The village has three defibrillators. One is located outside the front roller doors of Sutton Courtenay Tyres on the High Street. The second is outside the Football Clubhouse in the Recreation Ground. The third is outside the Fish on Appleford Road.

At its April meeting the Parish Council coopted Cathy King to the vacant seat. The Parish Council consists of 11 Councillors who all live in the parish, the role is unpaid and they collectively make decisions at Parish Council meetings which are open to the public. There is always a public session at the start of a meeting when residents can raise matters.

The Parish Council employs the Parish Clerk and utilises contractors to provide services in the community and maintain Parish Council owned assets that are for the benefit of the village.

For all other issues to do with pavements, roads, bus stops, etc. please report the problems via fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk or by calling the County Council on 0345 310 1111. If the County Council is not responsible then the issue will be forwarded to the District Council.

Spending time with local people and businesses to understand your concerns and working to find ways to make improvements is the most important part of my role as your MP. I am grateful for

opportunities like this newsletter to provide local people with updates and to prompt new connections.

In Parliament, I have continued to advocate for issues that matter to our constituency. I've spoken about the importance of aligning new housing developments with adequate infrastructure – such as a new railway station serving Grove and Wantage, and new or expanded GP surgeries - at every opportunity. I will be on the legislative committee scrutinising the government's new Planning and Infrastructure Bill, which is a chance to critically examine the Government's bill that will guide development in the future and to suggest amendments and improvements before it becomes law. There is a need to address emerging concerns that this bill will not deal with the imbalance between new housing and existing public services and infrastructure, nor give sufficient consideration to natural and architectural conservation.

I have started working with fellow MPs on crossparty efforts to improve safety on the A34, including concerns about the length of the slip roads at the Chilton interchange. A project to improve safety and congestion was 'paused' by the previous administration, but the huge disruption caused by accidents on the A34, and, more importantly, injury and loss of life on this National Highways Road, must still be addressed.

Back in the constituency, I recently joined young people at an Oxfordshire County Council Pizza and Politics session, where we discussed the use of smart phones,

amongst other topics. I had a useful meeting with GARD (Group Against Reservoir Development) about the latest on the Reservoir and have secured a meeting with the Minister for Water and Flooding to discuss local concerns about this huge project.

Our area is a hub of research, innovation, and enterprise. Recent activities included opening the Nebula Building at Milton Park and welcoming Harley Davidson. With the government's announcement of the Oxford Growth Corridor, I am keen to help ensure that Culham, Harwell Campus, and Milton Park can benefit from investment and opportunities that arise. But I am mindful that most of our local businesses are small or medium sized and face different challenges. I recently chaired a discussion with local entrepreneurs and have visited local farmers to understand how new policies around tax and national insurance are impacting them, and the cost and availability of food.

The local and regional media have covered several issues impacting our area recently, so I have been interviewed about A417 flooding, hare coursing, and rural crime. In my first appearance on *the BBC's Politics South show*, I was on a panel discussing conflict in Ukraine and rising energy bills which are topics many of you have contacted me about. And on a lighter note, while advocating for children's literacy skills, I shared my favourite childhood story: *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*.


The walled garden

From the Ministry Team

On 8th May our nation will mark the 80th anniversary of VE Day - Victory in Europe Day, when the evil of Nazism

was defeated in Europe. Regardless of our age, we are all called to remember with thankfulness the courage and sacrifice of all who served at home and abroad to win the fight for freedom against Nazi tyranny. But that wasn't the end of the war. In Burma, Singapore, and other places, the war raged on as fiercely and cruelly as ever. VJ Day, in August 1945, finally brought hostilities to an end. The troops still fighting between May and August, and their families, felt overlooked as they struggled to live with uncertainty and hope.

May 2025 occupies the time between Easter Day and Pentecost. Our churches have celebrated the joy of the resurrection, and we await the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit in power to set the Church alight in love and witness. After the first Easter, the first disciples lived with the knowledge of Christ's great victory over evil but struggled to come to terms with what this meant for them as they remained under the threat of death from powerful religious and military powers. The national and local VE80 activities together with the bible readings in your church services, provide an important opportunity to consider how we can live grounded in the past and moving to the future, knowing that we and all our times, are held in the hands of our unchanging and faithful God and how this can strengthen us as we continue our pilgrimage.

O God of truth and justice, we hold before you those men and women who have died in active service, particularly in the Second World War, whose sacrifice brought Victory in Europe.

As we honour their courage and cherish their memory, may we put our faith in your future; for you are the source of life and hope, now and for ever. Amen.

Steventon extends a warm welcome to join with them in the lighting of a VE80 beacon at 21.00 on the 8 May. We are immensely grateful to Aces High Gallery (located behind St Michael's Church, entering through the 'Skyfall' gates) for hosting a weekend of VE 80 celebrations on the 10/11 May. We welcome you to a large scale VE80 themed event including military vehicles and equipment from the era, talk with reenactors and military veterans, jeep rides, food stalls and local musical groups. Weather permitting, WW2 aircraft will be seen flying over our villages and hopefully landing close by.


