PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



Development by FCC "Radcot Green"

Vale of the White Horse District Council recently made a "Call for Sites", areas which a landowner puts forward as a possible future

development. FCC have put forward an area of land within Sutton Courtenay for possible use for future development. They will be presenting information to the Council at the start of the next Council meeting on Tuesday 1st September. The presentation will start at 7.00pm. The meeting will be held virtually via Zoom and should you wish to attend, please do let the clerk know (contact details below) and the relevant meeting login details will be forwarded to you.

Litter Bins

The Parish Council have agreed, in principle, to arrange for a litter bin to be placed on Mill Lane. The most suitable location is to be agreed and any relevant planning permissions will need to be sought.

A discussion took place in relation to a dog waste bin the area of Tyrells Way/Bradstocks Way. This is not possible but it may be possible to place a waste bin which allow dog waste to be deposited to be erected,. The Council will look into a suitable location for the bin.

Recreation Ground Play area

The Parish Council are still working towards re-opening the play area. It was agreed that a professional inspection should be carried out on the equipment and this has highlighted a safety issue and recommends the play area remain closed until such time as the defect can be fixed. The Parish Council are following that recommendation and the play area remains closed. The Multi use Games Area and Skate Park are open for use but users must comply with the government social distancing guidelines in place.

New Defibrillator in Sutton Courtenay

The Parish Council are in the process of adopting the BT phone box on High Street (near to Lady Place). Once this has been handed over, the Parish Council will be arranging for the same to be used for the housing a defibrillator. This will be the third in the village, with one being located on the outside of The Fish on Appleford Road and the other being next to Sutton Courtenay Tyres on the High Street.

The Village Hall Management Trustees have spent considerable time understanding and implementing these requirements – some of which get updated just as they have been implemented! We hope to open by 1st September in a limited way for smaller user groups following government guidelines on numbers attending an indoor event.

We have prepared risk assessments, guidance and new conditions of hire for users which will be kept under review as the pandemic progresses and government guidance changes. We hope you will all bear with us. We are contacting all our regular users with regards the new conditions of hire but if anyone would like to hire the hall for a one-off event please get in touch with us.

SUTTON COURTENAY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN



The Steering Group has continued the detailed work to produce a robust, evidence based draft of a Neighbourhood Plan for Sutton Courtenay that can be put to a vote of residents in due course. Particular recent focus has been on

identifying important green spaces and the paths and tracks in and around the village that walkers and cyclists can use to get around, and on how they might be improved. Similarly, we have been clarifying the amenities and services that underpin the community. Funded by grants, we have engaged consultants to work with us to develop the policies and supporting evidence that make a convincing case for our Neighbourhood Plan.

Part of our work has been to record instances where the drainage system has been unable to cope, particularly at times of heavy rainfall or when waste pumping systems have failed. We would appreciate any information on flooding and drainage problems, with dates, location, and brief description, sent to our Chair (contact details below). In particular, we would like to know more about two such instances:

- when in the early 2000s did the High Street experience serious problems of sewage clearance?

- when was it that the pumping station off Church Street broke down, requiring tankers to take waste away until the pumps were repaired?


In the light of recent Government proposals for a radical overhaul of the planning system, neighbourhood plans could be even more important in informing councils responsible for identifying land for development. Sutton Courtenay has already experienced a huge amount of development, without corresponding improvements to road and other infrastructure. Our Neighbourhood Plan aims to provide a coherent set of policies, with evidence to back them, that enables Sutton Courtenay to avoid being overwhelmed or being absorbed into neighbouring villages or towns.

During the present social distancing period, the Steering Group is meeting via Zoom. Our next meeting is scheduled for 2.30pm on 9th September. If any resident would like to sit in "virtually", please let our Chair know.

Courier fraud and scams



Courier fraud is the name given to incidents where criminals contact victims by phone, purporting to be a representative of the police or a reputable organisation, in order to obtain cash, cards and bank details. The police have issued the following advice and information.

- Criminals have used stories such as an unexpected order on an
 online account (which you may or may not have), or that your
 bank card has been found on a suspect in police custody and
 officers want to move your money into a safe account.
- There have been recent reports in our area of phone calls to residents from someone posing as a police officer, advising them that there's been fraudulent activity at their bank and that the officer believes the bank is using fake bank notes. The call recipient is asked to withdraw money from their bank account and take the cash home. They then receive another call, asking for the serial numbers on the bank notes. The caller then confirms that the notes are fake and says that a courier will be sent to pick them up. The notes were not fake and the victims lost their money.
- The majority of those targeted by criminals committing courier fraud are over 70 years old.
- The police and reputable organisations will never ask you to move money to a safe account, to reveal your banking PIN or full password or send anyone to your home to collect cards, cash or jewellery. Police advice is to STOP, CHALLENGE and PROTECT.
- Stop and think for a minute before parting with money or information. Only criminals will try to rush or panic you.
- Challenge and question. Could the call be fake? It's okay to reject, refuse or ignore requests and hang up.
- Protect yourself and your money. If you think you've been a victim of a scam contact your bank immediately and report it

to Action Fraud, the UK's national fraud and cybercrime reporting centre, online at https://www.actionfraud.police.uk/ or call them on 0300 123 2040.

COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

The local news on Covid in Oxfordshire continues to be mostly encouraging. There has been a spike in figures in part of Oxford City - almost certainly he result of partying by under 30s. This is reflected across the Country with an increase in under 30s cases. The message from the Director of Public Health is clear. Covid is far from over for any of us and if we are to avoid a second spike this winter, we need to maintain social distancing, wear masks when required and to follow Government advice as it is published.

The problem of A level and GCSE grades is firmly in the headlines as I write. Add in the issues around the reopening of schools for the new academic year, and it is clear that Education is going to dominate the news for some time. Allowing all predicted A level grades to stand rather than relying on a hastily drawn up algorithm looks like the only fair way to treat thousands of youngsters. Using algorithm moderated GCSE grades is also going to produce outcomes riddled with unfairness. It is likely that Schools will have to make judgements on who should take which A levels based on their own estimates of pupils' capabilities.

Now that the HIF (Housing Infrastructure Fund) has been signed off guaranteeing enough money to pay for the new roads around Didcot and the new bridge over the Thames, people are beginning to be concerned about some of the consequences. Will this mean yet more houses? How will the road system in our area in Abingdon, around Culham Bridge and at the Frilford crossroads cope?

The OCC Highways team (many of whom live in the area and are well aware of the issues we all face) are committed to visiting every parish to explain their thinking and their traffic modelling to everyone. I very much hope that all interested residents will be able to attend the presentations. The timetable for the consultation will be announced very soon.

As the lockdown has progressed, the impact on the mental health of all of us is beginning to show itself. Anti social behaviour and domestic violence is on the increase. Unemployment is rising, the economy is badly damaged and all age groups are affected. It is all too easy to become very depressed. And yet, families have shown

enormous resilience to it all, and local communities and Covid Groups have thrived and brought people of all types and all ages closer together than they have been since the last world war. I reckon people are being kinder and more caring towards each other than I ever remember. I wonder how history will treat this period.

Thames Weirs

A number of people, residents and media have contacted me over the appearance of the fence and locked gates beside the footpath by the weirs. As you will realise, this is an ongoing issue, is a Parish issue and I have no wish to complicate things further. I have considered carefully how I could help and have come to the following conclusions.

First, there is no quick solution.

Second, given the potential consequences of legal confrontation, that it might take years to resolve and the only certain beneficiaries would be lawyers and one side only, this route should be avoided.

Third, the best chance of a satisfactory outcome for everyone is to be patient, reasonable and polite.

I have written to the landowner a letter which includes

- a. An apology for the behaviour of a small minority of irresponsible people who have left litter and displayed some antisocial behaviour. This is an undeniable fact. Any other approach, is, in my view, likely to be counterproductive.
- b. A suggestion that a cooling off period is needed.
- c. A further suggestion that we try to negotiate a solution for the future involving restoring some limited public access.

I am aware that this may not work and will take some months at best. I am also aware that what I have said may anger some. However, I honestly feel that this is the best, possibly only option in the circumstances. If a majority disagree, I will step back from the process. I am happy to receive comments (calm and polite please) in support or opposition and will report any progress.

What's in your hand?

September is usually the time when we get back to our normal routines after the summer break. It often feels like a new start — especially for children and young people beginning a new academic year at school, college or university. Remember the new pencil case and new school shoes feeling? But with the current coronavirus pandemic, it's very different this year! We are not sure what schools and universities will look or feel like this year. Some of us might no longer have jobs to go back to after the summer. Some of us might find ourselves in ongoing lockdown. This will be a September like no other.

However, it is still a good time to consider how God can use us to make a real difference in our workplace, at school, amongst our family, friends and community. As Christians we believe that God equips us with everything we need to make His love known.

When God gave Moses the job of bringing the Israelites out of Egypt, He asked the question, 'What is in your hand?' (Exodus 4:2). Moses was holding his staff, which represented his livelihood (what he was good at); his resources (his flock represented his wealth) and his security (which God was asking him to lay down). God asks the same question of us: What has God given you? Our gifts, temperament, experience, relationships, mind, education can be used in the work God has given us to do. How will we use them to make a difference in the places where He calls us to serve Him?

John Ortberg, in his book It All Goes Back in the Box, speaks of Johnny, a 19-year-old with Downs syndrome. He worked at a supermarket checkout putting people's items into bags. To encourage his customers, he decided to put a thought for the day into the bags. Every night his dad would help him to prepare the slips of paper and he would put the thoughts into the bags saying, 'I hope it helps you have a good day. Thanks for coming here.' A month later the store manager noticed that Johnny's line at the checkout was three times longer than anyone else's! People wanted Johnny's thought for the day. He wasn't just filling bags with groceries, he was filling lives with hope!

History of the footpath by the Weirs

My father Samuel Lewis was a builder who was contracted until his death in 1938 to keep the footpath and bridges safe for walkers. The path had been a tow path for horses bringing coal to the Wharf, now a private house.

During the war the lady occupant of Mill House opened the entrance to the island, which became known as 'Sandy Beach', because during wartime no-one had access to the seaside beaches. When UKAE Harwell was established after the war, water was diverted after use down to the Mill House garden, and away towards Wallingford. UKAEA then built a new footbridge entrance to the tow path.






