POST OFFICE SERVICES

SUTTON COURTENAY DEFIBRILLATORS

The village has three defibrillators. One is located outside the front roller doors of Sutton Courtenay Tyres on the High Street. The second is outside the Football Clubhouse in the Recreation Ground. The third is outside the Fish on Appleford Road.





PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



S106 Art project – Village Green vehicle barriers

The Village Green is registered which means it is an area of land that has been officially designated for community use, typically for sports, recreation, or informal gatherings. Once registered, the land is protected from development and preserved for public enjoyment. Part of the protection of the space is the exclusion of vehicles.

Many of the 200+ posts protecting the grass areas of the Village Green need to be replaced. If the posts are replaced like for like they would be funded from the precept (the Parish Council's portion of Council Tax). Whilst the existing posts have provided a practical solution to ensure vehicles do not drive or park on the Green, they are not an attractive feature in the historic centre of the village. Parish Councillors believe this could be a great opportunity to enhance our Village Green, and celebrate what makes our village so special. This new project aims to celebrate Sutton Courtenay's history, its stories, people, and the natural beauty that surrounds us. **We would love to hear your ideas!**

Funding for the Project - The Parish Council has access to funding provided by developers, and held by the District Council which is ringfenced, through legal agreements, for art projects in the parish.

The Parish Council has been considering how to best use the funding in a practical way whilst adhering to the terms of the legal agreements. Last year, the Parish Council used some of this funding to provide the oak benches and noticeboards/village map, which you will have noticed are installed in multiple locations across the parish. Prior to this some was used for the stained glass window in the church extension.

Your Feedback - At the moment, this new Art Project is a blank canvas with possibilities ranging from decorative posts, low level metal arches, or something more substantial such as the walnut sculptures in Drayton. Whether you have thoughts or ideas on what theme could be adopted, what materials could be used, or what type/style of barriers could be installed we want to hear from you!

OLLY GLOVER MP



In recent weeks, I've been focused on Planning. I was appointed to the Planning and Infrastructure Bill Committee, where MPs from various parties scrutinise this new government legislation. We are reviewing

the bill line by line, suggesting improvements before it returns to the House of Commons. Experts and charities have provided evidence, and I have advocated for amendments to protect nature, ensure genuinely affordable housing with necessary infrastructure, and introduce solar panels above car parks. The committee debated the vital role of planning committees in ensuring transparency and community engagement. While the government may not adopt many amendments, we continue pushing for improvements, and it is important that the government ministers championing the Bill hear the full range of concerns about it.

I also led my first Westminster Hall debate, championing walking and cycling for journeys to school, and urging its prioritisation in the Road Safety Strategy. I raised local examples, including a safe crossing over the A415 in Culham for Europa School students and improvements to the walking and cycling path there, and a much-delayed walking and cycling bridge project over the A34 in Milton, to link Milton Heights with Milton Park and Milton Village. We discussed safety concerns like pavement parking forcing people using wheelchairs and buggies onto the road and the need for investment in rural cycle and footpaths. Minister Lillian Greenwood is set to visit a local school to observe Bikeability training, which boosts children's confidence in cycling to school.

Recent Westminster activities include meeting Lord Vallance to discuss concerns that our local area may not benefit from the proposed 'Oxford to Cambridge Growth Corridor', and summing up a debate on St George's Day, where I referenced Dragon Hill in Uffington and The George pub in Upton. I also participated in a debate on estate management fees affecting new residents and raised questions with ministers on various local concerns, including export license processing for small businesses, stalking protections, transgender rights, and the lack of coordination in roadworks.

Regarding the mega-reservoir, a High Court hearing on 24th and 25th June will determine whether a Judicial Review into the Government's decision to approve Thames Water's plans for the Abingdon Reservoir without a Public Inquiry should proceed. I have secured a meeting with Emma Hardy, Minister for Water and Flooding, to ensure the government fully understands the community's concerns about this major infrastructure project.

The Planning and Infrastructure Bill Committee has kept me in Westminster more than I'd like, but I was glad to meet residents in Wantage and Didcot at my advice surgeries, visit Church Street and Newbury Street GP practices, celebrate VE Day in Wantage, and visit Linda Benton's art exhibition championing beautiful and old local trees in Didcot and East Hagbourne.

Alongside my regular appointment-based surgeries, I am planning drop-in sessions in some villages this summer — look out for details of the dates and times. Following the 1st May election, I am delighted to have been re-elected as your county councillor, responsible for the division covering Drayton, Sutton Courtenay, Steventon, Milton, Milton Heights and Appleford. The boundaries have slightly changed, replacing the area covering Marcham, Abingdon Airfield / Dalton Barracks, Shippon and St Helens Without, with the area covering Steventon. Hello Steventon! For those who voted for me, thank you — we had a brilliant result with more people voting than last time, and personally I gained around twice the number of votes as the next closest person standing. Our small area punches well above our weight across many spheres, and I aim to take this even further, making it a great place to be.

The walled garden



From the Ministry Team

Dear Friends,

On 29th June the church remembers two important people from its

history - St. Peter and St. Paul. In the church calendar they are celebrated on the same day. This is because it is believed they were both killed on that date, Peter in around 64AD and Paul a few years later in around 67AD. Both were killed for their faith and this, along with the influence they have had on the church over the centuries, is why they are remembered. Two of the churches in our parish are named after them – St. Peter's in Drayton and St. Peter and St. Paul in Appleford — as are many other churches around the country and the world.

Both Peter and Paul understood the importance of telling people about Jesus, and the words and stories written by them and about them in the Bible teach us many things. One of the most striking things about what is written is how it contains details of the mistakes they both made. So much so that Paul, in one of his letters, even criticises Peter for a mistake he is making. Examples like this show us that Peter and Paul were not perfect, and this helps to remind us that neither are we. It is how we respond to the mistakes we make that is most important.

This is often in contrast to what society tells us today. Whether it is the picture-perfect lives we see on social media or the fear that a genuine error could lead to some sort of penalty, we are frequently made to feel that we cannot get things wrong. What Peter and Paul show us is that it is acceptable to fail as God forgives and loves us even when our mistakes are talked about some 2000 years later!

To hear more about this, please join us at 4pm on 29th June at St Peter's Drayton. This is a special service for the whole DAMASCUS parish where I will be celebrating communion for the first time after being priested at Dorchester Abbey that morning.



with the total combined loss increasing nearly 50% from 2023 to £9.7 million in 2024.

According to new data, £9.7 million was lost to ticket fraud in 2024 in the UK alone. Action Fraud, the national fraud and cybercrime reporting service, has launched a new ticket fraud awareness campaign, warning people to be alert to fraudsters trying to catch out people planning for popular and sold-out events.

EASY

How to protect yourself from ticket fraud:

- Only buy tickets from the venue's box office, official promoter or agent, or a well-known ticketing website.
- Avoid paying for tickets by bank transfer, especially if buying from someone unknown. Credit card or payment services such as PayPal give you a better chance of recovering the money if you become a victim of fraud.
- The password you use for your email account, as well as any other accounts you use to purchase tickets, should be different from all your other passwords. Use three random words to create a strong and memorable password, and enable 2-step verification (2SV).
- Be wary of unsolicited emails, texts or adverts offering unbelievably good deals on tickets.
- Is the vendor a member of STAR? If they are, the company has signed up to their strict governing standards. STAR also offers an approved Alternative Dispute Resolution service to help customers with outstanding complaints. For more information visit star.org.uk/buy_safe.

OBITUARIES

Rest in Peace

Doreen Joyce King who died on 16th April 2025 was born on 6th October 1943 and grew up in Abingdon. After finishing school, she worked at the MG factory in the stores office where she met Robin. Doreen and Robin married in 1965, and they lived and raised their children, Jane and Steve, in Sutton Courtenay.

Doreen liked nothing more than spending time with her family, whether it was to watch Robin play cricket, to visit gardens and garden shows, day trips when her children were younger, outings with her grandchildren or get-togethers with the wider family. Doreen enjoyed every minute of every family occasion as well as being able to provide tea, cakes and plenty of other treats.

As a wife, mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, sister, mother-in-law, aunt, great-aunt, godmother, friend and neighbour, Doreen looked to always putting others first even when her own health deteriorated. Doreen's calm and loving presence will be greatly missed. Her funeral took place on Tuesday 6th May 2025 in All Saints' Church. *This is an edited extract of the address given by the Reverend Dov Whittle.*

Kathleen Elizabeth Slater (Kay) who died on 13th April 2025, aged 99, was born on 6th July 1925 – the youngest of seven children. Her parents, Samuel and Evelyn Matilda Lewis had moved to Sutton Courtenay from Lechlade in 1909 – a two-day journey by horse and cart. After a few months in temporary accommodation in Church Street they moved to 5 Brook Street. Samuel, a wheelwright by trade, worked for two building companies before setting up his own building business.

Kay had wonderful memories of her childhood. Her father was very musical and played several instruments, including the concertina and tin whistle! Kay always said that 'the house was filled with music and laughter'. She remembered swinging from a beam in her father's workshop, in the garden of Number 5, watching and learning whilst he worked. She and her siblings played games and fished and swam in the river as most of the villagers did then. The family had a pony and later a bull-nosed Morris in which she travelled in the dickie seat with her brother, Ron. They rented two fields and Kay remembered having a ride on their cow when she was very young. They also had a donkey and pigs as well as rabbits and geese, and the family worked three allotments.

One of her father's first building contracts was to convert the disused chapel at the corner of Frilsham Street and the High Street into a small village hall. Her parents then ran Sutton Courtenay's first dances there on Saturday nights. She remembered dancing with her father, standing on his toes. She would also help her mother serve lemonade, but, because she was so young, Kay usually ended up sleeping under the counter! Sadness came when she was thirteen and she contracted rheumatic fever and missed a lot of school. Her father was also very ill, and he died in 1938.

Soon after, war broke out, and two of her brothers joined up — one in the army, the other in the navy. Bert joined the Royal Observer Corps in the village but sadly contracted diphtheria and died in 1942. For the rest of her life Kay remained a staunch supporter of the Royal British Legion — and attended the Remembrance Service at All Saints' Church every year.

In 1947, at The Queen's Hotel in Abingdon, Kay was introduced to Alan Slater. In 1948 she encountered him again when she and a friend met up to go to a dance in a hall where Waitrose now stands. She and Alan took to the floor and their future was sealed. They were married in All Saints' on 29th March 1952. They moved to Portsmouth, Alan's home town, where they lived for a year, before coming back to live at 5 Brook Street. They had forty wonderful years together - exploring the UK, camping with their beloved dog, Sally - travelled throughout Europe and cruised to faraway places - but always coming home to Sutton Courtenay. Kay was devastated when Alan died on 5th May 1993 but she rebuilt her life - maintaining contact with friends and family and simply enjoying life in her home village, feeding the birds in her garden, and travelling everywhere - mainly by public transport.

She was immensely grateful for the loving support from family, friends and neighbours which enabled her to stay living independently for so long, until, finally, she had to move to Bridge House where she died on 13th April 2025, just a few months short of her 100th birthday. This is an edited extract of the address given by the Reverend Canon Helen Kendrick at the funeral service held on 12th May 2025 in All Saints' Church.




