SUTTON COURTENAY DEFIBRILLATORS

The village has three defibrillators. One is located outside the front roller doors of Sutton Courtenay Tyres on the High Street. The second is outside the Football Clubhouse in the Recreation Ground. The third is outside the Fish on Appleford Road.





PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



The New Benches for the Village Green and Church Street

Previously we reported that two wooden benches were coming to the end of their lives and the Parish Council would consider

options at its September meeting. Having heard from a number of residents who asked that the Parish Council replaces the timber benches rather than remove them, new benches have been ordered for the Village Green and at the nearby Church Street bus stop.

The benches will have cast metal ends/supports and recycled plastic slats. The original inscription on the Village Green bench will be reproduced and a plaque added to the bus stop bench to record the original contributors.




New bus shelter for Milton Road

Also on the agenda at the September meeting was the possibility of installing a shelter at the Bradstocks Way bus stop on Milton Road. Due to narrow pavements in the village, most bus stops do not have enough space to accommodate a shelter. That is not the case at this stop and following a number of requests from residents to improve the surface and provide seating the Parish Council has linked up with Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) to make significant improvements at this stop. OCC will fund a new path and hard standing for a shelter. The Parish Council has agreed to cover the purchase and installation of a shelter which will incorporate seating. Below is a photograph to show the type of shelter to be installed (although it will be in the dark green colourway of modern Oxfordshire shelters) and a plan of the proposed location.

The Parish Council will use funding from local developers (Community Infrastructure Levy) for both projects. With the long-term maintenance being covered by the annual precept (the Parish Council's portion of Council Tax).





Grants for 2025-26

The Parish Council is pleased to be able to award grants to local organisations which benefit residents in the parish. The organisation must be a not-for-profit although it does not need to be a registered charity. The Council will consider grant applications for the 2025-26 financial year at a meeting in November. Abingdon Marathon Sunday 20th October 2024 – road closures in Sutton Courtenay

The annual Abingdon Marathon will take place later this month. The race start time is 9am with a 5 hour cut off for runners. Runners are most likely to be passing through Sutton Courtenay between 10:30am and 1:30pm.

The route brings the runners into Sutton Courtenay from Abingdon via Drayton, the north/south section of Milton Road to Milton Park and then heads north via Harwell Road, the High Street, Brook Street, Drayton Road and Peep O Day Lane to Abingdon Rugby Club before looping back around to the complete the section again. OLLY GLOVER MP



Life in Westminster and our constituency continues to be a hive of activity as I'm now in my 3rd month as your MP. I've had the opportunity to raise questions, including at Prime Minister's Question Time, and

contact ministers regarding matters important to you. Some of our residents will be affected by the government's withdrawal of the winter fuel allowance, and I will continue to fight for those least able to bear this cut in their income.

Recently I joined the National Farmers' Union to celebrate the hard work of farmers and growers at their Back British Farming Day. I am proud to celebrate and support the terrific work of our local farmers, especially as we approach Harvest time!

A major concern for the residents of Sutton Courtenay has been the FCC landfill site and significant odours emanating from it. I met with the site operators with local councillors. They seem confident that works they have done to remove water contaminated with landfill material, and works to prevent this from happening in the future, will lead to a reduction of the odour problem, they tell me:

"FCC Environment would like to confirm to residents of Sutton Courtney and the surrounding villages that all leachate has now been removed from the landfill site and temporary capping works are nearing completion which we are confident will remediate the recent odour issues we have been facing on site due largely to the extremely wet weather conditions.

FCC acted swiftly when the problem was encountered and the business has spent £1.4 million on remedial works on site in recent months. We continue to carry out daily monitoring and odour inspections both on site and off site and feedback our investigations for each complaint back to the Environment Agency".

I am pleased to see that the number of complaints about the odours from the FCC landfill site has reduced but I will continue to work with the local councillors and monitor the work carried out by the site operators.

SUTTON COURTENAY VILLAGE HALL

The current trustees of Sutton Courtenay Village Hall (charity number: 300213) have, for some time now, been wishing to stand down from their role as trustees. It is a voluntary role and over the years the duties and responsibilities have increased. For two consecutive years, the trustees have advertised for new trustees but none have been forthcoming.

Additionally, the Village Hall and all its land is an unincorporated charity which means the trustees are personally liable for any adverse event which can damage the charity or any accident where it can be proven that the village trustees were negligent in their duty of care.

The Village Hall is an important community asset and it would be detrimental to community provisions should the charity be closed and the land disposed of. The trustees approached the Parish Council in its role as the custodian trustee of the charity and regular grant provider for advice.

The Parish Council resolved to support the Charity and sought advice from specialist solicitors. The first step is to convert the charity to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), this means there is limited liability. The Parish Council further resolved to become the sole corporate trustee. The CIO constitution allows the Parish Council to set up a committee for the management of the Village Hall (including tennis court and allotments) which can include non-Councillors with full voting rights.

As the new Sutton Courtenay Village Hall CIO will have its own identity there is the possibility that in the future the charity will no longer need the Parish Council to be the trustee and individual trustees could be appointed.

PETER STEVENS - DISTRICT & COUNTY COUNCILLOR

Hi all, it is with pleasure that I write my first column for the monthly magazine. I apologise upfront for the late start — I was elected councillor back at the end of June, and then promptly went on holiday with my family, followed by the normal summer holidays through to the end of August, which has meant that I am only really coming up to speed now in September. However, I have now attended the council meetings for all of the six parishes in my division, as well as sitting on two full county council meetings and three committees that scrutinise council work. Public life as a councillor is quite different from my normal work, with lots of wordy reports to read and more formalities – but more formal for the good reason to ensure everyone gets their democratic say - so worthwhile and rewarding.

In terms of news, we are waiting to hear about the new HIF road and bridge across the Thames in between Appleford and Sutton Courtenay. I spent a lot of time over the summer trying my best to help resolve issues with school buses which have faced considerable challenges over the holidays to prepare for the new school year. I visited the massive landfill site in between the two villages, where I saw what action is being taken to prevent bad smells re-occurring from leachate problems over the past year, and I have asked to visit the waste transfer site there to find out what they are doing to minimise their impact on us.



I am trying to support the new pavilion for the football club at Milton through planning difficulties. I will be trained on the legalities of planning before being allowed to join the county planning committee in November, where I will then scrutinise plans for the landfill site, gravel pits, waste transfer stations, the HIF road, and other infrastructure and large new local developments, to try to get the best deal for local residents and optimise long term outcomes for communities.

At county, district, and parish level, we objected to Thames Water and their proposed SESRO mega reservoir, and I continue to feed into the consultation to improve their strategic plans for the Thames, improving resilience to flooding, harnessing flood waters, stopping leaks, stopping sewage spills, and improving water recycling, as well as safeguarding water supplies.

This week, I am going to meet the county highways team at Marcham to discuss improving the roads, and to find out what steps they are taking to make the repairs to pot holes last longer and be more resilient to the climate changes increasing their prevalence.

I am also being briefed on the master plan to redevelop the Dalton barracks next to Abingdon, and will find out more about the new Joint Local Plan ahead of next month.

More next month, until then enjoy the last of the summer sun.



Autumn is a season of change, but still holds to traditions. The Michaelmas Fair springs to mind. This was a hiring fair for agricultural workers and an essential part of rural life in the past. LETTER FROM A VILLAGE NEWCOMER

Dear Liza

So, the woods are blazing crimson and gold, the paths are adorned with conkers, the swallows have absconded... and the Aunt Sally season is over for another year. Good to my word, I've been learning the ropes. I won't tell you where, because some of my early sighters flew over the backing and peppered the car park, but I can say that this game distils the agony and ecstasy of sport into its purest form.

The general idea is you throw sticks at a 'dolly', held waisthigh on a metal stand. Our forebears had the dolly mocked up as an old woman's head, so we can all pat ourselves on the back for not doing that, (much as it might have excused my inaccuracy). It's a fine thing to settle yourself at the oche as the heir to such a rich tradition. Parking Penalty Charge Notice:

Please Pay a parking penalty charge notice (PCN) issued by a local council.




