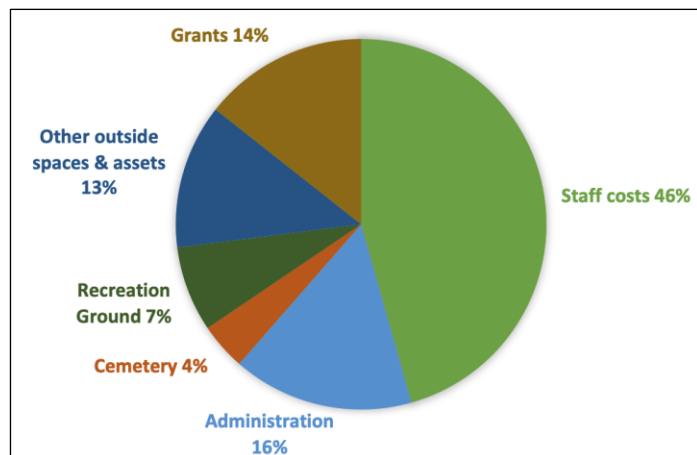


Parish Council Budget for 2026-27

The Parish Council has agreed the budget for the forthcoming financial year. The 2025-26 budget included provision for an additional member of staff for part of the year. The new budget includes the staffing provision for the full year. This, alongside increased costs for grounds maintenance and emptying of litter and dog waste bins, has resulted in an increase in the precept (the Parish Council's share of Council Tax) of £6,000. Which means a Band D property household would be paying an additional £3.89 for the year (the total being £79.98).

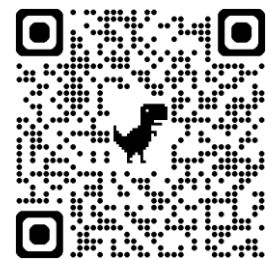
Councillor Vacancies

Sutton Courtenay Parish Council can have a maximum of 11 Councillors. At present there are two vacancies and the Council is looking to fill the positions by co-option. Individuals who are on the electoral register and who live or work in the parish or within 3 miles of the parish can be considered for co-option. If you are interested in working in a small team to contribute to local life, taking forward projects which benefit people across the parish, then please contact the Clerk.

Please note the role is unpaid, as a minimum you would be expected to attend monthly meetings and check your Council email account at least once a week. You would be asked to take an active role in a couple of areas of the Council's work across recreational amenities, the cemetery, planning policy, community infrastructure (defibs, benches, bins), community events and representing the Parish Council at meetings with local charitable and commercial organisations.

Members of the public are welcome to attend Council meetings. The dates of the next meetings are Tuesday 3rd February, 3rd March, 7th April and 5th May 2026. Meetings normally start at 7.15pm and are held in the Committee Room at Sutton Courtenay Village Hall.

This past month has been particularly busy, both in Parliament and meeting with local businesses in the constituency.

As discussions about the government's Great British Railways Bill continue, I have used my role as Liberal Democrat Transport Spokesperson to ensure the passengers are at the centre of these discussions. It is essential there is an improvement in the ongoing issues, such as train delays and expensive tickets, which I and many in our constituency experience regularly.

In parliament, a debate regarding Thames Water ensured I was able to raise the concerns raised by residents about the escalating costs and the lack of trust in Thames Water to safely build the largest bunded reservoir in the county.

I have also engaged with local media about problems with postal delivery services, including Evri, and the delayed parcels in Grove and other areas of the constituency. In an interview with the BBC, I spoke about the GP surgery delays specifically affecting Great Western Park.

I have been spending time with some of our wonderful small businesses to better understand the impact of last year's budget and the support they need to keep trading and providing us with products and food. It is always a highlight of my week to visit local businesses and community groups to learn about the work they do for our communities, making sure I am well informed when raising their needs in parliament. I have also had the pleasure of meeting many residents in Stanford in the Vale and Didcot on their doorsteps recently and in Wantage at one of my regular surgeries. My team and I have now closed over 10,000 constituent cases, supporting individuals, families and businesses to resolve a huge variety of problems.

Now that days are starting to get a little longer, it feels like we are over the worst of winter. Flooding and fear of it continues to be a big issue locally, and I refer residents to the Oxfordshire Flood Toolkit on-line which contains lots of advice. In an emergency, please ring the emergency services on 999. I believe that the fourfold increase in jetting and clearing gullies this year has exposed a lot of defects which now require more extensive remedial work to fix. The budget this year which we are hoping to agree next month, does propose more money to repair problems identified by the cleaning of over 70,000 gullies locally this year. Issues like Sutton Wick Lane and Milton High Street are at the top of my list for fixing.

The public consultation for Thames Water's proposed SESRO mega-reservoir ended 13th January, and I submitted my priorities, supporting the parish, district and county council submissions. I also went to Farmoor Reservoir and met the Head of Reservoir Safety (responsible for all their 50+ reservoirs) and saw the emergency discharge facility there back into the Thames, which was impressive, but pales into insignificance to SESRO which would be c.17 times bigger. Although Thames Water have a lot of issues, they also do a lot right. A day later, a Sutton Wick resident made an interesting comparison that when there is burst pipe, Thames Water respond 24/7 to fix them often overnight, whereas roads blocked by flooding, seem to be so much harder to fix. Anyway, I have made reasonable objections to SESRO's plans and wait to hear their responses.

Work continues on Steventon Lights and I have been liaising with the project team to try to improve the flow of traffic during the works. At long last, on the last weekend of February, the A34 interchange will be properly re-surfaced, and thereafter once the Steventon Lights works finish, work will start on the new HIF1 road which will provide a new faster traffic route all the way to the Golden Balls roundabout, removing the rat-runs and bridge congestion through Milton, Sutton Courtenay, Appleford and Clifton Hampden. Work will take a couple of years, and so I am establishing a working party to liaise with the project to minimise disruption locally.

As Chair of Abingdon Localities, I am also working to leverage this new road to improve local cycling and walking routes, including better safety across the Sutton Courtenay – Culham bridge, and linking Peep'o'Day Lane cycle route from Abingdon to Milton Park and onto Steventon. We had a really constructive meeting with the local landowner from Peep'o'Day Lane through to Milton Park, and hope to do the same with the local landowner at the other end where we are seeking a manageable incline for the last stretch into Steventon.

For Steventon, I have asked relevant officers to come to a Steventon parish council meeting to explain what is happening with the bridge. Essentially, the work has been completed, as best as possible, but as it is an old bridge, and not designed for the amount and weight of traffic that wants to cross it, if it was to be re-opened again to unrestricted two way HGV traffic, it would fail again quickly, so the council is unwilling to open it up again fully, and wants to consult with the local committee on the best alternative options. I have asked the council to explore alternatives, like two way with a weight limit, or limit to cars only, or re-marking it so it is one way for HGVs in the middle whilst two way for cars, or even an ANPR system for traffic lights triggered when trucks approach. The quicker we agree a solution, the quicker I can help get it normalised. I encourage you to participate in the consultation or share your views with me to pass on.

Meanwhile, we wait to hear how central government propose to devolve power to the regions – will we move to one unitary council across Oxfordshire... and will we get a mayor across the Thames Valley (which would be apparently the strongest economic powerhouse outside of London) or some other arrangement? Let's see...

In this regard, I have been talking to our MP, Olly Glover, and we plan to collaborate on a range of issues.

Olly in his transport role can help facilitate plans to improve the train station and service from Appleford. FCC have offered us some land for a new car park, and I am working with the HIF1 team to link the cycle and walking route through to the station, providing safe access to each platform, which will enable much better use of the station, particularly whilst construction hampers roads to help people be more reliant on the train. This also requires temporary improvements to the service so more trains stop there. We believe that once the car park is built, many from surrounding areas will prefer this station over Didcot and Culham, and if we can show that people use it, temporary services could become permanent.

Olly is also championing new legislation to aid state adoption of roads on recent housing developments where there are often long-standing issues hindering adoption or completion of work to satisfactory standards impacting local residents. I know this has been a really stressful issue for residents of Partridge Close and Rye Gardens and actually every village seems to have at least one development facing these issues. I really hope he can find some traction to report back constructive news soon.

A Joyful and Ambitious Start to the Spring Term

The Spring Term has begun with purpose, energy and a wonderful sense of togetherness at Sutton Courtenay. From the moment the children returned, there has been a calm, focused atmosphere across the school. Staff and visitors have commented on how ready the children are to learn, how respectfully they interact with one another, and how confidently they are stepping into the new term.

Classrooms have been alive with rich learning. In English children are using full sentences in speech, employing ambitious vocabulary, and building their ideas through well-structured expression. Their mathematical reasoning has deepened through manipulatives, and increasingly accurate model drawings—an important foundation for confident, fluent learners.

Creativity is thriving too: our DT projects have sparked enormous enthusiasm, with many children continuing their designs at home and proudly bringing in their creations the next day. These moments capture the heart of an ambitious curriculum—one that excites, challenges and nurtures imagination.

Dream Big Day – Inspiring Futures

On Thursday 15th January, we held our first **Dream Big Day**, a transformational event designed to raise aspirations and open children's eyes to the extraordinary range of careers available to them. We were delighted to welcome volunteers including architects, actors, scientists, nurses, physiotherapists, talent consultants, accountants, filmmakers, graphic designers, AI programmers, firefighters, writers and researchers.

Volunteers were really impressed by how articulate and confident our pupils were, especially in linking their learning to real-world careers. One highlight came from the AI workshop, where children explained with ease how programming connects directly to artificial intelligence development.

Children left the sessions buzzing with possibility:

"I didn't know what an architect was before today - now I want to be one."

"I love writing - I can't believe I could spend my life doing research & stories."



Parents also reflected on the impact, noting how this event "planted a seed of possibility". Dream Big Day has enriched our wider curriculum, nurturing ambition, imagination and emotional engagement—essential ingredients in helping every child see themselves as the hero of their own future.

Looking Ahead

The coming weeks are full of opportunities: teacher-led clubs begin shortly, Storytelling Week and cyber-safety workshops are on the horizon, and our pupil-led clubs and class trips will continue bringing learning to life. We remain committed to strengthening reading, writing, mathematical fluency and the routines that support wellbeing through Zones of Regulation and our "Ready to Learn" expectations.

We are proud of the purposeful, joyful culture growing in every classroom. Thank you to our parents, staff, governors and—most of all—our remarkable children, who inspire us daily and make our school community so special.

From the Ministry Team

A metaphor found in the Bible that I particularly like is the idea that we are refined by God's holy fire. The metaphor comes from the practice of burning away the impurities of metals to leave the purest and most valuable metal possible. In terms of our relationship with God, the idea is that through God we can remove the unhelpful things in our lives to become the person God wants us to be. This is a useful image for the season of Lent, which begins on the 18th February with Ash Wednesday. During an Ash Wednesday service, the ashes from the burning of last year's palm crosses are placed on the forehead of each person in the shape of the cross. At first, this may seem like an unusual thing to do, but it is a practice that is centuries old. It's purpose, and the reason for the ashes, is to signify our mortality and our need to turn to God. The symbolism of Ash Wednesday begins the period of Lent where we can reflect on what being refined by God's fire may mean in our lives in preparation for the events of Easter. This time of reflection is where we can consider what changes we may wish to make for our own benefit and the benefit of those around us. If there is something we can change to make us feel happier and healthier, Ash Wednesday is a good time to start (or restart depending on how well any new year's resolutions have gone). This year, the Ash Wednesday service for the Parish will be held at St Michael and All Angels Church in Steventon at 7:30pm and all are welcome.

Before that though, there is Shrove Tuesday (or Pancake Day) on the 17th February when all those tasty treats that we may wish to give up during Lent can be used and eaten. On pancake day at St Blaise in Milton at 5pm, there is even the chance to put your pancake flipping skills to the test. I had just returned home, happy to have spent a joyful New Year's Eve filled with fun, music, and dancing, when, at the same moment, a devastating tragedy was happening in Valais, Switzerland. A blaze broke out at the bar **Le Constellation** during the New Year's Eve celebrations in Crans-Montana, leaving 40 people dead and 116 severely burned. The large majority were teenagers and young adults under the age of 25. The fire is thought to have been caused by a dangerous combination of sparklers placed on champagne bottles and inflammable acoustic insulation on the ceiling of the bar. So many lives and families were shattered in such a short time by lack of vigilance; it is horrifying. The thought that people died in this way fills me with terror and profound sadness.

I grew up in these mountains and celebrated New Year many times in Verbier—another ski area just a 1.5-hour drive from Crans-Montana—when I was a teenager. Those moments were filled with joy, pleasure, and intense camaraderie, and youth made them even more playful and light-hearted. The tragedy that took place in Crans-Montana is immeasurable. How can a single moment of pure joy transform into such a disaster? Even though none of my close loved ones were directly affected by this accident, I feel deeply saddened and in solidarity with those who were. I grew up in Valais, and I am a Swiss citizen by adoption. I feel like a member of this community, sorrowful and pained by what has happened.

This event reminds me how attentive we must be at all times because life can be transformed for the worse in a fraction of a second. We should always remember how fortunate we are to be surrounded by people we love—family and friends—even though relationships can sometimes be complicated. And last but not least, in these difficult and turbulent times, life should be lived fully, as if every moment were the last.

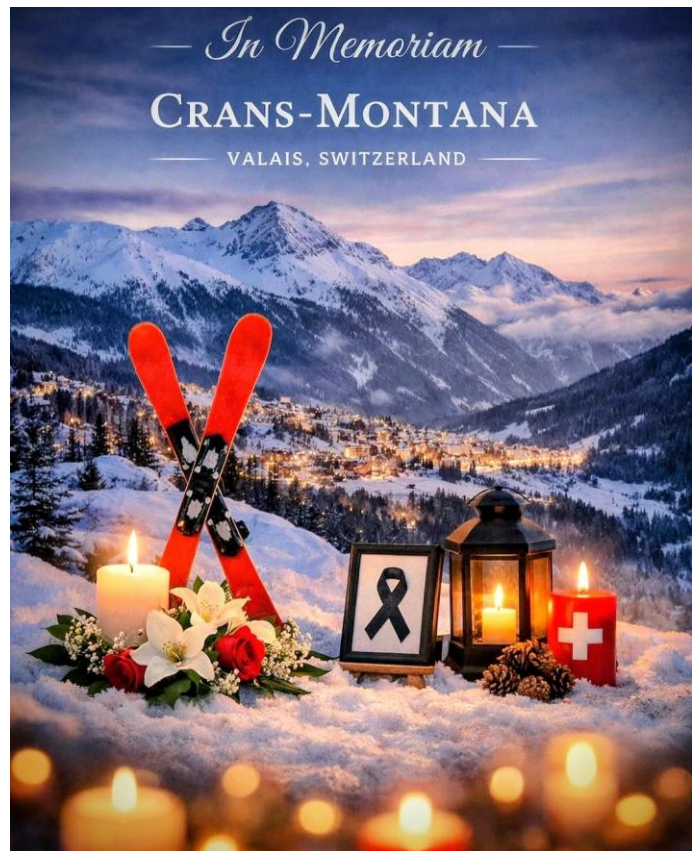
I followed the national ceremony held at Martigny on Friday the 9th and observed the minute of silence as proposed by the Swiss authorities. I wished I could have been there. From the depths of my heart, I hope that the individuals and families affected by this tragedy will find the strength to overcome this ordeal, rebuild their life, and one day find peace.

I will close this tribute with words from memorial songs written this week, honouring those whose laughter vanished far too soon: "We will remember them, standing side by side, hand in hand. They still live in our sky, and they are the light we carry forward—even in our darkest moments, even in the deepest pain."

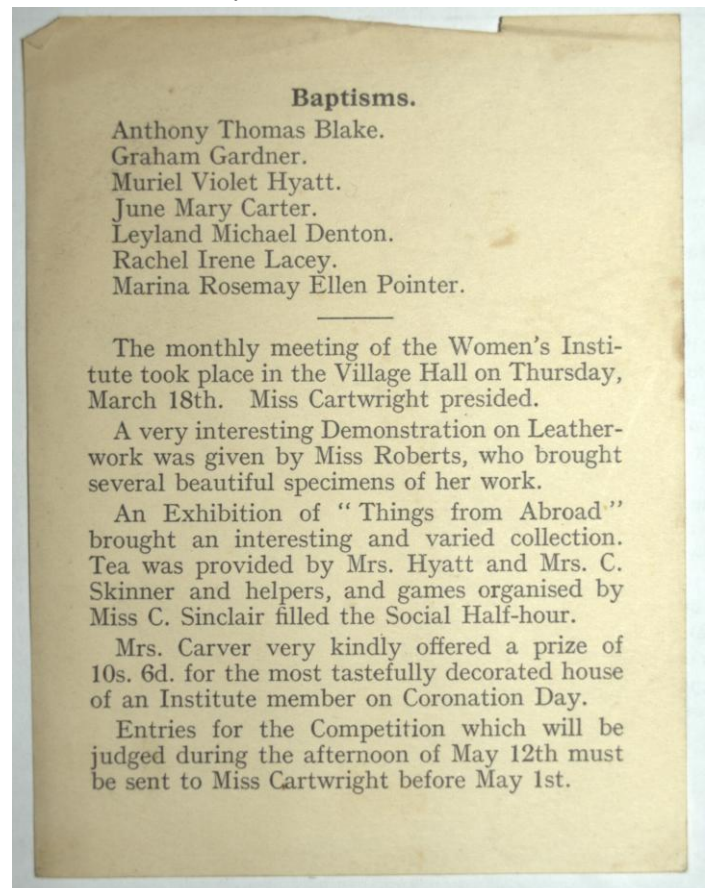
"Today, we hold onto the memory of the love that was taken from us so unfairly, leaving a void that stretches far beyond our reach."

Rest in Peace

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following people who died recently:

Roy Francis MASON, who died on 13th November 2025, was born on 13th November 1933 in Portsmouth to his mother Florence and his father, William. He grew up with his sister Bet, who was three years older than him, and to whom he remained close all his life. During the war the family were evacuated from Portsmouth to Sutton Courtenay, to escape the bombing, and they moved into a cottage just behind what is now Hari and Esha's Store. Roy came to love the village of Sutton Courtenay and remained here for the rest of his life.

Roy attended the old school and had many memories of war time – especially the hardship of rationing. He and Bet used to play games with the other children in the village, frequently role-playing the key players in the war, and Roy used to be General Montgomery, which led to the nickname of Mont, which eventually stuck with family too. Whilst at school he worked on the Milk Round for the Allens and on leaving school he did everything from grave maintenance to gardening. He always loved being outdoors but the majority of his working life was spent with British Leyland in Cowley as the Storeman in charge of supplies for the car factory.

He was an intelligent and hardworking man – even though his spelling was always atrocious! He married his first wife, Dorothy, in 1958, in her home village of Long Wittenham, and they moved to Harwell Road in Sutton Courtenay where they went on to have two daughters, Jenny and Tracey. Sadly, Dorothy developed cancer and died in 1975. Roy was left to bring up Jenny and Tracey on his own. They remember him as a fairly strict parent who set firm boundaries. But he was also very loving and protective – caring and perceptive and would cheer them up when they felt sad. Roy met all the challenges of being a single-Dad with the support of his sister, his Mum and their wonderful neighbours in Harwell Road. Once his girls were grown-up he started dating again and, being such a charming man, with a twinkle in his eye, proved to be popular with the ladies. He met Annette and, along with her three boys, they became a blended family.

Roy was an enthusiastic fisherman from an early age and always a great gardener and liked nothing better than being in the open air tending his flowers and vegetables. His sister Bet always said that when he wasn't gardening, he was fishing. He would often give away seedlings and plants as gifts, along with excess produce from the vegetable plot. He was a very practical man and did a lot of the building work on the house by himself – even installing their first central heating system. He enjoyed dancing and he and Annette won a few trophies in the various competitions they entered and Tracey has fond memories of him jiving with her in the kitchen.

Unfortunately, Annette developed Parkinson's Disease and, once again, Roy became a carer. He looked after her devotedly until she died in January 2016. Looking after Annette took its toll on Roy's own health – both physically and mentally and her death hit him hard. He loved being a Grampy and having the grandchildren and great-grandchildren to visit. He always made sure he had a good supply of biscuits in the house and the grandchildren fondly remember how he always got the tub of biscuits out every time they came to visit. When the great-grandchildren appeared, the same tub of biscuits (replenished with fresh ones obviously) came out, along with chocolate buttons. And there was always a rich tea biscuit on the windowsill waiting for Molly the Dog of whom Roy was always very fond.

Roy died on his birthday, at the end of a long life which was well-lived in loving and caring for his family who will always remember him as someone who was practical, caring, friendly and generous but above all, a loving husband, father and grandfather. His funeral took place in All Saints' Church, followed by burial in the churchyard, on 17th December 2025.

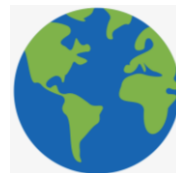

Making best use of technology to help cut crime and catch criminals

Just before Christmas Thames Valley Police rolled out a live facial recognition operation in Oxford, aimed as much at explaining the technology to the public as at catching criminals.

The use of live facial-recognition technology can bring great benefits to help cut crime and catch criminals.

Whilst the use of this technology is widely welcomed by most people, there are understandable concerns by some. I have worked closely with the police to ensure that all the necessary safeguards are put in place to protect privacy and that the only people who should have anything to fear from the use of live facial-recognition are criminals seeking to target people and property in our community.

The system does not - and cannot - identify everyone that it sees, but instead is looking for those on a specific watchlist; those who are either wanted by the police or have a warrant issued for them by the courts. Essentially it is very much like the screenlock that many of us will use on our mobile phones. It recognises the people the police are looking for but simply doesn't recognise the rest of us.

It is important that the police explain the use of this tactic and ensure widespread consent from the public. The use of any technology just provides a tool for the police. It is still the men and women of Thames Valley Police who will use their professional judgment to protect the public.

The effectiveness of these operations will continually be evaluated, alongside other tactics the police use. With more officers in neighbourhood policing roles and overall crime falling, it remains important that the police are able to address the issues that matter most to the public. You can play your part by reporting any crimes or suspicious activity you see in your community on thamesvalley.police.uk or by calling 101.

ADVERTORIAL SERIES – BUILDING WORK

PERMITTED DEVELOPMENT

I am often asked by people who are thinking about extending their property and have assumed that, because the extension that they are considering falls within the limits of Permitted Development, no planning approval is required and that they can just get on with it.

Permitted development covers the enlargement or alteration of a dwelling, but only if the property is not listed or in a conservation area, national park, Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, or Site of Special Scientific Interest. It also applies only to houses—not flats, maisonettes, or other buildings. Additional restrictions, such as Article 4 directions, may also apply to specific properties.

Front extensions don't fall within permitted development, though some side extensions may. Verandahs, balconies and raised platforms require planning permission, although Juliet balconies (with no platform or external access) are normally permitted development.

Permitted development rights have specific criteria that can be complex. Single-storey rear extensions must not extend beyond the original house's rear wall by more than 3 metres for semi-detached or terraced houses, or 4 metres for detached houses. "Original house" means as first built or as it stood on 1 July 1948. Previous owners may have already built extensions affecting these limits. In 2015, planning legislation increased these limits to 6 metres and 8 metres respectively.

While formal planning approval isn't needed if your extension complies with permitted development limits, you do need

confirmation from the local planning authority that the proposed work is indeed permitted development. For extensions up to 3 metres (semi-detached/terraced) or 4 metres (detached), a Lawful Development: Proposed Use application is required. For extensions under 2015 legislation, a Prior Approval: Larger Home Extension application is needed, which will include neighbour consultation. In both cases, the local authority must be notified before development commences, with supporting plans and elevations.

If the local planning authority decides work doesn't fall within permitted development limits, a Householder Planning Application is required. If an extension is built without a Lawful Development Certificate or Prior Approval Notification, the authority can require a Householder Planning Application. Without planning approval for built extensions, and if appeals are dismissed, the authority can issue Planning Enforcement Notices requiring demolition at the householder's expense.

Permitted development isn't just extensions—it includes solar panels, roof alterations like dormers, chimney alterations or replacements, outbuildings, swimming pools and LPG or oil containers.

As you can see, permitted development isn't as straightforward as it appears. The technical guidance runs to 50 pages! If you're thinking about a project and would like guidance, please get in touch.

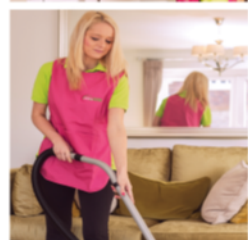

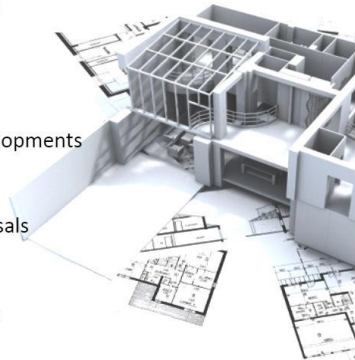
