

Post Office

The Post Office Authorities have advised the Parish Council that as from 26th March a new Post Office service opened in Sutton Courtenay. This is now operating from a newly formatted open plan counter at Burgrey Stores in the High Street. The service will offer a range of key Post Office products alongside retail transactions. The opening hours are Mon-Fri 05.30 - 19.00, Sat 06.00 - 17.30, and Sun 06.30 - 13.00.

Local Government Boundary Commission - Vale of White Horse District Council wards

A review is about to take place as to number of District Councillors and the wards that they represent, as the Vale of White Horse District Council wishes to reduce the number of councillors that it has. The aim will be to ensure that each councillor represents approximately the same number of electors, based on estimated population figures as at 2018. Currently the Sutton Courtenay and Appleford Ward has more electors per councillor than recommended. The Commission will invite comments in due course, and will publish draft recommendations. It is proposed that whatever is finally agreed will be implemented from the next District Council election in 2015.

Vale of White Horse District Council - Interim Housing Supply Policy

As mentioned in the February issue, the Vale of White Horse District Council has a draft Interim Housing Supply Policy, which if adopted by full Council in May, will encourage proportionate housing development in sustainable locations. The District Council has invited possible housing sites to be submitted for assessment. In Sutton Courtenay 6 sites have been put forward for screening, - 2 sites north of Milton Road, land at Peewit Farm, land at Cross Trees Farm, land south of the former Catholic Church site, and land at Long Barn, High Street. After approval was given for 140 houses at the Amey site in Appleford Road, the District Council acknowledged that the final policy would need to take into account that planning consent. The matter will be considered by the Parish Council at its next meeting.

Power Station

The Didcot Community Forum has been asking local residents about what they would like to see on the Didcot "A" power station site once it is decommissioned. The Parish Council has pointed out that the power station site is in Sutton Courtenay and the Vale of White Horse district and not in South Oxfordshire Council's area. Matters are at a very early stage and there will be plenty of opportunity to comment, but if anyone has any ideas at the moment about possible future uses of the Didcot "A" site, then please let the Parish Council know.

Grass Cutting season

As grass cutting season gets underway, please ensure that grass clippings are disposed of properly. In the past, there have been clippings tipped in Doctors Lane, in the recreation ground and on rural paths. Please help to keep the village tidy by placing garden waste in the brown bins available from the Vale of White Horse District Council or take it to the local recycling centre at Drayton. Parish Councillors and other volunteers clear up after residents who just dump garden waste, so please act responsibly and dispose of waste correctly.

HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

Residents need to be aware of the Vale of the White Horse District Council's IHSP (Interim Housing Supply Policy) where landowners were asked for any land for potential housing development.

In the Sutton Parish there are 6 potential Sites which could see approx 185 - 200 houses. This, plus the Amey and Catholic Church Sites already allocated could take the total up to approx 400 houses. This increases the buildings in the village by some 20%.

The Sites earmarked are:

- 1. Peewit Farm adjacent field
- 2. The farm and accompanying land adjacent to the Recreation Ground
- 3. Long Barn to Westbrook
- 4 & 5. Behind Milton Road 2 sites
- 6. Extension of the Catholic Church site/2 areas

This is the biggest potential development in 60 years. Bigger in total than the estate. It also needs to be noted that this also happening in

Drayton – potential 532 houses

Milton - potential 145 houses

Approximately 5000 in the Vale shared between other villages.

The whole infrastructure within the village is suffering now and this will be greatly increased in the form of traffic, sewerage etc. The other issue is development into the open countryside.

The Total potential amount of houses with in 5 miles of Sutton Courtenay (including the Didcot developments) is likely to be well in excess of 10,000 houses.

I doubt very much that the majority of these new houses will be "affordable" which is what is really needed by people these days

FROM ED VAIZEY MP

I thought it might be interesting to let you know the main subjects about which people write to me. In March, I received about 100 e-mails calling for changes in the Budget (mainly fuel duty); I also received over 250 emails from the 38 Degrees Campaign on the Health Bill. Most of my e-mails come from campaign groups but the issue on which I have received the most personally written emails has been gay marriage.

The Diamond Jubilee will be a wonderful opportunity to celebrate not just Her Majesty's amazing reign but also all that is best about South Oxfordshire. I am sure many people are preparing for the Bank Holiday Weekend in June as I am (I am especially pleased my birthday is a bank holiday – long overdue recognition!). I also wanted to raise awareness of the new Jubilee Time Capsule project. The JTC is a unique and accessible digital project which invites people of all ages to share memories and stories of the last 60 years and it will be gifted to the Queen at the end of the year. It is a great way of engaging with the Jubilee celebrations and I encourage everyone, but particularly schools, to get involved at http://www.jubileetimecapsule.org/.

There are also many other cultural celebrations of the Jubilee around the constituency – Faringdon, for example, is holding a Craft Competition, Wallingford is having a big picnic in castle gardens, Didcot is having the Diamond of Didcot Awards in their new garden at the Civic Hall and Wantage and Grove have teamed up for a massive celebration across both towns.

Last year the National Citizens' Service pilot scheme took 8,400 teenagers on a course of helping the local community and personal development activities. This summer the scheme is hoping to expand its participation to 30,000 teenagers who will spend a fortnight adventuring away from home and then a three to four week stretch in the local community, where they will develop social action projects to benefit their area and see them through to completion. Aside from the enormous good that it does for local communities it also helps the graduates. After completing the scheme 96% of graduates felt more confident and 86% felt more responsible for their local area, plus 90% of the parents would recommend the programme to others. I heartily recommend this scheme to schools, parents and teenagers alike and you can find out more by visitingwww.direct.gov.uk/ncs.

The continuing rise in unemployment is concerning, however, out of 650 UK constituencies, we rank 609th for unemployment with 1,242 people out of work – less than 2.5%. This rate is so low due to the supportive local environment for small local businesses – those ones that need every scrap of help they can get in these tough times. I was pleased, therefore, to hear about the launch of the Small Business Finance Directory which should help make it easier for such companies to find credit. The directory allows companies to search by region for alternatives to conventional bank loans and overdrafts. There are nearly 1000 sources of finance listed and I believe that it could prove a very effective tool for local business.

Finally I'd like to bring people's attention to the Big Lottery Fund which has awarded grants totalling over £25 million in the South East since January 2011 to over 1,000 projects including two in the constituency: Marcham C of E Primary School and Project Inspire, a plan to convert Fernham village church so it could also be used for community activities. I would encourage local projects to consider applying for National Lottery funding here (http://ask.biglotteryfund.org.uk).

From the Ministry Team...

Life after Death Watch Beetle – On-going Improvement plans for All Saints

Structurally, the Church is now in good shape and work to dry the walls, improve ventilation and renew the rainwater pipes is completed. It has also stopped Death Watch Beetle activity in the roof. These considerable achievements mean that we may now turn our attention to other areas where the Church facilities fall short. The PCC considers these to be:

Heating The Nave Dais Toilet facilities "Welcome" space and Storage

A Junior Church and Community Meeting Room

Heating

With advice from English Heritage and the Diocesan Advisory Committee, quotations for a gas fired hot water radiator system have been obtained. This type of system is now widely used in Churches, local examples being Milton, Drayton and Dorchester Abbey with very positive recommendations from their communities. The installation cost of about £70,000 will be sweetened by much lower running costs. We are on schedule to install this at the end of August (through September).

Nave Dais

An application to make the present trial arrangements permanent is with the DAC. It is proposed to remove the side facing pews on the N side, to level the whole area and to fit new carpet up to the Altar. This will make it more flexible in use both for services and concerts. This work will be done in conjunction with the Heating project, so that pipes may be run underneath.

Storage and Welcome Space

A shed is being obtained in which to store our ladders and staging, thereby releasing space at the SW corner. It is proposed to remove the Victorian pews from the rear side aisle and to make the floor level. The chairs will be hidden behind a screen using timber from the redundant pews on the dais. There will be wall space for photographs, Church news and information.

Junior Church and Community Meeting Room

Plans have been drawn up to improve our inadequate toilet, kitchen and meeting facilities by extending the present Kitchen Vestry outwards and sideways. This new room would be large enough for Junior Church and for meetings. It will have 2 toilets leading off it, one for disabled. A soundproof sliding partition will separate the two areas which when open will provide a spacious area for larger meetings and social gatherings. The kitchen facilities will remain in the Kitchen Vestry.

We do hope you will agree that this is a worthwhile set of proposals which will enhance the life of the Church and ensure that we can continue to serve the community into and beyond the 21st century. They won't all happen at once [except for the heating] – this is very much a 5 year plan. Comment, criticism and offers of help will be welcomed by David Knowles, Chairman of the Fabric Committee or any member of the PCC.

And finally, we shall have to be creative and raise money so to this end we are launching an appeal towards the installation of the heating system on Thursday 3rd May at 7.30pm in the Great Hall of the Abbey (see advert for more details) With love and prayers, Helen

REST IN PEACE

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following people who have died recently.

LAWRENCE MICHAEL RYAN who has died aged 61. A private family funeral was held at Oxford Crematorium on 2nd March 2012.

CYRIL JAMES HARRIS (TRIMMER) who has died aged 80 was born in Harwell in 1931 – the youngest child of William and Louise Harris. The family moved to Milton Road in Sutton Courtenay where he spent most of his childhood and attended school in the village. The origins of his nickname, 'Trimmer' are lost in the mists of time but he seemed always to have been called that and very few people knew he was called Cyril. On leaving school he worked as a labourer on various building sites and over the years he worked for Ameys, mixing asphalt, for the road building industry – an ideal job for Trimmer as it started early in the morning and finished early – allowing plenty of time for him to go fishing. He also worked as a farm labourer. He was always very good at fixing and mending things and liked nothing better than tinkering with cars but he was a countryman at heart and one of his particular pleasures was fishing and catching eels in the Thames. He loved the river and, later in life borrowed a small boat which he converted so that could get from Sutton Courtenay to Abingdon to have a drink in the pub. For many years poaching was another occupation as he always said he could earn more from selling his catches to the big houses than he could whilst working as a labourer. In 1998 he moved to Abingdon and in 2002 he had a leg amputated but could still manage to get to the pub in his wheelchair and then a mobility scooter. He enjoyed nothing better than a drink and a smoke with friends. After further surgery he died on 5th March 2012. This is an edited extract of the address given at his funeral by the Reverend Helen Kendrick in All Saints' Church on 14th March 2012.

ANTHONY WILLIAM CURRAN (TONY) who has died aged 77 on 7th March 2012 was born on 6th April 1934 in Spring Road, Abingdon to his parents Minnie and Bernard Curran. He grew up on the Harwell Road, Sutton Courtenay with his brothers and sister - Francis, Josie and Philip. He was a bit of a lad and often got into various scrapes. He even had a near death experience when he fell into the River Thames and almost drowned but his life was saved by a soldier who pulled him out. He attended St Edmund's School in Abingdon, which he left in 1949 when he started work in the greenhouses at Milton Hill House (the Esso Headquarters) where he stayed for three years before joining the Royal Artillery in June 1952. He was sent to Egypt to the Suez Canal Zone until he returned home in 1955 and he was proud of belonging to the Canal Zoners, the Suez Vets and the Royal British Legion and took great pleasure in attending reunions. On his return from Egypt he worked for H Linegar until 1966 when he joined 'Premix' at Ameys. He later transferred to Ameys Ashphalt as a long distance lorry driver. After several years he went to work for South Oxfordshire District Council where he was put to work training the young unemployed boys in the Youth Training Scheme. Much to his surprise he really enjoyed this and was very proud of the young lads he taught building skills to. He took early retirement at the age of 60. He married Sylvia in St Edmund's Roman Catholic Church in Abingdon on 25th August 1956 and the first year of their married life was spent living with Tony's family until they moved to 30 Tyrrells Way where they were the first to move into the estate which was still being built around them. Sylvia and Tony went onto bring up their family of four - Sue, Micky, Martin and Clive which has continued to grow through the generations with grandchildren and great-grandchildren. In 1979 Sylvia and Tony were founder members of the Country and Western Club with their great friends, John and Ann Tolly which they ran for 25 years until illhealth forced them to retire. He served for many years on the Village Hall Committee and, using his practical skills, was involved in its maintenance. In later years his deteriorating physical health was immensely frustrating for him. He found it difficult to sit back and watch other people do the jobs he felt he should be doing and that he always felt he could do better. Straight talking, stubborn, obstinate and determined – he loved a challenge and held firm opinions on every subject which he wasn't afraid to share. Continued.....

ANTHONY WILLIAM CURRAN (TONY) *continued....* He knew his own mind and in an argument was never wrong – and even when he was wrong he was always right! This could sometimes be very challenging for those around him. He was a man with a strong work ethic – often working seven days a week when his children were young in order to provide for them all. He cared deeply for this village – its history and its community – and, as with some of his generation, he found some of the changes he witnessed difficult. He was a man who enjoyed his life and who will be greatly missed by his family and friends. *This is an edited extract of the address and tribute given at his funeral by the Reverend Helen Kendrick which was held at All Saints' Church, on 15th March 2012.*



SUTTON COURTENAY ANGLING CLUB

The End of the Season

The 15th March to the 15th of June are a tough time for the dedicated river angler as these are the months of the closed season. Anglers argue about the necessity for this period. The Environment Agency and the Scientific argument is that fish need uninterrupted time for spawning, making fishy babies that is. There is an interesting counter argument based on class and politics. In summary coarse fishing is a "working class" sport and fly fishing is a sport of the "upper classes". The writer is a fisherman by inclination but an historian by training he is aware that these terms are complicated. It is argued that the closed season is merely a device created by the well connected toffs to keep hairy oiks away from the rivers during the best part of the salmon and trout seasons. The fact that many canals and lakes do not have a closed season would seem to back up this argument.

It seems best that fish are given a break when spawning takes place especially when environmental conditions make it pretty hard for fish to manage to reproduce anyway. Lack of clean, clear water is a problem. The silting of gravel beds where many fish need to lay eggs can also be a problem and the predatory ravages of the introduced species of crayfish, who love fish eggs all affect chances to spawn. Look out for spawning fish over the next few months. Some fish come in very close to the bank to lay eggs on gravel or onto weed. Large female pike are surrounded by the much smaller males vying for attention.

So closed season advice is that there are plenty of good canals and commercial lakes around for a fishing fix. Oxfordshire is home to some of the best carp fisheries in the country. Linear Fisheries and Orchid Lakes are both nearby for big fish chasers and the Oxford Canal is a pleasant day out where you can fish with very limited equipment.

The Rivers are currently in the closed season. Anyone spotted fishing should be reported to the environment agency **0800 80 70 60**or the police.

In season the Sutton Courtenay Angling club would like to welcome anyone who wants to fish in the Thames but also to remind everyone that an Environment Agency permit and a Sutton Courtenay club ticket are necessary before you fish. Day tickets and season tickets ($\pounds 28$) are available at **Didcot Angling Centre** on Wantage Road and environment agency rod licences are available online and at the Post Office. Junior prices are considerably less.

BIRD WATCHER

One afternoon in early March we were walking on the landfill site when we saw a Red Kite floating around, easily recognisable by the forked tail which is used for steering. The Kite suddenly started to chase two Black Headed Gulls, which flew away. Then it attacked one of the Mallard Ducks which was swimming on the pond, attacking in the same way that Ospreys catch fish. There was a big splash and the Kite flew away, realising that a fully grown duck was too big to tackle. I consulted the local expert who suggested that the Kite was young and experimenting to see what could be tackled and what could not. Normally Kites are looking for an easy meal, preferably dead.

They will take small rodents and rabbits live, but are mainly scavengers. In Elizabethan times they were very common in large towns such as London, where the method of rubbish disposal was to throw it in the street.

In January and February the Skylarks began to sing regularly as they laid claim to their territories. I noticed three fighting near the Milton Road.

In early March I saw that some of the Black Headed Gulls had developed the black head which gives them their name. This is the breeding plumage. For the rest of the year it returns to a black spot on each side of the head behind the eye.

MY DAILY WINGED VISITORS

I would just like to say what a brilliant time of year it is for the wild birds visiting our gardens and I would like to share some of my sightings with you. I feel so lucky this year to be able to look out of my back garden and see such a spectacular array of different species during the day, but oh what time wasters they are! I've only got to see something move and out comes the binoculars.

Last year we had a family of woodpeckers nesting next door and to see and hear the babies flying about was a delight. Earlier this year we had the Green Woodpecker and now have the Lesser Spotted ones visiting 2 to 3 times a day, along with a family of partridge which started of as 18 but sadly gets smaller by the week and has now dwindled down to around 8 but still facinating to watch scuttering around the garden in between the shrubs and carefully onto the lawn into the open. There always seems to be a look out and if it senses danger, then thats it, off they go flying across the field until tomorrow.

I was also looking at 6 to 8 tiny birds which landed onto our bird feeders the other day, beautiful little things with long tails, cream and pale pink on their delicate bodies. After looking them up on the internet it seems that they are Long Tailed Tits. Never seen these before but then neither have I seen the little yellow ones which again are in a group of 4 to 6 and join my chickens daily for their feed and sit up in the trees above the rest of the day. On looking closer at these (sadly, found one dead near the chicken run) it seems they resemble Yellow Hammers, which again wonderful to have them visit my garden.

Then there was a smallish hawk off some kind which landed ontop of my fence, it sat there so still, just looking around, I couldn't move quick enough to get my binocluars and after I had a good look at him he seemed to take off in slow motion so I could take a good look at his wonderful feathers.

Theres numerous of other little birds just like the ones in your gardens, the Blue Tits, Chaffinchs, Robins, Doves, Sparrows, Thrush, then we have the Pheasants proudly walking about then bringing a smile to my face as they sprint across the lawn at the slightest noise or movement, a flock of Redwings come and cover the lawns at least twice a week, a nightly visit from a Tawny Owl, which did sound a bit eerie the first couple of times I heard it but now so used to it's cry I've come to miss it if it's not around. And not to mention the gathering of ducks every evening, again landing down with the chickens for their supper.

'Mr and Mrs' are the names we have given to a pair that come and land on our pond every year since we moved in, we know it's the same two because after their swim they cheekingly know, that if they come to the glass door looking for us they'll get fed. Last year they thanked us with 9 beautiful ducklings, she'd sat there for weeks under our walnut tree. Mind you, the stress and sleepless nights!!! For weeks while she sat on those eggs in the quite of night all alone in the dark and the shear thought of a fox or some other creature getting her was awful. But with a little help from a human they all made it out of my garden across the field and into the river. And yes, yesterday Mr and Mrs returned to our pond to let us know that they are still alive and together!
