



VILLAGE HALL BOOKINGS





PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Large Goods Vehicles through Appleford Road and Church Street

Further to the article last month about large goods vehicles through the village, the Driving Standards Agency has advised that a notice has been displayed in the test centre encouraging the driver training companies not to use Sutton Courtenay for practice purposes.



High Street - verges

Southern Gas Networks have agreed the final restoration works needed in the High Street and this work should be completed shortly. An assessment of Milton Road and Harwell Road will be undertaken in due course.

Bridleway 24 off Harwell Road and Sustrans no. 5 cycle route - closure

Certain electricity cabling and drainage works are required along the northern boundary of the power station site and this route will be closed until around the end of October. The alternative route is via Sutton Courtenay Lane to the main entrance of Didcot "A" power station.

Community Led Plan

The village group working on the community led plan has been delivering questionnaires. This is your opportunity to be involved with and contribute to the future of the area. The Parish Council would encourage you to complete the form and have your say, to ensure that it is the community's own plan which reflects the wishes of those who live locally.

Hedge Cutting

The Parish Council has received comments from residents concerned about overhanging hedges which are causing problems for pedestrians and even cyclists in the area. Could landowners and those with responsibility for maintenance please ensure that the public areas on paths and cycle tracks are kept clear.

Planning Applications

APP.114/13 s. 73 application to vary condition 1 (timescale) and condition 2 (plans) of DRA/SUT.1179/26-CM on Land at Sutton Wick Quarry. The Council objected in principle to an extension of time in regards to the working on this site.

Two applications for the FCC landfill site were considered by the County Council, one for a waste transfer facility to handle 60,000 tonnes of non hazardous waste and 200 tonnes of clinical waste, and a second application to vary conditions on the establishment of the recycling facilities, at its planning committee meeting on 9th September. Both of these applications were refused.

Planning Agreements

Queries have been put to the Parish Council regarding planning agreements. The following may offer some explanation.

Planning Authorities may enter into agreements to regulate development or use of land. This has been a provision of legislation for decades. The current legislation that governs this is s. 106 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 and the provisions of the National Planning Policy Framework

The agreements are used to achieve planning objectives, particularly to mitigate the impact of development and to provide the infrastructure needed to support the development. The NPPF states that planning obligations should only be sought where they meet all of the following tests:

- necessary to make the development acceptable in planning terms;
- directly related to the development; and
- fairly and reasonably related in scale and kind to the development.

The agreement itself is between the planning authority and the developer. A Parish Council usually has no legal interest in the land used for development, nor is it a planning authority, so it cannot be a party to the planning agreement.

SUTTON COURTENAY PRIMARY SCHOOL

Encouraging children to have healthy life styles from an early age is crucial so that children grow up valuing sports and exercise as an essential part of their life.

At Sutton Courtenay this is encouraged from the moment children enter school in our Nursery class. Outside play happens within our Nursery class whatever the weather! Children have access to a wide range of ride on vehicles and climbing frames and have the space to let off steam.



Love life; love learning; love one another

From our Reception class onwards, the children are taught both by their class teachers and professional sports coaches to develop skills in a wide variety of sports and activities. Our large hall and extensive grounds provide ample opportunities to play rugby, football, netball, basketball, athletics, volley ball, tennis, rounders and many others.

You may have heard that over the next two years the government is providing schools with extra money to 'widen participation' in sports in order to develop active healthy lifestyles in our young people. At our school, part of this money has been used to have extra sessions from our sports coaches and some will be used for teacher training to strengthen sports teaching knowledge. In addition to this we have also decided to make some of our after school sports sessions free by paying the coaches directly from school. This term the children have the choice of: basketball, Zumba Kids, football and multi-sports, with zumba and basketball being the free options. All our clubs are either full or nearly full this term, with some children taking up all four activities!

Whilst we have increased in pupil numbers to 135, we are still classed as a small school and this can pose problems when trying to put together teams as sometimes we just do not have enough children! This year we have entered the small school football tournament and have some very talented players vying for a spot on the team. We will also be entering teams for cross country and taking advantage of other competitions as they arise.

We are looking forward to a very active year here at school!

Be part of the Bible story in China

Have you heard the amazing story of the Bible in China? How it's gone from being a banned book to a bestseller? How it's part of incredible Church growth, where around a million Chinese people come to faith every year? And did you know that YOU — and your church — can be part of the story? Bible Sunday, organised by Bible Society, is an annual opportunity to celebrate the blessing of owning and reading your own Bible. This year, it's also a time to join the amazing story in China — by helping provide Bibles to Chinese Christians too poor to afford a copy of the Scriptures themselves. In the last 12 months, a million people have come to faith in China, according to estimates. Imagine that. It's equivalent to one more person making a commitment to Christ by the time you read this article.

These new Christians are mostly from rural areas – and they are mostly poor. It means the cost of a Bible is simply out of their reach. And it's created a huge Bible shortage. Nearly half of all Christians in China don't own a Bible. In some places 10 Christians have to share a single copy of the Bible between them. Earlier this year, the Chinese government gave permission for the printing of 3.5 million Bibles for the churches there. They'll be printed at Amity Printing Company in Nanjing – which is part-owned by Bible Society. The printing presses are ready to roll – with the capacity to print almost 50 Bibles every minute. It's only the cost of the paper that's missing. *Just 80p could buy the paper for one Chinese Bible*. Through Bible Sunday, we can help to raise funds to buy Bibles for Chinese Christians. The Bible Sunday theme this year is 'the Bible's message of freedom'. Visit biblesociety.org.uk/biblesunday to find out more. Or come to All Saints' Church on Sunday 27th October at 10.30am to celebrate Bible Sunday where there will be a special collection for the Bible Society.

REST IN PEACE

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following people who have died recently:

Muriel Emily Owens (Mickey) who died on 11th August 2013 was born in Reading on 28th July 1927 to her parents, Leslie and Eunice Miles. She was apparently called Mickey after Walt Disney's Mickey Mouse which was so popular in her early childhood. Her father worked for Coxeters in Abingdon as a Cabinet Maker and Upholsterer (with a bit of undertaking on the side) and the family moved to Sutton Courtenay where Mickey grew up and it became for her the village she always regarded as home. As a young woman during the war she worked for the Red Cross and then as a Secretary for South Midland and for Cowley Road College. Mickey met her future husband, Derek Owens, in the early fifties and they began married life in Sutton Courtenay. Their son, Leslie, was born in 1957, followed by their daughter Catherine a few years later. The family moved to Steventon Road, Drayton where they have lived ever since. Mickey lived her life focused on caring for her family. She was one of life's worriers and very protective of them. She loved cooking puddings but was not so good at main courses. She was very much one of the make do and mend generation and would knit jumpers for the children. Naturally private and reserved she led a quiet and unassuming life, maintaining just a few close friendships. She was not one for socialising with large groups of people. When Derek became ill she cared for him devotedly, nursing him at home. It was perhaps the stress of caring for him that precipitated her first stroke in the 1990s, followed by a major stroke in 2011. Although ill-health came to dominate her later years Mickey still maintained her sharp mind by doing crosswords and she loved watching game shows on TV - particularly where they involved general knowledge questions, which she enjoyed answering, and Countdown where she liked pitting herself against the participants. She always liked dogs and enjoyed their company. This is an edited extract of the address given at her funeral held on Thursday, 22nd August 2013 at Oxford Crematorium, conducted by the Rev'd Helen Kendrick, followed by the interment of ashes in All Saints' Churchyard on Tuesday 17th September.

Christine Rose Davis (Chris) who has died, aged 88, was born on 13 April 1925 in south-east London. On leaving school she started work as a secretary for the Gillette Company. She then joined her parents and worked in the family business as licensees in Peckham. Later they moved to Fulham where the family were licensees at The Cottage, just off the Fulham Palace Road. Chris married Harry Davis in 1946 and they lived happily until Harry's death in 1986. Chris was a devoted mother to Marilyn, her only daughter, and was also devoted to her three grandchildren Harry, Richard and Peter. She immersed herself in family life and was a central part of the boys' early and teenage years. She even persuaded herself to enjoy rugby and could be seen on many a windswept Saturday afternoon standing on the touchline shouting encouragement. One of Chris's endearing traits was that she was always very prompt. Chris was always very elegantly dressed; she knew exactly the right clothes to choose for every occasion. Perhaps this talent came from her time as manageress of an exclusive dress shop in Ewell village. Never without a smile on her face her beauty was not just skin deep. She had a warm and welcoming personality with a delightfully cheeky sense of humour and was always interested in other people. She loved being part of the wider community – whether it was the Church, the Women's Christian Fellowship or indeed the WI. From her arrival in the village she was active in Sutton Courtenay WI and was a member of the committee for over 8 years - only resigning in April this year. She was the perfect WI member, willing to take on any task to help with the running of the group; an invaluable member of the team who covered most roles on the Committee during her time. She was a volunteer at the League of Friends' tea bar at Abingdon Hospital and she also helped at the County Markets, run from the Abingdon Guildhall. She was part of a WI exchange, visiting Estonia with her friend Daphne Sinclair. She organised group trips to the Theatre in Oxford, a tradition the WI will be carrying on. She made many lifelong friends and was a much loved WI member. She was always generous with her time and her talents. She was a woman of faith who deeply loved her family and greatly valued the friendships she made over the years. Her faith gave meaning to her life and underpinned all that she did and she drew great strength from worshipping here at All Saints'. Continued...

Chris was very interested in going to the theatre. She was a patron of Oxford Operatic Society and took great pleasure in watching Marilyn and her grandchildren perform in Oxford and Abingdon. She was a stalwart supporter of Abingdon Operatic Society. She helped to run the box office twice a year for 16 years. So over these 32 shows she got to know the Abingdon public very well. She relished her duties in the box office on show nights and made some very good friends working in the front of house.

Kind, compassionate, and caring, she was a good listener prepared to offer wise words when asked and was a friend and companion to many across the generations. She retained a sense of independence and an adventurous spirit. She was never afraid to say what she thought but was always caring and supportive. Above all, she loved Marilyn and her family and was immensely proud of them. She will be greatly missed by her family and her many friends.

These are edited highlights from the tribute given by Niall, her son-in-law and the address given by the Rev'd Helen Kendrick at Chris's funeral in All Saints' Church on Monday 2nd September 2013.

BIRDWATCHER

Following a few weeks of glorious sunshine I have just started to feel a chill in the air the last few days, signalling the onset of autumn. Our feathered friends have been busy with their young and the fledglings are now commonplace around our village. As a wildlife photographer, this is a frustrating period because these young birds do not have their full plumage yet and the adults are going through their post-breeding moult. A good example of this is the Goldfinches that do not have any red on their head, just whitish-grey bristles, although their black & yellow primary feathers are brilliant and beautiful in colour. These images do not look very pretty.

The busiest birds have been the Green Woodpeckers and Magpies who are happy with the quantity of apples and other fruit that has fallen from the trees. With hundreds of wasps and flies around the fruit, these larger birds are enjoying the easy 'insect' pickings.

The last few weeks have been relatively quiet around Sutton Courtenay and this is a signal for me to head north to Scotland to photograph some different birds and wildlife. The area to the South West of the Cairngorm Mountains has stunning scenery and abundant wildlife. My main interest is the massive fish hunting raptor — the Osprey. If you hide yourself alongside a well-stocked loch before sunrise and wait, you will likely see these huge birds of prey. I have found that they fish from about 05:30am until 08:00am. With a wingspan between 5 & 6 feet and massive white talons dangling below, you cannot mistake an Osprey. The birds will circle the loch for a few minutes looking for a fish and then, from a height of about 40 feet, plummet into the water, talons first, plunging completely under water. The Osprey then emerges with a fish and soars into the sky with deceptive ease. These magnificent birds will take between one and four fish during a morning. The Osprey start their migration to Africa during early September, so don't head to Scotland to view them now. They will have all flown south until the Spring!

While hiding in the foliage alongside the River Spey, I was fortunate enough to see and photograph my first Dipper. I was a little too far away (about 60 feet), but my long lens enabled me to capture the moment in reasonable quality.

My family and I enjoyed meeting many of the villagers at the Sutton Courtenay Village Craft and Produce Show back on the 7^{th} of September. It was fabulous to see all the local talent displayed at the show and share our photographs and tales.

FROM ED VAIZEY M.P.

When the Government introduced Police and Crime Commissioners, one clear aim was to increase public accountability. While we have a low crime rate in the Constituency compared with many other parts of the UK, I know that local residents do have concerns about many police issues, so the opportunity to make sure that those in charge of the police is very important indeed.

I am very pleased, therefore, to be able to publicise an event on 14th October. The Police and Crime Commissioner for Thames Valley, Anthony Stansfield, will be holding a public meeting in Didcot. This is an open public meeting, which anyone can attend.

The event will be an opportunity for the Police and Crime Commissioner, along with the local police commander, Supt Andy Boyd, to meet residents and deliver presentations about the role of the PCC and local policing in South Oxfordshire. A representative from the Community Safety Partnership will also be in attendance to tell



everyone more about the work they carry out in the area. Residents will be able to ask questions and feed back any concerns you may have about policing and crime.

The meeting will take place at 7pm on Monday 14 October at Didcot Civic Hall. Please do go along if you can both to hear about what is happening with policing locally and to put your own views to Anthony Stansfield and his colleagues.

If the subject of crime is one that gets your blood pressure up, you might like to hear about some statistics I recently came across. High blood pressure is one of the leading causes of a variety of illnesses, and it does not have any obvious symptoms but 1 in 3 people in the UK suffer from high blood pressure. It is easily picked up with a quick check, which most GP surgeries will carry out on an ad-hoc basis. Why not get your blood pressure checked next time you see your GP, or make an appointment to do so if you may not be at the surgery for a while? It takes very, very little time but might save your life ...

Since Parliament has returned from the summer recess I've been getting your emails and letters thick and fast, on Syria, bovine TB and the Transparency of Lobbying, Non-Party Campaigning and Trade Union Administration Bill.

On Syria, Parliament, reflecting the view of the British people, has made it clear that they do not want to see military action. I respect this opinion and the way it has been put. We must, however, ensure the continued taboo around the use of chemical weapons, so I support the Government's move to work with all the organisations we are members of, NATO, the EU, the G8 or the G20, to address what happened in Syria.

On Bovine TB, pilot badger culls are proceeding in Somerset and Gloucestershire. As I understand it, the monitoring of their effectiveness, humaneness and safety will be overseen and evaluated by an independent panel of experts who will report their findings to Ministers. I will be carefully looking at their findings.

On The Lobbying Bill, my view is that Government must keep the lines of information open from all parts of society. However, we must also bring transparency to the way third parties interact with the political system and reduce the undue influence of "Big Money" in politics. In my view the bill will achieve these aims.

SUTTON COURTENAY AND APPLEFORD COUNTY COUNCIL REPORT

With an Officer team many times larger than the District Council, and a budget of nearly £1billion, it is understandable that decisions and actions take much longer to reach at County than at District. There is some good news for Sutton Courtenay over weed clearance and some sprucing up of the Village White Entrance Gates in the coming months, but we all (me included) will need to be patient.

There is a small pot of money available for community schemes. I have already received some interest, but would welcome more, so that I can co-ordinate the applications. Any community activity needing support or start-up help to the tune of £100 - £500 may be eligible. Please let me know if you are interested by the end of October.

Home to School Transport

It seems that this issue is not going to go away. OCC spends some £17m every year on School Transport. It needs to save over £100m across its budget and most areas are protected. I suspect that we will wind up with Schools themselves taking responsibility for the funding (or not) of school transport – starting with Academies. There is a gradual move towards making schools responsible for their own budgets and taking away the responsibilities of County Councils for Education provision. The interim changeover period is going to be painful and contentious, but OCC, in common with all County Councils has got some tough decisions to make in the next year or two.

Spare a thought

The County Division of "Sutton Courtenay & Marcham" seems a very large and disconnected area with each village having its own, quite separate problems. Some of the problems are similar simply because all 3 of the larger villages are of similar size. There are many other shared problems, however, and all the villages including Appleford, Milton and Shippon have an interest in sharing their experiences and their ideas. Abingdon's problems are our problems, too. Increasingly, Didcot's problems are becoming ours. All are under threat of speculative planning applications. Sutton Courtenay is under special pressure from the expansion of Milton Park, a potential 1m square foot warehouse, the steadily increasing activity at the FCC waste recycling site, not to mention the demolition of Didcot A.

All these things have implications for housing and transport in all the villages. It must be in all our interests for the villages and their Parish Councils to get together to share experiences, problems and solutions. I wonder if we all live too much in our own bubbles at present. We would surely have much more clout together.

LANDFILL SITE EXPANSION CURBED

On Monday 9th September F.C.C. (formerly W.R.G.) submitted two planning applications to Oxford County Council to change the usage of the landfill site to increase the waste transfer facility (to package waste for the Ardley incinerator), to increase the ceiling of the waste imports and to extend the hours of working to 10pm on weekdays and 8pm on Saturdays, as well as later hours on public holidays.

This a further example of the planning creep practiced by F.C.C. to increase the size of this operation by stealth. The applications would have increased noise and traffic as well as allowed increased hazardous clinical waste and external storage of waste.....with the concomitant rise in the rat population.

The applications were vigorously opposed by local spokesmen lead by Robin Draper, Sally Furze and Dr. Angela Jones. South Oxfordshire Councillor Richard Webber added additional opposition. We were most gratified that Oxfordshire Planning Committee Councillors accepted our point of view and voted unanimously to reject both applications, despite the proposals being recommended by planning staff.

We believe that councillors also took into account the large number of written objections submitted by residents of Sutton Courtenay and Appleford.

Later this month we will be meeting with Planning Minister Nick Boles and our local MP Ed Vaizey, to put forward our concerns at the exploitation of the planning system and the way in which a small group of Spanish shareholders have been able to pursue such a large landfill site expansion to the detriment of hundreds of village residents.

But the decision on Monday shows that our objections are taken seriously by councillors and continued objection to expansion of this disruptive operation can succeed.

BONFIRES

The leaves are starting to fall and gardens are being tidied before the winter. What to do with the waste? Bonfires are popular option. The Vale's website (www.whitehorsedc.gov.uk) contains help advice for safe bonfires including:-

- Only burn dry material
- Never burn household rubbish, rubber tyres, or anything containing plastic, foam or paint
- Never use old engine oil, meths or petrol to light a fire or to encourage it
- Avoid lighting a fire in unsuitable weather conditions smoke hangs in the air on damp, still days and in the
 evening
- Avoid burning when the wind will carry the smoke over roads or into other people's property
- Avoid burning at weekends and on bank holidays when people want to enjoy their gardens
- Avoid burning when the air quality in you area is "poor" or "very poor" you can check this by ringing 0800 556677
- Never leave a fire unattended or leave it to smoulder douse it with water if necessary

Always start with a small fire to create a hot core then feed it often with small quantities of material this will encourage the smoke to be burnt and minimise the amount smouldering and smoke generated by the fire.

OXFORDSHIRE WOOD FUEL PROGRAMME

Be smart when you buy firewood. Please buy from a local supplier, as this minimises 'fuel miles' and supports local businesses. Ask your supplier whether they provide OxLogs (www.oxlogs.com), which are the Oxford quality standard for woodfuel. Otherwise ask 1. what the moisture content of the wood is (it should be 25% or less), 2. what volume of wood you are getting (you should know what weight or volume you are getting, not just 'a load'), 3. whether it is soft or hardwood (a hardwood log has more energy than a softwood log of the same size), and 4. how long the logs are.

Wood with a high moisture content will burn badly, since much of its energy will first go into turning that moisture into steam before it can heat your house. Last summer was terrible for drying wood, but this year has been much better. You can buy a moisture meter for about £15 online. For more information see www.oxonwoodfuel.org.uk/our-community-wants-to.

Join Logs for Labour. L4L matches up woodland owners whose woodlands need managing ('log offers') with people who are willing to help out in return for logs ('labour offers'). The woodfuel programme is organising a series of L4L events for the autumn and winter. 

Maurice Duruflé was born in Normandy at the beginning of the 20th Century. His early education as a chorister at Rouen cathedral introduced him to plainsong chant and it is this style of singing which has strongly influenced his requiem. He was a fastidious composer constantly re-working his compositions and often burning discarded writing, as such only 14 opus numbers are known to exist. This work displays a subtle and expressive reading of the requiem, in contrast to the somewhat fiery settings of Verdi and Berlioz at the time and represents the idea of comfort, faith and hope.
