Appeal for village photographs

Have you taken any photographs of the local area? War Memorial cleaned

The war memorial has been given a light clean with water and a brush to prepare for Remembrance Sunday and Commemoration of WW1 Centenary. This was sympathetic cleaning to remove just the dirt and grime without causing damage to the stone. The war memorial was unveiled by Herbert Asquith in 1920 and serves as a fitting tribute to those who lost their lives in the conflicts of the last century.

Oxfordshire County Council – Minerals and Waste Local Plan Part 2

Various sites in the vicinity of Sutton Courtenay e.g. at Culham, Appleford and off Peep O Day Lane have been mentioned in the Minerals Local Plan for new and continued use for working. The Council has expressed concerns as some may affect a proposed new river crossing, be sited next to sports areas or close to housing as well as creating extra traffic.

Magnox – Presentation to Parish Council

At the last meeting of the Parish Council Magnox gave a brief presentation about their proposals to continue the removal of the old Harwell pipe in the village. The first section was removed in 2013 from the river to Appleford Road, and they subsequently removed sections across fields near Milton Park. At the end of the year they are aiming to start on the section through the village. This is from Frilsham Street working along footpath 27, across the fields and Churchmere Road heading towards All Saints Lane and Appleford Road. See full detailed report on Page 11 of this issue.

Fireworks

In past years there have complaints about 5th November and the celebrations that seem to extend for several days either side of that date. Please be considerate for neighbours and the many pets and animals in the village when letting off your fireworks. Please notify others when any fireworks are going to be lit so that villagers are aware and arrangements can be made to keep pets indoors.

Grants

Final reminder that the Parish Council will soon be preparing its budget for the next financial year and if there is any worthy and needy organization, where Sutton Courtenay residents benefit, which is considering applying to the Parish Council for



a grant, then please write to the Clerk, stating the purpose of the grant and supplying a copy of your organisation's accounts, as soon as possible. Grant applications will not be considered again until the Autumn 2018.

The following planning applications have been considered:

P18/V2282/HH Demolition of conservatory, erection of single storey extension, remodel ground floor layout, replace doors and windows. Remove roof and raise ridge to facilitate loft conversion. 21 High Street. Council had concerns regarding the raising of the roof and installation of 7 rooflights and the overlooking of neighbouring properties. The need for 3 additional parking areas off a bridleway was questioned.

P18/V1979/FUL New house with triple garage off Churchmere Road. This was a replacement dwelling, but the Council had not been sent a block plan so the actual location of the house could not be determined, nor was there a north point on the drawing, so it was impossible to calculate whether windows would overlook neighbours.

P18/V2277/FUL Site clearance and preparation, and erection of the development of a Data Centre campus at Sutton Courtenay Lane. Council recognized that the site had previously been granted planning permission, but had concerns regarding the size of the car park, the monitoring of vehicles particularly through the village and cumulative impact with the adjacent warehouses.

P18/V2307/FUL Replace existing wooden windows and French doors with UPVC at 29 Lady Place. Council had no objections provided they were in keeping

P18/V2373/HH Side garage extension and larger attic space at 30 Harwell Road. Council had no objections

From the Ministry Team...

This month is the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War and there will be

commemorations all over the country as we look back and remember the appalling cost of that conflict both to our own country and to the rest of Europe. A staggering 65 million men fought in the First World War. An estimated 9 million died, many more were injured. Life expectancy in the trenches was a mere 6 weeks at the height of the fighting. A whole generation, the flower of Europe, were decimated and traumatised by what they saw.

Perhaps the greatest sadness as we look back to the 1918 armistice is that underlying causes of the conflict were not addressed and twenty one years later the world was again at war. Earlier this summer we were in Dresden and saw first-hand a city that suffered greatly from British bombing, a reminder that our own leaders had to make tough, and with hindsight, controversial choices. Links have now been established between

the cathedrals of Coventry and Dresden and this is one small example of the work of reconciliation that has gradually repaired the past. As we owe a huge debt to those who gave their lives in war we also owe a debt to men of vision who during our own life times have brought Europe together in peace and harmony.

Over the next few days you may see the silhouettes of soldiers in our churches, around our villages and elsewhere in the country. They are part of a campaign (#ThereButNotThere) to raise awareness and also to support Help for Heroes, a charity that works with injured service men. These silhouettes will be in our churches on Armistice Day itself which falls on a Sunday this year. Please join us on Sunday 11th November at Sutton Courtenay War Memorial at 10.:45 ready to hold the silence at 11:00. The traditional two minutes silence is a time for us all to reflect on the evils of war and to give thanks for the peace we enjoy today.

COUNTY COUNCILLOR

A couple of weeks ago, I witnessed my first meeting of “The Growth Board”. Around a table sat all the great and the good from local government in Oxfordshire. The audience included representatives of Natural England, CPRE (Council for the Protection of Rural England) and various charities. The expenses bill for running such a meeting must have been eye-watering.

I expected to witness big issues being discussed and big decisions being taken. However, the agenda consisted of receiving reports and appeals for consideration from many worthy organisations. Clearly the big decisions and discussions were not going to happen in such a public meeting.

A new, and much needed Scrutiny Committee of the activities of the Growth Board is going to have its work cut out if it is only going to be allowed access to such public meetings of the Growth Board.

Of the many reports presented to the Board at the meeting, one that stood out for me was from “Active Oxford”. It seems that child obesity is a growing and particular problem in Oxfordshire.

It was that report that has prompted me to say something this month about Cycling, an activity that would do much to help reduce child obesity as well as to encourage a healthier lifestyle for everyone. However, cycling in this county is beset with pitfalls. As an occasional and inexperienced cyclist, I do not possess a single piece of Lycra, but I have first hand experience of some of the issues facing cyclists in our congested County. Well

meant, but underused and badly connected cycle paths that spill out onto busy roads – bridges where cyclists, pedestrians and drivers hurl abuse at each other because no one knows who has priority – lack of spaces in towns to park your bicycle – too narrow cycle lanes beside heavy traffic - I have experienced it all. The solutions are all costly and hence not enough is happening.

However, in Milton Park, we have a major employment area surrounded by thousands of homes within 3 or 4 miles. At present, cyclists have to brave congested roads to get to and from work. Unsurprisingly, very few parents are prepared to let their children loose on the roads. There are few encouragements to get us out of our cars and on to bicycles.

But it is not all hopeless:

MEPC already encourage all business on Milton Park to provide shower facilities for their staff. The proposed new cycle/pedestrian bridge from Milton Heights to Milton Park will make much of the route to/from work for residents safe for cyclists. There are stretches of pleasant, safe cycle paths between many of the villages and Milton Park. With help from local landowners, these stretches could be linked up. There are existing paths that could be made safer and relatively cheaper.

As “Active Oxford” argue, we cannot give up on this. Cycling is healthier for each of us and healthier for the planet.

Earlier this month Michael Gove announced a landmark Agriculture Bill to replace the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP). As we leave the European Union this Bill will replace the current rules. The Bill also contains a specific provision to enable government to provide financial assistance to improve productivity. This may have a significant effect on the farmers in the area, and I look forward to the changes in the bill being implemented.

MAGNOX REMOVAL OF HARWELL PIPELINE

Following the presentation by Magnox Ltd at the Parish Council meeting on the 2nd October, it was requested that an article should be submitted to this newsletter regarding the work being performed by Magnox, so people unable to attend the meeting know what work is planned in the village.

The two pipelines from the Atomic Energy Research Establishment, (AERE), at Harwell to the River Thames were constructed through the village in the late 1940's. These pipelines carried fresh water to a waterworks on All Saints Lane before pumping it to the Harwell site, and also discharged treated water effluent from Harwell into the Thames via a weir at the rear of Mill House. The discharges were under a licence from the Environment Agency.

The water discharges from the Harwell site finished in March 2013 and to date 4.75km of the pipeline has been excavated and removed, (from the Harwell site to a point south of Sutton Courtenay village, including Milton Park and the railway which has allowed the re-opening of the Backhill Lane Underpass).

The next and final phase of work is to remove the pipelines from the village. The intention is to start this work in early December for completion around June 2019. The pipelines follow a number of footpath, road and bridleway routes from Frilsham Street and Footpath 27 via Old Wallingford Road and Footpath 7, and All Saints Lane, to Appleford Road. The work will require the temporary closure of these routes, to allow the work to be undertaken safely, as it proceeds through the village. A number of properties fronting onto these routes will be directly affected by our works and we

have written to those households separately to explain the effects on them for access and possible alternative routes.

Starting in December 2018; the current plan is to remove the pipes from these areas during these dates:

Frilsham Street to Old Wallingford Way, December 2018 to February 2019

Old Wallingford Way to Churchmere Road, March 2019 to April 2019

All Saints Lane, May 2019 to June 2019

A small team of 6 workers and two excavators will expose two lengths of pipe at a time, approximately 6 to 12 metres. This rolling process will slowly work its way through the village over a period of a few months. All excavations will be back-filled and the work area made safe at the end of each day; there should be no more than 1 or 2 lorry movements per day.

SUTTON COURTENAY FORUM UPDATE

What is the Sutton Courtenay Forum? - A reminder

Firstly some background, Sutton Courtenay Action (SCA) was formed at the initiative of a group of residents to take proactive action to robustly challenge major planning applications that would have a significant detrimental impact on the community. All villagers were and are invited to join or contribute to its work.

SCA has played a pivotal role in building the body of evidence that demonstrates the technical flaws, erroneous assumptions and contradictions in the major planning applications and has presented at the Vale's Planning Committee meetings with considerable success. These being the speculative application by London Regeneration for up to 360 houses East of the Harwell Road and the Redrow application for 200 houses behind the village hall which is an allocated site in the Vale's Local Plan.

In October 2016, SCA organised and led a group of over 150 residents to the Vale Offices to present a petition for a Fair Deal for Sutton Courtenay and as a result, the Vale was persuaded that Sutton Courtenay was a special case and through the then Leader of the VWHDC Matthew Barber it agreed to increase the dialogue through a discussion Forum to better understand the issues affecting Sutton Courtenay.

SCA coordinated the formation of the Sutton Courtenay Forum and requested our District Councillor, County Councillor and the Parish Council and other bodies to also participate by sending representatives to ensure joined up working and as they were part of the local democracy. Terms of Reference were drawn up and agreed by the VWHDC and the Parish Council.

The Forum representatives come from a cross section of the village and include our Parish Council, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Committee, our County and District Councillors, Sutton Courtenay Action and other villagers who have expressed an interest in participating. Independent experts for both traffic and drainage have also attended. It is governed by the Terms of Reference agreed by the Vale and The Parish Council. Villagers have been invited to participate via both the Sutton Courtenay Newsletter and the Sutton Courtenay Action email and that invitation still stands. Villagers have also been asked to raise any issues for discussion. The Parish Council appointed two representatives to attend forum meetings and they can also pass on any request for information. These councillors provide a report of the Forum meetings to the Council at its meetings as reflected in its minutes.

The Forum has never sought or pretended to be a decision-making body. The Sutton Courtenay Forum is an information exchange and does not have a remit for problem solving. If as a result of the information exchange, potential actions arise these are passed to the Parish Council.

Why do we need it?

Sutton Courtenay is a unique case within the Vale due to its attractiveness to developers, our location adjacent to Milton Park and the ever growing Didcot Garden Town coupled with the traffic impact of our bridge crossing. It is important to have increased access to the Vale and the various Planning Officers due to the numerous and ongoing major planning

applications impacting the village. Residents were pleased that the London Regeneration application behind Harwell Road was refused. The Redrow application behind the Village Hall is now three years old. It has technical issues on drainage and traffic but the current decision due date has passed. The village awaits the decision which could be refusal based on the technical issues. We also face the North Appleford Road application and the Warehouses and Data Centre applications. The Forum has also raised enforcement and other issues raised by residents.

Uniquely amongst the Vale villages the Forum has enabled SC residents to have robust discussions with the Vale and to ensure that Sutton Courtenay's unique problems have remained in the forefront of the minds of the Leader and officers in the Vale. It has put across to the Vale widespread concerns across the village, not only about the flood of recent and current speculative development applications, but also the cumulative impact of the many hundreds of houses already built with little improvement to the infrastructure or amenities to support that expansion. The Oxfordshire County Council traffic survey was heavily influenced by the Forum's detailed contribution. This resulted in the OCC decision that further development constitutes severe harm and enables development to be refused.

With the multiple key planning applications at last coming to a head in the near future, it is really important for the Village to maintain a united front if it is to continue to be successful in protecting residents' interests. The Forum continues to play an important role in that.

Latest Meeting 19 September 2018 Summary

The Vale was represented by the Leader of the Council, Roger Cox (Matthew Barber ceased to be Leader in May 2018), Emily Hamerton, Development Manager and Vale Officers for planning and enforcement.

Topics discussed included the revised NPPF (National Planning Policy Framework), Oxfordshire Growth, HIF (Housing Infrastructure Fund), JSSP (Joint Statutory Spatial Plan), the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway, traffic including the Harwell Road closure, Redrow and London Regeneration applications, Appleford Road and Warehouse applications and enforcement.

As a result of the JSSP, until 2021, Oxfordshire Councils now only need to show a 3 year housing land supply. This is good news for the village since it is now much more challenging for speculative development such as London Regeneration to be approved.

LETTER TO THE EDITORS

Update on queries about the Sutton Courtenay Forum

We would like to thank those who have given us very positive feedback for asking questions about the Sutton Courtenay Forum, published in October's SC News. To update, we have now found out more, from a variety of sources (not from the Forum itself). Apparently, the Forum is governed by Terms of Reference agreed by the Vale of White Horse District Council and The Parish Council. Membership includes, along with elected councillors, members of the Neighbourhood Planning Group (sic) and Sutton Courtenay Action, plus any villagers who have expressed a wish to participate or raise an issue. We are surprised that none of this information was forwarded to us when we made FOI requests. We were even told by the Parish Council that the Forum was nothing to do with it! At least now there is some explanation, but we still don't know what the ToRs are, so a repeat FOI request is on its way. However the information we have come across raises further questions.

First, does anyone have a clue who Sutton Courtenay Action (SCA) are and why they should be included in the Forum? It is difficult to find any information on the activists concerned. There is only one individual identified, the spokesperson. There is a SC Action Facebook page which has members, but this is clearly different, as we know some individuals on the FB page are only there to find out what SCA is doing. The SCA and SC Forum titles are sometimes interchanged in

various statements/publications, so when it is claimed that the Forum has members from SCA, are they frequently the same people?

Second, we learned the Neighbourhood Plan "group" is part of the Forum. We think this means the NP steering committee (NPSC). Again it is difficult to precisely identify who belongs to this. The NPSC recently conducted a survey and intend to use the responses to this to form a neighbourhood plan for the village. Although they have repeatedly declined to provide a figure for the population supposedly surveyed, it is clear, as indicated in their report in October's SC News, that the response rate was extremely low. Using mid-census adult population estimates, it was only c.23%. Thus, the NPSC do not seem to have a representative basis upon which to raise issues at the SC Forum (particularly across the village, as many households, in some streets, did not receive a survey form) let alone to form a NP.

Readers now know as much as we can glean; but we promise to keep digging until we find out who is representing what level of information, allegedly on behalf of villagers, to the District Council, who have power over planning decisions which affect all of us, wherever we are in the village and for whatever we want in the way of housing. On a final point, we understand the NPSC is spending local taxpayers' money on the failed survey. We are endeavouring to find out how much. If we do, we'll let you know via the SC News.

NEIGHBORHOOD ACTION GROUP5 (NAG5) SAFETY CORNER

Crime prevention

There has been a spate of burglaries and shed break-ins recently. A few reminders about what you can do to help to keep your home and belongings safe.

- Invest in timer switches to turn on lights when the house is unoccupied.
- Close and lock doors and windows when you leave the house and go to bed. Use your house alarm if you have one.
- Don't leave house and vehicle keys, handbags and wallets etc visible through/from the front door.
- Keep valuables out of sight. If you have high-value jewellery consider using a bank safety deposit box or, if you keep it at home, invest in a home safe suitable for providing jewellery. Insurance companies can provide advice on which type of safe is most suitable for your needs.
- Don't advertise that you're away from home by posting about it on social media.
- Keep your shed in good condition. Fittings should be bolted through the door and any screws concealed. Make things harder for the would-be thief by using tamper-proof screws or coach bolts together with a good quality pad bar or hasp and staple and close shackled padlock.
- Lock all tools and equipment away. Ensure ladders are locked to a secure fixture in the shed or garage, so that they can't be used to reach your top floor windows.
- Install security lighting as a deterrent and consider fitting a garage or shed alarm.
- Use plants such as thorny shrubs to act as a barrier at potential access points.
- Mark property with your postcode or use forensic marking such as Selecta DNA and SmartWater.
- Register your valuables with www.immobilise.com.

Fraud, scams and phishing

Fraudsters and criminals are becoming ever more sophisticated and convincing in the ways in which they try to obtain our personal and financial details via letters, phone calls, e-mails and texts. It's a good idea to get into the habit of stopping to think before providing such information.

- If you think you've uncovered a scam, been a victim or been targeted, report it online to Action Fraud, the UK's national fraud and cyber crime reporting centre, at www.actionfraud.police.uk. If you don't have online access you can call Action Fraud and report it on 0300 123 2040.
