## **OLLY GLOVER MP**



Given the awful weather we had in January, I was so sorry to see how some constituents once again faced flooding or the threat of it. I have been in contact with our local councils to ensure the concerns of constituents who

contact me are heard.

It has been a busy month in Parliament, with the opportunity to speak up and debate local, national and, indeed, international issues. In the Didcot and Wantage constituency, I am serving both urban and rural communities, but many of the topics debated affect constituents wherever they live. I voted in favour of support for the women affected by the changes to retirement in the WASPI Bill; in favour of the Climate and Nature Bill (which so many of you contacted me about); and the Sunshine bill that requires new homes to be fitted with solar panels at the outset. I have asked questions about the shortage of medication for those with epilepsy, ADHD and Parkinson's Disease. I was also able to applaud the work of small post offices whilst arguing they need more support.

Education has featured heavily this month; with debates about the critical need to improve the services for children and young people with special needs. I enjoyed my visits to local schools where I heard from the hard-working staff of their concerns and difficulties but also saw the difference they are making. The young women at Didcot Girls School gave me a grilling as challenging as any I have seen in parliament! I was also able to sing the praises of Bikeability this month; a scheme in many of our schools that teaches children to cycle safely. While the work in Parliament is serious, there can be lighter moments – and so I was pleased to squeeze in a mention of the divisive matter of mayonnaise on chips whilst discussing the merits of Belgium, Switzerland and Norway! Much closer to home, I have met constituents in my surgery as well as spending time in the constituency hearing their concerns, and more importantly trying to resolve them where I can. Affordable housing, challenges around the management of new housing estates and transport infrastructure feature heavily, although I was pleased to see the Milton Park Local Development Order come into fruition, and the new cycling and transport infrastructure put in place.

Unsurprisingly, I have been contacted by many residents concerned about the Chancellor's recent statement and her very public support for the planned reservoir. I continue to push for a public inquiry – the anguish of those affected by flooding and the rise in water bills is a clear signal that Thames Water does not have the trust of those of us living locally.

My team and I continue to serve constituents in addressing a wide range of personal matters. Please contact me if you need support or would like to meet or wish to invite me to a local event (I can't make them all but I try to fit in as many as I can)!

## Call for volunteers to set up a Sutton Courtenay Path Maintenance Volunteers Group

The Parish Council is very aware of the importance and need to maintain parish footpaths as they form a vital part of our parish's amenities.

Oxfordshire County Council's Countryside Access team is responsible for maintenance of Public Rights of Way in Oxfordshire. Due to Oxfordshire County Council's limited budget for the maintenance of Oxfordshire's Public Rights of Way a measure of self-help may be needed from us as a community, in addition to active and timely reporting of issues.

# Access to information and reporting problems on our footpaths

A map of the Public Rights of Way in our parish can be viewed at: publicrightsofway.oxfordshire.gov.uk/standardmap.aspx and search 'Sutton Courtenay' under parish. There is a facility to report problems on routes. All reports are acknowledged and updates provided by the Countryside Access team.

You can also view a listing of the Public Rights of Way with descriptions at

www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/residents/environment-and-

planning/countryside/countryside-access/public-rights-

way/public-rights-way-online Select the file 'S' from the list labelled 'Definitive Statements by parish'. Our parish reference is 373.

A limited picture of some of the local footpaths is reproduced opposite – a greater magnification and wider area can be viewed through the Oxfordshire County Council website that will display each footpath with its identifier (format - parish reference/footpath number/section number). Path furniture such as gates, signage and stiles can also be viewed on the interactive map.

#### Initiatives by the Ramblers Association

The Parish Council has been investigating voluntary schemes for the regular maintenance of footpaths, currently setup across the county, and have contacted the Ramblers Association.

#### (a) Voluntary Path Clearance Groups

Discussions were held with the coordinator for the Vale Path Volunteers which is the footpath maintenance team of the Vale of White Horse Ramblers Group. Vale Path Volunteers are a group of volunteers who work with the approval of the Oxfordshire County Council Countryside Access team. They clear vegetation, such as brambles and tree branches, which obstruct the use of the Public Rights of Way in the Vale of White Horse District Council area.

The Vale Path Volunteers coordinator kindly came out to walk some of the footpaths in Sutton Courtenay. His verdict was, 'currently, the paths walked are not sufficiently restricted by vegetation to warrant a visit by the Vale Path Volunteers, but I am sure that in time they will be. When you feel that vegetation is close to causing a problem, please let me know, and I will conduct a recce with a view to arranging a work session by the Vale Path Volunteers'. However, it should be borne in mind that this is a small voluntary group that covers the whole of the Vale and there may be long waiting times before our requests could be serviced. Remedial work needed to improve the surface of the footpaths is not within the remit of these volunteer groups.

A person wishing to join the Vale Path Volunteers does not have to be a member of the Ramblers Association. However, they would be expected to participate in all Vale Path Volunteers activities, not just those related to one specific location, such as Sutton Courtenay.

#### (b) Parish Path Warden scheme

The Ramblers Association also have a Parish Path Warden scheme run by Oxfordshire Ramblers (in partnership with Oxfordshire County Council and others). It is volunteerbased and co-ordinated, on behalf of Oxfordshire County Council, by the Oxfordshire Ramblers Association.


The purpose of the Parish Path Warden scheme is to keep Oxfordshire's Public Rights of Way open for easy use by reporting any path problems e.g. vegetation overgrowth, difficult stile, locked gate, collapsing footbridge, path not made good after ploughing etc. This does involve walking all the paths at least once each in summer and winter. The Parish Path Warden is given a large scale (1:10,000) map of the parish, which contains details of all the Public Rights of Way, including their reference numbers. The scheme helps in developing a strong working relationship the Oxfordshire County Council Countryside Access team who organise an annual meeting for all Wardens to give an update and discuss any generic issues. A parish can have more than one Parish Path Warden.

# Setting up a volunteer group for path clearance in Sutton Courtenay

The Ramblers Association provides guidance and training for those who would like to set up a footpath clearance group. The coordinator of the Vale Path Volunteers group has offered to provide advice and guidance as needed. There is a range of information on the Ramblers Association website including Risk Assessments, Code of Practice, and advice regarding equipment, ranging from saws and loppers to power tools.

The Parish Council would support such a group by arranging for collection of bagged arisings from the clearance. Grants to buy the equipment can be sourced. A secure place to store the equipment could be investigated. If you are interested in starting up such a group please get in touch with the Clerk to the Parish Council, Jennie Currie (details opposite).



## From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends,

During this month of March, the church is in preparation for Easter. It is

a time called Lent, which is like Advent for Christmas, a time when Christians seek to refresh, renew or strengthen their faith. It is part of that faith journey Dov was writing about in his letter to you last month. Advent looks forward to the birth of Jesus, of God coming to us. Lent reflects on Jesus' trial, suffering and sacrifice of his life. The joy of Christmas turns into the sorrow of Lent and then turns into the joy of Easter. This is the great mystery of faith "Christ has died, Christ is risen and Christ will come again".

The Old Testament prophet Malachi (3:1-5), warns of this future event, saying that when the Lord comes he will judge against those who do harm to others. There is a long list which includes those who would "thrust aside the widow and orphan (the vulnerable), the alien foreigner (the refugee), those who bear false witness (the liars)". Throughout scripture in both the Old and the New Testament, the message is clear, that we must look after and take care of each other.

My Grandmother taught me that charity begins at home. I am now beginning to understand how true this really is, because without it our communities and our lives would be the poorer. Our villages are fortunate to have many social and recreational opportunities such as the village hall, sports clubs, art, drama and singing groups, warm spaces, green spaces, the DAMASCUS Youth Project, the village magazine you are reading, to name but a few. All of these, including the parish councils, are there because people volunteer themselves and others support them.

In the Damascus parish, the ministry team are able to provide services every Sunday at various different times in each village, because of the help and support of volunteers. Jesus gives us only two rules to live by, the first commandment is to love God and the second to love one another. Simple yet hard. However, we can all be that "charity" that begins at home, the place where you live. Our communities need volunteers and supporters to take care of each other and to look after our environment. If you are not one of these yet, hopefully you will soon be benefitting from being one.





## **COUNTY & DISTRICT COUNCILLOR**

With Mad March upon us, it is time to look to spring and a new year.

Recently I went to London with my family to join the Chinese New Year celebrations, and it struck me as positively uplifting at the end of winter to coincide the timing of new year celebrations with the start of spring and signs of new life, as is apparently quite common in some other cultures. I look forward to our local rituals like the chance to see new lambs on a local farm. Following the new year theme, our councils have just debated and agreed the budgets for the new year too. This year's budget is much the same as last year, as in reality, although the sums are large, there is very little wriggle room to do anything new or different. Both district and county are well run financially and have balanced budgets. However, the county has found more money for repairing roads – and ideally making a more permanent job of it than the frequent firefighting temporary pot hole repairs that seem be to needed just to keep things ticking over. Oxfordshire, believe it or not, is ahead of many councils in the UK, in that it is trying to prioritise enough money to keep the status quo, and we have also found some money to move from fire-fighting to more, better, and more permanent repairs. The other headline I want to share is that the county has also found new budget for flood alleviation work, which is much needed as this is now an annual theme for our Thames-side communities.

You, like me, might have received a letter recently from Thames Water announcing large rises in their water bills to pay for long neglected infrastructure improvements. Although approved by Ofwat, the rises are large, and a bad omen for what might be coming with the mega-expensive new strategic Oxford reservoir for the South East, to which we have been objecting as excessive and inappropriate because, if they fixed our current infrastructure and improved water management to standards seen in the best developed countries, it would not be needed. Sight of the new bill increases really rubs this in, as this is just a taster of annual mega price hikes for years to come to pay for the new reservoir. We continue to hold Thames Water to account for a better deal.

Looking forward to the rest of the year, the way local councils are run is changing with the devolution bill, with plans to be submitted by November. For us, this means by the end of 2028, Vale of White Horse District Council will be merged into Oxfordshire County Council. So, it's not really devolution to local areas. But it may be beneficial in terms of economies of scale and other efficiencies. We have yet to see. Restructures can take a lot of time and effort and having been through a lot of restructures personally in the private sector, and knowing how gruelling they can be, my sympathies are with our council staff, who must do their best to navigate how central government want to restructure local services, without adversely impacting the current delivery of high-quality services. Beyond this, the new government are keen to create more strategic combined authorities ideally led by a mayor like in big cities. However, Oxfordshire is less convinced this will be beneficial for us, as we are a far cry from a big city with different challenges and demographics. On the plus side, one must believe that this long overdue new government are delivering changes now that are long overdue. I will keep you posted on how this pans out.

## **THAMES WATER**



# An essential new reservoir for the South East

As we move into the Spring, our teams will be undertaking a range of environmental surveys to support the next steps in the reservoir design. This involves surveying the local trees and ecology. Additionally, we've started our archaeological assessments with oversight from technical experts, digging shallow trenches in nearby fields to explore any potential findings. These works are necessary to ensure we document and preserve anything of archaeological significance below the surface of the ground. All topsoil is being carefully stored and will be replaced once the surveys have been completed. You may notice our work from the public footpaths.
