#### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS



#### **Radcot Green Presentation**

A presentation was made to Council by FCC and their representatives at a meeting of the Parish Council held on  $13^{th}$ October 2020. The meeting was

held via Zoom meetings and many residents dialed in to listen to and ask questions in relation to the proposed Radcot Green Development within Sutton Courtenay. A brief summary of the meeting and formal minutes for the subsequent Parish Council meeting will be published on the website in the coming days along with a copy of the slides used by FCC and its representatives during their presentation.

#### **Redevelopment of the Recreation Ground**

The Parish Council are aiming to redevelop the Recreation Ground. As part of the initial consultation process, they are seeking resident's views on both the existing facilities and suggestions on what facilities people may wish to have in the future. These views are being obtained by way of a survey and this can be found in the centre of this newsletter, this can be pulled out and completed. Details of where to drop off your completed surveys can be found on the introductory page, along with information of what to do if you want an electronic version. Hard copies can be delivered to your door if you wish and the Parish Council will also collect your completed questionnaires should you not be going out at the present time. The closing date for response to the survey is December 15<sup>th</sup> 2020. The Abingdon Damascus Youth Project have created a survey specifically for the younger residents.

#### Planning Inquiry – Appleford Road

The planning inquiry for the proposed housing on Appleford Road took place during the week commencing  $5^{th} - 9^{th}$  October 2020. The Parish Council were represented by a Planning Consultant who prepared and presented a statement on their behalf and various local residents also made statements as well as District and County Councillor Webber. The Parish Council will make you aware of the outcome of the appeal once we have the same – there is no confirmation of when a decision will be published.

#### **Covid 19 Support Groups**

The Covid-19 Support group is continuing to provide its excellent support of local people in the area during this time and are prepared should the need for their assistance increase given the rise of cases over the next few weeks. The Parish Council wishes to thank these volunteers for their continued work for the village residents.

#### Grants

The Parish Council award Grants on an annual basis. The Parish Council will soon be preparing its budget for the next financial year and if there is any worthy and needy organization, where Sutton Courtenay residents will benefit, who wish to consider applying to the Parish Council for a grant, they may do so. Please write to the Clerk, stating the purpose of the grant and supplying a copy of your organisation's accounts, as soon as possible. Grant applications will not be considered again until the Autumn 2021.

## Working together to support learning

Last week the staff completed their assessments, which will help us to plan the next steps in learning. We deliberately did not carry these out for the first month. Our first value is readiness, and before we

rush into catch up plans for learning, we have to make sure that everyone is feeling settled and safe. This is all about establishing strong relationships and routines. Of course, in the day to day teaching, both teachers and support staff are constantly taking in information about who knows what and what little changes can be made to support each child's learning journey. However, at times it is worth carrying out more formal assessments, and getting together as a staff to plan longer term strategies. After half term, we will be offering each family the chance to talk with the teachers, either by telephone or via a virtual meeting whichever works best for them. This will be in place of our usual consultation evenings. We will also be running our annual survey for the school community to tell us how we are doing. One of the strengths of the school during the pandemic has been the way we have all worked together so well for our children, and we will continue to look for ways to make this work whatever is happening around us!

## The impact of the pandemic

So far we have been extremely lucky and have not had to close any 'bubbles' in school due to positive cases. Our biggest challenge has been covering staff when they have been struggling to access tests or awaiting results for family members with a temperature or persistent cough. So far we have managed to cover this within ourselves with a mixture of myself, support staff and teachers teaching the class from home via Microsoft Teams. It has been a bit frantic at times but worth it to provide the children with continuity.

We are maintaining our full curriculum with only minor changes such as a reduction in trips. It is lovely to see the children enjoying art, music and active play as much as ever!

The staff have remarked that this has made them pause and look again at all the wonderful opportunities we have close at hand. We are making good use of our Forest School this year with Reception and Year 3 accessing this. Barn Owls Nursery are using the grounds for exploration – one child had gone home and told his mum all about an enormously long walk he had been

taken on and all that he had seen – it was around the perimeter of the site! Today, Wrens class set off in the glorious autumn sunshine and visited All Saint's Church – another safe place to make the most of. We will be looking to make more use of the Environmental Centre at SCEEC this year too. We are very fortunate to have so much nearby

#### Online dating (romance) fraud warning from the police and Action Fraud

Reports of romance fraud have risen by 26% in the past year, with Action Fraud receiving 400 reports a month from victims in the UK. The total lost by victims between August 2019 and August 2020 was  $\pounds 66,355,239$ , equating to an average loss per victim of just over  $\pounds 10,000$ . Reports increased to 600 per month from June to August this year, indicating that the national lockdown may have led to an increase in people meeting and talking to romance fraudsters.

- Criminals are experts at impersonating people and spend hours researching victims for their scams, particularly when committing romance fraud.
- Romance, or dating, fraud occurs when you think you've met the perfect partner online, but they're using a fake profile to form a relationship with you. They gain your trust over a number of weeks or months to encourage you to believe you're in a loving and caring relationship. Their end goal is always to get your money or personal information.

#### COUNTY AND DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

It seems that the Planning White Paper, consultation and outcome will be pushed back beyond next year's Local Elections. For most of us, this is a relief. If it had gone through unaltered, the implications for our area were many and highly significant. As a potential "Growth area", restrictions around development would be considerably relaxed.

The County Division of Sutton Courtenay and Drayton, which includes Drayton, Appleford, Milton and Shippon, is already under extreme housing pressure. An arial map of the area shows that there is not much room between each of the settlements. Not much wonder that many residents feel we are in danger of becoming merged into a "Greater Abingdon and Didcot" - rich in employment sites, but unable to move for traffic gridlock.

OCC Highways has been wrestling with the problem of how to manage the increasing pressure on our road system for many years now. So severe has been the problem, that they have been objecting to further development at least until major improvements are in place. The two schemes proposed, based on their traffic modelling - one around Didcot and one at the Frilford Crossroads are at very different stages. Now that the Growth Deal and HIF Fund are signed off, the proposed link road and new bridge over the Thames are funded and, if the planning process goes smoothly (a sizeable "if") these bits of infrastructure will be in place and functioning in 2024. Many still have reservations over the argued benefits of the scheme, but, at least there is a real prospect of some infrastructure being in place *before* the housing. This is something that local politicians on all sides have been calling for for years.

Frilford crossroads is at a much earlier stage. Road designs are being worked on, including a Marcham bypass, but there is almost no money in place to pay for it all and certainly not the many millions it will cost. In present circumstances, it is hard to see Government being in a position to provide the funds, so we are all watching this space.

As Sutton Courtenay, Milton, Appleford and a Drayton are discovering, even when the funding *is* in place, a whole lot of other issues emerge.

OCC Highways now say that some housing around Didcot could be allowed because the HIF Bid has been signed. This assumes that we could all cope with extra housing for the 3 years it will take to deliver the infrastructure. I.e. Back to the "infrastructure before housing" argument.

Developers can argue that there is now the capacity for further housing. The new link road and bridge is planned to cope with the 17000 + houses that are being built, and are likely to be built within a 5 mile radius.

Many argue that new roads, in time, simply generate more traffic.

Many others argue that the environmental impact of all the housing and road building will make it impossible to reach any climate change targets.

Others argue that all this focus on our area works against the principle of "levelling up".

And then, of course there is COVID - expected to cost every UK adult £32000 - and that was the end of May estimate.

Perhaps it is time to take a long, hard breath....

Some advice..

In the past few weeks, three separate issues have arisen on the topic of planning disputes between neighbours. Please don't shoot the messenger, but the way the planning system operates can seem very strange.

First, anyone has a right to apply for planning permission anywhere. Yes, I could apply to build a house in my next door neighbour's garden. (I would be mad to do it, because it would be expensive and would almost certainly be rejected).

Secondly, I can build anything I like on my own property with or without planning permission. Even if I have not had planning permission, the new building has to be judged as a retrospective application. If it would probably have been allowed anyway, nothing will be done.

Thirdly, if you, as a neighbour object to what I have done, you need to register your objection within 10 years or the objection will not be valid.

And no, I did not write the rules!

#### From the Ministry Team...

I am writing this letter just after our Harvest Thanksgiving service at church. This year our farmers have struggled with the vagaries of the British weather; too much rain early on and then not enough in the earlier part of the summer. They have also had the problem of getting enough man power for harvest itself with most seasonal workers being unable to travel due to various COVID-19 restrictions. As a result farmers have had to work doubly hard to provide food for the supermarkets. This is a reminder to us that everything we enjoy requires hard work behind the scenes to make it happen.

Our churches made a collection of food for the Abingdon food bank. The food bank gave out a record number of food parcels at the start of the lock down in the spring. Currently demand is lower but we fear that over the winter there are likely to be many people who lose their jobs and then fall through the safety net and end up in need of food and other basics in order to survive. We are continuing to pass on food to the food bank and there are boxes in our church porches if anyone would like to support those who desperately need help in these unusual times.

For our churches, as for every other community organisation this has been a difficult year. We have done our best to provide good quality services since the end of lockdown and we have held some scaled back community events where and when we have been able. Even to do this has required extra work behind the scenes sorting out risk assessments, deep cleaning and all the other things that are required to enable people to feel safe when they come into our buildings. My thanks go to everyone who has made this possible.

We are looking forward to Remembrance Sunday. Regretfully government restrictions make it very unlikely we will be able to meet around our war memorials. In Sutton Courtenay we will be holding a short Open Air Service in the Churchyard (please see advert for details) and do continue to check our web site, *www.damascusparish.org.uk* or look on church notice boards for further details.

#### LETTER TO THE EDITORS

Prompted by the photographs of the VE Day and the VJ Day commemorations in the June and September editions of SCN, Jonathan Blinman from the High Street has emailed the Editors a copy of an email exchange with his family. Here's an extract from that exchange.

"I was 9 at the time and only dimly remember a street party with trestle tables out in the road. I recall my best friend David's mum rather impressed me devising a guy for the bonfire we were having - a stuffed figure dressed in painter's overalls, a 6" brush in hand, and a lifelike painted mask of Adolf Hitler complete with moustache and forelock. David's dad had been killed at Monte Cassino.

Anyway, endless recent TV references to the Normandy landings reminded me of one of my WW2 memories which I thought I would share with you (lockdown by COVID-19 brings all sorts of buried memories out of the woodwork!). In 1944 when I was at school in Abingdon (aged 8) we raced home in the afternoon to find the village occupied by the Army! Sutton Courtenay had been selected for the dress rehearsal of the airborne landings at Arnhem and, as kids, we were over the moon to find our homes and gardens full of soldiers with weapons, a machine-gun post in my front garden (and my mum Betty doling out cups of tea!) and, overall, the cracklle of gunfire and the thud of explosions. Bursting with excitement, we collected brass cartridge cases and silk parachute cord!

And the initial scene of the airborne landings was captured in this [see below] watercolour sketch by my dad Edward. (he had been invalided out of the army some while earlier) It is a view from Sutton across the fields towards Wittenham Clumps glimpsed in the distance. Sadly over 1000 of those eager young men never came home.

Food for thought as we ride out this never-ending coronavirus."

## Job redundancy: check your rights and talk to Citizens Advice

One of the most serious outcomes of the current pandemic problem is that thousands of people in the UK are losing their jobs. If you are one of

these people, and are made redundant or offered voluntary redundancy, it is important that you thoroughly understand your rights and options.

The first thing to do if you are at risk of redundancy is to look at your contract of employment, which will spell out your basic rights. Make sure that your company abides by these conditions. Also, consider other sources of help such as your union if you belong to one. Bear in mind that if you have been in the job for less than two years you do not have as much job protection, but if for more than two years, your employer has to follow certain procedures, e.g. find you another job in the company if possible.

You can't be made redundant in an unfair way or for discriminatory reasons. The reason must be a genuine one, i.e. the job you do or the skills you have are no longer needed, or the employer can't afford you, or the business is failing. With technology advancing, sometimes fewer people are needed to do a given job.

You might be entitled to receive redundancy pay, which increases with length of service and has two elements – statutory and contractual. Statutory pay (not paid to those who have less than two years' service) is the minimum that the law says you are entitled to, and is based on your age, weekly pay and the number of years you have worked in the job. Contractual redundancy pay is the additional amount to which your contract may entitle you. If you have been furloughed, the law says that your redundancy pay must be worked out according to your usual wages, not the 80% furlough figure. Bear in mind that if your employer offers you a suitable alternative job and you refuse to take it without good reasons, they can refuse to give you redundancy pay. You can check that your redundancy pay is fair by using the calculator at

You are also entitled to a paid notice period or pay in lieu of notice, and the employer should give you paid time off for attending job interviews.
