

#### VILLAGE HALL BOOKINGS





#### PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

#### **Didcot Community Forum**

The Parish Council is a member of the Didcot Community Forum. This is made up of representatives from the local area to discuss proposals and plans for Didcot. The role of the forum is expanding to include discussion regarding the Science Vale area and an Area Action Plan is proposed. The Parish Council is asking whether it can have a more formal role in the planning given the links with Didcot and the fact that part of the Science Vale area is within Sutton Courtenay parish.



#### **Footpaths**

We have experienced either warm or wet weather of late and the grass and tree growth is exceptional. There are some paths in the village which are impassable. The Parish Council would kindly remind landowners adjacent to footpaths that it is their responsibility to keep anything overhanging trimmed back to the boundary to allow people to get through

#### Motorcycles on lanes

The Council has received reports of more and more motorcyclists riding illegally on the footpaths and lanes within the parish. Damage is being caused as ruts are left behind. Police have powers to seize motor vehicles that are being used not in a correct manner. Should anyone see a motorcycle being ridden off road inappropriately then please pass on the details to the Police by telephoning 101.

#### **Planning Applications**

#### The following planning applications have been considered:

P14/V09878/HH and P14/V0981/LB Demolition of extension and garage and erection of 2 storey extension and internal alterations. Erection of detached garage with study over.

P14/V1087/O 1 Abbey Cottages. The Council objected to the extension for the house and materials, which were out of keeping with the character of the grade I listed Abbey adjacent.

P14/V1087/O Demolition of existing dwelling and triple garages and erection of two new dwellings and triple garages at The New House, Churchmere Road. The Council had concerns regarding the larger footprint and impact of traffic on the unadopted lane.

P14/V0831/LB and P14/V0830/HH Erection of a garden office, conservatory attached to rear of property, velux windows in front elevation roof, roof lights to lower roof over kitchen at rear,18 High Street. The Council objected to the application owing to the impact on the street scene, and the appearance of the elevation created at the rear.

P14/V1170/LDO Pre-development notification related to the addition of an exhaust chimney to the approved scheme at 172 Milton Park. The Council had no objections.

MW. 0055/14 and MW/0056/14 Formation of hard standing and non material amendment to extend the multipurpose area across the remainder of the application site of consent APF/18979/s-CM, a wood recycling facility at Hill Farm, Appleford. The Council had no comment to make.

#### Greetings from All Saints'

We believe in the Holy Spirit! When we say this in the creed in church the Spirit can seem like a bit of an afterthought, coming after God and Jesus. Yet in many ways the most powerful belief Christians have is a belief that God is at work in the world through his Spirit. It (or he, or she) is a Spirit of Love, a Spirit of Truth, a Spirit of caring. #### **OFF ROAD MOTORBIKES**

It has come to Police attention that a minority of people are regularly riding around on off road motorbikes on private land between Milton Park and Sutton Courtenay. The Police, local land owner and Sutton Courtenay Parish Council have all met to discuss this issue.

As stated this land is privately owned and the owners have not and will not give permission to any persons to ride or drive any kind of mechanically propelled vehicle on this land.

The local Neighbourhood Police Teams will be carrying out regular patrols in the area to tackle this issue. Those found to using the land for such activity's risk being issued with a Section 59 warning notice with consideration of having the vehicle seized, and if seen on a public road will face prosecution from appropriate driving offences, such as no insurance.

#### **Section 59 Warning**

A person maybe warned that if they continue to drive this or any other motor vehicle in a similar manner, or if they drive this or any other vehicle in a similar manner on any other occasion, or this motor vehicle is driven by anyone else in a similar manner, the vehicle may be seized under powers granted by Section 59 and 60 of the Police Reform Act 2002.

The fact that you have been issued with a warning will be recorded on a Police information system.

This Warning lasts for 12 months, if the vehicle or person is seen again within the 12 months the vehicle can be seized.

Should your vehicle be seized, you will only be able to reclaim it on payment of a removal charge of at least £150.00 plus a storage fee of £20.00 a day. If the vehicle is not claimed within 21 days, arrangements may be made for its disposal.

The Police, Parish Council and the land owners are concerned that someone may get hurt by such activity, either by hurting themselves or by hurting somebody else.

There are appropriate places where these vehicles can be used reasonably locally and we would encourage these places to be used.

If a land owner does give permission for land to be used for this activity, after 28 days, planning permission would be required, along with Public liability insurance as well as personal insurance should anyone get injured i.e. dog walkers or children. The Police would also want to see written permission at the time in the form of a letter with contact details for the land owner so checks can be made at the time to ensure full permission was given.

If any parents are aware that their children are using this land in this manner we would ask you to ensure that they do not. Many of the people involved seldom wear any protective clothing or helmets and risk serious injury should there be an accident.


This activity on this land will not be tolerated and those found using it for this will be dealt with accordingly.



The Soldiers of Oxfordshire (SOFO) Museum opened to the public on Sunday June 15th at 2pm. Thereafter it will be open from Tuesday-Saturday 10am-5pm and Sundays 2-5pm.

The Museum houses the collections from the Oxfordshire Yeomanry and the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry it will offer a Research Centre, a modern archive and collections store and Galleries in which the stories of the Soldiers of Oxfordshire will be told. The opening of the museum will be heralded by the Oxford Caledonian Pipe Band.

The Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light infantry served alongside the Highland Light Infantry in both wars and were familiar with the pipes......from the trenches of Messines in 1915 to the attack on the Reichswald forest in March 1945.

The imaginative concept of building the new Museum in the grounds of the existing Oxfordshire Museum in Woodstock was that of Oxfordshire County Council. In accepting the Council's invitation, SOFO has raised the money to build, mainly from private donors, a substantial asset which will, in due course, become public property. It will be a vital resource for all interested in local and family history, and aims to be integral to the County's education system. From the outset, a functional modern design was called for and the result can now be seen to be settling well into its ancient setting.

The Oxfordshire Museum already attracts a large number of visitors. The presence of the SOFO museum will reinvigorate the whole site and attract a new audience drawn to the unique objects, stories and archives that the SOFO museum has to offer.

The displays in the Galleries will be a fantastic resource for families, young children, school visits, life - long learners and the keen social and military researchers who want to learn more about how conflict has affected the county. Conflict continues to affect the County today with the presence of several military installations and units, at bases such as the large logistic installation at Bicester, Dalton & Vauxhall Barracks and the RAF at Brize Norton and Benson. By placing key moments from history alongside current military actions, the museum will keep this important heritage alive, telling the stories of not only the county regiments but 'all' soldiers of Oxfordshire.

Battles: Among many others, SOFO has a rich archive from the Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire chronicles, tracing the history of the regiment, with highlights from Waterloo, Pegasus Bridge and present day conflict. Momentous times from history with personal stories from letters home, diary extracts and newspaper reports. We look at the men who led the regiment through to the Royal Green Jackets and to the present day Rifles, discovering what life was like for an ordinary soldier and what he had to endure. Time and again, the personal stories drive home the image of a regiment bought together through training and leadership to carry out outstanding acts of bravery in the defence of the realm.

Airpower: A new departure for SOFO, recounting the history of airpower for the county and ensuring the RAF are honoured as well as the specific stories from D Day, air recognisance flights from RAF Benson and exploits from the Royal Flying Corps. We have also been given generous help and support from the Upper Heyford Action Group with stories from the Cold War. This includes details about the nuclear armed F111's positioned in the county making us all in Oxfordshire a target facing total destruction for thirty years during the cold war, a fact many didn't realise at the time and that more have forgotten now!

Modern Conflict: SOFO is committed to use the museum galleries and its programme of events to provide opportunities for Oxfordshire's military and their families to become more involved with others in the community at large, through family events and activities. SOFO has already worked with a number of schools who work closely with the families from the various bases through on line displays and opportunities for schools to curate mini exhibitions. Through the Modern Conflict display, 21st Century Soldier, SOFO has looked at modern conflict and through it the threat of the technological advances needed to counter life on the frontline. As well as the training of bomb

Smartwater is a brand of forensic marking fluid containing millions of microscopic particles that make up an individual property identification code. The liquid is invisible to the naked eye, but glows green under UV light. It can be used to mark valuable items (e.g. laptops, MP3

players, televisions, mobile phones, cameras, antiques, jewellery and bicycles). Thames Valley Police have kits for use in the home available at a greatly reduced price of £15 each (normally £60).

Over the past couple of months PCSO Sandra Syphas, with NAG5 representatives, has visited households in Appleford and Sutton Courtenay with kits and information about Smartwater, and had a very positive response. Appleford is now a designated 'Smartwater zone' and it's hoped that Sutton Courtenay will shortly follow suit. Householders in Drayton will be visited over the next few weeks. The hope is that all three NAG5 villages will become designated Smartwater zones. #### **ED VAIZEY MP**

As you may have read in the press or seen on TV in recent months, there have been many web sites springing up which claim to offer government services. While these sites are not illegal, it is hard to see why they are necessary. These "third-party sites" charge for services that people can get for free, or at a lower cost, through GOV.UK websites — the official government sites. The third party sites usually exaggerate the benefits of their additional services, don't tell you what you can get through GOV.UK, or imply an affiliation with government, and the sites can be very convincing. The services most affected have been:

- Booking Driving Tests (theory and practical)
- Driving licence applications (including the free service for over-70s)
- Passport Applications (and bookings for emergency appointments which are actually provided for free)
- European Health Insurance Cards (EHICs) applications which are also provided free by the Government.

The Government has been working with a range of organisations, such as Which and the National Trading Standards Board, to try to combat the problem and has had some success, with increasing numbers of users going straight to the Government sites, but there is still some way to go. I hope readers won't mind me using my article this month to add to the efforts to publicise the best way to avoid being caught out.

If you need a government service, then the best way to find it on-line is to go to www.gov.uk, where you'll see the very wide range of ways you can access government services on-line. If you go straight to www.gov.uk, you will always get the real service, directly from the right department and at the lowest possible cost. More and more services are now accessible on line and it is the quickest way to get all sorts of things you may need like vehicle tax discs and advice on visas.

More widely, in my mailbox this month, a number of constituents have contacted me with their concerns about modern slavery and supply chains. I abhor slavery in all its forms. It is an affront to the dignity and humanity of us all. I therefore welcome the Government's Modern Slavery Bill, which will disrupt and imprison the organised criminal gangs behind much of the modern slave trade. It is the responsibility of us all to help stamp out slavery, and the private sector has to play its part. Firms must ensure that they do not do business with suppliers involved in trafficking, and the Home Office will continue to work with businesses and the Gangmasters' Licensing Authority to prevent the exploitation of workers.

Other issues featuring in this month's mailbox include live animal exports, making the school run safer and the human rights situation in the Central African Republic.

#### **COUNTY COUNCILLOR REPORT**

Until recently, the major concerns of the County Council have traditionally been Transport and Education, County Planning issues have ranked a poor third. These days, both County and District have found Planning issues way at the top of their agenda.

Sutton Courtenay, Appleford and Milton, with their national infrastucture pressures from Didcot B, their regional pressures from the FCC recycling plant and Milton Park /Science Vale UK and their District housing pressures, can very fairly argue that the cumulative effect of all this must be taken into account when assessing planning applications of all types. If the present planning system does not allow cumulative impact arguments, then there is something badly wrong with the system and it needs to be changed. So many major planning applications in our already heavily congested area have major transport implications. The pressure on the long awaited "Milton interchange" improvements is immense, and the volume of current planning applications from all sides threaten to swamp its potential benefits before building has begun.

The pressure under the NPPF (National Planning Policy Framework) to accept new development - domestic and commercial seems almost irresistible. We are told that "in planning terms" unpopularity" is not a "material consideration" and that the risk of rejecting applications is that such decision will be overturned at appeal with costs being awarded against the planning committee. It is true that that is the system as is, but it is also true that "fear of costs" is also not a "material consideration".

I am certainly no anarchist when it comes to planning. I happen to believe that we need a lot more houses (how many more, and where they go are separate issues). I also happen to want this area to be as economically successful as it can possible be, and that its best chance of achieving this is for Science Vale UK to grow, and for us to become the UK centre for scientific research and development. If we've got the numbers of houses we need right (a big "if") and if we have got the right places for the houses (another big "if") then, I support it. If anything gets in the way of the growth and future of Science Vale UK – particularly traffic – I am against it. Rejecting the Million square foot Warehouse was, I believe the correct decision. What happens now will be interesting.


#### **ROYAL BRITISH LEGION**


