PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



Annual Parish Meeting of Electors

The Annual Parish Meeting of Electors will be taking place before the formal Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 7th

April 2020 at 7pm in the Village Hall. Agendas will be published prior to the meeting on both the noticeboard outside Burgrey Stores and also on the Council's website.

Council Meeting held on 3rd March 2020

We do apologise to any members of the public who attended the meeting on the 3rd March 2020 which began late due to the Council not being quorate. To be quorate the Council has to have 1/3 of its total number of Councillors present. This is the total number of possible Councillors, not the number currently on the Council. Sutton Courtenay can have 11 Members but currently has only 8, this means that this situation may arise more often going forward. Should you wish to become a member of the Council, please contact the clerk on the contact details at the foot of this article for more information.

Roadworks High Street and Drayton Road

The roadworks on the High Street are now underway and controlled by traffic lights. We have now received notification of the Road Closure Notice applied for by the contractors who will be doing the work for Thames Water in relation to the closure of Drayton Road. The earliest that the road can be closed is 11th May. We have received confirmation from Thames Water that the works will not start until the conclusion of the High Street works and their anticipated start date is 25th May 2020. This date is provisional due to a number of factors and we will let you know, via the newsletter and the website, if we are advised anything different. We have also requested "businesses/village open as usual" signage at either end of the diversion to assist the local businesses.

Footpath along Church Road

The Parish Council are aware of issues relating to condition of the footpath along Church Road. The Parish Council are not able to deal with such issues as ultimately this is Oxfordshire County Council's responsibility. Please be assured that this has been reported to Oxfordshire County Council and we continue to chase until we have a substantive response from them.

Footpath between Churchmere and All Saint's Church

The Rights of Way Officer from Oxfordshire County Council and a team from the Vale Path Volunteers were out on Monday 9th March and cleared the footpath which runs between Churchmere and All Saint's Church (including an overhanging branch held up only by the ivy around it) leaving it much more accessible for walkers. We thank them for doing this work. Pictures of some of the work being undertaken are available on the Parish Council website should you wish to view the same.

Agendas for Parish Council Meetings

The Agenda for Parish Council meetings is published on the Parish Council website and on the Noticeboard outside Burgrey Stores at least 3 clear working days before the meeting takes place. The Parish Council are also willing to email or post these to residents if you if you would wish (there is a charge for copies which are posted to cover printing and postage costs). Should you wish this, please contact the Clerk at the details below.

Church Parking

Please note the following amendment to the notice regarding parking for the church which was in last month's newsletter article. The notice in the February edition may have implied access for local residents to park within the Abbey grounds at any time, this is not the case.

In the event of a large wedding or funeral, additional parking may be possible, with prior notification inside the gates of The Abbey. This is dependent on events being held at The Abbey and also the weather – the grass is unsafe to park on if very wet.

P20/V0395/HH — Retrospective application for planning permission for a close board boundary fence at the rear of a listed building 4-5 The Green. Comments: Council has no objection.

The Village Hall is situated in Hobbyhorse Lane, Sutton Courtenay, OX14 4BB. Our hall is a community facility managed by volunteers (trustees) for everyone in the community. It is the focus of many groups from the village and the surrounding area who meet weekly or monthly for a variety of activities.

It could be the perfect venue for your large family gathering, party, group dining, formal occasion, client

gathering or committee meeting. We can also make arrangements for conference meetings for local businesses.

It is an excellent venue for children's parties as the main hall can easily accommodate a Bouncy Castle. The hall has sound equipment, and the bar area facilities include a fridge and a large urn. Crockery can be hired or you can bring your own.

In addition there is a kitchen and a smaller hall/meeting room. There is ample onsite parking. Behind the village hall is a tennis court which can be used free of charge.

Community hire charges for the main hall are £16 p/h but if you want to use the hall on a regular basis, the rates are negotiable.

We encourage you to come and look round prior to booking.

The village hall will be closed till such time as the government's guidance on social distancing measures is lifted to help reduce the transmission of coronavirus (COVID-19). Many one-off hirers have cancelled / postponed bookings. All regular bookings have cancelled for similar reason of social distancing. On Wednesday 18th March we were told that school would close indefinitely as a result of the Covid19 virus crisis.

The events of the last week have been a roller coaster. Only last week we held a parents' evening and as I chatted to parents about the outbreak, we speculated over whether we might close a week early for Easter. In the event, things have moved incredibly fast, sometimes changing hourly. We are hoping to remain open in a very reduced capacity to provide childcare for key workers, but as I am writing this, on Thursday 19th March, we are still awaiting details of how this will look and who will be eligible.

One thing is certain — this week has really shown the spirit of the school. The whole school community has come together to support each other. Teachers, support staff and admin staff have been working around the clock, completing their day jobs as usual and then working late into the evening preparing packs of work and training in how to use online platforms to set work. One of the problems is that we do not know how long this situation will last, and we must prepare for the worst case scenario which is that we may not be back in school until September.

Packs of work are now filled and ready to go, and the children have had a chance to practice with the new ways of working. We can only now step into the unknown and learn as we go.

From the Ministry Team...

To the Cross and Out the Other Side

Writing this in mid-March, I don't think it has ever seemed more difficult to project myself forward into the coming month than it is at this moment. As I write, the country is gearing up to cope with the threat of COVID-19, but we are all still to some extent unsure of what the reality will be like.

For the first time in over 1500 years public worship has been suspended across the country - baptisms (except emergencies) have been cancelled and it is unclear at the time of writing what it is to happen for weddings and funerals. Schools are closing. Around the country, medical staff, businesses and individuals are having to make difficult decisions about how to behave in this new and uncertain environment.

But our churches all remain open for private prayer during daylight hours and we are trying to put into place suitable measures to keep people safe and to work out ways that we can help those in our villages who may become ill and need to self-isolate. Cards have been delivered to every house in the parish.

So the first thing to say is that, whether or not we can gather together for worship, the promise of Easter is that after the hard and painful road to the Cross which we remember in Holy Week and especially on Good Friday, there is new life and resurrection round the corner. That has been true over the millennia since Jesus first willingly came into our world of disease and suffering and trod that road for us, showing that absolutely nothing the world throws at us can separate us from the love of God.

Fear, like everything in our human makeup, can be a gift from God when used in the right way, to avoid danger, but it can also lead us astray if we let it get hold of us. So the answer is not to deny our reasonable feelings of fear but to ask God to help us keep them in proportion, to use them rightly, and to give us the gift of love that is the only antidote.

If you find yourself needing to self-isolate (a new phase with which we are all becoming very familiar) or keep socially distant, either because of infection or to avoid infection, remember that if you need to talk about your fears or ask for help in practical ways, you can phone or email me or any of the other members of the ministry team. One thing we can all do is to pray for each other and keep in touch with vulnerable friends and neighbours by phone and email, while respecting their need to keep separate.

May we know that God is with us and all those whom we love as we walk this difficult road together.

CHURCHYARD ENTRANCE

While many large vehicles had miraculously negotiated the narrow churchyard entrance, many will be aware that a building sub-contractor knocked a gate post last autumn to make it unstable. It was therefore dismantled. The builders could have quickly reinstated the gate post (at no cost to the Church) but it was decided that this is an opportunity to widen the entrance. This will make it suitable for emergency vehicles for the first time. The decision has meant that planning permission to rebuild the post and widen the original gates has had to be sought: permission from the Diocese might also be necessary. The former should be known in April.

Scam phone calls

 Neighbourhood Watch in the NAG5 area has received numerous reports of phone calls claiming that 'loft lagging' fitted recently has been found to cause condensation, and has been declared

substandard by the government. These calls appear to be opportunist and come from local numbers.

A recent call to a NAG5 resident asked if he was still
receiving scam phone calls. When he said that he was he was
asked to confirm his name and address so that the caller
could be sure the details were correct. Once the victim had
done so he was asked to provide his banking details so that a
direct debit could be set up to help prevent scam calls.
Fortunately he realised it was a scam.

Reporting incidents to the police

Burglaries

• There has been an increase in daytime burglaries in Abingdon. If you're suspicious about a vehicle which might be associated with break-ins, please take the registration number and call 101 to report it to the police, who will check the details against their database. • Ensuring windows, doors, side gates, sheds and garages are locked helps to deter break-ins. Clearly marking mowers, tools and garden equipment with your postcode makes them less desirable to thieves.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR REPORT

Water, water everywhere (but not enough to drink if Thames Water are to be believed).

Over the past 30 years, Thames Water (TW) have been arguing that, in the near future, we are going to be desperately short of water and much the best solution is a giant reservoir between Steventon, East Hanney, Drayton and Marcham. Indeed, if their predictions had been correct, we would have been facing severe drought many years ago.

To be fair (and I am struggling here), the population and global warming have been increasing steadily throughout that time and TW can argue that we need to be looking at the evidence of need yet again. But with TW's history of poor and somewhat alarmist predictions, it must be right to question their latest evidence via a public enquiry. There is evidence and science on both sides of the argument - evidence and science that needs to be argued in public.

With repeated Environment Agency flood warnings in recent months, and as I look out at muddy paths, sodden ground, full rivers and streams, with full and apparently merging lakes replacing gravel pits, drought hardly seems an immediate threat. TW and their reservoir surely have something to prove.

I confess I am not an angler or a sailor, but I can see that the recreational benefits of the reservoir are tempting. The potential nature conservation opportunity is also appealing - assuming that security issues do not forbid access to the reservoir area.

However, the overriding issue for me is undoubtedly the carbon output of building Europe's largest above ground reservoir over more than 10 years. Our chances of hitting our ambition to be Carbon neutral by 2050 would be very small if TW was to have it's way. Add in large scale housing and road development and the chances are nill.

That is why I remain implacably opposed to the reservoir - at least until TW have demonstrated for the first time in 30 years that the case for need is overwhelming and there is no better solution.
