PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Sutton Courtenay Post Office

Are you aware that the Post Office is now situated in Burgrey Stores in the High Street? It opened as a new Post Office service on 26th March 2012, and has been operating almost a year. It operates from a newly formatted open plan counter within the shop. A wide range of key Post Office products and services are available. The opening hours are Mon-Fri 05.30 - 19.00, Sat 06.00 - 17.30, and Sun 06.30 - 13.00.

<u>Milton Park – Local Development Order</u>

The Secretary of State has now approved the Local Development Order for Milton Park. This was approved as drafted. Sutton Courtenay Parish Council suggested the setting up of a local liaison committee to act as a forum for an exchange of information. This would enable MEPC to keep local stakeholders informed as to developments on Milton Park and give local people the chance to raise matters with MEPC. Discussions will be taking place about membership of the committee, agendas, timing of meetings and frequency etc. The matter is now being progressed by the Vale of White Horse District Council and an initial meeting to discuss a possible constitution will be held later in the month.

<u>Pye Homes</u>

At the last Parish Council meeting representatives from Pye Homes Limited and their agents spoke to the Council about the proposals for housing development at the rear of 92-112 Milton Road. This was a presentation similar to the exhibition which had taken place in the village hall. The planning application has now been lodged and is available for viewing on the website of the Vale of White Horse District Council under reference: P13/V0233/FUL.

Questions were asked about traffic volumes and speeds and the Parish Council will be discussing traffic calming measures for the entry point to Milton Road from Milton village at its next meeting.

FCC – Landfill / Waste Site

FCC held two exhibitions on 20th and 21st February regarding their future proposals at the landfill site. There will be two planning applications to be lodged in the Spring of 2013. The first will be for waste transfer (60 tonnes per annum of household waste and 200 tonnes per annum of clinical waste) and associated operational development. The second will be for changes to the internal operating houses of the already approved materials recycling facility. The Parish Council will be carefully considering the applications when received, as the use of the site as a waste transfer station, will inevitably bring associated activities and traffic movements.

Planning Applications

The following applications were received by the Parish Council:

P12/V2695/FUL Variation of condition 1 on P07/V0108/COU to cease use of and remove associated plant, materials and equipment before 31st December 2012 (storage of waste containers by Biffa) at the Landfill Site. The Council objected and questioned whether the storage of containers by a third party was of direct relevance to the site. It objected to the continued alterations of deadlines within consents.

P12/V2342/HH Proposed two storey side extension - 9 Southfield Drive. The Council thought that the principle of an extension did not present a problem, but considered that the distance from the boundary may not meet with design guidelines.

P12/V2642/FUL Removal of existing outbuilding and erection of a family dwelling on land rear of Lakeside, All Saints Lane. The Council commented on the difference between the application form and the drawings which referred to 2 dwellings and 1 dwelling. The materials and design were not in keeping with the area.

P13/V0006/FUL Erection of 2 x 2 bed single storey dwellings in the garden of 8,9,10 The Green. The Council objected owing to the harm to the character of the area, and vehicular pressures in the area.

MW.0200/12 Extension of time for removal of the internal haul road and litter fence at the landfill site, from 2012 to 2030 to coincide with the completion of the landfill site as approved under the current landfill planning consent. The Council had no objections.

P13/V0052/HH First floor extension and ground floor extension at Beechfield House, Abingdon Road. The Council had no objections

P13/V0118/HH Erection of 2 storey side extension, 6 Abingdon Road. The Council objected owing to overdevelopment of the site and known flooding.

P12/V2691/FYL Renewal of temporary consent for siting of containers in the Recreation Ground Old Wallingford Way. Council had no objections

From the Ministry Team...

In May this year I will have been parish priest of Sutton Courtenay with Appleford for 10 years. I have learnt many things in my time here but one of the biggest challenges I have experienced is how to breathe new life into the various celebrations of the church year as they come around again and again. In thinking about Easter this article by Paul Hardingham really helped me...

Easter in Three Dimensions

Films like Life of Pi or The Hobbit come alive when watched in 3D. As we celebrate Easter, it's good to ask, 'Do we see it in 3D or is our celebration simply one-dimensional?' It's easy to miss the true significance of the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. As C. S. Lewis said, 'Easter is not primarily a comfort, but a challenge. Its message is either the supreme fact in history or else a gigantic hoax.' So how can we see Jesus' resurrection in three dimensions?

The first dimension is the proof of the resurrection: The resurrection of Jesus was an historical event to which we have eye witness accounts: 'He appeared to Peter, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also.' (1 Corinthians 15:3-8). Jesus' resurrection also had a dramatic effect, as the church grew. 'It is a perfectly amazing story of peaceful revolution that has no parallel in the history of the world.' (Michael Green).

The second dimension is the promise of the resurrection: George Bernard Shaw famously said, 'Death is the ultimate statistic, one out of one of us dies.' As Jesus promised, 'I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in me will never die.' (John 11:25-26).

The resurrection of Jesus declares that he didn't die in vain, but has secured eternal life for us. When we believe and trust in Him, we can look forward to an eternity with God, with a body like Jesus! The resurrection of Jesus guarantees us a secure future.

The third dimension is the power of the resurrection: The resurrection is also a present experience, 'This is eternal life, that they may know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.' (John 17:3). Eternal life is not just about life after death, but a quality of life to be experienced now i.e. 'life in all its fullness'.

Wilson Carlile, the founder of the Church Army was speaking at Hyde Park Corner, 'Jesus Christ is alive today.' A heckler in the crowd shouted out, 'How do you know?' Carlile replied, 'Because I was speaking to him for half an hour this morning!'

... As I write we are still in the middle of our Lenten Journey but I hope that these words will help you to breathe in the new life that the experience of Easter offers each one of us - new life which can inspire and invigorate us through all the challenges we may face, wherever we may be on our journey through life.

KEEP SUTTON COURTENAY RURAL—UPDATE 22 FEB 2013

Planning applications for two housing estates totalling 119 dwellings in Milton Road and a massive warehouse in Harwell Road are now in process. The first of these has been submitted by Pye Homes for 34 dwellings on a greenfield site, and is registered the Vale of White Horse District Council and on the planning website at

w.whitehorsedc.gov.uk/java/support/Main.jsp?MODULE=ApplicationDetails&REF=P13/V0233/FULhttp://ww

Plans for the remaining 85 houses in Milton Road by Bidwells/Redrow Homes and the Harwell Road warehouse are due any day and may be registered by the time you receive this SC News.

The consultation period for the Pye Homes application ends on 20th March 2013. KSCR urges village residents to object, as soon as possible*, to this attack on our scarce remaining village green areas. Developments, especially industrial, in recent years, have meant that only 19% of our parish remains as agricultural land. We have already been recognised by the VoWH as providing our fair share of sites for housing within its five year housing supply policy because of current planning approval for c.160 dwellings at the Amey's and former Catholic Church sites. Pye Homes and Bidwells/Redrow Homes housing estate plans for our village land are not needed. However it is essential for villagers to register objections to Pye Homes and Bidwell's planning applications. Your objections now are likely to be just as valid for probable, future attempts to build on other open spaces in the village –e.g. at Long Barn in the High Street and for the proposed development of the Harwell Road warehouse.

KSCR are holding a meeting with local residents to discuss objections to the planned developments. We will share the results of our own investigations and provide help to residents in framing their own objections. Please join us:

SATURDAY 2ND MARCH, 3-4PM, VILLAGE HALL

If you are unable to come along, we outline below our main objections which you may find helpful.

The major planning objection to proposals such as that of Pye Homes is that houses are not needed in the village. The existing VoWH five year housing supply policy does not identify a need for further housing approvals in Sutton Courtenay. So, there is no need for the Vale to override its saved planning policies, (e.g. NE9, concerning adverse effects on long open views). Furthermore, the Governmental Secretary of State for planning has stated that if planning permission refusal by the local council is appealed against, Planning Inspectors must count prior planning approvals, unless they are unviable, and support the decision of the local councils.

Other objections include

- Increase in traffic volume, danger, pollution and noise presented by extra vehicles exiting onto a major through road in the village. The village is already overburdened during peak times and overwhelmed when the A34 is disrupted. Pye Homes have provided inadequate data concerning traffic impact. KSCR aims to provide the VoWH with an accurate traffic assessment. However, residents' personal experiences of the adverse impact of current traffic problems should be provided to support an objection on traffic grounds.
- Increased risk of flooding and inadequate sewerage system: Flooding in the village has already resulted in sewerage flooding in the village on several occasions. KSCR have sought professional hydrology advice to support our view that these houses will increase the risk of local flooding. Again, reports of personal experiences of flooding should be included to support your objection.
- **Biodiversity and archaeology**: There is also a threat to the biodiversity enjoyed in the southern end of the village and the unique archaeological nature of this area.

This list is not exhaustive and residents may wish to add further objections.

Now you see it — soon you won't !! Lying within the boundaries of Sutton Courtenay Parish, Didcot A has been much in the news with the announcement that it will cease operation at the end of March. In due course the cooling towers will be gone which has evoked mixed emotions among local people. The power station has been a landmark for over 40 years and has had a considerable impact on the area. A valuable source of energy, the towers have also inspired artists and photographers over the years — despite once voted Britain's third worst eyesore!

On 17th February the Time Team programme about the excavation of the Roman villa site last year at Dropshort was shown on Channel 4. In the limited time available for the excavation some rooms of a villa were found revealing signs of early Roman life. Among the finds were pieces of pottery, tiles and glass from that era but the search for the remains of a mosaic floor was unsuccessful. Investigations indicated that the River Thames has since changed course and a building would then have been close to the river. The archaeologists concluded that despite what they had unearthed the significance of the site remains something of an enigma.

We are sorry we had to postpone the January meeting due to the weather.

The talk about the history of Wallingford will now take place on <u>9th April.</u>

I have been a cyclist in and around Sutton Courtenay since the stabilisers came off, 42 years in case you were wondering, and currently ride my bike to and from work six days a week. I would just like to point out a few things.

Sutton bridges

If there are no cars around the lights often don't stay green long enough for me to cycle across the bridges, two thirds across I meet oncoming traffic! If there is a large queue of cars the driver directly behind often gets very frustrated revving engine or tooting horn!

The roads in general are very potholed and you have to ride well away from the curb or verge, and this combined with cars that the local authorities can't seem to stop speeding is very dangerous!

Peep o Day Lane

As with all other cycle routes it's covered in snow and ice two or three weeks a year, it floods for about six weeks per year. I cycle at 4.30am with no lighting down the lane, it over grows to the point two cyclists can't pass at least twice a year, on the concrete sections there are many potholes. I personally have had to dodge a bolting horse and rider, teenagers on mopeds, and out of control dog owners, it's not the dogs fault!

Oh let's not forget the cars that often park in the pump house gate way that then block entry and exit to the path. Don't get me wrong there are plenty of dodgy cyclists, I see them around every day, but it's not always our fault.
