### **Recreation Ground routes for dogs**

We want to remind owners that dogs are not permitted on the central field of the Recreation Ground or in the fenced play area. There are signs on the gates to advise this. There are Public Rights of Way around the north and east sides of the Recreation Ground. On the southern side a specific dog friendly route is fenced off from the central field connecting the Rights of Way to the cemetery and beyond. Dogs can be walked through the cemetery. In the cemetery we request that owners to keep their dogs on leads and pick up after them.

# Christmas tributes at the Old Wallingford Way cemetery

The Parish Council appreciates that many families will be making a special visit to the cemetery over the Christmas period. In February 2026 the Parish Council will arrange for the removal and disposal of any remaining Christmas wreaths and tributes.

Visitors to the cemetery are requested not to leave glass or plastic items (except artificial flowers). Objects made from glass are prone to being broken due to weather conditions and wild animals who often take a great interest in objects at the cemetery. Glass items are likely to be removed by the Parish Clerk.

### 2026 Community Litter Pick

Following the success of the October litter pick, and considering feedback from people who would like to be involved in future events. The next litter pick will be held on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> April 2026 at 2pm. Everyone is welcome to join Councillors in litter picking designated areas of the village. Equipment is provided on the day. On your return to the hall there will be refreshments.

### Councillor Vacancy

Sutton Courtenay Parish Council can have a maximum of 11 Councillors. At present there are two vacancies and the Council is looking to fill the positions by co-option.

Individuals who are on the electoral register and who live or work in the parish or within 3 miles of the parish can be considered for co-option. If you are interested in working in a small team to contribute to local life, taking forward projects which benefit people across the parish, then please contact the Clerk.

Please note the role is unpaid, as a minimum you would be expected to attend monthly meetings and check your Council email account at least once a week. You would be asked to take an active role in a couple of areas of the Council's work across recreational amenities, the cemetery, planning policy, community infrastructure (defibs, benches, bins), community events and representing the Parish Council at meetings with local charitable and commercial organisations.

This month has been incredibly busy, full of constituency engagements alongside exciting activities in Parliament.

In Parliament, I secured a commitment from the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care to help unblock progress on the GP surgery in Great Western Park. At Prime Minister's Questions, I challenged the Prime Minister on the Government's decision to delay SEND reforms until 2026, asking what he has to say to parents and education staff who are deeply worried by these delays. I also led a debate on the proposed cuts to funding for the International Baccalaureate (IB) programme - an issue that affects many families at Europa School - and spoke on the need to improve statutory maternity and paternity pay.

I have also been busy in my new role as Transport Spokesperson - speaking in Westminster Hall debates on sustainable aviation and on headlight glare, and pressing the Secretary of State for Transport on the environmental impact of the proposed third runway at Heathrow.

It is always a pleasure to meet constituents in Parliament. Recently, I've met with residents campaigning to end cages for farmed animals, and with local pharmacists attending the launch of the new *Shot in the Arm* vaccine campaign.

Back in the constituency, I've held surgeries in Wantage and Didcot and met residents on the doorstep in East and West Challow. I joined members of CulBug (the Culham Bicycle User Group) for a cycle trip and opened the new visitor centre at Culham Campus - planting a tree and recognising 60 years of remarkable work at the site. I also had the pleasure of visiting Fitzwaryn Special School and Wantage Primary Academy to see Bikeability training in action alongside the Local Transport Minister, Lilian Greenwood. It was wonderful to attend SOFEA's "Donate What You Can" community meal in Didcot, where all proceeds support the charity's Nourish and Flourish programme. I also visited the Thames Travel bus depot in Didcot and made further progress on improving the Orchard Centre, where parking is now free after 7pm every day. Lastly, it was a privilege to lay a wreath in both Wallingford and Didcot at Remembrance Day events, alongside laying a wreath on the Poppy Train at Didcot Railway Station. Lest we forget. ### **Merry Christmas Everyone**

Christmas is a great time, and I hope this year will be no exception. Enjoy the break and relish the time with friends and family. I don't know about you, but I have found 2025 to be a frustrating year — I have worked really hard all year trying to juggle several different roles, and I have achieved quite a bit, but not nearly all that I wanted. So I am hoping for much more in 2026; to finish unfinished business, edge closer towards resolving long-standing issues, and push forward towards creating a better place locally. My 2026 wish list includes:

- For the new HIF1 road and bridge across the Thames to be planned and built to finish on time and within budget, creating safer and less congested routes in our area.
- Safe traffic lights for children and parents travelling to and from Europa school.
- A better train service for Appleford.
- New cycle routes linking Abingdon, Milton Park and Steventon being shown to be feasible.
- An agreed solution for Steventon Bridge.
- Exciting new sports facilities in Drayton.
- Sound and sensible plans for a new unitary council that delivers better public services at lower cost.
- More local, socially responsible investment from our pension funds.

Last but not least, in November my motion that the district council should request Thames Water to re-evaluate their options given the ballooning costs of SESRO was passed unanimously. I am hopeful for an open dialogue with Thames Water on the best — the safest, most environmentally-friendly, flood-mitigating and most cost-effective strategy for water management for the next 100 years, rather than a presumption that is the SESRO mega-reservoir.

Moving beyond our area, I am hoping for so much more in 2026 from central government and internationally:


- Peace in the Middle East. Justice for war crimes.
  Realism around the risks of extremism. The centre to
  take control of the moral high ground around our
  national flag growth has and should be turbo-charged
  by immigration, not cursed by it.
- A safe, secure, clean and cheap energy sector in the UK, along with double-digit growth for our local clean technology and advanced sciences sector, regardless of foreign subterfuge.
- Global commitment, led by COP30, to mitigate, minimise and become resilient to climate change.

Let's voice our ambitions for the coming year. The more we articulate, the more likely positive change will happen.



# £200,000 taken from criminals going to local crime prevention initiatives

I have recently announced the award of nearly £200,000 to 49 community and voluntary organisations to support crime prevention initiatives.

My Community Fund is always hugely oversubscribed with 248 applications submitted for over £1.7m of funding, so unfortunately, I know many will be disappointed.

The Community Fund provides support to voluntary and community groups that help to prevent crime and keep communities safe. Importantly money for the Community Fund comes from proceeds from the sale of items seized from criminals that cannot be returned to their rightful owners. This ensures that the criminals pay, rather than the cash coming from taxpayers.

I am delighted that we are able to take money away from criminals and use it in a positive way, to support many of our hard-working communities and voluntary organisations in the Thames Valley to reduce crime further. In total there are 49 schemes funded across the whole of Thames Valley. To give a flavour of the types of projects supported, here are a few of the local applications that were successful:

- Bright Futures Oxfordshire, Youth mentoring scheme -£5,000.00
- Didcot and Wallingford Didcot TRAIN, Inspiring young people £6,000.00
- Improving Road Safety in Long Wittenham £5,700.00
- Sandford-on-Thames Road Safety Initiative £3,300.00
- Gloves Not Gangs, Spartans Boxing Club, Abingdon -£4,000.00
- Sweatbox Youth Work, Wantage £5,000.00
- Abingdon Damascus Youth, The Gazebo Project -£4,000.00
- CCTV at Thomas Hughes Memorial Hall £1,500.00
- Fraud and Scam Awareness, Vale Community Impact -£5,000.00

### From the Ministry Team

Many years ago, when I worked in a busy open plan office, a phrase often heard was, 'Look busy, the boss is coming!'. Nowadays many of us are

past-masters at applying this to the season of Advent. This season in the church year is meant to help us focus on the coming of Christ but all too often it is the most frantic and distracting of times. We set ourselves artificial deadlines to get 'everything' done; our diaries are crammed with seasonal events; our shopping trollies are over-loaded and our bank balances very often turn red. Advent was originally intended as a quiet time to prepare for baptism, involving prayer and fasting; but this season of quiet contemplation has turned into a season of stress, worry and exhaustion, and for those going through a tough time in life all the negatives become magnified. How can we refocus our thoughts on the key themes of Advent – hope, peace, joy and love? With thanks to Michael Pffunder of the Bible Society here's how:

On the first Sunday of Advent we light a candle for HOPE: Advent is about tuning into Christmas. Before long, Christians will be celebrating the twofold arrival of the Saviour: back then, in Bethlehem; and in future, when he returns to establish his eternal reign. Most church traditions include the advent wreath in their celebrations. The nights leading up to the winter solstice keep getting longer. Meanwhile, the light increases, week by week, candle by candle. A symbol of hope as darkness falls. Advent is a chance to spend a few minutes a day calming down and refocussing on our hope in Christ, which lies beyond our present circumstances.

On the second Sunday of Advent we light a candle for PEACE: Given how hectic December can be, church traditions which treat Advent as a time of contemplation and renewal can help. Peace may be a case of saying sorry, letting go, or simply resting in the Lord's presence, in anticipation of his coming. The apostle Paul led a life of suffering and hardship. Yet he found that the 'peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus' (Philippians 4.7). Could this be our own discovery, this Advent, whatever our situation?

### On the third Sunday of Advent we light a candle for

JOY: Pick a quiet weekday to visit an open, but empty, peaceful church, which has a nativity scene as part of its Advent tradition. Or look up a painting in a book or online. Take a moment to settle down and look carefully at the characters. The shepherds: social outsiders with a taxing day job. The Magi: facing an evil, scheming ruler. Mary and Joseph, about to run for their lives and seek asylum in a

foreign land. No-one in the nativity scene is happy because of their circumstances; but all of them are full of joy because of the child in the manger. Advent invites us to discover a 'joy to the world' that isn't of the world.

On the fourth Sunday of Advent we light a candle for LOVE: By now, all four candles are burning in many churches and homes. The light is shining in the darkness. Jesus is about to arrive. The wait is almost over. Christians celebrate Advent to receive the message of God's love as if they were hearing it for the first time. God so loved the world that he gave his only Son.

So, this Advent, remember the Lord is coming. Don't look busy — prepare inwardly. Take time to pray and reflect in silence. Keep your eyes fixed on the light that shines in the darkness and find the joy in Christmas once again.





### LIGHTING IN OLD WALLINGFORD WAY

### Improved lighting in our village

We are a group of Citizenship GCSE students from Didcot Girls' School and, as part of our Citizenship Action Campaign, we're focusing on improving lighting in Sutton Courtenay — specifically by campaigning for the installation of a lamppost by the recreation ground and improving lighting on Old Wallingford Way.

To start our campaign, we conducted a survey asking local residents if they feel comfortable walking down unlit streets and their thoughts of lighting provision on Old Wallingford Way with the following results:

Nearly nine in ten respondents (89%) live in Sutton Courtenay, 61% believe the lighting on Old Wallingford Way is insufficient. Only 7% felt the path was adequately lit.



We believe that better lighting would increase the use of the facilities at the recreation ground during the darker months. Young people and families with children would be able to comfortably walk to the playground and enjoy valuable time



outdoors. The recreation ground has been renovated in recent years so why should residents not be able to use it all year round?
