

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Council budget 2015/16

The Parish Council has carefully considered its budget for 2015/2016 looking in detail at its income and expenditure. The Parish Council will receive a grant from the Vale of White Horse District Council in the sum of £2039 and the requirement raised from council tax is £43378. The Council is very prudent with its spending and this is the sixth year that the Council has held the figure the same.



Drayton Road Traffic Calming

Oxfordshire County Council is now progressing this scheme again following a change of staff. Final drawings are being prepared on the basis of a double pinch scheme. This is similar to the scheme in Steventon on the Hanney Road, making traffic both entering and leaving the village slow up on the approaches.

Didcot "A" redevelopment

The Parish Council was very concerned to learn that no exhibition regarding the redevelopment of the Didcot "A" site was being held locally in Sutton Courtenay, particularly as the site is within the parish of Sutton Courtenay. It has raised this issue with the planning consultants for the developer and with the Vale of White Horse District Council.

Warehouse, Sutton Courtenay Lane

The Parish Council spoke against the warehouse application at the planning committee meeting in December. The committee members, however voted in favour of the application and a resolution to approve the application was passed.

Recreation Ground Car Park - Litter

It has been noticed that quite a bit of litter is being dropped in the car park and recreation ground. The Council would ask that rather than just dropping the litter that you take it home with you and dispose of it properly.

Culham Bridges

Abingdon Road and Tollgate Road will have waiting restrictions in place and road closures when temporary traffic signs are in place, from 14th February until 6th March. This is to enable footway works to be undertaken, and is the re-commencement of the work which was temporarily suspended in November last year. The likely hours of closure are the same as last year, approximately 9.30 a.m.- 3.00 p.m.

Planning Applications

The following planning applications have been considered:

P14/V2415/FUL Extension and alterations to create 2 dwellings at 11 Harwell Road. The Council objected owing to the tall sided building protruding in front of the building line, the lack of amenity garden space, insufficient room for parking, and the overshadowing of the adjacent property.

P14/V2621/HH Erection of a two storey side extension at 77 Bradstocks Way. The Council had no objections

P14/V2623/HH Erection of double garage on the side of the existing house at 93 Bradstocks Way. The Council had concerns regarding the access at the junction, and referred to the previous planning history of refusals for an increase in building at the side.

P14/V26652/HH Single storey rear and side extension to enlarge kitchen and study and add utility room at 13 Lady Place. The Council had no objections

P14/V2730 Internal alterations and insertion of two external doors to North West elevation, to convert existing 3 units into 2 larger units at17, 19 and 21 Almshouses, Church Street. The Council had no objections

Date of Next Meeting: Tuesday 3rd February, 2015 at 7.00 p.m. in the village hall, Frilsham Street. Developers, London Regeneration Ltd, will be giving a presentation to the Council about its proposals for housing development rear of Harwell Road. The Council will be listening to the presentation and will not be debating anything, nor will there be public debate. Public consultation on the scheme is taking place earlier in the day and also on 10th February. Please see notice on page 16 of this issue.

SUTTON COURTENAY PRIMARY SCHOOL

It has been a little over two years since the school was inspected and found to be good in all areas. The strengths of the school were also highlighted as being:

- The Head Teacher is an outstanding leader. She is determined and successfully helped staff to raise the pupils' achievements in all subjects.
- Families are becoming more involved in their children's learning.
- The curriculum is rich and involves a lot of interesting topics that grab the pupils' interest.
- Reception children make rapid progress because of outstanding teaching. In Years 1-6 teaching is almost all good.
- Reading standards are impressive.
- Governors offer the school strong and effective support and challenge.



Love life; love learning; love one another

We have continued to build upon these strengths, further developing our creative curriculum with the new even more demanding demands of the new national curriculum that was introduced for September 15 – but in our school in January last year.

Of course, we have also worked on the areas that Ofsted had highlighted – indeed they were already areas that we had identified as a school and had begun work on.

Improvements in the Nursery: The Ofsted report noted that the classroom was shabby, resources not sufficiently stimulating and teaching not vibrant enough. Since then the nursery was completely renovated (which was planned prior to the inspection) with many new resources purchased and organised in such a way that the children have a greater amount of choice. The teaching within the nursery is now creative, engaging and fun. Children quickly settle into the nursery and its routines. The classroom has been further enhanced this year with an interactive whiteboard and the outside area has been completely revamped with a new playhouse and artificial grass area so that children can always play outside.

Independence: We have continued to build up pupils' independent skills by teaching them about how they learn and by developing a growth mindset attitude.

Excellence and success are celebrated at school and we have extremely high expectations for each and every child. Our teachers take their time to get to know the wonderful individuals that we have within the school so that they are able to get the very best out of them.

If you would like to know more about the school or to arrange a visit, do contact the school office and I would be delighted to show you around.

Please note: Action for Children who run the Family Centre sessions from the building within our playground are relocating to the Scout Hut as of February. The building that is operated by Oxfordshire County Council (and not the school) is in need of a significant amount of repair and Action for Children do not have the funds that would be needed to rectify the issues.

If you could have any super power what would it be?

For one moment in his life, Peter, follower of Jesus, found himself with a super power of walking on water. As it says in Matthew's Gospel, "Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake... 'Lord, if it's you,' Peter replied, 'tell me to come to you on the water.' 'Come,' he said. Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came towards Jesus. But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, 'Lord, save me!' Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. 'You of little faith,' he said, 'why did you doubt?'" *Matthew 14:25-31*

Unfortunately, this story isn't evidence that Jesus is in the habit of handing out superpowers to all his followers but we can still learn something from it. Like most modern superhero stories, this incident is less about the superpower on display and more about what the characters learn about themselves and those around them. The first thing Peter sees is Jesus doing what God alone can do. In the Bible, power over the wind and waves is always attributed to God. Jesus' feat of walking on water is more than just a clever trick. To Christians it's further evidence of his authority – an authority which enables Peter himself to walk on water. Even more remarkably, we can trust that the power of Christ residing in us through his Spirit will enable us to walk through life's storms without fear. The second thing Peter learns is that he can't do it himself, in his own power. He began to walk towards Jesus, "but when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, 'Lord, save me!'" Peter was aware of the wind and the waves in his peripheral vision when he climbed out of the boat. But when he stopped focusing on Jesus and allowed his vision to be filled with the storm, he began to sink.

We might not find ourselves in a boat surrounded by a storm, but we regularly weather metaphorical storms in our own lives. These storms might be due to the stresses of modern life - financial worries; impossible deadlines at work; family strife and conflict; ill-health or the breakdown of a relationship. But when we find ourselves in a storm, what do we do? Do we allow the wind and waves to fill our vision and overwhelm us, or do we keep focusing on Jesus? Do we trust that, if we begin to sink, he will reach out and catch us? From my own experiences I believe that the one we can always look to is God, who not only directs the winds and waves but also death and life, the only one who can save us and carry us through the storms of today. Rest in Peace

We send our condolences and the assurance of our prayers to the family and friends of the following people who have died recently:

Eileen Barbara Wood who died 12th November 2014 was born on 13th November 1919 in Twickenham to her parents Sarah and Frederick Adams. She grew up with her brothers Peter and John and sister Kay and was always known as Barbara, never Eileen. Aged 14 she took a job book-keeping at the Co-operative Society. She met her husband, Harry, at Richmond Ice-rink where he literally fell at her feet. They were married 2nd June 1941 and went onto have three children: Brian, Raymond and Anne (Whitehead). As Harry joined the RAF they moved around the country and after the war Barbara worked in Nelson Primary School, Whitton before they moved to Brimpton in 1958, Minster Lovell in 1968 and then to Abingdon in 1977. She loved her extended family and was very proud of her children and her seven grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. Over the years she loved to knit, going to Speedway and motor cross races, cycling, swimming, chatting and chocolate. With age, arthritis took away her joy of knitting and sadly Harry became ill and died earlier this year. But, with an early diagnosis of Alzheimer's and the correct medication, she regained her happy spirit. She continued to enjoy the company of her family and friends. She loved family gatherings and holidays at the beach. In October she very much enjoyed her last family holiday in Norfolk, eating sherbet and chocolates and keeping everyone entertained with her brilliant one liners. Sadly she caught a chest infection, had a series of mini strokes and died 1 day short of her 95th birthday. She was an honourable, loving, generous, kind, funny woman with an infectious giggle and a ready smile. She was rich in that she was a contented woman. She was very devout and said her prayers every night. She will be greatly missed by all her family and friends. Her funeral, conducted by the Reverend Helen Kendrick, was held in All Saints' Church on 28th November 2014. This is an edited extract of the tribute given at Barbara's funeral by her son, Brian.

James (Jim) Howe who has died aged 75 on 26th December 2014 was born on 4th March 1939 in Co. Durham to his parents, Jack and Evelyn Howe. After school he did an apprenticeship in Electronics. He did his National Service for two years in the RAF but afterwards finding no work available in Co Durham came south and found a job at Harwell. Jim met Sylvia at a dance. For Jim it was love at first sight and, although Sylvia lived 12 miles away in Sunderland, he was determined to see her again. For the first few dates Jim missed the last bus home and had to walk the 12 miles back. At least, as Sylvia said, it proved he was serious! They were married in Sunderland on 14th September 1963 and, after their honeymoon, came to live in Abingdon where they brought up their girls - Vanessa and Lisa. Jim went onto work for Oxford Medical in Abingdon for 25 years before having to retire due to ill-health. They moved twenty years ago to Sutton Courtenay and strove to make the most of retirement. Jim loved cooking. He was mostly self-taught and he took great delight in serving Sylvia delicious tasting meals, beautifully presented, on her return home from work. Always a country man at heart he loved the great outdoors and anything to do with nature and wildlife. He liked birds and flowers and fishing and loved being so close to the River Thames. Over the years the family enjoyed some memorable holidays and Jim instilled in his girls a similar love for the countryside. He and Sylvia set themselves the challenge of walking the Thames path in stages and they managed to walk from the source as far as Maidenhead. They had also walked the majority of the Ridgeway Path – at least twice – as they would park the car, walk to a pub, have lunch and walk back to the car again! He loved sea-fishing and rugby and also supported Abingdon United Football Club. Above all, Jim was a caring, devoted family man, who loved his family and always put them first. He and Sylvia had a strong and enduring partnership - and they lived out their wedding vows by loving and caring for one another through good times and bad. Jim had a romantic streak - he had been known to buy roses! And he could also be stubborn and a bit cantankerous at times but it was this same stubbornness that pulled him through some very challenging times. Following his final diagnosis of lung cancer Jim faced his illness bravely and stoically – lovingly cared for at home by Sylvia and the family. His strength and determination was such that he succeeded in not only being there for Christine's wedding in June – but also walking into the ceremony and standing for all the photographs with a proud smile on his face. And finally, he made it to Christmas Day - when the family all gathered together for what Sylvia will always remember as a happy occasion which Jim so much appreciated and enjoyed. And on Boxing Day he passed away peacefully, knowing he was loved, in the arms of his beloved Sylvia. His funeral was held in All Saints' Church on 14th January 2015. This is an edited extract of the address given at Jim's funeral by the Reverend Helen Kendrick.

Warehouse

Once again, Sutton Courtenay has lost a planning battle! The warehouse outline application has been approved. I was amazed at how few Sutton Courtenay residents objected to this second application. Perhaps they thought that their objection to the first application would count....not that it would have made any difference. The number of County Councillors who changed their minds, when the second application was very little changed, was also amazing!! Only a week or so before this application was heard, the newspapers were highlighting the schools, hospitals and old people's homes should not be built in air polluted places and yet, this warehouse, with HGV's arriving and departing every minute, day and night, is to be built practically opposite the village school!!The so-called "experts" actually stated that there would be little difference in the amount of traffic generated! - by the HGV's and the "supposed" number of employees who would be driving into work in three shifts!

Once again, Sutton Courtenay has been dumped upon! As far as I am concerned, Planners should be looking at the cumulative effect - the likelihood of a thousand more houses being built in the village as well as the thousands in Didcot. Is a hamburger roundabout really going to make that much difference? I leave it to you to imagine the traffic problems . Cyclists

Pedestrians have reported that some cyclists are continuing to ride on the footpath over Sutton Bridge (often referred to as Culham Bridge), and at a dangerously fast speed. Cyclists have been observed riding very fast on the footpath in Harwell Road and in the High Street, some of them without any lights while cycling in the dark. The following are some of the legal requirements for cyclists. If a breach is witnessed the police can issue an onthe-spot fine.

- If used before sunrise, after sunset or in poor visibility bicycles must have, and use, fully operational front and rear lights. They must also have a red rear reflector.
- Riding a bicycle on a footpath is not permitted (with the exception of very young children).
- Obey a traffic sign or order (e.g. stop at the line when a traffic light is at red, or contra-flow to permitted traffic direction).
- Obey a signal from a police officer or traffic warden.
- Riding a bicycle under the influence of drink or drugs is not permitted.
- A bike is for one person only passengers must not be carried by a cyclist.

For your own safety please wear head protection and ensure visibility to other road users.

Please keep any notes as they may be required as evidence if the matter goes to court.

Child contact procedures

Recent years have seen an increase in the number of people visiting the Citizens Advice Bureau after the breakdown of a marriage or a relationship.

Where children are involved, one issue that frequently arises is that the father is seeking the right to keep his child living with him, or the right to visit them. Fathers are often concerned that the judge will favour the children's mother and that hiring a lawyer to obtain a court order will be far too expensive. Going to court over your children is a last resort, as it is very costly and time-consuming.



If you are a separated father in this situation, the first recourse should be for you to come to an agreement with your partner about the care of your children. If this is not possible, the next step is to enlist the help of a local family mediation service in order to solve the dispute out of court. You must prove that you have considered mediation before you go to court, but this does not apply in some cases - e.g. if there has been domestic abuse. Legal aid is sometimes available to help pay for mediation, whereas it is not available for the court proceedings of private family law cases. You can availability family out about the of legal aid for mediation www.familymediationhelpline.co.uk

Decisions reached with the mediation service are not legally binding, and mediation is not a substitute for legal advice. You will be encouraged to consult a solicitor during the mediation process to advise you on the personal consequences of your decisions.

At the end of mediation, the decisions you have reached can be used as the basis for a divorce settlement, or a legal separation agreement.

An unmarried father doesn't necessarily have the right to play a role in his child's future, even though he might be supporting them financially. This right will depend on whether he has "parental responsibility" for the child. Fathers who are named on their child's birth certificate (if it dates from 2003 or after) do have parental responsibility. Another way to obtain parental responsibility is to ask the court for an order.

If you want your children to live with you, you will need to apply for a residence order. If the children will be living with their mother, you will need to apply for a contact order. This will set out the kind of contact you will have with your children - for example how often you can see them or take them away on holiday. It can be a good idea to apply to the court for both a contact order and a parental responsibility order at the same time, if you don't already have parental responsibility.

If you are thinking of going to court to deal with arrangements for your children, you should consult an experienced adviser, which you can do for free at a Citizens Advice Bureau, or go to www.adviceguide.org.uk to find out more.

As you are all no doubt aware, 2015 is the year of a General Election. In my constituency this is being held alongside elections for both South Oxfordshire and The Vale of White Horse District Councils and elections for many towns and parishes.

The way people register to vote is changing and it is very important that as many of you as possible have the chance to have your say at the ballot box. Individual Electoral registration (IER) is being implemented which requires each person to register to vote individually rather than by household. Residents who have automatically been re-registered on the electoral roll will have received a confirmation letter from the returning officer, and will not have to do anything more.

To try and increase the number of people registered to vote council staff will be visiting the homes of those who are not registered, or who have not sent back forms asking who lives at the property. These canvassers will always carry identification badges, so please ask to see them, and there is no need for them to enter your homes. You can register securely online by visiting **www.gov.uk/yourvotematters** or by contacting the shared elections office on 01235 540310.

Thursday May 7th (the date of the election) falls in a week with the May Day bank holiday on the Monday, so if you are planning to take this opportunity to go on holiday, please register for a postal vote as soon as possible.

As so many elections are taking place at the same time, counting the votes is being spread over several days. The General Election votes will be counted after polling stations close at 10pm on the night of 7th. District Council counts will take place on the afternoon of 8th and town and parish council counts on 9th. COUNTY COUNCILLOR REPORT

The NPPF and what's left of Localism

The fall-out from the 160 home Taylor Wimpey application in South Abingdon has had an enormous impact on the way that OCC Transport/Highway officers can argue traffic impact as a reason for refusing an application. The NPPF (National Planning Policy Framework) states that the impact on traffic must be "severe" before traffic can be used to block an application. Various pieces of case law have demonstrated that unless traffic is at an almost complete and permanent standstill, it will not be deemed "severe" enough. This puts OCC officers, VWHDC officers and planning committee members under enormous pressure to overlook traffic implications in almost all cases. In short, the NPPF trumps almost all traffic considerations.

Much the same situation has now arisen over "safe routes to school" in the same South Abingdon application. After months of wrangling, the OCC Cabinet have agreed that arguments over the safety of proposed pedestrian crossings in Ock St and Marcham Rd in Abingdon are trumped by the NPPF pressure to allow housebuilding. In short, the NPPF trumps child and pedestrian safety.

The VWHDC Planning committee's decision to pass the latest iteration of the giant Warehouse on the edge of Sutton Courtenay because traffic impact is deemed to be "not severe enough", air quality "not bad enough", scale "not large enough" and cumulative impact of 500 odd houses + Didcot B + FCC recycling + Milton Park not large enough" to warrant refusal, is the latest example of the NPPF's enormous impact on planning. Indeed, one begins to wonder if planning committees have any room for manoeuvre at all. Faced with County and District Officer recommendations to accept applications, it seems that the financial risks are so great that refusal of large scale applications is all but impossible.

A select committee of MPs from all parties made recommendations to the Minister for Local Government broadly in support of the arguments above and that the NPPF was in need of modification. The Minister disagreed stating that he felt the NPPF was delivering housing and growth as it was designed to do, and there was no need to modify it.

So there we are. More houses, more jobs, more traffic, more growth and, under the NPPF, at almost any cost. The problem for our area is the very uneven dispersion of the population. 90% of population, along with the jobs and the traffic is crammed into about 5% of the available land. Abingdon, Didcot and all the villages in between are on the verge of merging. We may just about get away with our planned numbers and allocations for 2031, but heaven help us if we cannot find a better solution thereafter.

Politicians need to be starting a grown-up conversation on 2031 solutions now - not in 15 years - a conversation which allows the voice of Localism (so drowned by the NPPF) to be heard.

Sutton Courtenay Flooding issues

As a result of sustained pressure from a number of persistent (and well-informed) Sutton Courtenay residents, a site tour and meeting was held with OCC Planners and the EA to try to get some effective measures in place in time to limit the chances of a 2014 repeat flooding incident on the edge of the village. It very soon became apparent that the maps being used by FCC and the EA were not accurate (as argued by residents) and that this would mean a rapid revision of the FCC Flooding strategy and necessary immediate actions. Whilst we are still some way from a long-term strategy in which everyone can feel confident, OCC, the EA and FCC are very close to some immediate actions. All are aware of the need to get these in place quickly – and in the meantime, we hope that the elements will" lay off "for the few weeks it will take to happen. – More on this next month.
