POST OFFICE SERVICES

SUTTON COURTENAY DEFIBRILLATORS

The village has three defibrillators. One is located outside the front roller doors of Sutton Courtenay Tyres on the High Street. The second is outside the Football Clubhouse in the Recreation Ground. The third is outside the Fish on Appleford Road.

There will also be tree works at the Recreation Ground although the work there will not affect the parking area or access to the facilities.


Parish Council Budget for 2025-26

The Parish Council has agreed the budget for the forthcoming financial year. The new budget includes provision for the employment of a new member of staff (part-time) from the autumn. This has resulted in an increase in the precept (the Parish Council's share of Council Tax) of £9,200 which means a Band D property household would be paying an additional £4.11 for the year (the total being £76.09).

My warmest wishes for the New Year. It was wonderful to join in local social and festive occasions such as the switching on of Christmas lights.

Before parliament ended, I was able to address ministers about important matters. These included: how local communities can benefit from clean energy schemes, the need for improvements in services provided by coroners following the sudden deaths of those with epilepsy, and the need to address electoral reform. Some responses were more helpful than others!

I spoke in debates about the problems faced by those with disabilities, shared concerns raised by poor estate management, and championed the BBC (which I am sure many of us watched and listened to over Christmas).

The Transport Select committee meet to hold the Department of Transport to account. Two key areas discussed have been rail services and infrastructure, and the backlog of driving tests, which so many constituents have aired concerns about. Flooding remains a significant concern. I chaired a meeting with Thames Water and the local councils to facilitate working together. I will continue to provide updates about this vital piece of work as we need to see real improvements.

Over the winter months, I have been updated about the FCC site. I continue to monitor the situation, and I'm grateful for the work Peter Stevens continues to do. I'm sure many of you now know this, but if there are further odour issues, please report them to the Environment Agency's hotline via 0800 80 70 60.

PETER STEVENS DISTRICT & COUNCILLOR

We are in the midst of winter with a very cold snap just past; but now, as I write, it is currently unseasonably mild and dry, which is a relief. I saw the County's special pothole filling machine pass my home last week. It is an excellent invention, as it allows workmen to fill potholes on the go, literally taking minutes per pothole, avoiding the need for road closures, and enabling the team to do whole roads in a day. I watched as they repaired some terrible holes close to my home. A mobile arm in front of the truck is positioned over the hole, then there is a blast of fire which heats up and melts the surrounding tarmac. The truck then moves forward and drops a fresh hot tarmac mix in the hole, then finally the roller at the back of the truck compresses the tarmac, binding it to the heated surrounding tarmac and levelling it off. Two men control traffic around the truck for the 2-3 minutes this takes, then the truck moves on to the next hole up the road. I don't think the repairs are any more resilient than the old method, so holes may recur in time, but at least this repairs the roads much more quickly – it is a pleasure to see in action.

The county has also upgraded its road-salting fleet and facilities this winter, with 10,000 tonnes of salt, 30 vehicles and 60 drivers serving the county. Much of this runs from Drayton Depot and I regularly see the drivers stoically salting 1,200 miles of roads across the county on icy nights.

Last weekend, I joined a group of local residents to walk the paths between Sutton Courtenay, Appleford and Didcot, noticing that many are in poor condition, or are unsightly or unpassable. I also saw the extensive work FCC and Heidelberg are doing to manage the landfill, leachate issues, waste recycling and materials operations between our villages. This was in preparation for chairing the liaison committee on Monday, where they are held to account for being good neighbours and are asked to outline their plans for future operations, and for the land after they have finished. I intend to work with them and local parties to improve the area's paths for access and for leisure, and to ensure future plans respect our local environment and balance our needs against commercial or wider objectives.

The biggest plan locally is the new HIF1 road and the bridge over the Thames between Sutton Courtenay and Appleford which will enable traffic to travel more easily and quickly from the A415 at Culham to Didcot and on to the A34. This was given planning permission just before Christmas after several years of deliberation by the Secretary of State. The project now moves to detailed design, with more consultation locally to mitigate remaining concerns as much as possible, before starting work in 2026 with a planned completion date of early 2028. I know opinion is divided on the road, depending on where you live and travel. However, the road does provide an opportunity to improve local routes for cycling and walking such as over Sutton Bridge to Culham and the Europa School, as well as diverting HGVs and heavy traffic away from smaller roads. It will also do much to accommodate the extra traffic from all the new and planned developments around Didcot in order to minimise the adverse impact of these builds on our communities. It is well intentioned.

Lastly, the government is currently engaging with local councils to devolve power away from Westminster. Both County and Vale of White Horse District councils have expressed support, as in theory locally devolved decisions mean that they are more likely to better suit our local communities. However, it is not yet clear what this means or how it will work, so I will report back in due course as it becomes clearer.

In the meantime, wrap up warm, check your homes and pipes are insulated, and good luck weathering out the winter months. The council publishes a Snow Guide, which may be helpful.

Dear Friends,

As I write this, the church is in the season of Epiphany. Sandwiched

between Christmas and Easter, it would be easy to overlook this part of the church calendar. However, Epiphany includes the celebration of two significant events from the Bible: the baptism of Christ and Jesus' first miracle.

The baptism symbolises the start of the ministry of Jesus, a point at which 'heaven was opened' with the Holy Spirit descending and the voice of God proclaiming Jesus to be God's son. Soon after that the first miracle happened. It took place at a wedding in Cana in Galilee where Jesus turned water into wine. I cannot promise any wine-related miracles, but I can guarantee a reminder of how God is with us wherever our journey takes us.




We're conducting site surveys and ground investigations in the local area, including near Steventon, East Hanney, Drayton, and Sutton Courtenay. You may see our surveyors conducting various investigations, such as winter bird surveys and traffic surveys.

We're also carrying out a clay compaction trial on land off Hanney Road, near East Hanney, to support our reservoir design plans. We have begun excavating the clay to build temporary embankments up to three metres high to test the clay. We're aiming to finish by February 2025, weather permitting.

WILD OXFORDSHIRE

January News – Hedgerow Highways

Hedges are a vital part of our local nature, providing shelter and resources for many species of mammals, insects, and birds (from hibernating hedgehogs to the smallest of beetles). They're crucial wildlife corridors that allow safe travel between isolated habitats.

The benefits that hedgerows provide for biodiversity are endless. In a heavily fragmented landscape, hedgerows link up valuable habitats for wildlife such as woodland, grassland and ponds. This connects populations that would otherwise be isolated and vulnerable and allows relocation to better habitat. Over 100 priority species utilise hedgerows for a variety of reasons such as for shelter, food, or navigation. Birds and small mammals nest in hedges, bats use hedgerows as foraging grounds and navigational markers, and reptiles hide in the long tussocky margins associated with hedgerows.

November through to March is the best time of year to plant new hedges. The first step is to acquire your roots. In Oxfordshire we recommend planting Blackthorn, Spindle, Buckthorn, Guelder Rose, Hawthorn, Wild Privet, Cherry Plum, or Hazel. Plant 4 or 5 plants per metre, about 25cm apart using the slit planting method, ensuring all fibrous roots are completely buried in the soil. To see a detailed tutorial of this planting method, head to our website where you can watch a demonstration from expert Nigel Adams. www.wildoxfordshire.org.uk/guidance/hedgerows-guidance

Aftercare for hedgerows is crucial. Keep weeds and grass away from the hedge plants for the first 2-3 years to give them plenty of space to absorb moisture and light. Thoroughly water the plants during dry spells. Compost can be very helpful to maintain vigour due to the competition for nutrients between such closely situated plants. Try to trim your hedge annually in the first three to five years to encourage bushy growth. Once your hedgerow is fully established (approximately 5 years) you can trim every year or every two or three years but make sure you don't trim your hedge to the same place every cut. More detailed aftercare information is also available on our website. Good luck with your new hedges!

His funeral took place on Wednesday 11th December 2024 in All Saints' Church.




