

Oxfordshire Broadband

Oxfordshire County Council is trying to develop better broadband in Oxfordshire. An OXOnline partnership spans private, public and community sectors and is supported by the six local authorities in Oxfordshire and the Oxfordshire Local Enterprise Partnership. The project aims to bring the next generation of high speed broadband access to Oxfordshire by 2015. Go to http://myconsultations.oxfordshire.gov.uk

and register your demand for better broadband. Registration will show that there is an active demand in the county and should improve Oxfordshire's chances of an improved service for the area.

Overhanging trees and hedges - Householders

A reminder to all that owing to the weather over the Summer period there has been exceptional growth and many hedges and trees are overhanging footpaths. The responsibility for cutting back trees and other vegetation that overhangs the public

highway from neighbouring land rests with the owners/occupiers of the land on which the tree/hedge is growing. Would residents therefore please help to keep the footpaths and rights of way in the parish clear by trimming back any overhanging growth which is a problem to walkers.

Odours from landfill site

Over the Summer period there was an increasing number of odours coming from the landfill site. Complaints were regularly lodged with the Environment Agency by many residents and a temporary halt was put on the activities at the site by the Agency.

The Council would encourage those who experience problems to continue to contact the Environment Agency, as the monitoring authority, and to report the smells. It is only by contacting the Agency that they become aware of any local issues and can record the matters brought to their attention and take the appropriate action. SUTTON COURTENAY PRIMARY SCHOOL

The new school year is in full swing and by the time this is published we will be getting ready for our Harvest Festival at All Saints' Church. If you would like to join us at the service, which starts at 2.00pm, you would be very welcome.

The term has got off to a busy start and the children have all settled into their new classes. With the school continuing to grow the school has been organised in a slightly different way this year.



Love life; love learning; love one another

Our reception children (Barn Owls), Year 1 (Robins) and Year 2 (Kestrels) all have their own classes. Year 3 and 4 have formed the Red Kites class and Year 5 and 6 Falcons. We have 121 children in the main school now and 17 in our Nursery. Three years ago, when I became Headteacher there were only 86 children in the school, so it has been wonderful to see the school grow!

We have a focus on developing music this year and all the children in Falcons will be learning the clarinet as part of their music curriculum. It will be fascinating to see a whole class of children getting to grips with this fantastic instrument.

Alongside this, we also have various instrumental teachers that come into school to give lessons to small groups. At present we are able to offer lessons to learn: violin, cello, drums, guitar (classical and electric) and piano. Some of you will already know that the school has a choir – which seems even bigger and better this year! In the summer the choir took part in the Festival of Voices that is held at Dorchester Abbey and now we are busy preparing for our third Young Voices Concert, which takes place at the O2 Arena in London. I know that there have been villagers that have expressed an interest in having tickets to come and watch this concert (which is on 30th January 2013), so if you would like to find out more please contact the school office.

The choir have already started rehearsing for this major event, which will see our school choir join with many others across the country to form a mass choir of 6,000. They then perform to a sell out audience at the O2 and they also act as backing singers to up and coming artists. This time they will once again be singing with Randolph Matthews an international vocalist and Connie Talbot, as well as the African Children's Choir. It certainly promises to be a very exciting concert.

In preparation for this event and to launch our music week, Randolph Matthews is visiting the school to do some vocal workshops with the children – as well as a special session just for the choir. In addition to this we have also organised an 'African Drumming Group' and a percussion workshop so that children experience rhythms and tunes from around the world.

If you have young children and would like to visit our school, I would be delighted to show you round. Please contact the school office to make an appointment.

HARVEST THANKSGIVING - Simply say 'thank you'

October means Harvest, and that means thanksgiving time. Here is a beautiful description of this rich time of the year: "You crown the year with your bounty, and your carts overflow with abundance. The grasslands of the desert overflow; the hills are clothed with gladness. The meadows are filled with flocks and the valleys are mantled with corn; they shout for joy and sing." (Ps 65:11-13) What a beautiful picture of harvest, of blessing as the year begins to draw to a close! In the Bible, the Psalms have a lot to say about harvest and thanksgiving. "May the peoples praise you, O God; may all the peoples praise you. THEN the land will yield its harvest, and God, our God will bless us." (Ps 67:5,6) You may not be in farming, but you will have 'sown' things this year: you may be growing certain relationships, or work projects. Now is a good time to review them: and, if they are doing well, thank God for them. If they are doing badly, pray for them. The Bible tells us time and again that God longs to bless us, and will bless us — if we acknowledge him, and thank him. "Praise our God, O peoples," cries the Psalmist with joy. "He has preserved our lives and kept our feet from slipping....you brought us to a place of abundance." (Ps 66:8,12) If there is any 'abundance' in your life, have you thanked God for it recently?

REST IN PEACE

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following:

Olive Loretta Stevens who has died, aged 75, on 22nd August 2012 was born in Carlisle on 4th June 1937 to Robert and Margaret Boustead. She joined her brother Bobby for a traditional northern upbringing. At the tender age of 16 Olive left Carlisle to live in Abingdon before marrying Mervyn in 1956 whom she had met in Carlisle whist he was on National Service. Sadly Olive found herself as a single parent following Peter's birth in 1972. She worked very hard to provide for her family during difficult times and she will be remembered from her time working behind the bar of several pubs in Didcot where she was very popular as a reliable hard worker and someone who was always ready to listen and dispense advice. Olive also ran a bed and breakfast for several years which was particularly popular with workers from Didcot Power Station. Olive then made what turned out to be a very significant decision which was definitely one of her better ones. She decided to join the bowls team at the Marlborough club where one day on the bowling green she met Reg. They developed a close and loving friendship which soon led to the sound of wedding bells when they married on 16 October 1993. They had many happy times especially during holidays and breaks in the Lake District and they loved to eat out although Olive also loved to cook for people. Olive and Reg both felt that they were very lucky to have found each other in the autumn of their lives and they shared 19 wonderful years during which time there were a lot of laughs. During their marriage they faced a number of difficult challenges which were mainly health related but always faced them together with a sense of humour, resilience and a 'can do' attitude. Olive was a competitive but fair bowler and would be the first to praise her opponent for a good shot. She had been a good darts player and was a keen knitter. She used to make birthday and Christmas cards for everyone and it was clear to everyone who received one of her cards how much love and care she had put into making it. Olive also took up genealogy and spent many happy hours researching the Boustead family tree and was delighted to discover that she was a distant relative of Thomas Woodrow Wilson the 28th President of the United States of America. Olive loved giving and receiving cuddles because she felt that a cuddle meant so much and could solve many problems. As well as her caring nature Olive was a very sociable person, with a good sense of humour, who would strike up a conversation with anyone in any situation. She had immense pride and love for all her family who will greatly miss her. This is an edited extract of the tribute given at her funeral, held in All Saints' Church on 3rd September 2012 by the family.

FROM ED VAIZEY MP

One of the best things about being a local MP is being invited to some great celebrations. Recently, I was asked to present medals to some of the children who have completed the Summer Reading Challenge. Using local libraries and with the help of lots of local volunteers, hundreds of local children each read 6 books over the summer. The enthusiasm and excitement of the children, and the pride both they and their families felt in their achievement, was wonderful! That's not the end of the many activities available in local libraries for children (and adults!) so do visit your local library to see what you might interest you.

I am very glad to see that the work to improve Didcot Parkway station is finally underway. Thousands of people from across the constituency travel through the station every day, and the improvements will make their journeys much easier. As the work will take around 15 months to complete, it may get worse before it gets better, but I'm sure that this partnership between the various local councils, Network Rail and First Great Western will eventually be good for everyone.

This summer has been an eclectic couple of month for my office mailbag. The parliamentary recess has been so full of amazing sport and other spectacles that people have been very distracted from political campaigns. But as soon as the parliamentary term began again on September 3rd I was flooded with emails and letters. I have continued to receive representations on same-sex marriage; I've had a quite a few emails about the price of petrol; and, more recently, a few submissions for the consultation on internet parental controls. However, by far the largest campaigns have been for the Post Office DVLA contract and the reduction in Air Passenger Duty tax.

Unfortunately, while I very much support the post office bid to run DVLA services, the DVLA is required by EU law to tender the contract competitively and so the Government cannot take sides on this occasion. As for the Air Passenger Duty campaign, it may be the largest one-issue campaign I've ever seen as an MP. In the past few months almost 500 people have got in touch to express their views. I know that my colleagues in the Government have also had their mailbags flooded with similar letters: they have already taken firm steps to limit any rise and will continue not to levy VAT on domestic flights.



Readers will remember the success of the Vivaldi Credo RV592, performed by the choir a year ago, "deeply moving and full of vitality" (Oxford times.) With this concert, we include the natural partner to the work.

Our second half is devoted to the main work, The Hummel mass in Bb Opus 77. For a composer who was alive and working with so many famous contemporaries, and as a pupil of Mozart, Haydn and Beethoven, Hummel's writing was certain to be of the highest quality and this work does not fail. Hummel manages to convey a sense of wonder and majesty from the moving choral opening with its instant appeal leading to the exuberance of the Gloria. The work ends with a tender adagio for the Agnus Dei and then on to an exuberant and final flourish. The work is inventive and with lovely themes to keep the listener in musical heaven. This is a truly magnificent choral Mass and for those not familiar with this composer come to our concert and be amazed!

ROAST CHICKEN WITH SPANISH STYLE BEAN STEW

OK so we can't fight it anymore, summer is over, but from a cooking point of view it's a really exciting time. Not just because of what's in or coming into season but it's comfort food time. This dish is just that, comfort food but with a Spanish twist. Try using Guinea fowl in replacement of chicken, it's in season, has a great taste and now readily available.

Serves 2

Ingredients

2 skin on supremes of chicken. (supreme just means a chicken breast with the wing attached. The butcher will do this or buy a whole chicken and have a go yourself).

Olive oil Salt and pepper Knob of butter

Small sprig of thyme

For the stew

100g of chorizo roughly chopped
1 red onion sliced
1 red pepper sliced
Small sprig of thyme picked
1 tin of butter or cannelloni beans drained
200ml of chicken stock
Splash of sherry vinegar
Salt and pepper

Method

Pre heat the oven to 190c. Put a large non stick frying pan on a medium heat. Drizzle the chicken breasts with a little olive oil and season generously with salt and pepper. Fry skin side down in the pan for around 5 minutes or until the skin is golden and crisp. Turn the chicken over, add the knob of butter and a sprig of thyme. Tilt the pan and continuously spoon over the butter for a minute. Place the chicken on an oven tray and cook roast in the oven for around 20 minutes until cooked through. Once cooked, remove from the oven and cover with foil to rest. While the chicken cooks get on with the stew. Place the frying pan you used for the chicken back on a medium heat, it should still have some of the juice and butter from the chicken. Add the chorizo and fry for a couple of minutes until it starts to colour a little. Add the onion, pepper and thyme tips. Fry until the onions and peppers have softened a little. Turn the heat down low and add whatever beans you have decided to use, pour over the stock and bring to a gentle simmer for 10 minutes, you want the stew to have time to develop flavour but not dry out. Season with salt and pepper, feel free to add a little more stock if it's too dry. Finish the stew with a splash of sherry vinegar. Divide the stew between two shallow bowls, carve the chicken breasts and place on top of the stews, spoon over any juice from the rested chicken.
