The village has three defibrillators. One is located outside the front roller doors of Sutton Courtenay Tyres on the High Street. The second is outside the Football Clubhouse in the Recreation Ground. The third is outside the Fish on Appleford Road.





OLLY GLOVER MP



People who know told me that my first few days as an MP would be like nothing I had ever experienced in my life. Despite a career which has involved many high-

pressured jobs with responsibility for safety-critical railway operations, they were absolutely right.

Day 1 went by in a whirl of briefings. The layout of Parliament; IT setup; how safety and security of MPs is protected.

I have also heard it said that it is like your first few days at school. But at least at school they have some idea of which rooms you should be in and where you can sit. To start off, with there is no dedicated office space available for individual MPs, for the very understandable reasons that many are occupied by those who recently lost their seats in the General Election

Getting used to Westminster is just half the challenge. I now have the privilege of representing nearly 75,000

constituents, and need to quickly create an effective team of support staff to help me do this well.

A major issue for Sutton Courtenay is that of the FCC landfill site and significant odours emanating from it. Local councillors and I have met with the site operators and will continue to hold them to account. They seem confident that works they have done to remove water contaminated with landfill material, and works to prevent this from happening in the future, will lead to a reduction of the odour problem. 

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



Odour Complaints

The Environment Agency (EA) is responding to the number of odour complaints in connection to the operations at the FCC's landfill and composting operation. The high

volume of complaints has resulted in a much-increased attention by the Environment Agency. Residents are requested to continue to report issues to the Environment Agency via 0800 80 70 60 — as it does make a difference.

Since June 2024, the Environment Agency are issuing monthly updates which are available on the news section of the Parish Council's website www.suttoncourtenay-pc.gov.uk. The following is an extract from the August 2024 update: *Next steps*

We expect to (sic) emissions from site to reduce and odour reports to decline over the coming weeks. Our focus has been getting the site compliant and stopping the smell. We haven't ruled out taking further enforcement action for offences related to this incident and breaches of the environmental permit. Any enforcement response we take will be in accordance with our published enforcement and sanctions guidance which you can find on our website.

On Thursday 15th August, FFC invited members of their Community Liaison Group, including Parish Councillors, to attend a site visit to inspect the work being carried out on site to treat and remove the leachate liquid (which is the current cause of the significant increase in odour complaints). FCC informed that the leachate incident occurred primarily as a result of unprecedented rainfall over the 2023/2024 winter which carried on into spring 2024. The parish council will be considering the report of the visit at its September meeting and follow-up with further clarification requests to FCC and the EA.

Grounds maintenance

The Parish Council is continuing to closely monitor the work being completed by our contractor. Many of the problems with delayed cuts and missed sections have been rectified. The current contract includes monthly* cuts of the verges and fortnightly* cuts of Parish Council owned open spaces - the Village Green, All Saints Lane, Old Wallingford Way play area (including the skate park and pump track) and Old Wallingford Way cemetery. (*From March to October inclusively.) The contract specifies that cuttings are to be left on site.

If you notice any areas that are not being cut, please contact the Parish Council via the Clerk (contact details below).

Damaged play equipment

Recent visitors to the Old Wallingford Way Recreation Ground will have noticed damage to the six balance mushrooms and a nearby fence panel. The damage to the fence panel has been identified as vandalism and the Parish Council has arranged for the panel to be replaced.

The balance mushrooms were previously recorded as having excessive movement in the stems which caused them to wobble whilst in use. Following multiple visits from the installers, the problem has not been resolved and several of the mushroom tops were damaged around the same time of the damage to the fence panel. Sadly, at present five of the mushrooms are missing their

tops. Kompan, who manufactured and installed the play equipment has agreed to replace the mushrooms with timber waterlily pads which will provide similar play opportunities for children to balance and step between the pads.





I slid a note under the door of the Plough to make sure they know how I like my stout. Meanwhile, I'm trying to hunt down the erstwhile Queen's Head and the Southport Arms.
