Recreation Ground refurbishment

Plans for the refurbishment continue. By the time of printing, a consultation event will have taken place. This was an opportunity for

residents to view the plans and vote on some equipment for the play area. Should you not have been able to attend, there is still the opportunity to vote for your equipment choices online. Simply visit the Parish Councils website (www.suttoncourtenay-pc.gov.uk) and click on the recreation ground tab. The link to the survey (along with pictures of the choices are on the "February 2022 consultation" page. The survey should take less than two minutes to complete. The survey will close at noon on Friday 4th March. You can also see the plans and various other related documents on the website.

Fix My Street Super User

Oxfordshire County Council are looking for "Super Users" across the county to help report Highway matters which are their responsibility — such as potholes or damaged kerbstones. Please find below a brief description of the role provided by OCC. If you are interested, please contact the clerk on the details below and she will put you in contact with the County Council.

Oxfordshire County Council created OXTOG – Oxfordshire Together – to mobilise and support a team of volunteers around the County to help look after their own roads, pavements and public rights of way. As part of OXTOG there is a growing team of volunteers known as Fix My Street Super Users.

The Super Users are, in effect, the 'eyes and ears' of the County Council Highways Officers and are trained to report and action certain road repairs, specifically potholes and damaged kerbs, on low-speed, minor roads using Fix My Street.

The Volunteer Co-ordination team at Oxfordshire County Council is currently recruiting more Fix My Street Super Users in this area. The training takes place online in small groups.

COVID comes to town!

It has been a trying term. Parents and carers have seen less of me on the gate this month. This is because I have been teaching a great deal; covering classes due to staff absence. I have had a wonderful month with the children, but trying to manage a full teaching load with my other duties has been a trial at times! The Early Years team has not been complete since the beginning of January due to staff Covid cases. We have all been sustained by the huge positivity and helpfulness of the children and the staff team working together to cover each other, showing true teamwork.

Our wonderful pets!

Our school pets help us to stay positive and support the children's learning in many different ways.

Cessy the school cockapoo continues to delight the children. This week she has visited the Robins class and Kestrels, getting to know these children and encouraging them to read to her. The



children love to talk to her. They also learn to take responsibility for making sure her needs are met. This means keeping her water topped up but also watching her body language carefully so that they can see signs when she is becoming tired or when she wants to play- skills that also help them in their interactions with other humans!



Here is Nutmeg working hard. He was inspiring the Robins children with their writing today. They were acting out the story of 'We're Going On A Carrot Hunt.'! They used the whole school site for their retelling and then came in and wrote their ideas down independently. Our animals can really

help the children's engagement with their learning.

Kestrels class are the proud owners of three stick insects. They are extremely difficult to see! The children can really understand the concept of camouflage by observing these fascinating creatures, who are ideal classroom pets.



In Wrens' aquarium there is a frog called Natterjack, a snail called Shelley, a shrimp called Steven, and a fish called Mr Bean. Every day, the child, or children, who was the Star of the Day the previous day, gets to feed the residents. The children love to watch the movement in the bowl, which is very calming. Once a week, an adult drops some frozen blood worms in to the tank. These specifically feed the

Natterjack, but the children are fascinated that some of the fish show an interest too in these, as does Shelley the Snail.

ABINGDON DAMASCUS YOUTH PROJECT



Throughout February, a small group has been working closely with Discovery College Oxfordshire around dealing with emotions in tricky situations, looking at coping strategies and identifying trigger points. We are so proud of all those who are taking part and will be seeking their feedback at the end of the sessions. Alongside this, we have

worked with Louise manager (a at McDonald's) to provide mental health self-care packs which include lots of sensory calming equipment that help in stressful times. McDonald's is teaming up with BBC's Children in Need to help improve the lives of young people.

COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

For the past 15 years, my colleague, Cllr Bob Johnston of Kennington and Radley has been trying to persuade me to explore Thrupp Lake as a haven of peace and wildlife. This last Valentine's weekend, my wife and I went on a bicycle ride to see if he was right. In spite of the mud and rain, we thoroughly enjoyed the journey and would recommend it to anyone on foot or bicycle. Living next door to Sutton Wick gravel pits, which is still a major active quarry site, as we do, it was great to imagine how our area might look after many years of restoration.

Havens of peace are in short supply in my own area at present. With the threat of the Thames Water Reservoir, whose banks may well cast early evening shadow over Drayton, and the proposed HIF1 Road between Sutton Courtenay and Appleford potentially affecting traffic, noise and air quality in both villages, peace, quiet and wildlife could all become distant memories. The two projects together have a cost tag amounting to billions and dwarf any other projects in the whole of Oxfordshire. It begins to feel that the infrastructure gods have got it in for us. Decisions on both will be made in the next few months.

In the case of the Reservoir, it is important that all those of us who have views on the need and advisability of the scheme should engage with and support GARD* – the group of scientists who believe there are better options, and also respond to the Thames Water consultation. Silence from local residents can be seen as acquiescence by those who wish to see these schemes coming about.

In the case of the HIF1 Road, please engage with your Parish Council and write in to OCC*, the planning authority, with

your views on this scheme. I am aware, from residents who contact me, that there is a great deal of concern over already growing noise disturbance from Appleford Sidings. Few complaints have been received by the environmental health team so far, so please write in to them with your concerns, if you have any. Given the potential addition of noise from the HIF1 Road together with any reverberation from the banks of the proposed flyover, it is essential we have a full understanding of the present baseline noise levels before we inflict any more on local residents.

In the end, it will be the data which decides if, when and how these massive projects go ahead. The more data we can give them, the more we will be heard.

FINDING IT DIFFICULT TO MAKE THE FOOD SHOP LAST UNTIL THE END OF THE WEEK?

Local Foodbanks, Community Larders and the Community Fridge can help make the weekly shop go further, but do you know the difference between them?

There are a number of different organisations locally that can help provide food in these difficult times of increasing prices. In Sutton Courtenay we are fortunate to have access to Foodbanks, Community Larders and a Community Fridge.

Each Foodbank, Community Fridge and Community Larder operates slightly differently so it worth checking their requirements before making contact. Generally, to access a:

- Foodbank a referral is necessary
- Community Fridge NO referral is necessary
- Community Larder NO referral is necessary but a small subscription is payable.

The local Foodbanks work with a variety of local agencies such as Citizens Advice Bureau, Vale Community Impact, schools, housings associations, GPs, social services, Job Centres, churches, local charities, voluntary organisations. If anyone is in contact with any of these organisations and is struggling to put food on the table it is worth asking them for a referral.

Anyone experiencing financial difficulties or other problems can get independent, confidential advice from:

Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) which has offices in Didcot & Abingdon – *telephone 0808 278 7907* (see also pg 12)

Vale Community Impact (VCI) has an office in Wantage - *telephone 01235 765348* or *email help@vci.org.uk*

They will help provide support, give advice on how to maximise your income, help you navigate the benefits system, and identify any additional grants that may be available.

DIDCOT EMERGENCY FOODBANK Telephone 01235 813187 HOW TO GET A REFERRAL

Anyone wanting to access the Didcot Foodbank will need a referral from one of the agencies mentioned above but there should already be a connection with the referrer or those applying should be known to them. Just ask for a Foodbank referral. A voucher will be issued or an email referral made. Parcels can be collected from:

THE MOST IMPORTANT STEP IS TO GET A FOODBANK VOUCHER

HOW TO OBTAIN A FOODBANK VOUCHER

The Abingdon Foodbank works with the local agencies mentioned already mentioned. Each organisation will access what help is needed and issue a foodbank voucher where appropriate either as an electronic referral or in paper form.

ONCE A VOUCHER HAS BEEN ISSUED

A paper voucher can be exchanged for a food parcel at either of the two local centres which are at:

Christ Church, Northcourt Rd, Abingdon, OX14 1PL Tuesdays & Fridays 11am to 1pm

Preston Road Community Centre, Midget Close, Abingdon, OX14 5NR Wednesdays 1pm to 2.30pm

The identity of electronic referrals will be verified at the centre. At the centre, trained volunteers will discuss any dietary needs and see if any other help is available. If anyone is unsure what to do, they can email or call the foodbank for guidance. The foodbank will then put them in touch with a relevant local agency.

COMMUNITY LARDERS Telephone 07377 181472

These are open to everyone. **No referral is needed**. They are low-cost food clubs but other help can be available. They also help to reduce food waste.

Community larder members pay £3.50 or £7 a week for access to 10 or 20 cupboard goods (eg. tins & pasta) and it may be possible to receive unlimited fruit and vegetable too. Each larder operates slightly differently and the food offered usually varies each week, but the prices are the same for all. The nearest larders to Sutton Courtenay are:

Find Life – **Read** in Lent!

Many of us will remember from school days talking about what we would 'give up' for Lent. It was usually chocolate, sweets or biscuits. Lent, being the time between Pancake Day (this year 1st March) and Easter, has become associated with, 'giving up, usually enjoyable things, to become a better person.' It was following Jesus' example of the time he spent in the desert before He began His ministry.

Today there are many articles, books and podcasts about how to become a better person: eat well, rest more, take exercise, meditate, read, do voluntary work, avoid alcohol, be mindful, look at your carbon footprint ... and so on. For many of us, it tugs at something inside. We do want to become better people and leave the world a better place. The list can often feel very daunting, and sometimes we feel guilty for not trying or for failing. Or, if we do achieve it, we can feel superior to others. So, what do we do with these inner 'side-effects' of wanting to be better?

Christians believe that becoming a better person is something that God does for each one of us by His Holy Spirit. He starts in our hearts. This is what happened for Jesus when He was in the desert. He was being challenged about what kind of person He was – where did His identity lie? Was it in what he did (turn stones into bread)? Or what He had (I will give you all the Kingdoms of the world)? Or what others said about Him (do something spectacular – jump off the Temple and come down unharmed)?

Jesus overcame all these temptations because He believed what He was told at his baptism. He is God's Son – loved and accepted for who He is – no self-improvement plan, no achievement necessary. Later in His life, through dying on the Cross and rising again, Jesus offered that gift to us – the gift of becoming a son or daughter of God, loved and accepted. Like a present, it can be received and opened.



Intrigued? Try and read through one of the stories about Jesus told by his friends at the time – Mark, Luke, Matthew or John, on the internet (BibleGateway) or in the Bible, for

Lent! Get a version that you will find easy to read or listen to – there are plenty around, and just enjoy finding out about Jesus through their eyes and see what you think. Many Christians will be doing something similar as we too want to get to know Jesus better this Lent and to remind ourselves of what He did in order to know that we are loved and accepted by God.

May we all become aware of the touch of God's grace and love in our lives this Lent.

CITIZENS ADVICE



Cost of living crisis on the way

Citizens Advice has issued press releases warning that inflationary factors leading to higher food prices and energy bills will cause hardship for many this year. Unavoidably we will be paying much more for essentials (rent or mortgage, food, telephone and broadband,

household bills, Council Tax) by the middle of 2022.

However, much can be done to manage the expected debacle, and setting your own personal budget is a key step. Start preparing now, making a budget and seeing if you can maximise your income. Look closely and objectively at your financial figures – how much comes in every month, how much goes out, so that you have a clear picture of your situation. Take an average over a period of, say, six months, so that quarterly bills are taken into account. Decide what the priorities are and reduce your costs even on essentials if possible. Do remember that inflation will increase your outgoings.

There are various helpful resources which you can take advantage of. Citizens Advice can tell you about fuel vouchers, benefits or government grants and Covid support that might be available, as well as the Household Support Fund, administered by the local district councils of South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse at https://www.southoxon.gov.uk and https://whitehorsedc.gov.uk The Citizens Advice website at https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk has tips on how to reduce your living costs. You can also contact your energy suppliers and ask about affordable options to pay.

If you need more specific support or don't feel able to manage your situation alone, call Citizens Advice for general advice on 0808 278 7907 or the debt helpline on 0800 240 4420.

Money Seized From Criminals by Thames Valley Police Given Back to Communities

£100,000 is being made available for local voluntary and community groups following the sale of items seized by Police in multiple operations, which cannot be returned to their rightful owners.

Thanks to this success, community and voluntary groups are now able to apply for funding to deliver projects that tackle one of the Police and Crime Commissioner's (PCC) Police and Criminal Justice Plan priorities:

- Strong Local Policing (preventing crime & protecting communities)
- Fighting Serious Organised Crime (protecting vulnerable people)
- Fighting Fraud & Cybercrime (fighting modern crimes

"This funding will play a big part in helping voluntary and community groups across the Thames Valley. It will allow them to continue to run projects that play such a big role in preventing crime and protecting our communities.

"As ever, we are particularly keen to receive bids for this money from organisations that support our priority areas."
