## PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



## Defibrillator

The village now has a second defibrillator. This is located on the front of The Fish on Appleford Road. The original defibrillator is near the garage on

High Street. Demonstrations on how defibrillators are used is being arranged and dates will be published once finalised.

## Footpath along Church Road

We have received many queries and comments regarding the state of the footpath alongside Church Street both in respect of the path itself and the overhanging trees. These are matters dealt with by Oxfordshire County Council and the issues have been raised with the relevant departments at that Council for rectification. The Parish Council will continue to chase them.

## Magnox

A meeting with Magnox is being arranged which will discuss the reinstatement of footpaths and accessways following the recent reinstatement works carried out by them. Details of any outcomes will be provided once the meeting has taken place.

## Free car parking for Christmas shoppers

South and Vale have confirmed their annual free parking for shoppers dates. These will be on Saturdays 7<sup>th</sup>, 14, and 21<sup>st</sup> December in all Council owned car parks in Abingdon, Wantage, Faringdon Goring and Thame. Didcot's free parking dates will be Mondays 9<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> December, Henley's on Tuesdays 3<sup>rd</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> December and Wallingford on Thursdays 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> December.

## **Planning Applications:**

The following planning applications were discussed

P19/V2384/HH demolition and rebuild of the existing enclosing wall in front of the listed building. Rebuild collapsed wall to the side of the listed building. Replace iron railing with timber fence. Erect garden office in rear garden away from listed building The Old New Inn, 44 High Street Comments: The Council had no objections but would comment that it regrets the loss of the railings for a wooden fence.

P19/V2300/FUL retrospective application for the changes to approved dwelling (Lapwing Barn) and extension of the private amenity space to the west (change of use to residential) Lapwing Barn, 95A Drayton Road Comments: The Council expressed its concern at another retrospective application on this land. The property has been affected by a series of amendments and changes that, cumulatively, have changed the development from that originally approved. The Council objected on the above grounds and for reasons previously stated (unnecessary expansion of the site not in keeping with the emerging Neighbourhood plan).

P19/V1977/FUL installation of a temporary building within the existing service yard to house pallets of stock to protect the stock from the weather. Hachette UK Distribution Limited, Milton Road. Comments: The Council had no objections but did make the following comments, any traffic should be diverted around the village, the application is in Sutton Courtenay and not Didcot, strong conditions should be put in place to ensure that the structure does not become permanent, no extra sewerage, adequate tall tree screening to prevent intrusion.

P19/V2436/FUL new two storey 4 bedroom dwelling 120 High Street. Comments: The Council objected to the planning application as overdevelopment, impact on neighbour's privacy, loss of trees, increased traffic through the village.

P19/V1992.FUL (amended) Demolition of two properties and outbuildings and construction of a new detached dwelling and detached garage. 3 Mill Lane Comments: The Council objected to the planning application due to the potential flooding risk and increase of traffic through the village.

**P19/V2559/HH** Demolition of existing conservatory and single storey rear extension. Erection of new side and rear two storey extension and rear single storey extension. Associated internal reconfigurations. 30 High Street. Comments: The Council had no objections.

P19/V2555 Change of use of dog kennels to form residential dwelling and change of use of stable block to form ancillary office and plant room, plus external alterations and associated landscaping improvements and car parking space and a new access point. The Old Kennels Drayton Road. Comments: The Council objected to the application due to the risk of flooding at the property and the increase of traffic through the village as the property has not been used as kennels for a considerable amount of time and therefore any development would result in increased traffic flow. Also, that the access to the development joins the main highway on a 40mph stretch of road.

# From the Ministry Team "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!"

As I write this letter I am looking forward to a few days spent Christmas shopping with a friend in Wales. This has become an annual fixture for us – we try to buy quirky and unusual presents, preferably hand made, for friends and family in the craft and gift shops in West Wales and then wrap them all before returning home. It is meant to relieve the stress surrounding Christmas preparations and it works for us! But for some November will seem too early for present shopping. For others, far too late. Apparently, despite the increase in on-line shopping, 23rd December is still officially the busiest shopping day of the year in the UK. Perhaps, in my experience, especially true for the men of our nation as they rush out to buy presents for their loved ones. Many of us spend considerable amounts of time and money each year seeking out special, appropriate and sometimes unique gifts for our friends and our families. Yet, what should be a pleasure and delight, becomes a huge burden in every way.

In this era of dramatic climate change, we need to be mindful of the impact of giving presents on the environment. We should strive to minimise unnecessary packaging and plastic and buy, or even make, gifts which will be well-used and treasured. Perhaps we should even consider giving of our time and talents rather than 'things'.

Because, above all, sucked into excessive consumerism we seem to have forgotten that the giving and receiving of gifts is meant to help us remember God's gift in sending Jesus to live on earth among us. Christmas has become a time to compare ourselves with each other (who buys or receives the best gifts) rather than pointing us to the One whose gift is 'indescribable'.

Jesus gave up everything in order that we might know and experience the kind of riches we can't buy on-line from Amazon or even in Harrods!

Wrapped in a new-born baby sized parcel, God gave the very best of His love, His grace, His mercy and His forgiveness to anyone willing to receive it.

The lavish generosity of our God ought to be remembered every time we give or receive a gift – however small it appears, and especially as we are urged to share what we have. "Support the weak. And remember the words of the Lord Jesus, that He said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).



## **REST IN PEACE**

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of Pamela Bance who died recently.

Pamela Mary Bance (nee Stone) known as Pam, who died on 21st October 2019 was born on 20th July 1927 in a GWR railway carriage in the sidings at Steventon Railway Station. She grew up there with brother John and sister, Sheila. Later the family were to relocate over the rails to a railway cottage where Pam lived until she married. Having completed her education at Steventon Village School and Didcot Girls Grammar School Pam set out into the working world. After weekend jobs in the local bakery putting jam into doughnuts and at Easter adding sultanas to the hot cross buns, she looked for something more fulfilling. For her first job, part of the war effort, Pam worked at the MG car works in Abingdon, at the time commandeered to build tanks, thinking nothing of the cycle ride morning and evening from Steventon. After the war she joined the newly established AERE Harwell, working in the Chemistry Division where she met Don, soon to become her husband. On the 19th August 1950 Pam married Don at Steventon Parish Church, conveniently outside the football season because at the time Don was a successful, local footballer. Pam and Don Bance began their long and very fulfilling marriage in Newbury in private digs before moving to new council accommodation in Wildmoor Gate, Abingdon, where they were to live until 1981 before moving to High Street, Sutton Courtenay. During this period Pam was a loving wife attending to Don's every need. On 29th October 1952, Sonia was born followed by son David on 11th March 1955. For several years Pam worked as a full-time mother bringing up her new family. She went back to work, first as school secretary at Dunmore Infants School, and then as a local government officer at the Abingdon Borough Council Housing department working in Abbey House. She was a knitter, knitting jumpers for her children, her grandchildren and later for the Neo Intensive Care Unit for premature babies. She loved to travel; travelling across Europe and north America. In conversations she would frequently resort

to the atlas to study the geography or refresh her memories of a place or event. Pam was respectful to the earth. She loved gardening and would regularly reel off names of plants and flowers. She took an interest in wildlife and particularly birds. Raised at the time of houses with vegetable gardens, chickens, and rationing mum was very frugal with her purchases. Being aware of recycling and her impact on the earth long before this became popular. She cooked traditional healthy food and bread and cakes were always being prepared at home. In 1984 their relatively peaceful life was shattered with the arrival of the first of five grandchildren - Emily. Pam gave-up work to become a 'fully time' Nanny and set about the task with her usual determination and devotion. Pam went on to divide her attention with Mary, Kate, Harry and Oliver and lately with her great grandchildren; Zachary, Phoebe and Isaac. Pam loved children and they never ceased to amaze her. She was a good role model for all her family, generous with her time, always setting a good example even when others weren't. She was a loyal and faithful member of the worshipping community at All Saints, alongside her husband Don, a woman with a deep personal Christian faith who strove to live a loving life – being patient and kind in full measure. She had a real gift for hospitality - most often seen wielding a tea-towel or serving refreshments at church and other village events. She was a stalwart of the Women's Christian Fellowship, serving for a long time as Treasurer and of the WI. She led a very active social life with friends across the village and loved to help in any way that she could. She was always interested in people and never failed to be friendly and welcoming with a warm smile. Love and kindness shone out of her. In later years she moved to Oxenford House in Cumnor where their love and care was of the highest order and always so appropriate to her needs. She will be greatly missed by all her family and friends who gathered for her funeral on 8th November in All Saints Church. This is an edited version of the tribute given by her son David and the address given by the Reverend Helen Kendrick.

## **COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT**

## **Expressway**

Much is made of the idea of the Oxford-Cambridge "Arc". For some, it represents the future for Oxfordshire, presenting an opportunity for increased economic growth, based on the established "knowledge spine" and reputations of the two universities, and our centres of scientific research. To others, it represents a threat to rurality and the climate - with a potential Expressway linking the area paid for by vast quantities of extra housing.

But the "Arc" is, in reality, simply an idea. As a major net contributor to the national exchequer, the idea of stimulating further growth in the area and attracting further investment, is hard to argue against.

This does not necessarily mean that an Expressway is inevitable, however. Indeed, several of Oxfordshire's Councils have come out firmly against the Expressway. The latest of these is the County Council itself, who, in November, passed a motion rejecting the idea outright -"whatever the route" and a letter was sent to Highways England to that effect.

It is argued that connecting up the Arc could be done just as effectively (and at much lower cost) by improving and completing the East West Rail link provision. It is also argued that the carbon output in building the new road would make achieving our reduction targets almost impossible. It seems that this is going to become a major bun fight in the next few months.

## The School Run

We are all noticing just how stressed our local road system is, at present. The 10 mile journey from Drayton to Oxford can take 90 minutes at some times of the day. Yet at half terms and school holidays, it can be done in under 30 minutes. There are daily tailbacks at Culham Bridge and around Frilford crossroads. Major congestion caused by roadworks and accidents somewhere in the system are increasingly common. And even the rat runs are becoming congested. School Travel Plans have been around for many years, but clearly, something more is needed. And spare a thought for parents trying to get their children to school on time when bus services are often not good enough. Not much wonder that many parents are prepared to risk the wrath (and these days the possible financial consequences) of taking children out of school in term time). Is it possible that the solution lies in the coming together of the Education system, our Transport bodies and even the Travel industry? - variable term times? - variable starts to the school day? There is certainly a need for some fresh thinking.

## And please vote.

The Editors were invited to the Abingdon DAMASCUS Youth Project AGM on 19<sup>th</sup> November held at Milton Park. The Project originally served Drayton, Appleford, Milton, Sutton and Steventon but in recent years, due to its success in these villages, also now includes parts of Abingdon. The Project aims to enable young people to make a positive difference within their own communities

What an inspirational evening. These was a fantastic turnout of not just the young people and their families but also the High-Sheriff of Oxfordshire, Lady Jay of Ewelme, parish councillors from the five villages, five police officers including Chief Inspector Matthew Bullivant and PCSO Alison Blood; Matthew Barber the deputy Police Commissioner; three head teachers.

Prior to the formal business of the AGM those who attended were treated to a presentation of the work of the Project, and the activities (ranging from art and sport to litter picking) and workshops (including subjects such as bullying, substance abuse, money management, relationships, social media) that have taken place. # THE HISTORY OF THE ARMY AT DIDCOT, MILTON DEPOT & SUTTON COURTENAY

## Illustrated talk by David Taylor

This talk will explain the background to World War 1 and the need for an Ordnance Depot which was established between Didcot and Sutton Courtenay. The area was used in both World Wars by the army and later the RAF until the depot closed in 1964. When the land became vacant the power stations were constructed on the site so the area has had an impact on nearby villages such as Sutton Courtenay and Milton over many years.

David Taylor is Chairman of Didcot & District Archaeological and History Society and writes about historical subjects relating to Didcot and the surrounding area. He is also a tour guide in Oxford.

## **County Lines**

This term is used about drug gangs from big cities who expand their operations to smaller towns, often using violence to drive out local dealers and exploiting children and vulnerable people to sell drugs. Heroin, cocaine and crack cocaine are the most common drugs

being offered and supplied. In most instances the users or customers will live in a different area to where the dealers and networks are based, so drug runners are needed to transport the drugs and collect payment.

Dealers will frequently target children and adults — often those with mental health or addiction problems — to act as drug runners or move cash, so that they can stay under the police radar. Dealers may take over a local property, normally belonging to a vulnerable person, and use it to operate from. This is known as cuckooing. Young and vulnerable people will quite often be exposed to physical, mental and sexual abuse and, in some instances, may be trafficked to areas a long way from home as part of the networks' drug dealing business.

Children often don't see themselves as victims, or realise they've been groomed to get involved in criminality. It's important that we all play our part to understand county lines, and to speak out if we have concerns. Signs to look out for are:

- An increase in visitors and cars to a house or flat
- New and regularly changing residents (e.g. different accents compared with local accent).
- Change in resident's mood and/or behaviour (e.g. secretive, withdrawn, aggressive, emotional).
- Substance misuse and drug paraphernalia.
- Changes in the way young people you know dress; unexplained, and sometimes unaffordable, new things (e.g. clothes, trainers, jewellery, cars etc).
- Residents or young people you know going missing, maybe for long periods of time.
- Young people seen in different cars or taxis, driven by unknown adults.
- Young people seeming unfamiliar with your community or where they are.
- Truancy, exclusion, disengagement from school.
- Increased anti-social behaviour in the community.
- Unexplained injuries.

If you have concerns the best advice is to trust your instincts. Even if someone's not involved in county lines drug dealing, they may be being exploited in some other way, so it's always worth speaking out. Call your local police on 101, or call 999 if it's an emergency. If you wish to remain anonymous you can call the independent charity **Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111** or visit <a href="https://crimestoppers-uk.org">https://crimestoppers-uk.org</a>.

If you're a young person worried about your own or a friend's involvement, a good option is to speak to a trusted adult about your concerns. You can also call **Childline on 0800 1111**, or visit <a href="https://www.childline.org.uk">https://www.childline.org.uk</a> which is a private and confidential service where you can talk to specially trained counsellors about anything that's worrying you.

Guests and residents at The Abbey Sutton Courtenay are set to be warmer and cosier this winter having won funds to introduce further energy conservation measures on the site, this time in the hard-to-treat medieval house. This support comes from Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment (TOE) with funding from Grundon Waste Management Ltd from their own funds and through the Landfill Communities Fund.

The grant of £2000 is a very welcome contribution to the costs of the Cosy Up project which seeks to implement a raft of recommendations set out in an Energy Audit of the medieval building conducted by Moira Dorey of Oxford Brookes' Environmental Information Exchange. It will enable staff at the retreat centre to improve building performance, boost guest comfort as well as conserve energy consumption.

Over the next couple of months Abbey Staff and volunteers will be installing framed secondary glazing in well used rooms, masses of insulation in the loft spaces, thermal blinds at several windows, plus chimney sweep in various fireplaces.

# SUTTON COURTENAY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN—UPDATE



Good progress is being made towards the Neighbourhood Plan for Sutton Courtenay. Through it, residents will have their say on how they want to shape the future development of the village. Once we have a neighbourhood plan in place, planning authorities will have to take it fully into

account when they make their major decisions on future housing, roads and other developments affecting us.

So it is important that, as well as reflecting the views of residents so clearly expressed in the many consultations and the questionnaire survey, we are able to produce hard evidence to support the policies we want to see. Work is going on to put together that evidence on a range of topics, all aimed at showing SC as a vibrant sustainable community in its own right and protecting it from over development and creeping absorption. Sometimes it can be frustrating to have to 'go through the hoops', but we have to make sure our neighbourhood plan meets all the requirements for approval, both by residents and the relevant authorities.

We are identifying the views and green spaces that are important to the village, along with the pathways and cycle tracks that link them and could link them better. We are working to bring out the character of the village as something worth protecting and developing. We are also setting out the conservation and green principles that should govern our development, from energy saving housing to electric charging and from wildlife encouragement to future proofing of flood prevention. And we are clarifying issues that will make SC a healthy and sustainable place to live in for people across the generations.

If anyone has expertise in wildlife or green pathways or has good local knowledge of these and is able to contribute their time please do contact the Steering Group.






