





PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

X1 Bus Service

Mr. Edmund Tresham, Commercial Manager at Thames Travel, attended the last meeting of the Parish Council. He advised that services were mostly being commercially run and whilst it was regrettable that the Appleford Road end of the village no longer had a bus service it was not viable to restore it. Routing the X1 service via Drayton and the Caldecott area of south Abingdon provided more passengers. Thames Travel appreciated that there had been problems with timetabling and buses leaving termini at the correct time, particularly as a bus terminated as one service then started out a new journey as another. There had been



knock on delays that had occurred. They are dealing with this problem and monitoring passenger numbers, the timetabling of the X1 and other services . They are keeping an open mind and the services are being kept under review.

Vale of White Horse - Local Plan 2031 - Housing Delivery Update

As mentioned last month the District Council is inviting comments on the housing proposals for the area. The District Council has carried out an assessment of potential housing development sites and has included a site off Hobbyhorse Lane for approximately 220 houses. This is the field next to the village hall, and runs northwards to the southern boundary of the recreation ground. Also there are draft policies for Didcot A Power Station to safeguard this as an employment site, and for other development. The employment use should comprise predominantly general business uses, but probably with general light industrial or storage uses on less visible parts of the site. New access will be provided via the new planned science bridge from the south side of the A4130. The deadline for comments is 4th April.

Oxfordshire County Council – Proposed reduction in speed limit Milton Road from B4016 to Coopers Corner, Milton village

The County Council is proposing to reduce the speed limit on the road from the B4016 leading to Milton village from 60 mph to 40 mph. The Parish Council has welcomed this move.

Planning Applications

The following planning applications have been considered:

MW.0009/14 An application to continue the development approved by consent SUT/616/59-CM for the deposit of non hazardous waste including surcharging the existing landfill, without complying with condition 5 date for completion, to allow working until 31st December 2020 at Sutton Courtenay Landfill site. The Council had no objections provided the works were completed on time and that there were no further changes to the end date.

As I have previously written in the Sutton Courtenay News, 'Reading' is extremely important. The methods that are now used in school such as synthetic phonics have been much talked about in the press and they are used within our school but alongside this children are exposed to a myriad of different books within Sutton Courtenay C of E Primary School through sharing them with each other and having books read to them by their teachers.



This is also what our **Reading Volunteers** carry out week-on-week. We are so fortunate to have a large group of Reading Volunteers who are helping to create a love of books by sharing them with a child on a one-to-one basis. The children look forward to their session and **favourite books** are already

emerging. Thank you to all those within our village who have committed to the 'Reading Volunteer Programme' and are making a difference – Your time is valuable and very much appreciated!

Recently, we held a book week in school which we entitled: 'Telling Tales'. This focused on traditional tales and oral story telling techniques. We began the week with a whole school retelling of Goldilocks and later on in the week tested the knowledge of our children with a quiz. Alongside, a story teller spending the day with us and a dressing up day at the end – The children certainly had a memorable week.

We would like our children to be able to 'get lost' in a book, find out new ideas and not want to put that book down. In this technological age books could seem almost outdated and it is vital that children see the reason for having a novel or non-fiction book, which is in fact, sheer enjoyment.



What is the Grand Day Out?

It's a day out for the whole church family. That's everyone who lives and worships in the 815 churches across Oxfordshire, Berkshire and Buckinghamshire. We don't often get together – but on that day we'll be gathering with our Bishop John, his team and each other. We'll be joining in prayer and worship, taking part in a feast of different activities and sharing a massive picnic.



When is it? - Saturday 20 September 2014

Where? - The Grand Day Out is taking place in venues in Oxford around or near our cathedral. Everywhere is in easy walking distance of the Park and Ride drop-off points in the City Centre.

Why? - 2014 is a special year for the Diocese of Oxford. It's the final year of the initial five-year phase of Living Faith. As we reach that point, the Grand Day Out is designed to help us think afresh about the challenges and opportunities of living as Christians at the start of the 21st century and explore where God is leading us next.

So who is it for? - Everyone! Young, old, lay, ordained, families, single people, life-long Anglicans and people new to church. There'll be a wide ranging programme of events and everyone is welcome.

What will it be like? - We're aiming for a Grand Day Out. We'll be fed by the God who's the source of our Living Faith. We'll have the chance to get together — and see that we're each part of a bigger picture. And we hope we'll return to our churches and communities with our imaginations inspired for the future.

So what's going on? - - speakers (including Mary Berry) and workshops- prayer and worship - family activities - geocaching – games - youth events - events for people with learning disabilities - pilgrimage

REST IN PEACE

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following person who has died recently:

Irene May Hoborough (Rene) who died on 7th February 2014 was born on 27th December 1917 in Abingdon, where her family lived in a cottage at the Drayton end of Ock Street. They moved to Sutton Courtenay when her father went to work on Allen's farm as a stockman. Rene attended school in Culham before going to the old school in Sutton Courtenay. During the war she worked at a components factory in Abingdon. Her husband Reg, from Drayton, was born in 1914 and he worked as a civilian driver for Culham Naval Air Station, taking the huge low loaders called 'Queen Mary's' all over the country. In later years he continued working for the Property Services Agency at Culham. We don't know how they met but they always enjoyed dancing together - often going to dances at the then Village Hall on Old Wallingford Way. Rene and Reg were married in 1940 and their first and only home together was 29 High Street, Sutton Courtenay. Rene tended their long back garden with great enjoyment. She was a good cook and always provided hearty meals. She was known as 'a good trencher woman'. Over the years they enjoyed many seaside holidays, always accompanied by their two large parrots - which was why they always stayed in caravans and never in hotels! From the end of the war Rene worked as the village post-lady for 28 years and became very well-known across the whole community. During this time she wore out three bikes and was usually accompanied by Miss Towle's huge white Pyrenean Mountain Dog called Bruno. Rene would often make extra journeys after her delivery round, fetching pensions and shopping for elderly residents in Appleford Road in simple acts of kindness. When she finally retired her leaving present was a new bike and a cheque. All her life Rene was a passionate cat lover - especially of ginger ones - and her home and garden were never without at least two indoors and various visiting strays and their kittens. She would make up beds for homeless animals in her back porch and was a loyal customer to the travelling fishmongers. Reg died in March 1976 and although she lived independently for many years she eventually began to find life on her own a hard struggle – even with the kind support of friends and neighbours from across the village. Rene very much enjoyed receiving visitors – greeting them with a welcome smile and a good chat by her fireside. After a bad fall she was admitted to Didcot Hospital and it was from there that she decided to go into care. For the past three and a half years she was living comfortably and well cared for in Old Station House, Abingdon. I know that she was very grateful for the ongoing support and visits from Joan and other friends which kept her in touch with village life and the outside world. To me Rene was one of a disappearing generation of village characters. She always had some great tales to tell of her childhood and of her times as the village post lady and the characters she remembered (in often very colourful language). She died peacefully on the evening of 7th February and her funeral took place, as she wished, at Oxford Crematorium on 24th February 2014. This is an edited extract from the address given by the Reverend Helen Kendrick with information provided by Rene's friend, Joan Carter.

JO ALLAN (1920 TO 2014)

'Birdwatcher' for Sutton Courtenay News 1999 to 2007

Jo's daughter Judy writes:

Jo's fascination with plants and animals began at school in Somerset when she overcame a fear of tunnels to peer down a microscope. She became particularly interested in birds. In one of her Bird Diaries she vividly recalled as a small child watching four long-tailed tits feeding a brood and, when the young had flown, looking closely at the beautifully constructed nest. She put her finger in the tiny entrance hole to feel the warm, soft feather lining and then was fascinated to learn that it was quite common for parent long-tailed tits to be assisted by other family members. From these early experiences, the natural world was to become a source of joy and inspiration throughout her life.

From an early age, Jo also showed a talent for art and continued to practise it for most of her life. As well as creating her own art, she worked as an art teacher, designed and painted scenery for Abingdon Drama Club and, in later years, designed weather vanes. Jo trained during the War at the art college in Bristol where she met the love of her life, Doug, a research physicist evacuated from London. She survived the Bristol Blitz and then joined the Women's Land Army, writing and illustrating letters home about her experiences. Jo and Doug moved to Oxfordshire (Berkshire as it then was) in 1947 when Doug's work brought him to AERE Harwell. They had four children – Bridget, Judy, John and Viki.

In 1958, Jo and Doug were looking for a house that would accommodate their family as well as Jo's parents. They eventually found something they could afford in Sutton Courtenay - two barns, an open cart shed and the old farmyard they enclosed. With the help of a local architect, a series of local builders and with many challenges along the way, they finally had the house of their dreams two years later. Both keen gardeners, Jo and Doug also worked hard on converting the overgrown farmyard into a beautiful garden that became a haven for wildlife.

After Doug suffered a debilitating stroke in 1969, Jo worked as a Personnel Administrator at the JET project in Culham. After retirement she kept herself busy doing voluntary work, including as a National Trust steward at Basildon Park. Jo died peacefully at home with family around her in the house she loved.

In her Bird Diaries Jo reported on everything she found interesting on her walks around the river, the Common, the gravel pit lakes, in the village and in her garden. She had a deep well of knowledge to draw upon and, when unsure about something, she would enjoy reading her favourite reference books to make sure of the facts. She might tell her readers about the territorial disputes or breeding successes on the angling lake; the current occupants of the many holed "tenement tree"; that year's dominant wild flower species on the Common; the tame blackbird who came knocking on the kitchen door each morning for his breakfast; the behaviour of a particular species of bird or the declining numbers of another.

As Jo's mobility declined, she missed her walks around the village and the challenge of meeting her Bird Diary deadlines, but she never tired of watching the birds in her garden.

Editors' note: We are very grateful to Jo for the eight years of Birdwatcher columns written for this Newsletter. They were always beautifully written and highly informative, giving the sense of how much she loved and appreciated the birdlife she observed around her. We hope to be able to reproduce one of her articles in a forthcoming issue.

NEIGHBOURHOOD ACTION GROUP (NAG5)

Do you know or care for someone who is affected by dementia or memory problems?

Do you feel more could be done to make your local community more dementia friendly?

Those affected by memory problems and dementia, and their carers, can sometimes feel that they don't know where to turn for help or how to find out what assistance they are entitled to, which can lead to feeling isolated and unsupported. Members of NAG5 recently attended a course run by Oxfordshire Rural Community Council at Sutton Courtenay Village Hall as we wanted to have a better understanding of dementia, what it means to live with it and how best to communicate with those who have it.

We also learned more about **Neighbourhood Return**, which was set up to help to find people who are lost. People at risk of getting lost can be registered with Neighbourhood Return. If they're reported lost, volunteers are quickly contacted by text message to request a search in their neighbourhood, enabling the person missing to be found quickly and returned home or to a safe place.

Oxfordshire is working towards Dementia Friendly Communities. We would like to hear from anyone who has suggestions or ideas about how we might make the NAG5 community – villages of Appleford, Drayton and Sutton Courtenay - more dementia friendly.

NOTE1

The Independent Living Centre in Abingdon has access to a range of equipment for viewing and demonstration to enable: moving around, reaching things, preparing or eating food, getting into and out of bed, using the bathroom and going up and down stairs. There is also assistive technology available, such as sensors and monitors. Regular Open Days are held, each of which focuses on a particular theme or product range.

ED VAIZEY MP

As your MP, I am often asked to help communities with challenges they face. Usually, these will just affect one town or village, but there is now one issue which will affect most of the Didcot and Wantage Constituency: the electrification of the railway in Oxfordshire, and the resulting plans to close 18 railway bridges across the area. Even if you don't live near a bridge which may be closed for, we hear, up to 6 months, the chances are you will travel through an area which will be affected.

I am very much aware of the problems that the temporary closure of railway bridges and subsequent traffic diversions would cause and share the concerns of so many Constituents on that score. I have been directly in touch with Network Rail about the issue for some weeks and a member of my staff attended a briefing about the matter at County Hall. I have also visited a business owner to hear about the impact on his and other local businesses, which will be dreadful. To begin to try to sort things out, I have called a meeting with Network Rail senior executives specifically about this matter. I believe Network Rail have proved to be both insensitive and incompetent so far, as sadly has been demonstrated in the very, very poor process and communications about Fulscot Bridge which is to remain closed for months to come even though it should, by now, have reopened.

I am also arranging the meet the Minister responsible, Stephen Hammond MP, to make it clear that while I support the electrification of the railway line, which will lead to cleaner, more efficient railway services, it cannot be introduced at the expense of grotesque inconvenience to my Constituents.

I have quite a large list of Constituents to whom I send occasional updates on progress in dealing with Network Rail on the general issues about electrification and particularly the impact on bridges and road closures. If you would like to be added to that list, please email me at *vaizeye@parliament.uk* and I will ensure you are kept up to date – but will try not to swamp you with communications.

Another issue, of course, that has affected many people across the Constituency is the recent flooding. I was very pleased that work done my communities since our last major floods in 2007 meant that things never got quite as bad as they did then. As the waters subside, I have been working with others both locally and nationally to try to help with the immediate recovery, but also to look to the longer term and to make sure that we take the most effective possible measures to protect against such extreme weather in the future.

My mailbag this month continues to include a diverse mix of issues, ranging from pupils taking holidays during school term time to the use of wild animals in circuses. With the Chancellor of the Exchequer set to deliver his Budget in March, I have received a particularly high number of letters and emails calling for beer duty to be frozen for this year. I am pleased that the Government decided to make a targeted reduction in beer duty and abolished the beer duty escalator at Budget 2013. I'm assured that the Chancellor is fully aware of many of the arguments made in favour of a freeze in beer duty for 2014, and is also sympathetic to the case of responsible drinkers.

BROADBAND IN OXFORDSHIRE

Ed Vaizey MP has welcomed the Government's announcement of an additional £2.15 million of Superfast Broadband funding for Oxfordshire.

In addition to the £1.2 billion central and local government are already investing to give homes and businesses access to superfast broadband across the UK, the Department for Culture, Media and Sport have announced an extra £250 million for local authorities to extend superfast broadband to 95% of the country by 2017.

More than 10,000 homes and businesses across the UK are gaining access to Superfast Broadband each week, with the number expected to rise to 40,000 per week by the summer of this year.

Ed Vaizey MP said: "Superfast Broadband benefits everybody. This additional funding will come as welcome news to Oxfordshire residents, and in particular to those homes and businesses who have yet to have access to Superfast Broadband.

"It will make a significant contribution to the Better Broadband for Oxfordshire project, which will see Superfast Broadband rolled out right across the county."

FLOODING IN SUTTON COURTENAY

This press release was received from Ed Vaizey too late for inclusion in last month's edition of Sutton Courtenay News:

The flooding has not only dominated the national news recently, but also caused huge concern locally. Luckily, the flooding was not as bad in 2007, with fewer homes flooded, partly as the result of local action taken by local flood groups. Nevertheless, some homes were flooded, many roads closed, and a lot of farmland remains under water. I have personally visited a number of communities and farmers.

Over the worst week end my office was in touch with a number of affected constituents in Sutton Courtenay. In particular, we contacted FCC over concerns that poor drainage was leading to flooding in the village. I have also sought assurances that the FCC are complying with all of the planning conditions relating to drainage, which have been agreed with the District and County Councils.

It is now important that we do all we can to enable homes and businesses affected to get back on their feet. I will therefore be continuing my dialogue with both the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs and the County Council to ensure that those eligible for the Government's recently announced Repair and Renew Grant are able to access the funds without delay. It is also important that all future housing development takes in to account the impact that flooding can have.

SUTTON COURTENAY COUNTY COUNCILLOR

X1 Bus Service

The Local manager for Thames Travel very kindly (and bravely) attended the last meeting of SC Parish Council. The new timetable we are assured will be up and running "very soon", and they are very hopeful that the glitches, which beset the last timetable, will have been ironed out. We were told that the section of the X1 route, which continues through Abingdon to Oxford City Centre, was programmed to satisfy a perceived need by Sutton Courtenay Residents to be able to get directly to Oxford. It was pointed out that, if the X1 service terminated at Abingdon, anyone could easily change to any of the many Oxford fast service buses. Indeed, given that all the buses concerned were run by Thames Travel, no business would be lost. We all understand that bus services need to make financial sense as far as possible, but terminating the X1 service at Abingdon would surely allow an extra service (perhaps Didcot to Abingdon via Appleford / SC East / Culham). This would please all those who feel stranded in SC East, Appleford (and Culham) by the abandonment of the old 32 Service. If you agree, please contact Thames Travel and let them know.

Grants

Good news in that the hard-pressed County Budget has managed to find some money to continue the Community Grants for next year. The sum is halved from last year, but at least organisations such as SC Primary School, transport for the elderly and the Damascus Youth Project (all of which benefitted this year) will still have somewhere to go for something next year!

Flooding

At a very useful meeting I attended last week, a representative of Thames Water suggested that the reason that many people in South Abingdon were having problems with their drainage in the recent heavy rainfall was because they were not using their WCs correctly. This took me right back to 2007, when the councils, the various agencies and the residents all became involved in a blame game as many people's homes were in the process of being flooded. Thankfully, although there is still plenty of room for further progress, the authorities are now much better at working together. The causes of flooding are rarely simple. Our ability to predict who will flood and when it will happen is still far short of perfect. When it floods, rapid, co-ordinated responses are what is needed, not blame. We can sort out who was to blame later. Telling people whose houses are about to flood that they are not using their cisterns properly is not likely to be very productive.

Railways and Railway Stations

The railways have been in the news a lot recently. HS2 will it encourage people to be less London-centric and to live and work further North? Or will it have the opposite effect and simply suck in even more people, money into the capital? Rail electrification looks a great thing, but it does involve closing bridges and causing temporary traffic mayhem while it is going on. Having a Railway station is seen as an enormous asset to an area, but it does send up house prices, and it is used as a justification to place houses nearby. Having a Railway station is said to give an area sustainability in planning speak. Grove needs one. Radley has one. And so, interestingly, does little Appleford.

Appleford may have lost its shop and its Pub, but it still has a Station — no station car park — but a station nevertheless. Should Appleford keep quiet and hope that the authorities will allow the status quo to persist, or should the presence of Appleford station be used as a reason to make the village more "sustainable" - with all that that might imply?

For the sake of a bit of pavement, your telling me that everyone's got to sit and wait for me to haul loads of rape and muck and bales through?

Health and safety gone mad. Let's have a bit of common sense here.

I am very sympathetic to David Connor's parking problems I too am a driver and recognise the issues related to finding somewhere to park and also a pedestrian and sympathetic to the concerns of his anonymous sign writer. However there are a number of issues Mr Connor has not considered and I would invite him to do so.

Parking on the pavement is an absolute offence; there are no exceptions in law, it is an obstruction of the footway.

Pavements are not designed or built to take the weight of a motor vehicle.

Parking on them damages the pavement making them unsafe for pedestrians and can lead to accidents costing the NHS and councils additional funds which we the taxpayers pay for, an inconvenience for considerably more than one or two people a week.

It is not a pedestrian's responsibility to choose one pavement over another; the pavement is intended for the free passage of pedestrians.

There are other places to park, albeit a walk probably from the cottages on the High Street.

Finally, Mr Connor knew there was no available parking at his house when he moved there.
