. Don't be rushed a bank or genuine organisation won't mind waiting while you stop and think.
- 4. Listen to your instincts if something feels wrong then it's usually right to pause and question it.
- 5. Stay in control have the confidence to question and/or refuse unusual requests for information.

The Little Book of Cyber Scams

Thames Valley Police has worked with the Metropolitan Police to produce The Little Book of Cyber Scams. This forty-page booklet covers a wide range of cyber and cyber-enabled threats including malware and ransomware and social engineering attacks - where cyber- crime is made possible by someone gathering data deceitfully, either in person, over the phone or by e-mail - and lots more.

While some of the information is aimed at businesses the advice is relevant to everyone. 

Our vision is to safeguard the individual character and vitality of our historic Thames-side village whilst meeting the needs of villagers now and in the future.



Finely grated rind of 2 large lemons	55g (2oz) icing sugar			

Grease and line the base and long sides of a 1kg (2lb) loaf tin with one piece of baking paper leaving an overlap at the sides to lift cake from tin when baked. Mix all cake ingredients together with a hand mixer until smooth. Spoon mixture into tin and level. Bake in preheated oven at 180C (160Fan), 350F, Gas 4 for 45 mins to 1 hour (depending on your oven) or until cooked. Leave to cool slightly for Smins in the tin. Put syrup ingredients in saucepan and heat gently until sugar has dissolved and liquid is clear. Pour syrup over slowly so that it soaks into the cake. When syrup has been absorbed remove from the tin and place on a wire rack. When completely cold make the glaze by mixing the lemon juice and icing sugar together in a small bowl and drizzle over the cake.

"Just a five-day trek," they said. "It'll be fun!" they said. Well, as I cross mile after mile off my training plan, I'm not sure I'd describe it as 'fun'. But worthwhile? Absolutely.

I'm Laura Snell. I'm relatively new to Sutton Courtenay - I moved into the village in October last year. This October, I'll be trekking 53 miles over five days in Cambodia – stomping through soggy fields and overgrown trails towards Angkor Wat temple.

I'm trekking in honour of my best friend's mother, who sadly passed away from a stroke in December last year. My trek raises funds for the Stroke Association, to help the 100,000 families in the UK affected by stroke each year.






