PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Planning Inquiry

In the last issue, the Council referred to the Public Inquiry in July into the appeal by Redrow Homes for 200 houses off Hobbyhorse Lane. Shortly before the Inquiry was due to start, Redrow withdrew the appeal, so the Inquiry as planned did not take place. The Parish Council had spent funds in securing the advice of consultants, so has lodged a claim with the Planning Inspectorate to recover the costs involved.

Inconsiderate parking on pavements

The Council is receiving reports regarding inconsiderate parking on pavements. Such action makes it very difficult for pedestrians, those with wheelchairs and pushchairs, and the partially sighted to use the pavements, as the vehicles cause obstructions. The Parish Council is very sympathetic and supportive of the frustration and distress caused to residents, and would ask motorists to think carefully about where vehicles are parked in the village, and asks that courtesy and respect to other villagers is shown.

Drayton Road - build out

Cllr. Richard Webber has agreed to allocate some of the County Councillor's community budget towards the costs of the Drayton Road build out. Cllr. Webber and the Parish Council have been speaking with the County Council to try and advance this long outstanding project. Confirmation has been received that the County Council is holding some funding for the project, and we are trying to find the balance locally, before the costs escalate excessively.

Poppy Project 11th November, 2018

The Royal British Legion is marking the centenary of the First World War (2014 to 2018) with commemorations in the UK and elsewhere. The local Poppy Appeal organiser is aiming to turn the section of the village green by the war memorial, red with poppies to mark the centenary, and to raise funds for the Royal British Legion. The Parish Council is supporting the event, and would encourage residents to do the same particularly in the week leading up to Remembrance Sunday.

Parish Council meetings

On occasions there are speakers at the Parish Council meetings, or presentations from developers about future planning applications. The Notice of business for Council meetings is always displayed on the noticeboard outside Burgrey stores. It is not always possible to immediately add news to the Council's website as it is hosted and managed externally. If anyone is interested in knowing exactly what the agenda items are, and whether there will be a guest speaker at a Council meeting, then please check the noticeboard a few days before the Council meetings, which are held on the first Tuesday of the month.



The following planning applications have been considered :

P18/V1349/FUL Erection of 2 warehouses off Sutton Courtenay Lane. Council objected owing to the impact on local residents and traffic movements through the village.

P18/V1164/HH Dropped kerb at 5 Milton Road. Council had no objection

P18/V1615/FUL Erection of 3 new additional dwellings at Peewit Farm, 95 Drayton Road. Council objected owing to the traffic impact on Sutton bridge, and the coalescence of Sutton Courtenay and Drayton.

P181714/FUL Variation of condition 2 on previous permission to erect 3 dwellings at Peewit Farm, 95 Drayton Road, Council had no objection.

SATs Results!

We are very proud to share our Year 6 SATS results with you. 70% of our children reached the expected standard in reading and maths, and

74% in writing. 65% of our children achieved this in reading, writing AND maths, which is higher than the national average of 64%. We are incredibly proud of how hard they worked and the mature way they approached the challenge. It was a real team effort – all the staff were involved in some way, helping to make drinks and tea for after school lessons, giving up planning time to work with groups, and helping out with breakfasts during the week. The children worked hard with us, and now they are enjoying the results. Well done everyone!

At Sutton Courtenay however, we believe children's education is about so much 'more than a score'. A rich curriculum underpins their success. The school was alive with music, art and drama at the end of term as Year 5 and 6 performed 'Dream On', a specially adapted version of Shakespeare's Midsummer Night's Dream. The lines were based on Shakespearean language but the children delivered them with confidence and timing to create an impressively funny show. They had created their own scenery and many of the costumes in their art lessons - do have a look on the website to see! Year 3 and 4 performed a concert on their recorders for us, and you may have seen that our artists made it to the BBC news painting the builders' fence with a design showing their dream school. Next year we have lots of new initiatives planned too. But for now, it is time to celebrate a great year and we are all enjoying the summer break as I write.

Joining Ridgeway Education Trust

You may remember that we recently had a consultation regarding our conversion to academy status to join Ridgeway Education Trust, which is the trust containing Didcot Girls' School, St Birinus School and the Didcot Sixth Form. The period of formal consultation regarding our move to join Ridgeway Education Trust is now over, and the response has been overwhelmingly positive. There is now much work to do in the background on the legal aspects of this transition, but while this is happening the children are benefiting directly from the close partnership we are forming. Next year, there will be new initiatives in Mandarin Chinese, music, art, drama, history and PE, as well as continued support for English and Maths in our year 6 classes. It is an exciting time to be part of our school!

Enjoying the weather

We really enjoyed the glorious weather in the run up to the end of term, and made the most of it. On the 5th July, Robins class went to try to find Pirate Pete at Mudeford beach. The beach cannot be reached by road, so they had to take the ferry across. They then went on to the sand and had a wonderful time eating their picnics, building sandcastles, finding shells and of course, paddling. They did not see Pirate Pete, but he must have been their earlier because they found lots of shiny golden coins buried in the sand! All that treasure hunting made them very hot and hungry, so everyone had an ice cream from the small café on the beach. The weather was just perfect as we were fortunate to have light cloud cover. It was a very memorable day for everyone.

We had a fantastic Sports Day. It was hot - we managed to keep the children in the shade nearly all the time but it was very hot in the sun for the spectators and many of the staff. The children were as always a credit to our school with their attitude, effort, drive and above all else excellent sportsmanship supporting their team mates.

REST IN PEACE

JAMES (JIM) MATHEWS who died on 16th May 2018 in Australia was born at 2, Harwell Road on 20th January 1940 to Lawrence & Jackie Mathews. Jim was the oldest of the six Mathews children. He attended the old school in Sutton Courtenay and then went to Larkmead and then to the Cheney School in Oxford where he proved to be good at maths. He enjoyed school and throughout his life was always keen to learn new things developing a curious and questioning mind from an early age. Jim joined the Merchant Navy at 16 and for two years travelled all over the world. This experience provided him with a wealth of stories throughout his life - most of which are not repeatable here! He then went into the family business with his parents and stayed there until December 1985 when he decided to emigrate to Melbourne, Australia where he became the Produce Manager for Safeway. Apparently he had been on holiday to Australia and liked it so much that that

JOAN CALVER who died on 19th June 2018 aged 79 was born on 7th April 1939 and grew up in Risinghurst with her parents Norman and Ena Collett. Joan attended school in Risinghurst and Forest Hill. When her parents moved to Radley Joan remained in Risinghurst with her grandparents to finish her education .She had several jobs – in Coxeters. Woolworths; the Pavlova Leather Factory in Abingdon and at the RAF packing depot at Milton. Later in life she went onto work the night-shift at a plastic factory in Radley and did various cleaning jobs at Cowley Concrete and Radley College. Eventually she went to work for a department store where she became the Invoice Control Manager. She was always a hard working, loyal and diligent employee. It was at a dance in Abingdon that she met her husband to be. For Alan, then in the Parachute Regiment and on basic training at RAF Abingdon, it was love at first sight. Alan's persistence paid off and they were married on Easter Monday 1958 in Radley Church. It was very much an attraction of opposites -Alan a sociable extravert and Joan a reflective introvert - but it obviously worked as they formed a long-lasting partnership of over 60 years. Their first home together was in a 16ft caravan on a

was where he decided to live, although he frequently returned to Sutton Courtenay and always regarded this as home. Jim had married Caroline in April 1962 and they had four children - Andrew, Richard, Jackie and Susie. Richard has fond memories of his father playing games with them in the back garden at Harwell Road and trying to keep up with Jim on Sunday evening strolls by the river, as he had such an enormous stride. All the children remember working alongside him in the greengrocer's shop and on the van. He supported both Swindon Town and Oxford United and loved to watch his grandson, Elliott, play cricket. But his major love was dog racing and he enjoyed a flutter! Perhaps it was inevitable, being part of the Mathews family, that he always loved to garden and enjoyed helping his brother Richard in the business every time he came home. He loved to chat - and would walk and talk his way around the village. He was always very social and, as

farm where they had their first daughter, Chris, at Christmas, followed not long after by Sue. They moved in with Joan's parents in Radley and then to Headington and Swinburne Road in Abingdon where they lived for four years. By that time Joan's parents were renting an old farmhouse owned by the Baker Brothers in Sutton Courtenay and Alan and Joan decided to buy 63 High Street .They rebuilt and restored the house - Joan even helping Alan build the roof - and she was constantly redesigning the garden to create a delightful series of outdoor rooms. She was a self-taught tailoress and dressmaker and would blindfold Sue and Chris to try on outfits so they would still have a surprise at Christmas! She was a good cook and has passed her Christmas pudding recipe to the next generation so all is well for this Christmas. For many vears Alan was actively involved in the Freemasons which gave Joan the excuse to go to the Ladies Night where she could dance. Joan and Alan even managed a slow dance at home on their Diamond Wedding Anniversary despite Joan not being well. The family had four Labradors and two collies over the years plus a series of rabbits and guinea pigs, and school rats ! Their first holiday with the children was at Butlins in Bognor Andrew said to me, once met never forgotten! He liked nothing better than telling a story - often against himself. One of his favourites from childhood was when he and some accomplices were trying to throw a bicycle chain over the electricity wires and they managed to bring down the wires and disrupt the supply in the middle of a football match – much to the dismay of the neighbours. And, more recently, he loved recounting how he ended up with the wrong suitcase whilst travelling to visit his Mum and found himself in possession of a case full of ladies clothes instead of his own! Jim was very much a man who lived life his own way and could be very stubborn not always easy for those closest to him. She supported Alan in his career as an Athletics Coach following him to Northern Ireland and Scotland. But she loved being at home with her garden. Even when ill she would instruct Alan about alterations she wanted in the garden. Joan spent 12 years looking after her Mum and lovingly looked after her until she died. This took its toll on her health which began to decline following an attach of shingles in 2000. She was very proud of all her family and loved being Nan to six grandchildren and a Great Nan to nine great grandchildren. She will be greatly missed by her family and her friends who gathered for her funeral on 12th July at South Oxfordshire Crematorium. This is an edited extract from the address given at the service by the Reverend Helen Kendrick.

DOUGLAS (DOUG) ADIE who died on 7th June 2018 was born on 29th September 1941 in Shetland. His parents died young and Doug, and his sister Caroline, were bought up by their grandmother, Gaga, in Edinburgh. Doug would spend terms at school, paid for by his father's old regiment, The Gordon Highlanders and most holidays with Gaga and spend the summer in Shetland with his wider family. He'd often talk of Shetland as a time of halcyon days. He worked in the family tweed mill, helped on the sheep farm, crewed the fishing trawlers and spent leisure time sailing and walking. He became an excellent seaman and sailor but he also learned to love nature and animals, something that never left him. After school he trained to be an accountant in Edinburgh. While working there he met and married Jane. They moved to London where he joined Formica as an accountant and got to travel across Europe visiting the factories Spain, France, Germany and in Switzerland and at the same time fitting in ski trips and visits to friends. They decided they didn't want to bring their children up in London so Doug took a job working for a bus company in Birmingham. He initially thought buses were all about transport, logistics, diesel, metal, garages, route planning, but quickly realised that they were actually about people. They transported people, employed people, negotiated with trade unions, dealt with councils and

government and were a part of the community. For a man like Doug, it ignited within him a 50 year love affair with the bus industry. His career progressed and he moved to Alder Valley as general manager running buses in Berkshire, then become regional director for the National Bus Company, which was then privatised. He then started bus companies in Preston and Manchester. He then moved to London Buses and was M.D. of London Central which ran 2000 buses in South London, including a large fleet of Routemasters. London Buses was also then privatised (a theme of his professional life) and London Central was bought by GoAhead. Doug continued to work for the firm, and joined the main board as a director. But he soon returned to his real love, running bus companies in communities and he joined the Oxford Bus Company (owned by Go Ahead) as M.D. He wryly said that it was the first time in his life that he'd had a decent commute. He and Jane lived in Sutton Courtenay for 35 years and he'd drive every day to the job in London and commute weekly when he was working in Manchester and Preston. At 60 he took early retirement and he and Jane spent several years travelling round the world, and the UK, especially Northumberland and Suffolk. They were proud parents of Andrew and Alastair and of grandchildren Eve, Leo and Alex. Doug loved life, he loved his family and his friends, he loved being at

the heart of a party. He was a man with an extraordinary general knowledge and would always be interested in what people had to say to him. He also had huge natural charm and charisma and he was very funny. All qualities that helped him make many friends through his life. Despite his many accomplishments he was actually quite a simple man. He had enormous integrity, believing that his word should mean something and striving to always do as he promised. He was a man of quiet faith who cared deeply about All Saints' Church and did much to support it over the years including serving as Treasurer of the Friends of All Saints'. Indeed, he helped in the local community in a variety of ways - and most notably in his support for the DAMASCUS Youth Project as Treasurer - generations of young people from this village owe a great deal to When he saw a need he Doug. responded to it - quietly and generously, without fuss. He devotedly cared for Jane as she became ill with Alzheimer's Disease and he remained cheerful and upbeat in the face of adversity and the illhealth that afflicted him towards the end of his life. He will be greatly missed by his family and many friends and work colleagues who attended the Memorial service held in All Saints' Church on 24th July 2018. Privacy, Openness and Transparency

Last week, we met a friend, to who mwe have not spoken for some time over the garden wall. We spent a happy twenty minutes catching up. Within the hour, we received a phone call from the same friend to tell us that she had just received a message from Google asking her to rate her visit to Orchard Barn (our home). The first reaction was to laugh, the second was to wonder how Google knew of our conversation. The third was to realize how much Goggle (and others) can find out about us via mobile phones, emails and social media. There was absolutely nothing in our conversation which would have interested anyone else, but it was a private conversation. It's a scary world.

Whilst I believe, passionately that Privacy is an important principle that we should do everything possible to protect, Privacy is too often a defining principle in Government – both national and local. On a recent visit to Nottinghamshire County Council to find out how they run themselves, we were told that they are now passionate about openness and transparency. Everything they say, think and do is put in the public realm. No more secret papers. All salaries, plans for the future and failings of the Council are published alongside their successes. The only papers kept from public view are those that concern commercial confidentiality (while bids for contracts are coming in) otherwise everything is open to public scrutiny). They claimed that this approach had already had three major benefits.

One : There was a noticeable increase in trust of their Council by Nottinghamshire residents.

Two : There were now no time-consuming and costly Freedom of Information requests.

Three : Their relations with the local Press had improved immeasurably.

To be fair to Oxfordshire, it is probably more open and transparent than many local authorities. Its new Corporate Plan will contain not only a list of the Council's success, but also a list of its failures and what it intends to do about them. This is all commendable. Not so transparent are the conversations around shared services and management with Cherwell District Council, or the discussions around the Growth Deal and the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway.

Until Government treats those who elected it as wholly deserving and capable of being involved in discussions and considerations of policy, they can hardly be surprised if they are not trusted.


Sutton Courtenay Field of Remembrance update
