

Didcot "A" power station

The "A" station is expected to reach the allocated hours of generation under the EU Directive by March 2013. The Government has binding climate change targets, and the closure, drive by Government policy reflects the changing ways of power generation. Closing a power station is very complex, and obviously pre-planning is essential. The decommissioning and demolition of the plant is to take several years. The pre-planning process has started and RWE has been talking to statutory bodies, planning officers, the County and District Councils. The future of the site has not been decided. However, it remains a significant location for power generation, and the area will be commercial. The "A" station's open cycle gas turbine will remain operational until further notice. The closure of the "A" station will not impact on the "B" station — the gas fired power station plant which was built in 1997 alongside the coal fired station. The "B" station will continue to operate as normal. The power station is situated in the parish of Sutton Courtenay and the Parish Council is keeping up to date with issues relating to the site, and will keep residents informed via The News.

Cross Trees Farm

The Parish Council is aware of concerns regarding alleged unauthorised business activities in the vicinity of the farm. The Council has been advised that the planning enforcement officers from the District Council are looking into the matter.

Drayton Road – Traffic Calming

The County Council is considering some form of traffic calming as vehicles enter the village from the Drayton direction. Consideration is being given to a pinch point system, where traffic is slowed and gives way to vehicles from the opposite direction. The Parish Council is waiting for the county Council to design the scheme.

Fireworks

A reminder to be considerate for neighbours and the many pets and animals in the village when letting off your fireworks. Please notify others when any fireworks are going to be lit so that villagers are aware and arrangements can be made to keep pets indoors.

Planning Applications

The following planning applications have been considered :

P12/V1349/LB Part works already executed for new doors, windows, and roof lights and proposed fire place and panelling in living room. Pull Croft, 53, High St. The Council had no objections.

P12/V1897/FUL Development and operation of an anaerobic digestion facility Sutton Courtenay Landfill Site. Council objected on the grounds of planning policies, environmental impact, odour, feedstock origins and transportation issues.

P12/V1936/HH Single storey extension to dining room and kitchen, 71 High St. Council had no objections. Continued.....

From the Ministry Team...Remembrance

A number of years ago Jeremy Clarkson from Top Gear, presented a documentary, 'The Victoria Cross: For Valour'. This told the stories of some VC heroes, including his own father-in-law, who he never knew. Moved by these stories, Clarkson went on to ask, 'How can we call the likes of David Beckham a hero for scoring a goal? I wonder who your heroes are today?'

In this season of remembrance we think especially of those who have sacrificed their lives in war. However, Jesus calls us all to a radical and supernatural heroism when he says, 'You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbour and hate your enemy.' But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven.' (Matt 5:43-45).

God calls us to love even those we regard as our enemies. It's easy to love those we get on with or find attractive. The love of which Jesus speaks, as throughout the New Testament, is agape love. This quality of love seeks and works only for the good of the other person. When we can pray for someone we don't get on with, God begins to answer our prayer by softening our attitude toward them. We love them because they are individuals created in the image of God and in need of God's forgiveness and grace, just like us.

This month marks the 25th anniversary of the Enniskillen bombing in Northern Ireland on 8th November 1987. An IRA bomb exploded during a Remembrance Day service, resulting in 11 people being killed and 63 injured. What is remembered most from this day is the interview Gordon Wilson gave only hours after the bombing. It brought him to international prominence, as he described the conversation with his dying daughter Marie, as they lay buried in rubble. To the astonishment of listeners, Wilson went on to say, 'But I bear no ill will. I bear no grudge... She's in heaven and we shall meet again. I will pray for these men tonight and every night.' The impact of his words lay in his willingness to forgive the bombers, and as a result Wilson went on to dedicate his life as a campaigner for peace and reconciliation. He perfectly models Jesus words for us. As Jonathan Bardon, the Irish Historian, wrote 'No words in more than twenty-five years of violence in Northern Ireland had such a powerful, emotional impact.'

NEIGHBOURHOOD ACTION GROUP (NAG) 5

Speedwatch

At the end of September a member of NAG 5 joined the police in a check on the speed of drivers entering the village. A Speed Indication Device was used to monitor speeds.

The device was set up in Milton Road, about 30 yards before the bus shelter on the opposite side of the road so that it registered the speed of drivers entering the village. This spot was chosen because the buses collect a large number of pupils in the morning and it is a busy crossing both for children attending the village school and for shoppers. It took place between 08.10 and 09.00 on a Thursday morning. He results were disappointing.

There were close on 90 vehicles entering the village. Of these, 19 exceeded the speed limit. The registration numbers of the vehicles were recorded by the police. The two worst offenders indicated speeds of 47 and 48 mph and these two drivers will be visited by the police

The exercise will be repeated in the future at various locations in the village but we hope that residents will drive safely.

GAS MAINS REPLACEMENT IN THE HIGH STREET

There is concern in the village about the work currently being carried out in the High Street by Southern Gas Networks, who sent a letter to High St residents early in the summer explaining the need to replace the old gas mains. The start date was given as 13th August and it was estimated that the work would take 17 weeks. Notice was also given of the need to install temporary traffic lights.

On behalf of readers, we have spoken to Bob Taylor of Southern Gas Networks about the letter and the worries of village residents regarding the inevitable disruption caused by the work. Amongst the concerns are the fact that not all High St residents received letters, that the work was late in starting, that the work is proceeding very slowly, and there is confusion about the area in which the work is to be carried out.

Mr Taylor's response was that

- the address lists available to Southern Gas Networks are not necessarily completely up to date
- although the work was late in starting, the estimated completion date is still the first or second week in December
- some workers have had to be moved from this project to help complete others but the full complement will be resumed as soon as possible
- work will include the area of Mill Lane and will continue along the High Street as far as the junction of High St and Church St

FROM ED VAIZEY MP

As winter approaches, some people may worry about their energy bills. I would urge anyone worried about their bills to contact their local Age UK or Citizens Advice to find out if they can claim free help from the Warm Front scheme to help them be warm, well and wealthier this winter. The eligibility criteria for help under the Warm Front scheme has widened from September, so even if you have been turned down before you may be able to get help this year. The heating and insulation improvements Warm Front offers could help many households locally to stay warm.

You can also find out if you can get free help from Warm Front by calling 0800 316 2805 and further information and an online application form are also available on *www.direct.gov.uk/warmfront*

Over the summer, the government introduced new rules on the disclosure of interests and other standards for local councillors. These set out a much more straightforward regime which will be clearer and easier to follow, making sure councillors are open and above board about what needs to be declared, but are not tied up in bureaucracy in the process. You can get more details from the South and Vale Democratic Services Manager, telephone 01491 823049 or email <u>democratic.services@southandvale.gov.uk</u>. I know lots of people think about becoming parish councillors, but are put off because they think they have to disclose their financial details and those of their family. The rules have now been simplified, so do take a look if you are thinking of serving in some way. There will be elections for some councils next May, and there is always a need for local people to represent their communities. Do talk to a current councillor to find out what is involved – it may not be as bad as you think!

One of the most visible things in the constituency is Didcot Power Station. We've recently heard that after 42 years of service Didcot A Power Station will stop generating electricity on 31st March 2013. Closing a major power station is a complex task so the decommissioning and demolition of the plant is expected to take several years, and Didcot B will continue in operation. In just a few years time, however, the view will be changing.



FCC (FORMERLY WRG)

FCC Environment has been holding a series of public exhibitions sharing proposals for the Sutton Courtenay Landfill site and how they fit in the company's wider strategy to secure an end to waste imports and restore the landfill to agricultural use.



Two further public events are being held in November:

Wednesday 7 November, 2-8pm, Sutton Courtenay Village Hall Thursday 8 November, 2-8pm, Appleford Village Hall

Members of the project team will be on hand to discuss plans for a Vehicle Depot, Soils Treatment Centre and the completion of Phase 3 of the landfill site and, importantly, listen to feedback.

Vehicle Depot

FCC Environment proposes to base a fleet of up to 15 waste collection vehicles at the site which will allow the company to source waste directly from commercial and industrial customers in the local area. This will help the company to maintain the levels of waste needed to fill and restore the remaining landfill void.

Soils Treatment Centre

The successful completion of the site is dependent on a supply of suitable soils and clays. Materials imported to the site would need to be treated and processed in the Centre before being used for landfill restoration.

Completion of Phase 3 of the Landfill

Phase 3 is the name given to an area of the landfill to the north of the landfill site, close to Millennium Common. FCC Environment is proposing to amend the working scheme for this area to allow infilling with soil and clays rather than non-hazardous waste so that restoration can commence sooner than originally planned.

The company has also distributed a newsletter locally which provides an update on activity and plans at the landfill site and includes a questionnaire for feedback.

Literally as we were going to press we received this update from Pauline Wilson of Milton Road:

Proposed huge increase in FCC Waste Operations.

FCC waste company has just applied for a further variation to the permission it was given, in May this year, to extend its MRF facility, to increase the volume of waste throughput from 70,000 tonnes of waste per annum to 200,000 and the time-scale for operations from 2019 to 2030.

Villagers have, at the time of writing been given only until 8th November to object. This can be done online at *http://myeplanning.oxfordshire.gov.uk* using reference MW.0174/12

Further, FCC has been reprimanded by Oxfordshire County Council for starting construction of the MRF in breach of five planning conditions. They still have the application for an Anaerobic Digestor with the Vale of White Horse, which they also wish to operate until 2030. It seems that these two applications are, yet again, an attempt to inflict industrial scale developments on a green field area destined for return to agriculture.




