

VILLAGE HALL BOOKINGS



PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Parish Council Code of Conduct

The Localism Act 2011 provided for a new Code of Conduct to direct the ways in which members of Councils conduct themselves when carrying out local council business. The County Council, all District Councils and the Parish and Town Councils in Oxfordshire have agreed the same new Code, which means that someone serving on a more than one Council will be subject to the same provisions. The new code came into affect from 1st July 2012 and was adopted by Sutton Courtenay Parish Council.

Oxfordshire County Council – Strategy for Waste

The Parish Council has commented on the proposed waste strategy and on the Joint Municipal Waste Consultation. Its main concerns were that Oxfordshire seemed to be taking no measures to reduce commercial and industrial waste, and that there could be continued importation of waste from outside of the county. There was reference in the documentation of communities being at the centre of the strategy and minimising the distances waste travels, yet there seemed to be little protection for villages such as Sutton Courtenay, which bears an undue share of the current burden of the area's waste, being protected from planning creep. As for the municipal waste, for some large households a fortnightly collection seemed insufficient. There may be the need for larger or additional wheelie bins. Concerns were raised too regarding higher composting targets and the impact that might mean for Sutton Courtenay, particularly as the village already has suffered odours coming from the existing local composting activities.

Dial a Ride Service

A reminder that a new county side service has replaced the Octabus Dial a Ride. Anyone wishing to use the service can book their journey by telephoning $0845\ 310\ 11\ 11$. The service operates Monday to Fridays $9.00\ a.m. - 5.00\ p.m$. Concessionary bus pass holders will still be able to travel free of charge.

Footpaths

The footpaths seem to be quite overgrown this year, partly due to the amount of rain and vigorous plant growth that has taken place. The Parish Councillors are walking the paths to check those that have been reported as inaccessible and those where problems may exist. It is the intention that a report on the parish footpaths will be sent to the County Council's countryside section — the authority for ensuring the public rights of way remain open and available.

SUTTON COURTENAY PRIMARY SCHOOL

By the time that this article goes to print the new school year will have started and we will be welcoming a new class of twenty children to our Foundation Stage Class. Starting school is the beginning of an amazing time of discovery and wonder as children begin to learn and practice the skills that they will need to be great citizens of tomorrow. I am committed to providing opportunities and experiences that make our motto of 'love life; love learning; love one another' come alive in our school.

These experiences are wide and encompass many different aspects of the curriculum. For example, Forest School sessions led by a specially trained leader – who in our school is our fantastic Foundation Stage Teacher, Miss Tristram, help children to start assessing risks for

themselves as they climb trees, light fires and whittle wood at the ages of four and five.

Another wonderful experience came at the end of the school year in July when a group of around twenty children from our Key Stage Two classes (ages 7-11) performed a musical called Cinderella and Rockerfella. The play was practised after school and I did question my decision when I realised that we only had seven rehearsals to put on a play that lasted for one and a half hours! However, all the children involved in the play worked so hard to learn their lines, dances and entrances and resulted in a really wonderful performance - a truly great way to end the year.

Over the summer, one of our children will have had a brilliant experience as they were chosen to have tickets for the Olympic Games that were allocated to the school. The tickets that we were given as part of being involved in the 'Get Set' network were for athletics in the Olympic Stadium on the 4th August — the date that was later dubbed 'Super Saturday' by the press. Alex Foley, from Year 5 would have seen some of Jessica Ennis's events that led to her gold medal, Ussain Bolt's 100 metre heats to name but a few. I am looking forward to finding out more about her day when we return to school.

At the end of the term we celebrated the achievement of our Year 6 pupils and also gave out awards to children that had shown real qualities as a learner. The children nominated for the awards all had similar qualities: independence, perseverance, determination, and the ability to listen to advice and act upon it. The following children were recognised as being fantastic learners — congratulations to them all.

In mathematics the award winners were: Layland Moreton, Harry Greenaway, Alfie Grisbrooke, Emma Doel and Alex Foley. The English award winners were: Lucyanne Wooldridge Grieve, Sofia Dent, Tara Clay, Kacey Bolton and Kaylie Byrne.

As we begin another school year we look forward to an exciting residential trip for Year 5 and 6, a music week and many other opportunities in order to develop our young people. I am looking forward to the year ahead and to watching our children grow – in hear, mind and soul and to see that they 'love life; love learning; and love one another'.

REST IN PEACE

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following:

Gabriele (Gaby) Barnes who died on 25th June 2012 was born in Austria on 28th October 1923. She was the middle one of 5 children. Her oldest brother Franz was a pilot in the Austrian air force and was killed during the 2nd WW. Her family suffered many hardships during this period. Her parents would hide their children in the attic when the Germans were in the vicinity. She couldn't wait to explore after the war and travelled alone to the UK in Oct 1950. Over the next few years she travelled between Austria and the UK on several occasions working as an au pair in the Bournemouth area. In 1955 she met our dad in Bournemouth through their mutual friends Jessie and John and they were married in 1956. She became a citizen of the UK in May 1959. Gaby and John lived in West Moors until the winter of 1957 when they moved to Harwell and Gaby started work in the mid 1960s at the Harwell Nursery School as a kitchen assistant with her great friend June Bowman and worked there for several years. She then had several small cleaning jobs until she finally retired at 74. The family travelled regularly to Austria where she slipped back into the German language as if she had never been away. She loved baking and gardening and enjoyed a little gamble on the one arm bandits at the police club at Harwell. She also loved going to the local bingo sessions at Harwell on Saturday night. When the family moved to Sutton Courtenay in 1997 Gaby started attending The Bingo club at the old cinema in Didcot and played regularly, meeting up with her friends to have a chat and try to win the big money. Gaby was a proud Mum to Caroline and Roz, Grandmother to Andrew, Michael and James and Great-Grandmother to Owen and Olivia. Her funeral took place on Wednesday 4th July 2012 at Oxford Crematorium. She will be greatly missed by her daughters and all her family and friends who remember her as a very caring and loving person.

This is an edited extract of the family tribute given at the service.

Baby Annie Elizabeth Matthews who died on 29th June 2012 and whose funeral was held in All Saints' Church, on 10th July 2012.

Marye Gallagher-Daggitt who died on 8th July 2012 was born in Withernsea, East Yorkshire on 18th January 1933, daughter to Edit and Godfrey Appleyard and younger sister to Dave. Her father died when she was only 10 years old but nevertheless she obtained a scholarship to Malet Lambert School, Hull where she developed her love of tennis. She then joined the Midland Bank in Hull and met a young RAF man stationed at the Radar Base at Patrington. She and George married in 1954 and went onto have a daughter, Jane. In the early 1960s the family moved to Tullis Close in Sutton Courtenay where Marye soon became part of the community – actively involved in the Roman Catholic Church in the village and as a Governor at the Convent. She was well known for her attention to detail – she was a great list writer – her love of tennis and Wimbledon and Formula 1 Grand Prix. Her greatest quality was her loyalty and kindness to family and her friends. She was always concerned for other people and was a good friend to everyone. She will be greatly missed. This is an edited extract of the tribute given at the funeral by Sue Appleyard, Marye's sister in law, at the funeral held at All Saints' Church, Sutton Courtenay on Tuesday 17th July 2012.


Francis William Clarke (Bill) was born in Warwick on 31st May 1924 to William John & Hope Imogen Clarke. He was the only boy of the family, with three sisters. The family moved to Sutton Courtenay to Milton Road when he was 7yrs old. It was then that he first came to worship at All Saints' as a choirboy. He remembered the choirmaster was very strict and always expected the choristers to have perfectly polished shoes. Bill didn't particularly enjoy school and left at the earliest opportunity. He had a job in Judge Leonard's garage when, as a young man he assisted with the Home Guard prior to joining up. He served in the Royal Navy from 1942 until the end of the war and proudly wore his medals at every Remembrance Service. Every year, on his birthday, he would recollect where he was on that date in 1944 - aboard his ship in Weymouth Harbour waiting for the storm to die down prior to the D-Day landings. It was not a pleasant birthday as everyone on board - even seasoned sailors - were so seasick and it was a relief to begin the sail across the channel a few days later - although in later years Bill could hardly bring himself to describe what he went onto experience and witness on D-Day as the American forces they had taken across made their landings on the beaches. All his life Bill loved music, particularly big band music, and he played the drums in the MCM dance band which formed in 1947. This band provided the sound track to the lives of a generation in this village as they played at numerous dances in the old village hall on Old Wallingford Way. Bill married Pam on Boxing Day 1963. Sadly their daughter Judith died very soon after her birth, with Bill attending the funeral at the Graveside - a grave he and Pam have lovingly tended every week since. They went onto have their daughter Jill in 1967. Bill was a devoted Dad and so proud of Jill and all that she achieved in her life and of his granddaughters Hope, Hannah & Chloe with whom he was always teasing and joking. Bill worked in the building trade for many years and has glowing letters of recommendation from many clients. He also worked at the MG car factory as a painter and decorator, a trade he continued into much later life working for many people in the village. Bill loved his garden and allotment - supplying large pumpkins and other produce for Harvest Festival celebrations. Although he could more often be found leaning on a spade chatting to his great friend Don Deadman rather than using it! He was someone who worked hard all his life immensely practical - turning his hand to anything. He lived out his wedding vows by lovingly protecting and caring for Pam. And he never forgot his commitment to All Saints. He was proud of being the Verger and he liked things to be done properly and took his duties very seriously - conscientious and reliable, always impeccably turned out in his suit and with perfectly polished shoes. He was a joy to work alongside - and an excellent source of information about most people in the village! But, more importantly, he was a good friend. He was modest and unassuming but with a very wry sense of humour. Hardworking and generous with his time and his talents he was a man of quiet faith who deeply loved his family and greatly valued the friendships he made over the years. His faith gave meaning to his life and underpinned all that he did and he drew great strength from worshipping at All Saints'. His humour, his teases and his warm smile were guaranteed to lift one's spirits. He will be greatly missed by his wife Pam, daughter Jill and all his family and many friends. This is an edited extract of the address given at Bill's funeral by the Reverend Helen Kendrick, held in All Saints' Church on Tuesday 14th August. 2012.



BIRD WATCHER

In late Spring a flock of six white storks was seen flying over the village before being seen again at Standlake. They are very rare birds in Oxfordshire, especially a flock of six. A single Stork may sometimes be seen, but is probably an escapee.

Also in Spring Garden Warblers could be heard regularly. They sound like a Blackcap, but this is more tuneful and is sometimes called the Nightingale of the North.

In June a pair of Lapwings was flying over the landfill site. They seemed rather agitated, and were perhaps nesting. Birdwatchers, or birders as they prefer to be called, are always careful not to disturb nesting birds. Birdwatchers are

also sometimes called twitchers. These are people who will travel far and wide to catch sight of a rare bird.

There were Swallows flying low over the playing fields this summer. The height at which they fly depends upon the height of the insects, which in turn depends on the weather conditions. There seem to have been fewer Yellowhammers around the village this year though I have heard the occasional one singing. The male has a striking yellow head, which gives the bird its name, and has a song which ends on a high note and can be remembered by the phrase 'little bit of bread no cheese', with the word cheese being the high note at the end.

CHINESE STICKY PORK BELLY STIR FRY RECIPE

This is a great way to use pork belly. The meat is cooked twice so you lose most of the fat

Ingredients

6 lean belly pork strips 1 tbsp of Chinese five spice

For the stir fry

Oil 1 clove of garlic chopped 1 red chilli deseeded and chopped A thumb size piece of ginger peeled and chopped 1 carrot chopped into batons 1/4 green cabbage finely shredded A small bunch of coriander leaves finely chopped 200g of bean sprouts 400g of egg noodles Soy sauce Honey Sesame seeds



Method

Pre heat your oven to 180 c 350 f. Rub the pork belly strips with the 5 spice. Sit the pork on a wire grill rack over a baking sheet. Place the pork in the oven and cook for an hr.

Remove the pork from the oven and cut into 1 cm pieces.

Put a wok or frying pan on a high heat, add the pork belly pieces and fry for a few minutes. As the pork starts to crisp up add 1 tbsp of runny honey and a good splash of soy sauce. Continue to cook the pork until the honey and soy create a nice sticky glaze. Remove from the pan and keep warm.

Wipe out the pan and return to a high heat. Add a splash of oil to the pan and drop in the garlic, chilli and ginger. Fry for minute then add the veg. At this point you can use pretty much any veg that you like so have a play around. Stir fry the veg for a few minutes. Meanwhile cook the noodles according to the pack, Refresh in cold water to slow down the cooking time and add to the wok. Continue to stir fry.

You want the veg to be cooked but still with a little crunch. Remove the wok from the heat and season with soy. Top the stir fry with the pork and sprinkle over a few sesame seeds and the coriander leaves.

ATHLETICS COMMUNITY DAY

The following is an extract from an e mail from Caroline Dendy describing an athletics community day she held in the village on 14th August. Caroline is a UK affiliated run leader, and has been leading a running group in Sutton Courtenay for the past two years. The purpose of the day was to inspire people, both young and old, to try athletics, continuing the legacy of the Olympics. Here she describes the Sutton Courtenay event:

I held two Athletics Community Days this week. One was in Drayton and the second in Sutton Courtenay on 14th August. I only had 4 days to advertise it, so the numbers were limited to 8 and 10. We had 5 new people attend, two of whom would like to return to the weekly running club, 3 are currently too young but inspired. We had 3 children and one lady who was 5 months pregnant running with us (a regular). The atmosphere was fun, relaxed and (for me) memorable.

After our warm up lap to view the layout of the field we did our first 2 events; beat Bolt. On a 100m track we tried to run as far as we could in the same time as Usain Bolt ran the 100m. I had measured out the side of the track so that people could see how far they could get. Medals were awarded for the furthest runner. The second event was Bolt's favourite 200m. Participants had two attempts at this. Most of us, despite being runners, couldn't' reach the 100m line, let alone the 200m!

The third and final event was for us to see how hard it would be to run the 5km round a track in the time that the winning male and female Olympic competitor did it. We had teams of either 4 or 5 and ran only 100m each in relay. Even with fresh legs each 100m our best time was 17.5 minutes, which is a full 2 minutes slower than the winning ladies, who took only a little over 15minutes: Difar (gold), Cheruiyot (silver) and Dibaba (bronze). Mo Fara did the whole thing himself in a little over 13 minutes. Although we ran only 12.5m each in small chunks, we excused ourselves on the basis that he wasn't carrying a baby (himself) and had 22 years on our youngest runner. It really brought home how amazing these athletes are to run so fast for so long.

"I enjoyed the 5,000m best, it was brilliant and I want to do it again tomorrow." Joshua, age 9.

"My favourite part was winning the Mandeville cuddly mascot", Heather, age 7.

"I think I am going to be sick" Barry, (didn't feel right to ask an adult his age!). Followed later by, "what type of thing do you normally do at the running club?" "I am available Tuesdays"

SUMMER STINKS

On some of the best days of our dreary summer, FCC waste company managed to plumb its previous depths of public nuisance by producing thoroughly sickening stinks. In my part of the village, Milton Road, 26th July and 10th August now stand as particularly notorious and I understand the same was true for many throughout our community.

On both occasions I contacted the Environment Agency, who told me they had received many complaints. Both times, the EA officer reported back on his progress and also stated that he encouraged as many people as possible to complain. The number is **0800 806070**. Also, in relation to 10th August, the EA stated in the Oxford Mail "we are going to work with them (FCC) to try to make it not happen again".

For the EA to monitor whether their efforts are effective they do need to be informed if they are not.

It is ironic that such disgusting anti-social events should be thrust on the village and our neighbours just when FCC have engaged in a PR charm offensive to persuade us of the benefits of their plans for the waste site, including an Anaerobic Digestor. At their recent exhibition, I discussed, with representatives, the not unknown possibility of the digestate product of anaerobic digestion creating even worse smells than we've suffered to date. The response was "you'll just have to trust us". Would anyone, given performance to date?

By contrast, I believe any further development should be prevented until and unless FCC can demonstrate that they can control what they are already doing at the site. Then we may debate the addition of an AD. However, if they fail to control their current nuisance, the community should take action to get the composting activity, which causes it, to be permanently stopped and reclaim the right to enjoy our homes and gardens without being nauseated.

Community anti-speeding and road safety campaign

'Please drive slowly through our villages' say our children

Roadside temporary posters made from children's designs are now displayed on lamp posts, telegraph poles and entry points to the village. As outlined in the June issue these posters were designed by Ashley Massey and Rebecca Norkett, from Sutton Courtenay (C of E) School and Drayton Community Primary School respectively, as part of the anti-speeding campaign launched by NAG5.

The Oxfordshire Guardian covered the story, with photographs of the winners and their posters, published on 4 July. This can be viewed in the digital archives on the paper's web site at http://issuu.com/trimedia/docs/wk27-ogs/1

The first posters were formally unveiled in Drayton on 5 July; an event attended by all six of the prize-winning entrants from Sutton Courtenay (C of E) and Drayton Community Primary School, together with parents, the Head Teacher of Drayton School, members of the Neighbourhood Policing Team, Fire & Rescue Services and members of NAG5.

LOST COCKATIEL

LANDFILL SITE TRANSPARENCY AND PLANNING CREEP

Once again the Summer holidays were used by FCC(formerly WRG) and on this occasion Hansons, to launch planning initiatives, perhaps in the hope they would attract fewer objections. These also give insights into the way they manage the planning process to achieve their aspirations, gain retrospective permissions for unauthorised activities and obscure failure to meet planning conditions.

Transparency. As soon as the summer holidays started, FCC launched a sequence of exhibitions, in an attempt to improve community relations and explain its plans for the landfill site to the end date of 2030. The publicity was inadequate, so many people were just not aware or away.

Odours Again. The endeavour to improve relations was also spoilt by periods of foul smells engulfing parts of the village. Whenever offensive odours occur it is essential that as many as possible record these with the **Environment Agency on 0800 807060**.

PLANNING CREEP

Just months ago in May, OCC granted permission for a "Variation" to increase the size of the Mechanical Recovery Facility (MRF) already permitted. This stipulated that the plant was to cease operations in 2019.

FCC now intend to apply to OCC to vary that variation, to extend the lifespan of the plant to 2030 and use it as a transit station for waste, including clinical waste, from south Oxfordshire for onward transportation to Ardley. This is to enable FCC to bid for a County Council tender, which it must have known about before the May Planning Committee! This has a 15 years contract with an option to extend up to 10 years! (2039). (Readers will remember that the landfill site was initially due to close this year and through gradual "planning creep" this was then extended to 2021 and latterly 2030).

In addition FCC has announced that a **revised application for an Anaerobic Digestor will be submitted to the Vale DC shortly.** Meanwhile we still await approval of a drainage scheme which is now some two years overdue.

HANSONS AGGREGATES - EXTRACTION AND QUARRY PRODUCTS.

Again at the beginning of the holidays, Hansons submitted two planning applications. These follow a successful application in March to legalise its rock crushing activity, which it had been found undertaking **without** planning permission.

MW.0104/12 Extension of Facilities to provide for Dust Storage. Until the Vale Environmental Officer challenged it, Hansons had also allowed a very large pile of rock dust to build up contrary to Government guidance aimed at protecting local communities. Again this application is Hansons' reaction to its being challenged, but interestingly it also gains it an increase of 33% in the size of the plant to allow for internal dust storage.

MW.0126/12 Bridge Farm Gravel and Sand Extraction. Due to the commercial downturn Hansons claim not to have been able to exploit the quarry north of the Appleford Road. This quarrying activity was due to cease on 4 August and the plant to be dismantled by the 30 September. Belatedly Hansons have applied to extend the life of the quarry until September 2018, even though the permission has expired.

These applications can be accessed on www.oxfordshire.gov.uk using the MW references.

All the FCC and Hansons applications will need careful examination so villagers can make their own judgements. Meanwhile the greater transparency by FCC is welcome and hopefully will lead to better local relations, less planning creep and final closure of the site in 2030.
