Local Council Elections - 2nd May, 2019

Candidates

Anyone wishing to stand as a candidate in the local elections has until 4.00 p.m. on Wednesday 3rd April to submit a nomination form to the Vale of White Horse District Council. The forms need to be returned by hand, and not posted. It is advisable to make an appointment in advance, before you visit the offices, by telephoning 01235 422528. The forms can be obtained via the Electoral Commission's website <u>https://</u><u>www.electoralcommission.org.uk</u>. Assistance can be obtained from the Vale of White Horse District Council's elections office or from the Parish Clerk.

Voter registration

To vote on 2 May, residents need to be registered by Friday 12 April. Anyone who isn't registered at their current address should visit *gov.uk/register-to-vote* to ensure they are eligible to vote.

Polling cards

Those who registered to vote by 8 March 2019, should receive their poll card by Monday 8 April – anyone who doesn't receive it by this date should call the Elections team on 01235 422528 to make sure they are registered.

Anybody who registers to vote between 9 March and the cutoff date of 12 April should receive their poll cards during the week commencing Monday 15 April.

Postal votes

If someone wishes to vote by post, the Elections team must receive their application by 5pm on Monday 15 April – application forms are available at <u>whitehorsedc.gov.uk/</u><u>elections</u>.

Everybody who applies for a postal vote should receive their ballot pack by Wednesday 26 April – if it doesn't arrive by this date postal voters should contact the Elections team on 01235 422528 to request a replacement.

<u>Appleford Railway Station – Sunday trains</u>

The Appleford Rail Group is seeking for at least one train to stop each way morning and late afternoon or evening, on Sunday. With no local bus service, residents are left without a means of public transport, so the request is based on public service need, as it would only take a couple of minutes for a train to stop at Appleford. Sutton Courtenay Parish Council has supported the Rail Group with their campaign as a Sunday train service may help residents who live at the northern end of our village.

<u>Oxfordshire County Council – Strategic Transport</u> <u>Improvements</u>

The County Council's plans for a package of strategic transport improvements for the Didcot and surrounding area which include the new river crossing, a bypass for Clifton Hampden, the new science bridge and the dualling of the A4130 went out for initial consultation last Autumn. The County Council then submitted a bid to central government for funding, and the Chancellor announced in the Spring budget that funding had been allocated.

The County Council has therefore secured £218m to progress the plans. Sutton Courtenay Parish Council has already expressed concerns at the first consultation stage to ensure that the best route for the river crossing is selected. Now that the funding is secured, the County Council will work on the detailed design for each scheme, and as part of that process, and going through the planning consent stages, they will consulting on each scheme separately. They are commencing by looking at the programme for each scheme and working out when public consultation is required. The Parish Council is keeping a very close eye on matters, and talking with the County Council to ensure that the voice of Sutton Courtenay is heard, as it needs to safeguard Sutton Courtenay from possible traffic impact from these planned road additional improvements.

<u> Milton Road – Bus Shelter</u>

The Parish Council has been seeking quotations for a contractor to clean off the graffiti on the bus shelter in Milton Road. The preferred contractor has now been selected, and instructions given to clean it.

Village Green

A contractor has been instructed to replace some of the old posts which have rotted, and to straighten others which have been knocked by vehicles. The posts are there to protect the Green, as it is an offence to drive on it, and the Council wishes to keep it a pleasant area for all.

Planning Applications

The following planning applications have been considered :

P19/V0244 Installation of structural members within rear barn to support existing walls, floor and roof structure at 4 Church Street. The Council had no objections.

17/V1963/O Erection of 200 houses off Hobbyhorse Lane – amendment to drainage. The Council continued to object to the development and referred to omissions in the information provided

P19/V0053/FUL Change of use to canine hydrotherapy and grooming centre at Trident Business Park. Council had no objections.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS CONTINUED

P17/S4416/FUL Change of use of land from agricultural land to farm park at Culham Hill – amendments to Green Belt area, drainage and access. The Council continued to object on grounds of traffic impact, and loss of green belt

P19/V0428/HH Demolition of existing conservatory and single storey rear extension. Erection of new side and rear two storey extension and associated internal reconfiguration at 30 High Street. The Council had no objection

P19/V0352/HH Extension, internal alterations and addition of first floor accommodation at 1A Drayton Road. Council commented that the proposal was a demolition and rebuild. There would be overlooking from neighbours, and glass should be obscured. Trees on the site, which was in a conservation area, should remain.

All is set for us to become part of Ridgeway Education Trust on 1st April this year. The school has already formed a strong partnership with our colleagues in Didcot and we are seeing many benefits of shared expertise, both educationally and in the day to day running of the school. This move will mean that children from Sutton Courtenay Primary School will have priority entry to the RET secondary schools if they wish to apply for places.

In readiness for our entry into Ridgeway Education Trust, we have been doing some work on our school logo and giving it an update. As you can see, the concept is the same. We have moved to three figures rather than four, to reflect our three school values of readiness, respect and responsibility. The figures are holding hands to represent our inclusive and supportive culture, and reaching upwards to reflect the aspiration we all share for our children.

A Celebration of Books and Words

On Thursday 7th March we celebrated World Book Day. All week, the children had been focusing on widening their vocabulary, and all classes used dictionaries as part of their English work. On World Book Day itself, there were some amazing costumes as everyone really enjoyed the chance to dress up. During the afternoon, Year 5 travelled by minibus to Didcot Girls' School where they spent time in the library with Year 8 pupils sharing books. The celebrations went on into the evening this year, with Hands On Storytime where children came back to school to share books and enjoy short craft activities. In our school, we do celebrate books every day, not just on World Book Day! All classes are read to every day by their teacher, and our whole school reading scheme is the envy of many local schools.

Science Week!

The 11th-15th March was National Science Week. On Wednesday, the children came out of their usual classes and joined together in their house groups for a morning of science. They moved round four different activities: classifying trees, reacting chemicals to make lava lamps, investigating static electricity and competing to make paper planes that flew the furthest. Everyone had lots of fun and it was lovely to see children of all ages in each house working together and supporting each other, whilst experiencing lots of hands on experiments.

From the Ministry Team...Journeying Through Lent

Forty Days. Six weeks. A long time to wander

through the wilderness. People often don't look forward to Lent as memories surface of struggling to give up our favourite things. Words like 'sacrifice', 'discipline', and 'self-denial' are often used in ways that suggest that Lent is something to be endured rather than a time of renewal and spiritual growth. Perhaps it feels more like a punishment, or possibly just something you have to get through until Easter finally arrives. But at its heart, Lent is a journey. It's a path that we each have the choice to step onto that leads to the cross and to the empty tomb. Every year Christians celebrate Christ's death and resurrection. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration.

We Journey Together

Along the way, there are hills and valleys, stones to stumble upon, and smooth paths to tread over with confidence; and hopefully along the way, there are moments of clarity where our faith or vision seems a little clearer, even though there will undoubtedly be moments where it seems foggy and uncertain. Why not travel with us on Palm Sunday as the churches reenact Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem with a procession. But as Holy Week approaches, the atmosphere of the season darkens and the DAMASCUS Parish will be holding a Service of Shadows (known as 'Tenebrae') which will trace the story of Christ's passion. You're all invited. As with any journey, Lent is easier when travelled with companions.

When Our Feet are Tired

Perhaps you joined us as we began our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, or perhaps you just wondered why some people had been marked in ash with the sign of the cross on their foreheads...The imposition of ashes marks an ancient sign of penitence or remorse. As the cross is made specific words are spoken: 'Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ'. It is this turning away that determines how we travel, and on Maundy Thursday everyone is invited to gather for a Supper as we focus on the ways in which we are called to serve each other on our journeys, of faith or none, together.

Where Christ Walked, We Will Follow

When Good Friday arrives we will be retracing Christ's journey to the cross and churches across the Parish will mark this journey in different ways. Each a pilgrimage in its own way: whether by procession to the church, through the Stations of the Cross around the church itself, or by quiet meditation. However we travel, perhaps we can take time to journey well with one another, to discover the riches of moving more slowly; and afterwards share in the traditional eating of Hot Cross buns.

The Journey Ends AND Begins in Hope

So as you prepare for Easter this year, will you be ready to celebrate when a joyful dawn breaks upon Easter Sunday morning? God is never absent – our task is to encounter God

with new eyes and in new ways, in people we meet, places we stop, in nature's beauty and our own thoughts and feelings. Our experiences will have changed us and hopefully because of that, we might grow a bit, both individually and as a community, and maybe by the end, we might even feel a little better about Lent.

You're invited to come along, just as you are, to any of the services taking place across the Parish (details included with the Easter card in this magazine). All are welcome.

The tenders are in at around £600,000. The River Room committee need all the help you can give, as despite an amazing grant of nearly £90,000 that has just been confirmed from WREN, we still face a considerable shortfall in funding. There a couple of grant applications in the pipeline and to date we have raised almost £550,000 with your generosity and many supportive grants.

As you can see we do need more of your help both practically and financially to bring this community project to completion.

Clyde Newton Edwards, who died age 74 on 22nd February 2019, was born on 18th February 1945 in Oxford to Elizabeth and Walter Edwards. He was the youngest in a family of seven, and at birth he was very poorly and not expected to live, so he was always especially precious to his mother who brought him up, as his father, who was a Lorry Driver for a Coal Merchants, sadly died when Clyde was 11 years old. He attended Donnington Bridge School before beginning work for P.J. Jones in Oxford where he learnt the trade of panel beating. He eventually went into business and co-owned the 'Centre Services' Garage in Oxford for about 20 years until he took early retirement on the grounds of ill-health. He and Pauline met in a pub and for Pauline it was love at first sight. Pauline asked him out by asking him directly, 'When are you taking me out?' Clyde replied, 'On Wednesday!' and the rest, as they say, is history. They became an inseparable partnership and were together for 43 years – and married for 32 of those. They moved to Sutton Courtenay in 1987. Pauline had lived in the village when she was a child so this felt like coming home. They both loved the house, with its proximity to the village school, and their good neighbours, for whose support over the years both Pauline and Clyde have been immensely grateful. Clyde was extremely practical – he built various extensions, conservatories and the sheds at the bottom of the garden - and he enjoyed turning the house into a home. Clyde was multitalented - not-only could he maintain cars and motorbikes, for which he had a lifelong passion, but he could cook and operate a sewing-machine! Whilst being the first to admit he was not a religious man he loved gardening and would spend hours outdoors with his flowers - finding a sense of peace and calm in touch with the beauty of the world. Both he and Pauline made frequent trips to Garden Centres. He loved food - particularly cream cakes, or ice-cream and fruit or Cadbury's Cream Eggs! But it wasn't only eating food that he enjoyed but also shopping for it. According to Pauline he could food shop for England and he liked nothing better than filling a

trolley with his favourite foods - sometimes spending several hours in the supermarket! Clyde also loved dogs - Shadow and Mylo were well known to Sutton Courtenay children as they would meet and greet the children as they walked up the school drive alongside the garden fence. He was very jovial and would see the funny side of most things. He was extremely social and gregarious and got on with most people - although did not tolerate those he called 'time wasters'. He was a great host and enjoyed inviting friends and families to BBQs in the garden. He was caring and generous and wanted to help others if he could. He had an adventurous spirit - always wanting to meet new people and have new experiences. He and Pauline travelled to lots of places over the years, including Spain and Puerto Rico but also spent many happy holidays in their caravan in Bracklesham Bay, where they returned several times, making lifelong friends. Clyde loved clothes and was always smartly dressed - he had three wardrobes and fifty pairs of shoes! But above all he loved his family and worked hard to provide for them. When Pauline and he married, he took on her family as his own, becoming particularly close to her parents and brother, and was immensely proud of all his grandchildren and relished spending time in their company. At Christmas time he was a like a child himself and loved, not only the food, but also the numerous lights he insisted on putting up around the garden and the house. Sadly, the last eight years of his life were dominated by failing ill-health, following the development of kidney disease, and Clyde found it hard to accept that he was ill and found it very frustrating as the dialysis limited his independence. But he was lovingly cared for by Pauline and the family who did everything they could for him, and, along with the Kidney Unit at the Churchill Hospital and the support of the Marie Curie Nurses, enabled him to die at home, as he wished. He will be greatly missed by Pauline and all his family and friends who will remember him as, "Loving, kind and always laughing."

This is an edited extract from the address given at his funeral held on Monday 18th March 2019 in All Saints' Church, Sutton Courtenay, by the Reverend Helen Kendrick.

SUTTON COURTENAY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN - UPDATE



Thank you to those of you who attended our Community Consultation Workshop on 2 March 2019. The afternoon session was facilitated by Community First Oxfordshire, a community development charity which has had

involvement with 22 local villages and their Neighbourhood Plans.

The session gave the Steering Group an opportunity to:

- Stress the importance of the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan due the precarious position of the village, being surrounded by major development proposals such as Didcot Garden Town and also many associated local/national infrastructure works.
- Emphasise the point that Sutton Courtenay has reached saturation point, thus our Draft Plan will not propose to allocate sites for further development.
- Strive to produce a Draft Plan which will not only preserve, but also enhance, the village retaining what Green Spaces remain and ensuring that Sutton Courtenay retains its own separate identity.
- Confirm that the recently commissioned appraisals covering Village Character and Village Landscape support these objectives.
- Provide an update on the recent progress of the Plan.
- Tom McCulloch from CFO gave a presentation including:
- The results of the Questionnaire Survey conducted last summer.
- The emerging aims, visions and objectives of the Draft Plan.

Questions from the floor were answered by both Tom and members of the Steering Group. Following the Question and Answer session, attendees were encouraged to complete Feedback Forms on the draft vision, aims and objectives. The responses are being collated by Tom. This information will help formulate policies for inclusion in the Sutton Courtenay Neighbourhood Plan. There is a posting box at Burgrey for any attendee who was not able to return their form on the day. For those who could not attend the workshop, the form is available on 'The Neighbourhood Plan' page of the Parish Council Website https://www.suttoncourtenay-pc.gov.uk. Please do complete_and either post the completed form in the box at Burgrey or complete the form electronically and email to Tom (email address on the

form). Your responses are vital to all stages of the Neighbourhood Plan process, as community involvement is examined in some detail by the Inspector.

It is important that there are opportunities for feedback from parishioners of all ages. Our next event is a youth consultation evening on 24^{th} April (see poster) to enable the steering group to have a deeper understanding of the needs of young people in the context of the Neighbourhood Plan. Parents/carers – children under 16 will require your consent to participate.

We welcome comments and contributions to the Steering Group at any time; the next all-village have your say is the Sutton Courtenay Community Showcase on 18 May at the Village Green.

The Steering Group meets the third Monday of the month at 7pm in the Village Hall. All meetings are open to the public.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Given everything that is happening or is soon to happen locally and nationally, I am going to focus on a big issue for everyone in this division but an issue which has nothing to do with Brexit or local elections. It is the Thames Water (TW) proposal for a new above ground Reservoir between Steventon, Drayton, Marcham and East Hanney.

This proposal is the third such proposal since 1990. The last two were turned down. TW are now arguing that the water is needed to supply much of the South East of England –it will supply little, if any water to Oxfordshire.

There are 3 threads to the argument.

- The first concerns **the Science**. Is a Reservoir needed at all? The last TW proposal in 2007 was turned down emphatically because the case for need had not been met by TW. Would water transfer or desalination be a cheaper solution to water need. In the end, it is the scientists who must provide an answer not just TW's own scientists, but the well-funded and top level scientists from GARD (Group against the Reservoir).
- The second concerns **the Law** in particular, the planning process which has to answer the question Is this the best place for a Reservoir? And what are the implications for traffic and the environment?
- There is, however, a third issue which is often overlooked and unappreciated. It is **the Politics** surrounding the

whole proposal. And it is the politics which worry me almost more than anything. The way that the legal process works at present is that TW first approaches the regulator OFWAT with its proposal. There is every reason for TW to want a reservoir – they will own it, and it will sit on their balance sheet giving them a major capital asset against which they can borrow. It will be paid for, as will the cost of all public consultation (glossy brochures etc) by TW ratepayers. At the 2007 TW proposal, OFWAT allowed TW to raise £45m from ratepayers – about half of which was used to pay for legal fees to fight TW's case. When it came to a full legal enquiry, Councils trying to fight the proposal clubbed together to pay for legal representation. They managed to raise less than £1m - paid for through Oxfordshire residents' council tax.

While water companies own assets that ratepayers pay for. And while legal fees on both sides are paid for by ratepayers and council tax payers, there is little disincentive for water companies to keep trying their luck every few years.

In France I understand that the state owns the assets such as reservoirs. Private companies are employed by the state to run such assets. Is this not a better, fairer, more sensible system?

ED VAIZEY MP



This month I have met with Ministers in Westminster to discuss two important issues: railways and health care.

I met with Andrew Jones the Rail Minister, alongside his officials and Network Rail and Great Western. The Minister and I led discussions focussing on improvements along the Great Western Railway line, the potential for reopening Grove Station as part of a strategic project to develop commuter stations between Oxford and Bristol, and improved connectivity between Heathrow Airport and stations to the west, so one might travel direct to Heathrow from Reading for example rather than having to into London and then back out to Heathrow. I will be looking at the East West Rail scheme and the Cotswold Line Promotion Group for inspiration in how to build a business case for improvements to commuter services between Oxford & Bristol and hope that colleagues in Parliament with stations along that route might join me.

I also met with Health Minister Caroline Dinenage. Alongside colleagues from Oxfordshire County Council, Oxfordshire Clinical Commissing Group, Oxford Health and Vale of White Horse District Council the Minister and I led discussions on how we could improve Primary Care provision in the constituency. We discussed the ongoing situation in Wantage as well as our plans to develop new health hubs, both at an improved Health Centre in Wantage and plans for a new health hub in Didcot

In the constituency I have met with a number of residents and local businesses this month, including meeting with GPs in Wantage, The Thames Valley Police Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner, Residents of Alfredston Place in Wantage who are receiving poor service from their managing agent, and a visit to the Environmental Education Centre in Sutton Courtenay hosted by the Berks, Bucks & Oxon Wildlife Trust. I was also delighted to join local charity Mission Motorsport at Royal Hospital Chelsea to celebrate the launch of their new initiative Mission Automotive.

Investment scams

The Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) is warning people aged 55 and above to take the time to check that investment 'opportunities' are legitimate before handing over their money. On average victims of investment fraud each lost £32,000 last year, with a fifth of over 55s and

a third of over 75s believe that they've been targeted by an investment scam in the past five years. The FCA Warning List **https://www.fca.org.uk/scamsmart/warning-list** is an interactive tool to check for firms that the FCA knows are operating without its authorisation. If you don't have online access consider asking a trusted family member to do this for you, or get professional advice. FCA advice to avoid being a victim of investment fraud is to:

- Reject unsolicited contact about investments.
- Before investing check the FCA Register to see if the firm or individual you are dealing with is authorised, and also check the FCA Warning List of firms to avoid.
- Consider seeking professional, impartial, advice before investing.

Shed and garage security

As a result of recent shed and garage break-ins the police have issued the following advice.

- Keep your shed/garage in good condition with a close shackled padlock fitted to the door.
- Fittings should be bolted through the door and any screws concealed it's easy to unscrew the ironmongery, steal contents and, in some cases, replace the screws to make it look as if the shed hasn't been tampered with.
- By using tamper-proof screws or coach bolts, together with a good-quality pad bar or hasp and staple and close-shackled padlock the shed owner will make it harder for a would-be thief.
- Prevent easy removal of window glass by using mastic. Fit grilles or mesh to windows to slow down the thief.
- Ensure all equipment and tools are locked away when not in use. Ensure ladders are locked to a secure fixture in the shed or garage so that they can't be used to reach top-floor windows.
- Chain large items, such as bicycles, together to make it much more difficult for a thief to carry them away.
- Fit a wire cage inside the shed or garage, where more expensive items can be locked away.
- Post-code or mark all property such as lawnmowers, bikes and tools with ultra-violet pens, engravers or forensic marking such as Selecta DNA or SmartWater.
- Install a shed/garage alarm.
- Install security lighting as a deterrent and use plants such as thorny shrubs to act as a barrier at potential access points.
- When building a shed put it where it's most visible to you and neighbours.

New 'brushing' scam

This type of fraud involves Amazon sellers setting up an

account in a stranger's name, then sending their products to the unsuspecting recipient. The account that's been set up is then used by the fraudster to write fake 'verified reviews' in an attempt to improve their seller ratings. If this happens to you it should be reported to Amazon and you should change your password and order a new credit card. It's likely that your personal information will be been involved in a data breach. To check if this is the case visit **https:// haveibeenpwned.com**, which is a website that tells you whether your data has been part of a breach. Identity theft is a serious threat. Once a criminal has access to your personal information they can do anything from opening an account in your name and running up debt, to using it to obtain copies of your official documents.
