

I hope you are all safe and well. It has been easier than I expected to adjust to 'virtual parliament', in which 50 MPs can be present in the House of Commons at any one time and up to 120 of us can

join by video link. Back in March, I was not sure it would happen at all given the reservations some of my colleagues had, and yet here we are in May with it working pretty smoothly.

Having been concerned that it would feel strange to give speeches from my desk, I have now done so to speak in the Domestic Abuse, Agriculture and Immigration and Social Security Co-ordination Bill debates, alongside questioning several Cabinet ministers on behalf of constituents.

Virtual parliament has certain advantages, not least the fact that the day before debates, the Speaker publishes a call list which shows exactly who will be called and in what order. This is in contrast to how things you usually proceed in the House of Commons, when you can be in there for several hours bobbing up and down and not be called at all! You can also wear jeans on your bottom half as the camera can't see below your shoulders!

That said, like everyone else currently working we're all keen to

be back around our colleagues. Whilst some people suggest that the current period will change how everyone works forever more, I'm not so sure. Having had friends move to other countries and being reasonably used to speaking to them by video, it's not the same as being in the same room and I think most people want the interactions that come face to face.

MPs were advised to remain in their constituencies for lockdown if they could, so my partner and I have been in our home in the Didcot area, which we got in February. It has been good to spend an extended period here rather than just the Friday-Sunday period each week and she and I consider ourselves very lucky to have a garden and to be able to take walks around the beautiful environment we now live in.

Where we can, we've been getting out to help the organisations in our community that have played such a vital role during this crisis – from Sofea to the Ray Collins Trust – and remain full of admiration for the many ways they've been helping people during this period. *Do visit www.oxfordshireallin.org* to find one near you.

COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Many residents of Sutton Courtenay and Appleford will be aware of some of the great work that has been going on in our villages with the elderly and the vulnerable since the pandemic hit us. With a team of more than 60 volunteers under the command of Emily and Judy, all those needing help with food and medicine deliveries have been getting it.

Rachael (head teacher) and her staff have been working tirelessly with the young, while the Damascus Youth project have been on the streets helping our teenagers and young adults. Rev Helen and her Church team have not stopped for many weeks.

We have been having regular online meetings between all the various bodies to spot any loopholes and develop our efforts In line with Government guidance.

Both villages should be proud of the way they responded to the crisis.

Government Business Grants

Government have provided VWHDC with a pot of money to help businesses through the crisis. Several local businesses have already benefitted but there are some who have yet to apply and some the Vale may not even know about. Even if a business was unsuccessful last month, the advice is to try again as Government have changed the eligibility rules.

Urgent Appeal

The school has been working hard with children some of whom have no access to a PC. Online teaching and learning is particularly difficult with only a mobile phone. The school needs to purchase up to 60 Chrome Books (£231 each) which these children could use. The school would own them and loan them out as required. Thanks to donations already received, up to 10 have already been funded, but there is still some way to go. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



Parish Council Meetings

Under emergency legislation passed by the Government, which is provisionally in place until May 2021, the Council can hold

meetings virtually. The first full Parish Council Meeting held virtually took place on 5th May 2020. Agendas for meetings are posted on the website a few days before and emailed to those people who are on our email distribution list. The public participation section of the meeting continues and, should you wish to participate in a meeting or just listen in, login details for the meeting can be obtained from the Clerk prior to the meeting. Please email the clerk on the details at the foot of the article for details. Should you wish to be added to the agenda distribution list, please email the same address with your request.

Planning Appeal – Appleford Road

It was mentioned in the last newsletter that a Planning Appeal has been lodged in relation to the proposed development at Appleford Road. Various meetings of the Council have now taken place and at an emergency meeting of the Council held, virtually, on 30th April 2020 it was agreed that the Council would instruct a Planning Consultant to prepare and make a statement on behalf of the Council at the Planning Appeal Inquiry. The date for this has provisionally been set for October but we await final confirmation of the date (and venue) given the current restrictions in place. The Council would ask that if you have any substantive suggestions of data/information which may be useful to be included in the statement please let the Clerk know and these will be considered. Should you wish to see the minutes of the meetings, all meeting minutes can be found on the Parish Council website or you can contact the Clerk.

COVID 19 UPDATE

Non Medical Facemasks – A group of volunteers to produce non-medical facemasks is being organized. If you are able to assist with this, please contact Simon Lazare on simon_lazare@icloud.com or 0772 1160875. Delivery of material and collection of completed masks can be arranged if you are unable to leave your home. Information on how to make face masks can be provided and there are useful links on the Parish Council website.

Restrictions

At the time of writing, we remain under tight Covid-19 isolation regulations. Here is an update on any Parish Council owned land which remains under restrictions:-

<u>Cemetery</u> - The Parish Council made the decision, following government guidance, not to close the cemetery to people wishing to visit memorials during this time. This is on the basis that social distancing is observed at all times and no large groups visit at the same time. Any burials which are taking place during this period are carried out following the current government regulations overseen by the officiate and funeral directors.

<u>Recreation Ground</u> – The recreation ground as a whole has remained open. However, following government instructions,

the children's play area, basketball area and skate park were closed at the end of March. The basket ball area has now reopened for use by families or by a family with one member of another family provided that social distancing is observed. **The play area remains closed.** No safety inspections are being carried out on it during this period of closure.

<u>The Village Hall</u> – The Village Hall remains closed at this time.

Daily exercise

With the government relaxing rules on exercise, it is envisaged that many more people will be out and about around the village. The Parish Council request that the following be noted:

- Many of the footpaths around Sutton Courtenay are narrow. Please consider whether there is an alternative footpath you could use which may be quieter and allow for social distancing. If not, please be courteous to other users who may be going in the other direction.
- The speed limit throughout the majority of the village is 30mph or slower. Although the roads are, generally, quieter, there are also more people walking and cycling. Please obey the speed limits throughout the village.
- Please pick up your dog mess when walking your dog.

Useful contact details

Sutton Courtenay has a Neighbourhood Watch Group. The Group maintain a Facebook page which is updated at least daily with information about fraud, scams, alerts from the police, Action Fraud, Neighbourhood Watch Network and more. They have expanded the page to include information and updates relating to Covid -19. Keeping Busy in School!

While we have been away from school, Mr Greenough the school caretaker has been his usual creative self. We were recently given a set of rechargeable keyboards which were bought with

money from the music department at Ridegway Education Trust. Mr Dingley, the head of music, is passionate that every child should learn to read simple music using a tuned instrument while they are at primary school. The keyboards will be used during whole class music lessons.

We needed a storage solution and one day I joked with Mr Greenough that they should go in a cart designed like a barrel organ. Of course that got him thinking and the finished creation has now arrived, complete with a dancing monkey operated by working cams the children can turn a handle to operate.





The trolley represents all I love so much about the school – a community of people who are innovative and creative and are able to spark children's imagination. It will not only inspire music but also design technology!

Over the next couple of weeks, we will be preparing for the return of the children with a thorough clean. For some areas of the school, this will involve redecoration. Mr Greenough is already very busy with the toilets in Robins and the cloakrooms by Falcons, where he is preparing the walls and doors before giving them a fresh coat of paint. It isn't nearly such a pleasant job as making a music cart, but that's life and he is still smiling!



Learning at Home

Meanwhile, the majority of children are learning at home. We have successfully set up programmes where teachers can set work and interact with children online using the Google Classroom, and we are delighted with the way the parents and carers have responded to this. It has been inspiring for us all to learn and grow together in ways to make our teaching most effective with a bespoke curriculum, and to see the children's comments and the photographs they send in of their work, some of which you can see below. Their confidence has really grown.

We anticipate having to work in this way for most groups of children for some time to enable social distancing.

Unfortunately, we are finding that some families are more disadvantaged than others. Many have to share one laptop

between them which means taking turns to access work. Often their technology is old or unfit for purpose, and many are reliant on using a small phone screen for their work. This is far from ideal, and so we have launched an appeal for more Chromebooks, please see below.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING WITH THAMES WATER

Thames Water Works

The Parish Council had a conversation with Thames Water and their contractors on 19th May with regards to the imminent works in Sutton Courtenay.

The works on High Street are suspended indefinitely, not only due to Covid-19 but also to high water levels which would need to be lower before work could commence. They would hope that these may be carried out in the late summer/early autumn if we have a dry summer, if not, the works will be re-scheduled or next year.

The works on Drayton Road, involving a full road closure, is due to commence during week commencing 15th June. Thames Water will be providing posted leaflets through the doors of properties affected prior to the closure but details are as follows:

The works will be completed in two sections with one section being completed prior to the next starting. Access to properties in the closed area, including properties on Ginge Brook and Chapel Lane, will be via the section which is NOT being worked on at the time. Pedestrian access will be available at all times. An area wide enough to allow disabled access, pushchairs

The government started fishing on 6 May, we decided to delay angling until 30 May in case there should be a late re start to spawning.

and cyclists pushing their bikes to pass through will be fenced off. To enable social distancing, passing places in the fencing will be available. The fencing is transparent and therefore pedestrians will be able to see people approaching.

With regards to vehicular access, a diversion route will be signed. Thames Water appreciate that some drivers will not follow the diversion and may therefore use the village as a diversion. The Parish Council have requested that "no through route for vehicles over 7.5T" signage be put in place to deter lorries with no business in the village not to use the village as a diversion route. The contractors are requesting approval of this from Oxfordshire Council. The Parish Council have also requested "businesses open as usual" signs to assist local businesses during the closure.

The Parish Council will be having a further meeting with Thames Water prior to commencement of the work and will post any updates on the website so please do keep an eye out.

Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones (37:1-14) was given when God's people were in exile in Babylon. They felt dead, being separated from home, from all that was safe and familiar, and from God. The vision answers God's question: 'can these bones live?'

In the strange times we are living through we can also feel cut off from God, facing the loss of jobs, businesses, homes or health and with church communities unable to meet physically together in church buildings. This vision assures us that God has power over death and can breathe new life into what is hopeless.

And we have already begun to experience new life. When we were told that we could no longer worship in our church buildings everything felt hopeless, then we discovered a whole new world of using Zoom, Facebook and Youtube in order to offer something new and hopeful. Churches all over the world are discovering how to live stream or pre-record their services and we are discovering new ways of connecting with one another using new technology and rediscovering the telephone to reconnect with others. Community spirit is being revived as neighbours look after one another with simple acts of kand conversations at a safe physical distance. And then there were the physical distanced tea parties held to celebrate VE Day in streets up and down the land, not to mention the weekly coming together to clap for all carers and key workers to show appreciation. New life indeed!

When Ezekiel is told to 'prophesy to the bones' (4), God brings them back to life: the bones come together and are covered with muscles and skin, and then filled with God's breath to bring new life, by the life of His Spirit.

The Covid-19 virus robs people of their life by suffocation, so that they can't breathe. Our hope beyond the pandemic is that the gift of God's Spirit will bring new life to our lives, our communities, our churches and world. Life will certainly look very different in the future, but we can be assured that God is with us and that we are safe in his hands.

'I will put my Spirit in you, and you will live, and I will settle you in your own land. Then you will know that I the Lord have spoken, and I have done it, declares the Lord.' (14).



SCAMS AND FRAUD

TV Licensing scam

E-mails telling recipients that their direct debit to TV Licensing has failed and that they need to pay to avoid prosecution have been circulating for quite some time. These scam emails have recently been amended to tell victims that they qualify for a 'COVID 19 Personalised Offer' of six months free of charge. The e-mails contain links to genuine looking sites and aim to steal personal and financial information.

You should never provide this sort of information in response to any form of unsolicited communication, nor should you click on any links in e-mails or texts.

Coronavirus-related fraud and scams

Criminals continue to exploit Coronavirus. Uninvited phone calls, e-mails, texts and visitors on the doorstep may not be genuine, despite appearances. Criminals are often very convincing and persuasive. NEVER provide personal or financial information no matter how convinced you may be that it's a genuine request. Financial institutions, the police, local authority and other businesses will never ask for your information in this way.

There's also a concern that fraudsters may pose as volunteers or claim that they've been asked to call by someone well-known in the village. Please exercise caution and call the person who's said to have requested the contact. Use an independent source for the contact details and, if it's a phone call you've received, make the call on a different phone if possible

'Sextortion' scams

- So called because the victim receives an e-mail claiming that they have been filmed watching porn on their computer, and quoting a password that the recipient uses or has used in the past. Payment is demanded in bitcoin. It's thought that the passwords quoted were obtained through old data breaches. If you receive one of these emails don't click on any links and report it to Action Fraud at *www.actionfraud.police.uk*.
- Visit haveibeenpwned.com to check if any of your accounts have been involved in a data breach. If they have you should change the password.
- You should change your passwords regularly. Always use a different password for each account, which should be between 8 and 12 characters and use at least one upper case character, one numeral and one symbol such as *, !, #. If you write them down keep the information in a secure location.

Suspicious Email Reporting Service

This new service has been launched by the National Cyber Security Centre and the police. In the first two weeks 160,000 reports were received, leading to more than 1,400 links to bogus websites being removed. DISPOSAL OF HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND REFUSE

- Textiles, batteries and small electrical items kerbside collections have restarted.
- Bulky waste collections have resumed. There are a limited number of bookings which can only be made online at www.whitehorsedc.gov.uk/services-and-advice/ recycling-rubbish-and-waste/your-recycling-andwaste-collections/bulky-household
- Garden waste brown bins can be ordered online at www.whitehorsedc.gov.uk/services-and-advice/ recycling-rubbish-and-waste/garden-waste. The current cost is £49 per annum. They are emptied fortnightly on the same day as green recycling bins.
- Household recycling centres reopened on 18 May for essential use. Essential use means waste that cannot be stored at home, or would cause hard to health if stored. Opening hours will be limited to 8am to 4pm, social distancing measures will be introduced and the size and number of vehicles will be limited. This is likely to result in local traffic restrictions around each site to prevent queues blocking the road network. Full details can be found here www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/sites/default/ files/file/coronavirus/HWRCReopeningFAQs.pdf
- If you have, or a member of your household has, Coronavirus please ensure that any personal items such as tissues, disposable cloths, face masks etc are put into a rubbish bag, then into a second rubbish bag which should be tied securely. The bag should then be stored away from other waste for a minimum of 72 hours before being placed in your bin.
- Bin emptying is mostly running as normal. Vale advises that changes may occur as a result of staff being off sick or

self-isolating. If your bin hasn't been emptied please leave it out for three days (including weekends). If it still hasn't been emptied please take it in and put it out again on the normal collection day.






