PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Village Green Bench

Sadly the village green bench by the war memorial on the village green has been vandalised and is beyond sensible repair. It has had to be removed to ensure that no injury can be caused to anyone. The Parish Council realises that this seat is well used and appreciated by many, and it is planning to replace this. This unexpected cost will unfortunately have to be taken from the Council's reserves unless there is a kind benefactor somewhere. Should anyone know of an organisation willing to sponsor a bench seat, then please contact the clerk.

Decommissioning at Didcot "A" station and demolition of the cooling towers

The decommissioning of the A station has commenced with a gradual reduction in staff. Coal remains are being removed by lorry. As for the demolition contract, final bids have been received from demolition companies. An early works agreement will be signed with the successful tendering company during the Summer. The demolition programme is due to start on 6th January 2014. The proposal is to take the 3 northern cooling towers down using a progressive method where the rest of the site will be taken down using traditional explosive methods. Discussions between the land owners and local authorities regarding the future development of Didcot A land are taking place.

Highway Verges

The Parish Council is in contact with the County Council regarding the restoration of the verges following the Southern Gas Networks operations to replace the pipework. Please do not park on the verges now, and particularly once the works are complete in order to keep the village looking as best as it can.

Planning Applications

Milton Road – Pye Homes

The planning application for 34 houses north of Milton Road was considered at the Committee meeting of the Vale of White Horse District Council on 8th May. Cllr. David Hignell addressed the committee on behalf of the Parish Council, stating that it was incorrect to describe Sutton Courtenay as a sustainable large settlement that could accept further development. He pointed out the failure in the committee report to include criteria relating to infrastructure and the problems associated with highways, drainage and the impact on Sutton Courtenay from expansion elsewhere without thought for the hinterland.

The application was deferred to the Vale's next planning meeting to allow time for further reports.

The following applications were received by the Parish Council:

P13/V0694/FUL Creation of new pond, associated re-profiling of north education pond at the Environmental Study Centre, Sutton Courtenay Lane

The Council had no objections.

P13/P0823/HH One and half storey side extension at 93 Bradstocks Way

The Council had concerns about adequate on site parking, vehicle movements to ensure no separate dwelling could be created.

From the Ministry Team...

Who prays today?

Research by the Church of England has found that six out of seven people still believe that prayers can be answered, despite a dramatic drop in *formal religious observance in the UK. Only one in seven people insist that they would never resort to prayer. Teenagers* are less likely to reject prayer than their parents - with only 9% of 18-24 year -olds saying they would never pray, compared with 17% of those in their late 50s. The proportion of people in England and Wales who classify themselves as "*Christian*" in 2011 fell to 59%, from 72% in 2001. When asked what they would pray for 31% said peace in the world; 27% said an end to poverty and for family members, with only 15% mentioning praying for guidance or healing for themselves.

Canon David Winter has written this article about a man to whom prayer was central to all he did: Trevor Huddleston, who was born 100 years ago.

When Desmond Tutu - famous South African archbishop and Nobel Peace laureate - was a small boy he was walking along the pavement in Sophiatown with his mother. She took in laundry and was carrying a load of washing. They were approached by a tall white man wearing a black cassock. They prepared to step off the pavement, as they were required to do by the apartheid conventions of the time, to make room for him, but before they could do so he stepped out into the road and doffed his hat to Desmond's mother.

The tall white man was Trevor Huddleston, who was born exactly a century ago this month. He was the parish priest of the sprawling African township where the Tutu family lived. Raising one's hat to a passing woman carrying laundry might seem to us today a small courtesy, but for young Desmond it was a life-changing gesture. It told him that for some Christians, at least, race and skin colour were matters of indifference. He sought out Father Huddleston, who helped him with his education. More importantly, Desmond embraced the faith that lay behind that simple courtesy.

Trevor Huddleston went on to became a tireless campaigner against apartheid, but also a passionate advocate of the Christian faith. Born in Bedford, with a public school and Oxford background, he happily immersed himself in the life of the people in Sophiatown, where he served for 13 years. The people gave him the nickname 'Makhalipilo' - Dauntless One. His book *Naught for your Comfort*, published in 1956, became a world-wide call to address the evils of apartheid, and later, as a bishop in England (Stepney) and then of Masasi, he continued to protest that 'in Christ there is neither Jew nor Greek', black nor white, but 'all are one in Christ Jesus'. He retired as archbishop of the Province of the Indian Ocean in 1983 and died at Mirfield, the home of his Anglican Order, the Community of the Resurrection, in 1998. His ashes, however, were buried in Sophiatown, the place most dear to his heart.

His simple Prayer for Africa became a world-wide call:

God bless Africa; guard her people; guide her leaders. And give her peace. Amen.

FROM ED VAIZEY M.P.

I frequently receive information from public bodies that may be useful for constituents, and there have been several things recently that readers may like to know about.

Firstly, the General Medical Council has published a new guide to what patients can expect from their doctor. You can see the guide at http://dmtrk.net/t/CUG-1FJKJ-4GCWXV-KJ25D-1/c.aspx. You can also call 0161 923 6602 if you don't have access to the internet. Patients deserve the highest standards of care and the GMC is committed to ensuring that they understand what these are. They have therefore produced this guide ,which underlines the importance of dignity, mutual respect and partnership between patients and their doctor. It also sets out the duties of the doctor and that all doctors need to be honest and open if things go wrong, and to make the care of patients their first concern.

I've also received information from Thames Valley Police about how they have been performing locally: it's good news. Across South Oxfordshire and the Vale of the White Horse, violent crime has reduced by 15.6%. Detection rates are going up: for dwelling burglary by 27.5%, for serious sexual offences by 30.3% and for violence against the person with injury by 47.4%, and overall crime is at its lowest level for 15 years.

We are lucky to live in a part of the country with relatively low crime rates (the Vale of the White Horse was recently reported as one of the 20 most peaceful areas in the UK) but every crime committed has a huge impact on its victims, while every crime solved reassures us all about the efforts of our police force. I am very pleased indeed to see these results, which are part of a pattern of reducing crime levels over a number of years.

The Heritage Lottery Fund has contacted me with information about Heritage Enterprise, a new £125million grant programme specifically designed to stimulate local economic growth, generate new commercial income along with new jobs and skills by unlocking the latent commercial potential of unused historic buildings and sites across the UK. There are grants available from £100,000 to £5m. You can find out more about how your community could benefit from Heritage Enterprise by visiting their website; HLF is also offering start-up grants between £3,000 and £10,000. These grants will enable groups to create the organisational structures needed to deliver projects and to help with the associated costs, such as obtaining professional and legal advice.

This month's mailbox has been largely dominated by issues relating to animal welfare. People are concerned over the exports of living animals, and sentencing for those who commit acts of cruelty. Other issues that I have seen in my mailbox include support for Amnesty International's campaign to improve women's rights in Afghanistan, which is still an essential part of the UK's foreign policy priorities, and the Government's reforms to teachers' pay and pensions.

COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

I would like to thank all those who took part in the recent County Elections. I am very aware of how close the voting was in our Division and from painful experience, I do know how it feels to be on the wrong end of a closely fought election. I would like to thank all my fellow candidates for helping to make it a fiercely but honourably fought contest. One certainty in a tight election is that every vote counted. A 31% turnout was rather better than some had forecast, but it is hardly a triumph for the democratic process. If I have one priority over the next four years, it is trying to engage and involve many more people in local issues and decisions.

Despite the widely reported anger and frustration with the state of things, I found the doorstep reception more friendly than recent elections where expense scandals, electoral systems produced strong feelings. That there is frustration and a sense of resignation cannot be denied.

In this part of the world, immigration and the EU seem rather distant issues and, in my view, are more likely to be symptoms than causes of the frustration. Top of my list of possible causes is Planning. Where we put our housing, how much we need, how we keep it affordable, how we conserve our countryside in the face of building, how we cope with the need for energy, for waste disposal, for water and so on, are all helping to produce a sense of helplessness and resentment at what "they" are doing to us. The irony is that under the Localism Act, we should be feeling more empowered than ever before. For Localism to work two things have to happen. The first is that local people have to believe that they now have powers they have not had before, the second is that "the powers that be" have to be prepared to hand over some power and trust local people to make sensible decisions.

Second on my list of possible causes of current frustration and depression at the state of things is the weather. We all need a long, hot summer to cheer us up.

I cannot do anything about the weather, but if, after four years, I haven't done everything in my power to make people in this division feel better about the state of things and to feel more empowered, and more in control, then I will have failed.

Latest Developments

At a packed Planning Committee meeting on the 8^{th} May, the VOWH deferred its decision on the Pye Homes application to build 34 houses north of 92-112 Milton Road. Unfortunately, this is not the end of the war for the village as the application will return to the Committee, perhaps in only few weeks time. However, it does offer us the chance to reinforce the arguments that underlie why this development should not go ahead.



A large number of villagers attended the meeting to make their objections clear and we thank all who could attend. Your support is very much appreciated.

When it was time for the public response in the meeting, a lot of convincing arguments were put forward outlining why this development should be rejected. Special mention should go to the presentation of David Hignell (Parish Council) and our District Councillor Gervase Duffield, together with Pauline Wilson, representing KSCR. We also heard a very emotional appeal by Kevin Nicholls, widower of Heike, which demonstrated the very real human impact of these destructive planning applications.

The decision was deferred for the following reasons:

A redesign of the layout to ensure that the affordable housing provision is spread evenly throughout the site;

To provide KSCR time to report the findings of the traffic survey we are currently undertaking;

Gather additional information relating to land drainage of the site;

Clarify education provision requirements linked to this development proposal;

Provide additional information as to the highway works that are planned to address the identified highway and access issues that this proposed development generates.

KSCR will be collating further comments on the design of the proposed site and will feed these concerns back to the Planning Officer and Planning Committee. Please contact KSCR with your observations. We will also be working with Gervase Duffield on the matter of conditions that have been attached to the application, such as certain drainage requirements.

The battle against inappropriate development will continue. The Planning Officer's next recommendation with regard to Sutton Courtenay, the Redrow application, is likely to be announced shortly. If both of these developments go ahead, Sutton Courtenay will have 104 new houses to be built and it will take a large step towards becoming a suburb of Didcot. Its long history as a rural village will near its end. It would be nice to have more vocal support from our local MP Ed Vaizey in preventing this happening. The expansion of Milton Park is also of concern and will add to the impact on Sutton Courtenay and surrounding villages. KSCR has been in touch with the village group working on this.

Thanks to everyone for their great support to date. We will publicise the dates of the Planning Committee meetings when these applications are considered – please look for updates on our website *www.kscr.org.uk* - and would ask you to attend and support us if you possibly can. Also, please continue to make your objections known to EdVaizey, MP and the Vale of White Horse Planning Department. All contact details are on the KSCR website under "Contact Us".

BIRDWATCHER

Have you tried to get the brightly coloured Goldfinch in your garden, but just can't get them near your feeder? The lure of the yellow wing patch and bright red face is quite hard to resist trying.

I would like to share two well-tried ways to improve your chances.

- A bright yellow capped niger feeder (full with niger seed of course)
- A teasel plant close to the feeder

This combination of items has proven irresistible for my feeding areas in three different gardens. The image to the right was taken in my Sutton Courtenay garden a few weeks ago:



Occasionally a Blue Tit or Greenfinch will peck on the niger, but the only other bird I have seen to feed well on the niger seed in our village is the Lesser Redpoll.

The beautiful Goldfinch will sit on the niger feeder perches for long periods at a time and are much more confident to stay put, than the other birds.

Two Goldfinches seem to feed happily on one feeder, but as soon as a third bird approaches the fighting and squabbling starts with lots of aggressive high pitched chirping.

Microchips for Pets

Your pet becoming lost or stolen is one of the most distressing things that can happen. People in the area can look out for your pet but collars may come loose or name tags detached, with the result that many dogs needlessly end up in "stray dog kennels". However, if your dog or cat is microchipped, there is a much better chance of it being reunited with you if it is found.

If your pet has gone further afield, it can be traced back to you through the national microchip database. Most lost dogs and cats are just that — lost — and with secure identification can be returned home.

The size of grain of rice, fitting the microchip is a quick and relatively painless process. The microchip is injected under the skin, where it remains for the rest of the pet's life. Each chip has a unique code that can be cross-referenced on a national database against its owner's details. If your pet is brought to us we can scan it and within minutes be on the telephone to you.

Earlier this year a law was passed to make microchipping compulsory for dogs in the UK, so come and speak to us about the procedure and the different chips that are available. To help you get one step ahead of this, Larkmead Veterinary Group is holding a Microchipping Day on 8th June at our surgery on the High Street in Sutton Courtenay.

Microchips are not being made compulsory for cats yet, but they will be welcome to the Microchipping Day too – cats that fail to return home have often been involved in accidents and we are often faced with an injured cat in our care with no apparent owner. Did you know? There are now cat flaps that can be operated by your cat's microchip, so no more visitors making themselves at home!

MARION LORD

Marion Lord who has died aged 91 was a resident of Sutton Courtenay for forty five years. She was born in 1922 near Warrington in Lancashire, the only child of Harry and Marion senior. Harry was an independent minded, practical northerner who worked as an engineer fitter, having served in Mesopotamia in the First World War. Marion senior was a school teacher.

Her first school was in Iver, Buckinghamshire where the family had moved. She attending the school where her mother taught, They subsequently moved to Twickenham in London and Marion did office work, working at one stage for the National Union of Agricultural Labourers. She typed their history for the author Reg Groves, who acknowledged her in his 1948 workbook, 'Sharpen the Sickle! The History of the Farm Labourers' Union'.

Marion trained as a teacher at Roehampton College and became a further education college lecturer in business studies. Soon after the death of her mother in 1967, Marion and her father moved to Sutton Courtenay where she took a job at Abingdon College of Further Education. She retired at 60 to look after her ailing father. His death soon after created a large void in her life. She studied through the Open University and obtained an Arts degree. She was a stalwart of the local U3A and an active member of the Labour Party, helping with the local administration for Margaret MacKenzie.

Marion was skilful at making things and artistic. She enjoyed painting and painted some of her nicest pictures late in her life, when she was around 90 years old; at this late stage getting into painting with acrylics.

Marion had a strong sense of social justice and was for many years an active member of the Labour Party. She had no patience with what she perceived as unfairness, dishonesty or hypocrisy and was always ready to speak her mind. She also had a strong sense of humour though and could laugh at those traits as well.

Local people remembered her great interest in gardening and the great range of things she grew in the garden. She was extremely fond of cats and her friends remembered her sitting outside at night to watch her cats playing around the trees. She was warmly remembered as a very kind person, loyal and encouraging even when her own physical frailty made life difficult and came to dominate her daily routine.

Marion Lord's funeral service took place at Milton Methodist on May 14, and was conducted by Rev Dr David Rankin. The notes above are composed from tributes made at her funeral by her cousin, Jenifer Lord and other local friends. A small exhibition of her paintings was mounted in the Methodist hall on the day of her funeral.
